PREFACE

This publication contains particulars of the characteristics of dwellings and of householders in Western Australia recorded at the 1954 Census (Class of Dwelling - i.e., whether Private House, Flat, etc., - Material of Outer Walls, Number of Rooms, Number of Inmates, Nature of Occupancy, Date of Building, and Weekly Rent (Unfurnished) for Dwellings, and Sex, Age, Conjugal Condition, Period of Residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, Industry and Occupational Status for Householders). Information is provided for the State as a whole and for the metropolitan urban, other urban and rural divisions of the State in comparison with the 1947 Census and in cross-classification with other recorded characteristics. Information for individual local government areas is not provided herein; such information is contained in Part III. of this Volume - Analysis of Dwellings in Local Government Areas, etc.

With the issue of this Part all five Parts constituting the complete Census Volume for the State of Western Australia have now been published. The Parts already published are:- Part I. - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas and in Non-municipal Towns, Part II. - Cross-classifications of the Characteristics of the Population, Part III. - Analysis of Dwellings in Local Government Areas and in Non-municipal Towns, and Part V. - Population and Occupied Dwellings in Localities. A similar Volume is being prepared for each State, for the Territories and for Australia as a whole.

Inside the back cover of this Part is a list of 1954 Census publications issued by this Bureau.

Explanatory Notes relative to the contents of the Part follow the Table of Contents.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Divisions of State. — The Divisions of State for Western Australia — Metropolitan Urban, Other Urban, Rural and Migratory, as defined for Census purposes and as referred to throughout this Part, are constituted as follows: —

Metropolitan Urban — comprises the City of Perth, the Municipalities of Claremont, Cottesloe, East Fremantle, Fremantle, Guildford, Midland Junction, North Fremantle and Subiaco, and the Road Districts of Bassendean, Bayswater, Belmont Park, Canning, Melville, Mosman Park, Nedlands, Peppermint Grove, Perth, South Perth and part of Swan (see map accompanying Part I of this Volume). Other Urban — comprises, for the 1954 Census, all Municipalities and other urban areas with a population of 1,000 persons or more outside the Metropolitan Area; for the 1947 Census, comprises extra-metropolitan Municipalities only. Rural — comprises the remaining portions of the State, and is affected by intercensal changes in the areas of Metropolitan Urban and Other Urban Divisions. Variation in the boundaries of divisions of State is a factor that must be borne in mind when making comparisons between Censuses. The 1947 Census boundaries of the Metropolitan Urban Area of Perth remained unaltered for the 1954 Census. Migratory — refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated who at midnight between 30th June and 1st July, 1954, were travelling on ships in Western Australian waters or on long-distance trains or aircraft. Particulars of this division, which refer to population only, are shown in Table 2 of this Part.

Dwellings. — For the purpose of the Census, a "dwelling" is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only part of a building. The term has, therefore, a very wide reference, and includes, in addition to houses and flats, a great variety of "dwellings" ranging from a single-roomed shack to a multi-roomed hotel or institution.

Occupied Dwellings. — Occupied Dwellings are classified into private and other dwellings.

Private Dwellings. — These comprise Private Houses (including Sheds, Huts, Garages, etc., used for dwelling purposes), Shares of Private Houses, Flats, and Rooms, Apartments, etc. In previous Censuses dwellings returned on the Schedules as sheds, huts, garages, etc. were included with private houses. In the Census of 1954 these dwellings are shown in tabulations as a separate group wherever practicable, but are linked with private houses to preserve continuity with past Census results. Separate particulars are shown in the 1947 Census publications for private houses which were shared by two or more family units and for which only one Householder's Schedule was received, but in 1954 these dwellings were included with private houses. For purposes of comparison in this Part particulars of the 1947 houses so shared are similarly treated.

Share of Private House. — A share of a private house is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.

Flat. — A flat is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off and which includes both cooking and bathing facilities.

Other Private Dwellings. — These include dwellings such as apartments, rooms, etc., which are parts of buildings but are not self-contained units.

Dwellings other than Private. — These include Hotels, Boarding Houses, Lodging Houses, Hostels, Educational, Religious and Charitable Institutions, Hospitals, Defence and Penal Establishments, Police and Fire Stations, Clubs, Staff Barracks and Quarters, etc.

Unoccupied Dwellings. — The tables in this Part, except for Nos. 1 and 2, exclude particulars of unoccupied dwellings. The term "unoccupied dwellings" is not synonymous with vacant houses and flats available for occupancy, but refers mainly to "week-end", holiday and other dwellings whose usual occupants were temporarily absent on the night of the Census. Newly-completed dwellings awaiting occupancy are also included. Examination of the geographical distribution of such "unoccupied dwellings" indicates that for the most part they were temporarily unoccupied, or located in rural areas other than towns with a population of 1,000 persons or more.

Wagons and Camps. — This group, which includes caravans, relates to the transient habitations of itinerants and persons camping out, where occupancy is of short duration only. Particulars are excluded from all tables in this Part, except Nos. 1 and 2. This group is distinct from "Migratory" — see definition above.

EXPLANATORY NOTES (Continued)

Rents.— All rents shown in this Part are on an unfurnished basis. Dwellings shown as rent "Not Stated" include those whose rents were shown on Householder's Schedules on a furnished basis, and those whose rents were not applicable (e.g., for shop and dwelling combined). Rents shown for the 1954 Census are exclusive of particulars of dwellings occupied by "Tenants" (Governmental Housing); i.e., those who furnished answers in response to the instruction on the Census Householder's Schedule "Tenant paying rent to a Government Authority to write 'Tenant (G)'".

The broad features of this Part may be ascertained from the Table of Contents on page 2, but to facilitate reference to particular subjects an index is also provided — see end of the publication.

This Part contains particulars relating to each characteristic of dwellings and of householders obtained from the 1954 Census tabulations. However, additional information is available in some instances, but limitations of space prohibit its publication in complete detail. Such additional information relative to this Part and also to Part III. — Analysis of Dwellings in Local Government Areas, etc. may be obtained on inquiry from the Commonwealth Statistician.

Particulars of full-blood aborigines and of dwellings occupied solely by them are excluded throughout.

In this publication certain instances of incorrect data which appeared in Part III have been corrected.
