The 1966 Census publication programme is made up of five individual Volumes, four consisting of a number of separate Parts, together with a series of supplementary statements in mimeographed form. The actual titles of the 1966 Census Volumes and Parts are listed in the back of this publication; the content of each is briefly as follows:

Volume 1. Single characteristics of the population for Australia, Parts 1-11.-Age, marital status, birthplace, nationality, period of residence, education, religion, occupational status, industry, occupation and race.

Volume 2. Related characteristics of the population for Australia, Parts 1-5.-Growth and distribution of the population, demographic data, overseas-born population, the work force, and families and households.
Volume 3. Housing.
Volume 4. Single characteristics of the population and dwellings in Local Government Areas, Parts 1-7.New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, and Northern Territory and Australian Capital Territory.

Volume 5. Population and dwellings in localities, Parts 1-7.-States and Territories as for Volume 4, and Part 8.-Australia.

This publication is Part 4 of Volume 2 and contains details of the population in the work force as enumerated at 30 June 1966.

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## EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Work Force Characteristics

## Work force

At the 1961 and previous Censuses the work force was determined as:
'Those who are engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service at the time of the Census (including those on long service leave, etc.)............................................................; and
'..............................those out of a job at time of the C
profession, trade or service................................
At the 1966 Census an additional set of four questions was asked in order to obtain information on the basis of which the work force could be determined more precisely. The questions were as follows.

Did the person have a job or business of any kind last week (even though he may have been temporarily absent from it) ? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'.
Did the person do any work at all last week for payment or profit? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'. Persons working without pay as a helper in a 'family business' or farm and members of the clergy and of religious orders (other than purely contemplative orders) should answer 'YES' to this question. Persons doing only unpaid housework should answer 'NO'.
Was the person temporarily laid off by his employer without pay for the whole of last week? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'.
Did the person look for work last week? ANSWER 'YES' or 'NO'. (Note: 'Looking for work' means (i) being registered with Commonwealth Employment Service, or (ii) approaching prospective employers, or (iii) placing or answering advertisements, or (iv) writing letters of application, or ( v ) awaiting the result of recent applications.)

The work force includes all persons for whom the answer 'yes' was given to any one of these four questions. Except that persons helping but not receiving wages or a salary who usually worked less than 15 hours a week were excluded from the work force.

This approach conforms closely to the recommendations of the Eighth International Conference of Labour Statisticians held in Geneva in 1954 and the information so obtained has been used in determining the work force for the purposes of the 1966 Census.

The net effect of the new definition is to include approximately 108,000 additional persons in the Australian work force i.e. a proportionate increase in the Australian work force of approximately 2.3 per cent. The major factor in this change was females working part-time (sometimes for only a few hours a week) some of whom, in 1961, did not consider themselves as ' $\qquad$ engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service'.

## Occupational status

Persons in the work force were asked to state occupational status in accordance with the following instructions.

If working for wages or salary (including apprentices), write ' $W$ '.
If conducting own business or profession and not at present employing others, write ' 0 '.

If conducting own business or profession and at present employing others, write ' $E$ '.
If helping but not receiving wages or salary, write ' H '
If looking for first job, write ' $F$ '.

Persons not in the work force were asked to state activity in accordance with the following instructions:

## Persons not engaged in an industry, business, profession, trade or service.

For-Children not attending school, write ' C '. Full-time students or children attending school, write ' S '. Mainly dependent on pension or superannuation, write ' P '. Of independent means, write ' $M$ '. Engaged in unpaid home duties, write 'H.D.'. Inmates of institutions (e.g., for invalids and the aged, gaols, reformatories, etc.) write ' 1 '. Others not engaged in industry, etc., write 'N.A.'. (Young persons seeking work but not previously employed, write ' $O$ ' in answer to this question.)


#### Abstract

Industry Persons in the work force were asked to state industry in accordance with the following instructions. State the exact branch of industry, business or service in which mainly engaged last week using two or more words where possible. For example, 'Dairy Farming', 'Coal Mining', 'Woollen Mills', 'Retail Grocery', 'Road Construction', etc. Employees should state the industry of their employer. For example, a carpenter employed by a coal mining company should state 'Coal Mining'. If employed by a Government Department or other public body, state also its name. For paid housekeepers and domestic servants in private households, write 'P.H.'


From the answers to this question, persons were classified according to the Bureau's 'Classification of Industries' which provides for each person to be classified according to the nature of the business in which mainly engaged, regardless of whether operated by a government authority, corporation or individual.

## Occupation

Persons in the work force were asked to state occupation in accordance with the following instructions.
State in precise (or award) terms the person's main occupation last week, using where possible two or more words. For example, 'Builder's Labourer', 'Dairy Farm Hand', 'Clothing Machinist', 'Wood Machinist', 'Motor Mechanic', 'Electrical Fitter', 'Coal Wheeler', 'Dairy Farmer', etc. Employees of Government Departments or Authorities should be described by their official designation, such as 'District Employment Officer', 'Shire Clerk', etc., and not by such terms as 'Public Servant', etc.

The precise classification of persons in the work force according to occupation and industry is extremely difficult but is subject to continuing efforts to improve the quality of the data from census to census. Consequently the comparison of data compiled at the 1966 Census with that obtained at previous censuses is not only influenced by changes in the definition and content of the work force but also by the different responses which may have been evoked by efforts to improve the questions on the Census Schedule, and by some changes in coding rules designed to rectify known deficiencies in the data. Classification according to occupation and industry is difficult mainly because of the problem of conveying through a printed form the exact nature of the information required (e.g. the conceptual difference between 'occupation' and 'industry') and the consequential inadequacy of many replies.

Classification according to occupation is particularly difficult because: (a) the range of occupations is so extensive; (b) there is a lack of uniformity in occupational terms, which vary between industries, locations and States; and (c) respondents fail to give precise descriptions, especially of other members of the family, either through carelessness or ignorance of occupational designations. Similarly, classification according to industry is complicated by the development of new fields of industrial enterprise and the splitting and overlapping of previously identifiable fields.

Detailed statistics of single characteristics of population in the work force have been published in Volume 1, Parts 8, 9 and 10 .

## Other Individual Characteristics

 AgePersons were asked to state age in accordance with the following instructions.
State age in years and completed months. If aged under one year, state age in completed months (for example, a child of eleven months should be shown as ' 0 ' years ' 11 ' months). If aged under one month, write ' 0 ' years ' 0 ' months.

This question is more specific than that asked at the 1961 Census, which sought 'age last birthday' (in years). The change should overcome some mis-statement of age due to rounding. Similarly, it is expected that confusion in the reporting of ages of young children (which are conventionally thought of in 'months' up to the age of about two years) should be now largely obviated.

Prior to the 1954 Census ages 'not stated' were tabulated as such for urban and rural sections of each State and later distributed to specific ages in accordance with the frequency of stated ages. In the 1954 and later Censuses, 'not stated' ages were individually estimated prior to tabulation by first establishing the minimum range of ages within which the 'not stated' age most probably lay (as indicated by other information supplied in the Householder's Schedule) and by then selecting an age within that range from a table of random ages according to sex. This table had been compiled previously using the latest estimates of the age distribution of the population which were available at the time.

The proportion of persons who failed to state an age is very small.

## Marital status

Persons were asked to state marital status in accordance with the following instructions.
If never married, write 'N.M.'; at present married, write 'M' ; married but permanently separated (legally or otherwise), write 'P.S.' ; divorced and not remarried, write 'D'; widowed and not remarried, write 'W'.

A very small proportion of persons omitted to state any marital status. In such cases, marital status was assessed as follows.

Males under 20 years of age and females under 18 years of age were classified 'never married' unless there was definite evidence of marriage given in the Schedule, in which case they were classified 'married'. All other persons were classified 'married' if there was any evidence of marriage given in the Schedule. Otherwise a marital status was allocated from a random list according to the age and sex of the person concerned. The random list for the allocation of 'not stated' marital status had been compiled previously using the latest available statistics of the distribution of the population by marital status.

## Birthplace

Persons were asked to state birthplace in accordance with the following instructions.
For persons born in Australia write name of the State or Territory where born. For persons born outside Australia write the name of the country where born (not town or locality).

For the small number of cases where no reply was given, the allocation of a birthplace was made in accordance with other information on the Schedule (usually nationality).

## Population Distribution

The understanding and measurement of the process of urbanisation have long been recognised as fundamentally important to considerations of economic and social change. For this reason census information has traditionally been published separately for 'metropolitan', 'other urban', and 'rural' areas. However, the criteria used in the past for making this dissection (criteria which are still used in many countries) did not provide comparable data for different areas or for different points of time.

In Australian censuses up to and including the Census of 1947 complete local government areas were classified as either urban or rural, and 'urban' areas therefore usually consisted of whole local government areas, or multiples of them. However, many local government areas, particularly at the fringe of large urban complexes, contain both urban and rural components. In some cases it was necessary to split local government areas for statistical purposes in order to eliminate large rural expanses from the metropolitan areas. Boundaries of local government areas were also subject to variation for reasons unrelated to (and often conflicting with) statistical requirements, and consequently this method became increasingly unsatisfactory.

In the Censuses of 1954 and 1961 all localities of 1,000 population and over ( 750 and over in Tasmania) were classified as 'urban'. Boundaries were delineated either from local advice, inspection in the field, or from aerial photographs. However, although these procedures were an improvement on the earlier ones, the boundary decisions made for different urban centres, being highly subjective, did not always provide sufficient comparability from census to census nor between one centre and another.

## Delimitation of Urban Centres

The principles and criteria used for the delimitation of urban centres in Australia at the 1966 Census were as follows:

A boundary was defined for all settlements with a population of 1,000 or more and these were named 'urban centres' except for the State capitals and Canberra which were named 'Metropolitan areas'. This boundary is one which, from census to census, as urbanisation proceeds, will be moved outwards to encompass any peripheral urban development.
For urban centres with a population of 30,000 and over, and for a few smaller centres, the following criteria were adopted for delimiting the urban centres.
(a) The Metropolitan Area or urban centre was delimited by including all contiguous Census collector's districts with a population density of 500 or more persons per square mile.
(b) Certain collector's districts, although not reaching the required population density were also included by virtue of-
(i) land use (e.g. factory areas),
(ii) being surrounded by urban collector's districts,
(iii) forming a 'bridge' between two urban centres less than two miles apart so that they could be regarded as one single urban centre.
For urban centres of less than 30,000 population, local government area boundaries were adopted, unless they contained a large rural component or urban development was known to extend beyond the local government boundary. In these cases they were delimited by inspection of aerial photographs, by field inspection or by consideration of any other information available and the boundaries were set as closely as possible to the periphery of the built-up area without regard to local government boundaries.
In areas with large numbers of holiday homes, many of which are unoccupied at the mid-winter census date, dwelling rather than population criteria were used. These criteria were 250 dwellings (in lieu of the 1,000 population mentioned above) and 125 dwellings per square mile (in lieu of the 500 persons per square mile mentioned above). Around each metropolitan area and urban centre with a population of at least 75,000 and a regional population of at least 100,000 , a further boundary was defined, designed to circumscribe an area which would contain the urban development of that centre for at least twenty years and which would generally be socially and economically oriented to the centre. These areas were designated 'Statistical Divisions' (for State capital cities) or 'Statistical Districts' (for Canberra, Newcastle, Wollongong and Geelong).

Because the new criteria for the delimitation of urban boundaries were adopted only shortly prior to the 1966 Census a few collector's districts containing urban growth were not split into their rural and (potentially) urban components, with the result that significant urban population remained included in large, predominantly rural, collector's districts, which did not meet the density criterion. Such cases occurred mainly around the Sydney Metropolitan Area and Urban Toowoomba. The effect on the Sydney Metropolitan Area is small, probably not more than 5,000 urban population having been omitted. In Toowoomba the effect is proportionately much greater, the urban population, probably being understated by up to 3,000 persons.

## Migratory Population

The migratory population consists of persons who, at midnight between 30 June 1966 and 1 July 1966, were enumerated on board ships in Australian ports, or ships which had left an Australian port prior to Census night with a next port of call in Australia. It also includes persons, who at Census time, were enumerated on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

## General

The criteria adopted at the 1966 Census allow more reliable comparison of the population of different areas at the one point in time. However, comparison with section of State data of previous censuses is limited because of the different bases upon which these areas were defined at the earlier censuses. Although detailed comparison at the individual characteristic level is not possible, the population enumerated at the 1961 Census has been allocated retrospectively to each section of State on the basis of the criteria adopted for the 1966 Census, and the following table gives some indication of the differences caused by the application of the new criteria in each State. Unfortunately, it is not practicable to extend this table to show similar comparisons for censuses prior to 1961 nor to include details of the effect of the new criteria upon population allocation to section of State according to individual characteristics.

Because of the complexity of processing, and the fact that tabulations are produced progressively, it is frequently not practicable to rectify such small discrepancies. Consequently, some differences will be evident between tables included in a particular Census publication, as weil as between a particular Census publication and previous publications. In all such cases the differences are small (generally no more than 0.02 per cent) and in no way affect the general validity of the Census results.
    2. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables showing percentages are due to rounding.
