Pricing

New ABS Email Delivery Service Now Available

ABS Subscription Services now offer email delivery of monthly and quarterly printed publications as electronic files via the Internet! If you would like to have a look at an electronic publication, you can find an example on the ABS web site at www.abs.gov.au

About the Email Delivery Service

The ABS has an agreement with an Internet Service Provider (ISP) to supply bulk email facilities that enable the ABS to email its monthly and quarterly publications shortly after 11.30 a.m. (EST) on the day of their release. Of course the time you receive the publication will depend on the Internet environment outside the ABS including the service provided by your own ISP and your computer environment.

Printed publications are converted into electronic files (pdf format) using Adobe Acrobat software. Most files are about 200–300 Kb in size. The maximum size is 2,000 Kb (i.e. 2 Mb). Adobe Acrobat is a small, efficient, cross-platform file that is a replica of the paper copy, it appears on screen at the highest possible resolution, and prints on both PostScript and non-PostScript printers. Further information about Acrobat, and a free copy of the reader software is available at www.adobe.com.

Subscription to our email delivery service is being offered at the same price as subscription to the existing printed format and there are no additional charges to subscribers for change over to email delivery.

If you are interested in:

- faster delivery of your monthly and/or quarterly publications
- delivery direct to your desktop
- storing electronic publications on your computer system
- networking electronic publications on your office network
- the ability to search by keyword and quickly find the data you want
- the ability to cut and paste from ABS publications into your own documents

5206.0 Australian National Accounts: National Income, Expenditure and Product

A very important Main Economic Indicator (MEI), this publication provides a detailed presentation of quarterly national accounts at both current prices and chain volume measures in original, seasonally adjusted and trend terms. Tables are published relating to expenditure on GDP, and the GDP account. In addition, information is provided on: industry gross value added; summary income, capital and external accounts; the household and general government sectors; and other items.

The June quarter 1998 edition introduced a range of very significant changes. There were changes arising from revisions to international standards contained in the 1993 version of the 'System of National Accounts' (SNA1993) as well as changes related to the adoption of annual benchmark estimates obtained from the balanced annual supply-use tables.

6202.0 Labour Force, Australia, Preliminary

This publication contains preliminary results of the monthly Labour Force Survey, containing estimates of persons employed, unemployed and not in the labour force. Information is classified by sex, full-time/part-time status, States and Territories and selected age groups, with seasonally adjusted and trend estimates available for key series.

6401.0 **Consumer Price Index, Australia**

This important Main Economic Indicator publication contains information on movements in retail prices of goods and services commonly purchased by private households in the eight capital cities. The goods and services are divided into the following eight groups: food; clothing; housing; household equipment and operation; transportation; alcohol and tobacco; health and personal care; recreation and education. Indexes for each of these groups and for 'All Groups' are published for each of the State capitals, Canberra and Darwin and for the weighted average of the eight capital cities. Details are also shown for approximately 50 sub-groups and special series, and 101 expenditure classes for the weighted average of the eight capital cities.

8301.0 **Manufacturing Production, Australia**

Quarterly estimates of production quantities for 28 major indicators, including food, wood products, fuels, building materials and metals. Contains original, seasonally adjusted and trend data for quarterly items.

8731.0 **Building Approvals, Australia**

Number of dwelling units (houses, other dwellings, total) and value of residential building approved by sector; number and value of new other residential building approved by type; number and value of non-residential building jobs approved by class of building (e.g., hotels, offices, etc.) and value ranges. State data include total number of dwelling units approved by type of dwelling by sector and value of building approved by sector. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates for the number of dwelling units and value of buildings approved; quarterly value of building approved in chain volume measures.

1124.0 Historical Publications on CD-ROM, 1999

An HTML based product which allows you to access any page from any ABS publication when you need it. It's just like having your own personal librarian. It contains electronic copies of every printed publication produced by the ABS in a calendar year. This product uses WebCD software to deliver ABS publications in a whole new way—it's similar to a web site on CD-ROM. Publications are provided in Portable Acrobat Format (PDF). All of the Acrobat files on the CD-ROM are text searchable and maintain the original format from the paper publication. Presents a framework for managing culture and leisure statistics. The framework contains separate classifications—covering Industry, Participants, Goods and Services, and Consumers. It provides greater detail for the areas of culture, the arts, sport, recreation and leisure, than is available through the standard classifications such as ANZSIC and ASCO. In addition to definitions, the framework incorporates a data dictionary, listing key data items for each class.

4402.0 Child Care, Australia, Jun 1999

This publication contains results from the Child Care Survey conducted throughout Australia. It provides information on usage and demand for child care, relating to children under 12 years of age. Type of child care is presented for both formal and informal childcare arrangements. Summary findings and tables include information relating to type of care, reasons/main reason for using care, days and hours of care, cost of care, take-up rate of the Childcare Cash Rebate and additional child care arrangements needed. This information is cross classified with a range of socio-demographic attributes such as family type, number and age of children, labour force status and birthplace of parents, weekly family income and other items relating to families, children or parents.

The publication is a continuation of a series which commenced in 1969, with the most recent surveys being conducted in June 1999, June 1996 and June 1993. A number of tables in the publication provide a time series for the most recent surveys, which assist in identifying trends and changes in child care usage patterns and demand over time. Some information is also provided at State/Territory level.

4510.0 Recorded Crime, Australia, 1999

This publication contains uniform national crime statistics relating to a selected range of offences that have become known to and recorded by police. The aim of national crime statistics is to provide comparable recorded crime data across the police jurisdictions of each State and Territory. The statistics are to provide basic indicators of the relative level and nature of recorded crime in Australia and to provide a basis for measuring changes over time.

National crime statistics are compiled on a victim basis and measure the number of victims for each offence category rather than the breaches of criminal law. This publication provides a breakdown of the offences by victim details (age of victim, sex of victim, and relationship of offender to victim). Type of location and use of weapon data and outcome of police investigations statistics are also included. As the national collection progressively expands, future publications will provide additional details on reported offences.

4602.0 **Environmental Issues: Peoples Views and Practices, Mar 2000**

Presents information from the Environmental Issues Survey, which provides data about people's behaviour and actions which impact on the environment from day-to-day living. The survey is to be conducted in March 2000.

This edition of the publication provides data on household waste management (including recycling and hazardous waste disposal), use of private and public transport, and motor vehicle usage (including data on fuel, vehicle servicing and factors considered when choosing a motor vehicle).

4611.0 **Environment Expenditure Account,** Local Government, Australia, 1998-99

Deals with the data collected as a part of the Environment and Natural Resources Survey. The two environment accounts are Environment Protection Expenditure and Natural Resource Use and Management Account. The publication aims to show information about the specialised function of Local Government and its environment activities. The Environment and Natural Resources collection focuses on Local Governments and their role in providing environmental management for their jurisdiction. The publication was developed through the Environment Protection Expenditure Account for Australia (4603.0) and highlights financial transactions made by Local

Government on environmental issues. The publication for the financial year 1998-99 presents the first set of results collected from a voluntary survey, created after 2 years of consultation with Local Government and associated groups within government and universities. The results are presented in a format which aims to be of assistance to users of Local Government data.

4710.0 **Housing and Infrastructure in Indigenous Communities, Australia,** Sep 1999

This publication presents summary information from the 1999 Community Housing and Infrastructure Needs Survey. The survey included all known Indigenous organisations that manage or own community housing. with additional infrastructure information collected for discrete Indigenous communities.

Housing information includes the number, condition and size of community houses, repairs and maintenance expenditure, and amount of rent collected. Infrastructure information includes details of water supply and quality, power supply, sewerage, drainage and solid waste. Transport and communication issues, as well as access to education, health, and other community facilities are also included. The publication presents information at the National and State levels (including Northern Territory) as well as maps showing the distribution of Indigenous housing organisations and discrete communities across Australia.

Contains preliminary estimates for Australia of average weekly ordinary time earnings and average weekly total earnings for full-time adult employees and average weekly total earnings for all employees, for males, females and persons. 6302.0, Average Weekly Earnings, States and Australia, contains estimates of average weekly ordinary time earnings and average weekly total earnings for full-time adult employees and average weekly total earnings for all employees, classified by sector and State or Territory and by industry at the Australian level, for males, females and persons.

6345.0 Wage Cost Index, Australia

This quarterly publication contains indexes measuring changes in hourly wage and salary costs for employee jobs. These indexes were compiled for the first time for the December quarter 1997 (with a base of September quarter 1997 = 100.0). Indexes are compiled for ordinary time and total hourly rates of pay, both including and excluding bonuses. Individual indexes are compiled for various combinations of State/Territory, sector (private/public), broad industry group and broad occupation group.

6354.0 Job Vacancies, Australia

Contains estimates of the number of job vacancies with sector by State and Territory and with industry dissections and job vacancy rates by State and Territory.

Product Changes

From August 1999 Job Vacancies, Australia (6354.0) previously published with the title Job Vacancies and Overtime, Australia no longer includes data on overtime.

6209.0 Labour Mobility, Australia, Feb 2000

Provides information on persons aged 15–69 years who had worked at some time during the year ending February. Details of job mobility, job tenure, number of employers or businesses during the year and reason for ceasing last job or changing locality are presented. Occupation, industry and duration of current and last job are also available. Estimates can be cross-classified by labour force demographics such as State, sex, age, marital status and birthplace.

6281.0 Work in Selected Culture/Leisure Activities, Australia, 1998–99

This publication contains data collected in the Population Survey Monitor from November 1998 to August 1999. It presents information on work involvements in a range of activities on either a voluntary or paid basis. Culture/leisure activities include involvement with cultural institutions (e.g. libraries, museums, art galleries and botanic gardens), other cultural industries (e.g. radio and television) and a range of other activities, such as art and craft, performing arts, music, design etc. The survey was previously conducted in 1997. Some comparisons with this earlier survey are also presented in the publication.

The tables show demographic characteristics (e.g. age, sex and birthplace) of those people involved. It provides details of the types of activities undertaken, the time spent on activities, whether or not any payment was received, the amount of cultural income earned and whether the involvement was part of their main job. Some information by State is also presented. The number of people involved in culture/leisure activities in a hobby capacity is also shown.

The publication covers all work involvements in culture/leisure, regardless of whether the involvement was part of the main job, a second job or in a voluntary capacity. It complements the publication *Employment in Selected Culture/Leisure Occupations, Australia* (6273.0) which shows the occupations of those who perform culture/leisure tasks in their main job.

The publication explains: what the statistics measure; how they relate to other economic series; how they are produced; where they are published; and describes the factors influencing their accuracy and reliability. 5609.0 Housing Finance for Owner Occupation, Australia

The publication reports lending for the construction of dwellings, the purchase of new and established dwellings, for the refinancing of existing dwellings and for alterations and additions to dwellings.

5611.0 Finance, Australia

Includes comprehensive tables, graphs, commentaries, feature articles and technical notes. It is primarily a reference document, providing a broad basis for analysis and research on the Australian finance sector. 6416.0 **House Price Indexes: Eight Capital Cities**

Provides estimates of changes in housing prices in each of the eight capital cities of Australia. The information is presented in the form of price indexes constructed separately for established houses and for project homes.

The index for established houses is derived from changes in the prices of detached residential dwellings on their own block of land regardless of age (i.e. including new houses sold as a house/land package as well as second-hand houses) and therefore relates to changes in the total price of dwelling and land.

The index for project homes is derived from changes in the prices of dwellings available for construction on a client's block of land and therefore relates to changes in the price of the dwelling excluding land.

6423.0 **Producer Price Indexes for Selected Service Industries, Australia**

In recognition of the increasing contribution of service industries to the Australian economy, the ABS has embarked on a long-term development program to progressively extend the scope of the producer price indexes into the service sectors of the economy.

Price index series produced can be used for the following purposes:

- be of use in their own right for industry analysis;
- assist in improving the quality of national accounts by providing a wider range of deflators for deriving real measures of economic growth; and
- contribute to the development of new measures of inflation through expanding the coverage of the indexes compiled under the Stage of Production framework.

This publication presents experimental producer price indexes for the output of the Transport and Storage, and Property and Business Services industries. Price Indexes presented will cover the ANZSIC Divisions, Sub-Divisions, Groups and selected Classes.

What are the Producer Price Indexes?

The Producer Price Indexes (PPIs) are a measure of changes in the producers' prices, similar to the better known Consumer Price Index (CPI). While the CPI measures changes in retail prices paid by households for goods and services, the PPIs measure changes in the prices of products sold to businesses. Producer Price Indexes are compiled for the following sectors of the economy:

 building and construction—price indexes are produced which measure changes in the prices which measure changes in the prices of materials

- used in constructing: (a) houses; and (b) other buildings (e.g. office blocks, shopping centres, schools, hospitals etc.).
- manufacturing industry—price indexes are compiled measuring changes in: (a) prices paid by manufacturers for materials used in producing manufactured goods; and (b) prices received by manufacturers for articles they produce.
- international trade—price indexes are produced which measure changes in the prices of merchandise exports and imports.

Product Changes

The final issue of *Consumer Price Index: Effect of Changes in Prices of Imported Items* (6444.0) was June quarter, 1999. Replaced in September quarter 1999 with new indexes for "Tradeables" and "Non-tradeables" and published in *Consumer Price Index, Australia* (6401.0). These indexes decompose the CPI, at the expenditure class level, into items which are, or could be, internationally traded or not. The compilation of the "tradeables" and "non-tradeables" indexes are described in an appendix to the September quarter 1999 issue of 6401.0.

8201.0 **Manufacturing Industry, Australia,** Preliminary, 1998–99

Preliminary estimates from the annual Manufacturing collection. Contains data on employment, wages and salaries, turnover and industry value added classified by State/Territory and Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification subdivision.

8221.0 **Manufacturing Industry, Australia,** 1998-99

Presents final results for establishments in Australia from the annual Manufacturing collection. Shows details of employment, wages and salaries, turnover and industry value added classified by industry class. Also includes industry subdivision data classified by employment size, State and Territory, data related to exporting activity, selected labour costs, components of industry value added and net capital expenditure, and chain volume masures of industry value added.

8225.0 Manufacturing, Australia, 2000

Presents a variety of statistical information about manufacturing in Australia. Details have been compiled for 1998-99 from several ABS quarterly surveys and for 1997-98 and some earlier years from the annual Manufacturing collection and other annual surveys. Much of the 1997-98 data is previously unpublished information. Also included are articles prepared by other organisations or based on non-ABS statistical data. Generally, data are presented by broad industry within manufacturing. Topics include industry performance, employment and output levels, export activity, cost structures and profits including brief analysis of short, medium and longer term trends in industry structure and performance. Also presents information on the characteristics of the manufacturing workforce.

2037.0 Household Sample File

The 1996 Census Household Sample File (HSF) is a comprehensive unit record data file of Census characteristics. The file contains a one per cent sample of private households with associated family and persons characteristics, and a one per cent sample of persons in non-private dwellings. The HSF has been designed and produced after consultation with major users of Census data and is intended for use in model testing and detailed statistical analysis.

With updates made according to users' preferences and ABS confidentiality requirements, the structure of *HSF* is similar to that of the 1991 *HSF*. Technical documentation provided with the file also gives you access to information on sampling errors associated with statistics produced on the *HSF*.

The *HSF* is released under strict conditions and clients are required to sign an undertaking stating that the information will be used for statistical purposes only. This undertaking is subject to approval by the Australian Statistician before the *HSF* can be released.

9312.0.30.001 TranStats

TranStats is a CD-ROM product containing information about motor vehicles registered in Australia and individual States. *TranStats* contains details such as type of vehicle, make, model, year of manufacture and fuel type which can be linked with information from the 1996 Population Census, allowing a combination of motor vehicle data with economic and demographic data.

The product includes software for generating data at different regional levels, such as postcode, Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) and Local Government Areas (LGAs) and an optional mapping module is also available.
