You may convert any or all of your existing publications to email delivery as well as add new printed or electronic publications to your current subscription. #### **About the Email Delivery Service**

The ABS has an agreement with an Internet Service Provider (ISP) to supply bulk email facilities that enable the ABS to email its publication releases shortly after 11.30 a.m. (EST) on the day of their release. Of course the time you receive the publication will depend on the Internet environment outside the ABS including the service provided by your own ISP and your computer environment.

Printed publications are converted into electronic files (pdf format) using Adobe Acrobat software. Most files are about 200–300 Kb in size. Adobe Acrobat is a small, efficient, cross-platform file that is a replica of the paper copy, it appears on screen at the highest possible resolution, and prints on both PostScript and non-PostScript printers. Further information about Acrobat, and a free copy of the reader software is available at www.adobe.com.

Subscription to our email delivery service is offered at the same price as subscription to the existing printed format.

### 5250.0 **Australian Business Expectations**

Are you a crystal ball gazer? Do you know what the future holds? Well, if you don't, then you need to get a copy of the latest Australian Business Expectations publication. While most current official statistics measure what has already happened, the statistics published in Australian Business Expectations provide a unique insight as to likely future developments as perceived by business decision makers.

Australian Business Expectations contains statistics by size of business; industry and state; on the expectations of businesses in both the short term (the next three months) and the medium term (the current quarter of the following year) for a range of business performance indicators including operating income; selling prices; profit; capital expenditure; inventories; employment; non-wage labour expenses and other expenses.

### 5609.0 **Housing Finance for Owner Occupation, Australia**

Contains the number and value of secured finance commitments made by banks, permanent building societies, mortgage managers and other lenders, provided to individuals/households for the purchase of owner occupied housing. The publication reports lending for the construction of dwellings, the purchase of new and established dwellings, for the refinancing of existing dwellings and for alterations and additions to dwellings.

Contains estimates of the number of job vacancies, and job vacancy rates, with State and Territory and industry dissections.

### 6401.0 Consumer Price Index, Australia

Presents movements in retail prices of goods and services commonly purchased by metropolitan households. The goods and services are divided into the following groups: food; alcohol and tobacco; clothing and footwear; housing; household furnishings; supplies and services; health; transportation; communication; recreation; education and miscellaneous. Indexes for each of these groups and for 'All Groups' are published for each of the State capitals along with Canberra and Darwin, and for the weighted average of the eight capital cities. Details are also shown for about 54 sub-groups and special and analytical series, for the weighted average of the eight capital cities.

# 9301.0 New Motor Vehicle Registrations, Australia: Preliminary

This publication presents registrations of new passenger vehicles; light commercial vehicles; rigid and articulated trucks; non-freight carrying trucks; buses and motorcycles. Included are Seasonally Adjusted and Trend estimated registrations for passenger vehicles; 'Other' vehicles which comprise the light commercial vehicles and all trucks and buses; 'Total' vehicles excluding motorcycles by State or Territory and Australia. Also included is a table of the top seven passenger vehicle makes by their top three models.

To keep up to date with Australia's economy, subscribe to *Australian Economic Indicators* (AEI) (1350.0). AEI is the flagship monthly economic compendium publication of all the main economic indicators produced by the ABS. It also includes key economic indicators from the Reserve Bank of Australia; Commonwealth Treasury; Australian Bureau of Agricultural and Resource Economics (ABARE); the Australian Stock Exchange and the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). AEI contains: comprehensive tables and charts on National accounts; International accounts; Consumption and investment; Production; Prices;

Labour force and demography; Incomes and labour costs; Financial markets; State comparisons and International Comparisons; feature articles and technical notes relevant to economic analysts; quarterly updates of the Experimental Composite Leading Indicator of the Australian Business Cycle and a quarterly review of the economy. The March through to January issues of AEI generally present the statistics as time series for the last nine years of annual data, and for the last nine quarters or 15 months of sub-annual data. The February issue contains longer time series (20 years of annual, 10 years of quarterly and 4 years of monthly data where available).

Topics covered include: a statistical summary; population; education; labour; health; crime and courts; commerce and trade; tourism and culture; public and private finance; manufacturing; primary industries such as agriculture; livestock; fisheries and mining; housing and construction; road transport and information technology. Also included is an appendix of historical statistics.

#### **Product Change**

The 1362 catalogue series have been created to provide a standard format for State Regional Statistics publications, which previously existed under a number of different catalogue numbers. While the new individual state publications may differ slightly in content, they will share a similar catalogue number and publication name.

# 1216.0 Statistical Geography: Volume 1 — Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC)

A classification system, designed and maintained by the ABS, which divides Australia into geographical areas for the purpose of collecting and disseminating statistics. The 2000 edition is the 18th edition since the ASGC was devised in 1984. It provides details of the geographical areas effective at 1 July 2000 and also maps of these areas.

# 1349.0 Information Paper: A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring Trends

This information paper explains why, in ABS publications, the main features and commentaries sections concerning most time series are increasingly emphasising the trend series rather than the seasonally adjusted or original data. It also explains how these trend estimates are obtained as well as how they may be used more effectively for informed decision making. It indicates that these trend estimates are the better guide to the substantive movements in series, and are generally more suitable for most business planning decisions and policy advice.

### 3222.6 **Population Projections, Tasmania**

Contains alternative projections (based on different assumptions as to future fertility, mortality and migration) of the resident population of Tasmania, the Statistical Local Areas and Local Government Areas at five-yearly intervals from 1999 to 2021. Also includes number and percentage of population at selected ages, sex, median ages, as well as detailed notes on the assumptions.

### 3237.3 **Population Mobility, Queensland**

Provides data on characteristics of people moving to and within Queensland in the last three years and the factors influencing their movements. Also provides information on the most recent move, including: current and previous place of residence; main reason for moving; main reason for choosing current location; main reason for choosing current dwelling; current dwelling type and current nature of occupancy. Presents information on moves planned within the next three years, including: main reason likely to move; where likely to move and likely nature of occupancy.

These publications contain the estimated resident population by age (in five-year age groupings) and sex for each Statistical Local Area, Statistical Subdivision and Statistical Division in Australian States and Territories, as at the 30th of June 2000, and includes changes in Statistical Local Area boundaries since the previous Census.

### 3301.0 Births, Australia

Presents detailed statistics on live births and confinements — male and female births; births of Indigenous children; age and birthplace of parents; duration of marriage; previous births of the current relationship; nuptial and ex-nuptial births; single and multiple births; usual residence of mother (by State or Territory) and regional comparisons. Also shows various rates and time series data.

The appendix gives a comparison between the different births collections — Birth Registrations and the Midwives' Collection.

### 3310.0 **Marriages and Divorces, Australia**

Provides a valuable tool to examine family formation and dissolution as well as helping to quantify the number of children involved. While the main emphasis of the publication is registered marital status, allowance for change in living arrangements through the growing importance of de facto marriages is also recognised. It covers registration of marriages classified according to State or Territory of registration; age; previous marital status; country of birth of bridegrooms and brides, and type of celebrant. Registered marriages dissolved are classified by age; duration of the marriage at final separation and at date of dissolution; country of birth and number of children. Estimates of the population by marital status, age and sex at 30 June are also included.

Provides comprehensive statistics about leisure and cultural activities that people in Tasmania undertook in their leisure time during the last 12 months.

### 4441.0 Voluntary Work, Australia

Contains information about participation in unpaid voluntary work through an organisation or group. This publication includes data about the types of organisation with which the voluntary work is associated, the types of activities carried out, time spent volunteering, the characteristics of the volunteer, and the reason for volunteering.

### 4221.0 Schools, Australia

Provides statistics on schools, students, teaching and non-teaching staff involved in the provision or administration of primary and secondary education, in government and non-government schools for all States and Territories. Schools are classified by type and category; students are classified by age, year of education, sex and type and category of school attended; staff are classified by major function, area of activity, and sex. Also includes apparent retention rates for students to Years 10, 11 and 12, plus student/staff ratios and student participation rates.

### 4510.0 Recorded Crime, Australia

The Recorded Crime publication provides a measure of the level and nature of crime in Australia. It contains details on the number of victims recorded by police for selected offences against persons and property. Some of the categories included are: homicide; assault; sexual assault; kidnapping and abduction; robbery; blackmail and extortion; unlawful entry with intent and motor vehicle theft. Historical tables for offence counts and weapon use from 1993 to the most recent are also included.

### **4512.0 Corrective Services, Australia**

Corrective Services, Australia contains monthly information on persons in custody for each State and Territory. Details are provided on the numbers of prisoners and imprisonment rates by the type of custody such as open or secure custody or periodic detention. Information is also presented on prisoner numbers by the legal status of sentenced or unsentenced and by sentence type for all prisoners and for Indigenous prisoners.

### **4513.0** Higher Criminal Courts, Australia

Higher Criminal Courts contains figures drawn from the supreme, district and county court administrative information. These courts deal with the more serious offences including: murder; sexual assault and armed robbery. The publication focuses on the number of defendants dealt with by the higher courts; the time taken to complete their cases and the average time taken to pass sentence. It includes information on the average length of time taken to finalise cases where a defendant changes their plea from not guilty to guilty.

### 4509.4 Crime and Safety, South Australia

Presents statistics from a survey of crime and safety showing victims and non-victims of crime by households and persons and type of offence, selected characteristics of households and number of incidents for SA. Data on victims and non-victims by age and sex, major statistical region, labour force status, are also available.

### 4612.0 **Concepts, Sources and Methods for Australia's Water and Energy Accounts**

This publication describes the methodology and conceptual frameworks used for developing Australia's environmental accounts on water (Cat. no. 4610.0) and energy (Cat. no. 4604.0). The methodology describes stock and flow (supply and use) tables and how they are developed with reference to Australia's objectives and priorities, and the physical characteristics of resources. Linkages with the United Nations System for **Integrating Environmental and Economic Accounts** (SEEA), and Input Output frameworks and concepts are discussed. For a number of years the environmental accounts have been developed as an integrated information system for Australia that links environmental and resource issues to the national accounts, with the water and energy being the most comprehensive.

### 4613.0 **Australia's Environment: Issues and Trends**

Presents a broad selection of environmental statistics and information which illustrate topical environmental issues that affect the future of Australia as a nation. Each year the subject matter covered will vary, as new environmental issues emerge or more current data sources become available. Data and information are derived from ABS collections and surveys and also from a wide range of non-ABS organisations and agencies.

Each year the publication will explore some of the relationships that exist between our use of the natural environment in Australia for socio economic benefit and the impacts that some of these activities have on our ecology and stocks of natural resources. Broad environmental themes from which specific issues will be selected include: land use; consumption and waste; marine, estuarine and freshwater systems and people and the environment. Examples of specific issues covered in the first edition include: agriculture and the environment; international shipping and the introduction of exotic organisms; the conservation status of native fish and the influence of age, education and income on environmental attitudes and behaviour.

All statistical information and supporting text will be presented with the non-specialist audience in mind, as the publication aims to meet the information needs of a wide audience.

### 6206.0 **Labour Force Experience, Australia**

Provides information on the labour force experience of persons aged 15–69 during the year prior to the survey. Labour force experience can be described in terms of labour force activities undertaken by persons in a 12-month period, namely working and looking for work. Details include the number of weeks spent working, looking for work, or out of the labour force during the year. Estimates can be cross-classified by labour force demographics such as State, sex, age and marital status and birthplace.

### 6245.0 **Successful and Unsuccessful Job Search Experience, Australia**

Provides information on persons who had started a wage or salary earning job during the previous twelve months; method of job attainment; whether they were out of work prior to starting the job; and details of the job. For persons who had looked for a wage or salary earning job but had not started one, data on the details of their job search experience and the type of job they were looking for are included. Educational attainment is also available. Estimates can be cross-classified by labour force demographics such as State, sex, age, marital status and birthplace.

ABS consultants develop tailored information solutions in response to individual client needs. These solutions may take the form of statistical reports provided on a 'one-off' basis, or delivered regularly on a subscription basis. All such reports are accompanied by supporting information to assist in interpreting the data.

#### Available information

Statistical reports may include information on the quantity, value and gross weight of Australian exports, imports and import clearances. This information may be classified by: commodity; country and/or Australian State of origin or destination. Trade through overseas ports may also be reported if required, as may information on various modes of transport. Rate of duty and duty paid are also available for import clearances only.

#### Frequency and Timeliness

International trade statistics are compiled each month and may be received on monthly, quarterly, six-monthly or annual bases. Import and import clearance statistics are available 12 working days, and exports 21 working days after the end of the month to which they refer.

### **5506.0 Taxation Revenue, Australia**

### What are the Producer Price Indexes?

The Producer Price Indexes (PPIs) are measures of changes in producers' prices, similar to the better known Consumer Price Index (CPI). While the CPI measures changes in retail prices paid by households for goods and services, the PPIs measure changes in the prices of goods and services sold to businesses. Producer Price Indexes are compiled for the following sectors of the economy:

- building and construction—price indexes are produced which measure changes in the prices of materials used in constructing: (a) houses; and (b) other buildings (e.g. office blocks, shopping centre's, schools, hospitals etc.);
- manufacturing industry—price indexes are compiled measuring changes in: (a) prices paid by manufacturers for materials used in producing manufactured goods; and (b) prices received by manufacturers for articles they produce;
- service industries—price indexes are produced which measure changes in the prices received by the suppliers of selected services and
- international trade—price indexes are compiled measuring changes in the prices of merchandise exports and imports.

Price indexes are also produced for the supply of commodities to the Australian economy in a 'stage of production' framework.

### **6401.0 Consumer Price Index, Australia**

Presents movements in retail prices of goods and services commonly purchased by metropolitan households. The goods and services are divided into the following groups: food; alcohol and tobacco; clothing and footwear; housing; household furnishings, supplies and services; health; transportation; communication; recreation; education and miscellaneous. Indexes for each of these groups and for 'All Groups' are published for each of the State capitals along with Canberra and Darwin, and for the weighted average of the eight capital cities. Details are also shown for about 54 sub-groups and special and analytical series, for the weighted average of the eight capital cities.

### 6416.0 House Price Indexes: Eight Capital Cities

Provides estimates of changes in housing prices in each of the eight capital cities of Australia. The information is presented in the form of price indexes constructed separately for established houses and for project homes.

The *IRDB* provides a wide range of social, economic, and environmental data on both a regional and time series basis. The Database contains information from social and economic collections of the ABS and other Commonwealth Agencies, with data generally available from 1986 (and earlier for some items). Statistics are available on the environment, health and disability, employment and unemployment, rural economies and electoral matters. All data are available from the Australia wide to Statistical Local Area (SLA) level, with interactive tables, graphs, maps, and reports generated from screen based selections of areas, data items and time periods.

Motor Vehicles on GSP is a CD-ROM product providing a complete picture of the motor vehicle fleet from the Motor Vehicle Census based on the latest GSP (Geographic Statistics Platform) software developed for the Integrated Regional Data Base. This "stand alone" package contains data for 1997, 1998 and 1999 and includes details such as type of vehicle, make, model and year of manufacture.

It also provides a complete international investment position statement with details of the level of investment, investment flows and associated income. Information is also provided on Australia's foreign debt, exchange rates and analytical ratios.

### 5361.0.40.001 **Balance of Payments, Australia: Quarterly Forward Seasonal Factors**

Provides forward seasonal factors for balance of payments series, for each quarter of the current year, for the components of: goods credits and debits; services credits debits; and income credits and debits; and for the aggregates of current transfers credits and debits. Factors are resupplied during the year if reanalyses are required.

### 5338.0 **Balance of Payments, Australia Regional Series**

Provides country and regional estimates of Australia's current and capital accounts. The current account includes credit and debit estimates for goods, services, income and current transfers. Income is further broken down into compensation of employees and investment income.
