



AUSTRALIAN STANDARD CLASSIFICATION OF OCCUPATIONS SECOND EDITION

INTRODUCTION

This publication provides an introduction to the Second Edition of the Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO). It broadly describes the conceptual basis of ASCO and provides an overview of the ASCO Second Edition classification structure and its coding system. The relationship of ASCO Second Edition to the First Edition is discussed and it is also compared to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO–88) and the 1990 New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations. Plans for implementing the Second Edition in ABS statistical collections are outlined as are the further ASCO publications and electronic products that will be provided.

THE DEVELOPMENT AND USES OF ASCO FIRST EDITION

The development of ASCO First Edition as the Australian standard for classifying occupations was undertaken jointly by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) and the (then) Department of Employment and Industrial Relations. The project began in 1978 and ASCO First Edition was introduced progressively into ABS collections from May 1986, replacing the previously used Classification and Classified List of Occupations.

ASCO First Edition was used in all ABS censuses and surveys where occupation data were collected, including the 1986 and 1991 Censuses of Population and Housing, the Labour Force Survey and the Survey of Employee Earnings and Hours.

In 1990 ASCO First Edition was introduced into ABS administrative by-product collections such as births, deaths, marriages and divorces. ASCO First Edition is also used to code occupation responses on visa applications and passenger cards to produce occupation statistics on overseas arrivals and departures.

Major government agencies such as the Commonwealth Employment Service, the Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) and Comcare incorporate ASCO in their reporting systems. ASCO is the specified standard for the reporting of workplace accidents under the revised Regulations of the Occupational Health and Safety (Commonwealth Employment) Act 1991. Other organisations in both the public and private sectors use ASCO to sort and organise occupation-related information for such purposes as policy development and review, human resource management, and labour market and social research.

REVIEW OF ASCO FIRST EDITION

Widespread industry and award restructuring, technological change and competency-based approaches to career entry and progression have brought about significant occupational changes in the Australian labour market in the ten years since ASCO First Edition was developed.

In order to maintain the relevance of ASCO as the national occupation standard, and to ensure that ABS statistics are relevant and responsive to the current and evolving needs of its clients, the ABS and the (now) Department of Employment, Education, Training and Youth Affairs (DEETYA) commenced a review of the classification in 1992. This review has encompassed both the structural and the definitional content of the classification and has been completed in time for the Second Edition of ASCO to be introduced into various ABS collections from May 1996 onwards.

In undertaking the review, the ABS and DEETYA consulted widely with key users of ASCO, industry training bodies, unions, employer bodies and professional associations and are indebted to them for their valuable input into the review process.

CONCEPTUAL BASIS AND STRUCTURE OF ASCO

ASCO is a skill-based classification of occupations which covers all jobs in the Australian work force. The concepts of 'job' and 'occupation' are fundamental to an understanding of the classification. For the purposes of ASCO, a job is defined as the set of tasks designed to be performed by one individual while an occupation is a set of jobs with similar sets of tasks. Within ASCO, occupations are classified according to two criteria — *skill level* and *skill specialisation*.

Skill level

In ASCO, this is defined as the range and complexity of the set of tasks involved: the greater the range and complexity of the set of tasks, the greater the skill level of the occupation.

In ASCO First Edition, skill level was measured operationally as the amount of formal education, on-the-job training and previous experience usually necessary for the satisfactory performance of the set of tasks.

The concept of skill level remains unchanged in ASCO Second Edition. However, the operational definition of skill level has been refined as a result of competency-based initiatives in employment and training and an increased emphasis on entry requirements to an occupation. This emphasis on entry requirements arises largely from the difficulty in objectively measuring the skill level required for the satisfactory performance of tasks.

The criteria used in ASCO Second Edition to measure skill level are the formal education and/or training and previous experience usually required for entry to the occupation. In instances where information relating to these entry requirements was not available, relevant minimum endorsed competency standards were also considered in measuring the skill level of an occupation.

Where these criteria were not sufficient or appropriate for determining the skill level of a particular occupation, the range and complexity of the set of tasks involved was determined by application of the following criteria (for which on-the-job training may be a useful measure):

- breadth/depth of knowledge required
- range of skills required

- variability of operating environment
- level of autonomy as determined by the degree of discretion and choice which may be required to perform the set of tasks.

Skill specialisation

The skill specialisation of an occupation is a function of the field of knowledge required, tools and equipment used, materials worked on, and goods or services produced in relation to the tasks performed. In ASCO Second Edition the definition of skill specialisation remains unchanged but includes reference to non-production based operations. For example tools and equipment can also include all forms of computer-based equipment, personal interaction and art or design techniques. Materials worked on can also include data and individual or group service. Goods and services produced has been renamed goods or services provided and includes, for example, data and personal service.

THE CLASSIFICATION STRUCTURE OF ASCO SECOND EDITION

The structure of ASCO Second Edition comprises five hierarchical levels: Major Group, Sub-Major Group, Minor Group, Unit Group and Occupation. A profile of the ASCO Second Edition structure and a listing of the Major, Sub-Major, Minor, Unit Groups and Occupations are shown in Appendixes 1, 3 and 4.

This represents a change from ASCO First Edition, where the structure consisted of four levels: Major Group, Minor Group, Unit Group and Occupation. The Sub-Major Group level has been added to the structure to enhance users' options for statistical output. The table below indicates the number of groups in each edition:

In recognition of the need to maintain comparability and consistency between ASCO First Edition and ASCO Second Edition, changes at the unit group (four-digit) level have been made only where this was unavoidable. Although there are instances where unit group codes and titles have been altered, a large proportion of First and Second Edition unit groups can be linked to facilitate time series analysis.

In terms of comparability between ASCO First Edition and Second Edition, approximately two-thirds of the old and new unit groups are directly comparable while occupations in the remaining First Edition unit groups have been distributed into a number of new unit groups in Second Edition.

CONCORDANCE

A detailed concordance between occupations in the two editions will be included in the *Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO) Second Edition* (1220.0) which will be released in March 1997. The concordance will show where a one to one relationship exists between occupations in the First and Second

Editions, and when it does not. This concordance is based on occupation data from the 1991 Census of Population and Housing.

Following completion of data processing of the 1996 Census, an updated concordance will be produced that shows actual proportional relationships between the categories of the First and Second editions.

MAJOR STRUCTURAL
DIFFERENCES BETWEEN ASCO
FIRST EDITION AND SECOND
EDITION

ASCO First Edition had eight major groups representing eight skill levels. A more rigorous approach to the application of the skill level criteria has resulted in changes to the way some occupations are classified in ASCO Second Edition. In the Second Edition the skill level of major groups is clarified by arranging nine major groups into one of five skill levels. This addresses criticism of First Edition ASCO which has eight skill levels corresponding with the eight major groups. Major groups at the same skill level are differentiated according to a broad application of the skill specialisation concept.

As mentioned previously, ASCO Second Edition includes an additional level in the classification hierarchy. There are now five hierarchical levels — Major Group, Sub-Major Group, Minor Group, Unit Group and Occupation. It was considered that the addition of the sub-major group level will enhance users' options for statistical output particularly where sample sizes preclude output at the minor group level.

An important change has been the reorganisation of First Edition Major Group 5 Clerks and Major Group 6 Sales and Personal Service Workers into three major groups at different skill levels to better reflect the skill level of the occupations they cover. Instead of two major groups for clerical and sales and service occupations, there are now three — Advanced, Intermediate and Elementary.

In some areas of the classification additional unit groups have been created to provide more detailed information at the unit group level.

Specific examples of some other important changes to the classification are outlined below.

Managing supervisors

Managers of small organisations and businesses which do not necessarily have a hierarchy of managers, are now classified in Major Group 3 Associate Professionals (Skill Level 2), in contrast to First Edition where they were classified in Major Group 1 (at Skill Level 1) along with general and specialist manager occupations.

Air and sea transport technical workers

ASCO First Edition Minor Group 33 Air and Sea Transport Technical Workers has been moved to Major Group 2 Professionals.

Registered nurses

The First Edition Minor Group 34 Registered Nurses has been moved to Major Group 2 Professionals.

Enrolled nurses

The First Edition Unit Group 6603 Enrolled Nurses has been moved to Major Group 3 Associate Professionals and is now Minor Group 341 Enrolled Nurses.

Welfare workers

Welfare Workers have been moved from Unit group 3901 Welfare Para-professionals in ASCO First Edition to ASCO Second Edition Unit Group 2512 Welfare and Community Workers.

Other changes

Other changes reflected in the ASCO Second Edition structure are the result of the emergence and decline of occupations in the Australian labour market. The increased significance of various industry sectors to the economy, in particular the service and information technology sectors, has lead to the emergence of a number of new occupations. Conversely, technological and structural changes in the Australian work force have also resulted in the decline of some occupations.

Similarly, a trend toward the upgrading of skills and training required for many occupations in the Australian work force has resulted in the reclassification of certain occupations to more appropriate skill levels in the ASCO Second Edition structure.

STATISTICAL BALANCE AND FEASiBILITY

As a general principle a classification should be statistically balanced. Similar numbers of 'real-world' entities should be classified to each category at a particular level. However categories which have been defined to reflect the real world will not always be statistically balanced. To force categories to conform to size limitations would mean that the categories would not always be meaningful or useful. On the other hand the number of entities in each category should be sufficiently large to ensure that confidentiality of the data is not compromised.

A number of First Edition occupations have been split into separate Second Edition occupations to facilitate greater disaggregation of data. For example, the First Edition occupation Accountant has been split into three separate occupations in ASCO Second Edition: Accountant, External Auditor and Internal Auditor.

The issue of statistical feasibility has had a significant impact on the classification of supervisory occupations. While it is clear that a higher level of skill and training is required for entry to some supervisory occupations, it has been necessary to classify many supervisory occupations together with the occupations they supervise because it is not practicable to make the necessary distinction in statistical collections. However, where there is a marked difference in the tasks performed, a separate supervisory occupation has been specified.

Similar considerations have impacted on the classification of apprentice and trainee occupations. It is acknowledged that the skill level for entry into occupations as an apprentice or trainee is lower than the skill level requirements of the occupation. However statistical and operational considerations have meant that apprentices and trainees are generally located in the same unit group as the occupations they are training toward, the exceptions being Office

Trainees and Sales and Service Trainees which are unit groups of their own. In addition, although in ASCO First Edition each tradesperson unit group contained only one apprentice occupation relating to that unit group, most tradesperson unit groups in ASCO Second Edition include an apprentice occupation corresponding to each tradesperson occupation in that unit group.

IMPLEMENTATION OF ASCO SECOND EDITION IN ABS COLLECTIONS There will be a phased introduction of ASCO Second Edition into ABS collections. The following is a guide to its implementation.

1996 Census of Population and Housing

All occupation information reported in the 1996 Census will be coded to ASCO Second Edition. As in previous years standard output data on occupations will be published at the unit group level. An electronic file linking First and Second Editions of ASCO at the occupation level will be available in late 1997 after processing of the 1996 Census has been completed.

Labour Force Survey

Occupation information reported in the August 1996 Labour Force Survey will be coded to ASCO Second Edition. An information paper outlining the changes to labour force data following the introduction of ASCO Second Edition will be released later in 1996. A preliminary concordance between the two editions of ASCO will also be included in this paper. Further details of this paper can be obtained by contacting Sylvia Sajler on (06) 252 6565.

Survey of Employee Earnings and Hours

All occupation data reported in the May 1996 Survey of Employee Earnings and Hours will be coded to ASCO First and Second Editions. Data in the publications *Distribution and Composition of Employee Earnings and Hours, Australia, Preliminary* (6305.0) and *Distribution and Composition of Employee Earnings and Hours, Australia* (6306.0) will reflect ASCO Second Edition major, minor and unit groups. A limited amount of data will be published according to ASCO First Edition. Further information regarding times series for this collection can be obtained by contacting Rory Carle on (09) 360 5286.

Labour Cost Index Survey

Occupation information to be collected in this survey now under development will be coded to ASCO Second Edition and along with other information will be used to complete the ordinary time earnings component of the quarterly Labour Cost Index. The Labour Cost Index will provide a measure of the change in the cost to organisations of employing labour, and will be used in formulating industrial relations and wages policies, economic analysis and contract adjustment. Survey of Employment and Unemployment Patterns Occupation data collected in the 1996 second wave of this longitudinal survey will be coded to ASCO Second Edition. Data from

the 1995 first wave was originally coded to ASCO First Edition and will be recoded. Further information about this survey can be obtained by contacting Mel Butler on (06) 252 5936.

Overseas arrivals and departures

The Department of Immigration and Multicultural Affairs (DIMA) currently codes occupation data for long-term and permanent arrivals to ASCO First Edition. These data appear in ABS and DIMA publications at minor group level. The timing of the introduction of ASCO Second Edition into this collection has yet to be determined.

Births and deaths

Occupation data reported in relation to births and deaths are coded to ASCO. In the births and deaths collections, the introduction of ASCO Second Edition is planned to take place at the conclusion of the 1996 processing, that is, for data from 1 January 1997. IMPLEMENTATION OF ASCO SECOND EDITION WITHIN DEETYA The Department of Employment, Education, Training and Youth Affairs (DEETYA) is committed to introducing ASCO Second Edition as soon as it is technically feasible in its information systems. This could be as early as the first half of 1997. The Department's major careers advice publication, *Joh Guide*, will also be based on ASCO Second Edition as from 1997.

INTERPRETING ASCO
OCCUPATION DEFINITIONS

ASCO is primarily a statistical classification designed to aggregate and organise data collected about jobs or individuals. The classification definitions are based on the skill level and specialisation usually necessary to perform the tasks of the specific occupation, or of most occupations in the group. The definitions and skill level statements apply to the occupation and not the incumbent. The allocation of a particular occupation to a particular skill level should be seen as indicative and not be used prescriptively.

A STRUCTURED CODING SYSTEM

Assigning ASCO codes to occupation or job descriptions requires the use of a rule-based system to ensure that it is performed in an accurate, consistent and efficient manner.

To consistently and reliably allocate responses from statistical collections to any level of the ASCO structure, data on occupation tasks as well as the occupation title are needed. The coding system is designed to utilise, in a structured way, the responses from up to four distinct questions: occupation title, main tasks performed, industry of employer and employer's name. Primary importance is given to the occupation title, but extensive use is made of main tasks performed in the job. Restricted use can also be made of information given in response to questions on industry and employer's name when it is collected.

The structured coding system may be implemented as a clerical procedure or through computer-assisted coding. There is no functional difference between the two forms of coding; that is, they

are based on the same coding methodology and procedures, and are designed to yield the same results.

The review of ASCO has been accompanied by the development of a Windows-based structured coding system for PCs, which enables occupation responses to be coded to either the unit group or occupation level of the classification with a high degree of accuracy and consistency. This Windows-based coding system will replace the ASCO Expert system (a DOS-based system) which was developed for coding to ASCO First Edition.

The new system is being implemented in the ABS for coding occupation data from the 1996 Census of Population and Housing and from some other ABS statistical collections. More information on the new coding system and its intended release is provided in the ASCO Second Edition products listed below.

INTERNATIONAL COMPARABILITY

The International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO) was developed by the International Labour Office in Geneva. ISCO was first issued in 1958 and revised versions were produced in 1968 and 1988. The main aims of ISCO are to provide a basis for international comparisons of occupation statistics between member countries and to provide a conceptual model for the developments of national occupation classifications. The most recent edition, ISCO–88, was developed using a similar conceptual basis to that of ASCO First Edition.

At the time of its release in 1986, ASCO First Edition was significantly different from most other occupation classifications used by national and international statistical agencies. The major change from international practice prior to that time lay in the use of skill level and skill specialisation as criteria to structure the occupation classification. ISCO–88 also uses these criteria in the conceptual framework for the classification. Four broad skill levels are used, defined in terms of the educational categories and levels which appear in the International Standard Classification of Education, published by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation.

ISCO-88 consists of 10 major groups, 28 sub-major groups, 116 minor groups and 390 unit groups. The occupation level is not defined in ISCO-88, as it is expected that individual countries will develop this level of detail to suit national requirements.

The ten major groups in ISCO-88 remain broadly similar to the nine ASCO Second Edition major groups. The most significant difference at major group level is that ISCO-88 has identified skilled Agricultural and Fishery Workers as a separate major group (Major Group 6), whereas ASCO Second Edition includes Farmers and Farm Managers as a sub-major group in Major Group 1 Managers and Administrators, and skilled Agricultural and Horticultural Workers as a sub-major group in Major Group 4 Tradespersons and Related Workers.

ISCO-88 also includes a separate Major Group 0, for the Armed Forces. In ASCO Second Edition, jobs held by members of the Armed Forces are classified together with their civilian equivalents where these exist and to a number of other specific occupations.

In common with ISCO-88, ASCO Second Edition now incorporates the sub-major group as a level of aggregation between the major and minor groups.

NEW ZEALAND STANDARD CLASSIFICATION OF OCCUPATIONS In 1990, Statistics New Zealand released the New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (NZSCO). This is also a skill-based classification which uses skill level and skill specialisation as the primary criteria for classifying occupations. The major difference between NZSCO and ASCO Second Edition is its use of 10 major groups in the classification and, similar to ISCO—88, NZSCO has a separate major group for Armed Forces.

Early in the development phase of ASCO Second Edition, consideration was given to developing a joint Australian and New Zealand classification. However, a number of practical considerations precluded this development, chiefly the timing of the ASCO Review in relation to NZSCO and the need to have ASCO Second Edition ready for use in the 1996 Census.

ASCO PRODUCTS

ASCO First Edition publications and products will remain available for a short time following the release of ASCO Second Edition.

ASCO Second Edition products

The following ABS publications and products will be available progressively from the end of the first quarter of 1997.

Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO) Second Edition (1220.0)

This publication is intended for users who wish to understand the detailed structure and content of the classification as an aid in interpreting ABS statistics. It is also a necessary resource document for use in resolving coding queries when processing occupation data.

The conceptual basis of ASCO will be examined together with a description of the ASCO structure and an outline of the history of the development of the classification.

The main part of the publication will show the hierarchical structure of the classification down to the finest level of detail, the occupation level. It will also comprise a summary of the ASCO classification criteria and coding conventions. Definitions for the 9 major groups, 35 sub-major groups, 81 minor groups, 340 unit groups and 986 occupations in the classification will be included. As mentioned previously, a concordance between First and Second Edition will be included as an appendix.

This publication will combine and supersede the contents of the First Edition publications, ASCO Statistical Classifications (1986) (1222.0) and ASCO Occupation Definitions (1990) (1223.0). However, as previously mentioned, both these First Edition publications will remain available for a brief time following the release of ASCO Second Edition.

This publication will also supersede the AGPS publication ASCO Dictionary.

ASCO Manual Coding System: Occupation Level (1227.0) This publication will be updated for ASCO Second Edition. The coding procedures will remain unchanged.

This publication specifies the procedures and provides the indexes for the manual coding of occupation data to the 986 categories at the most detailed level of ASCO. It is intended for users who wish to assign six-digit ASCO codes on the basis of relatively detailed information such as is available from human resource management systems, job vacancy specifications or responses in special purpose statistical collections. For users wishing to code to the four-digit level only, the same coding procedures may be used, recording only the first four digits of the code. A four-digit index will be available if required on request.

Additional classification information on electronic media

Floppy disk

The above publications, or parts thereof, will be available as floppy disk products using ASCII text files. Further information and order forms for ASCO Second Edition products may be obtained from the ASCO contact officer or through ABS bookshops located in ABS State and Territory offices following the release of Australian Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO) Second Edition (1220.0).

CD-ROM

It is intended to provide most of the ASCO Second Edition products on CD-ROM. The classification together with definitions, coding procedures (both manual and computer-assisted) will be available on a single CD-ROM. Further details of this product will be available in March 1997.

Computer-assisted coding systems

The previous computer-assisted coding package, ASCO Expert, will not be available after July 1997. However, the same coding methodology will be available in a Windows-based coder which will supersede the First Edition products ASCO Expert Coding System: Unit Group Level (1990) (1224.0) and ASCO Expert Coding System: Occupation Level (1991) (1226.0). The Windows-based coder is already available for coding industry data to the Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification and will be able to be used for coding occupation data when ASCO Second Edition is released in March 1997. ASCO SERVICES

The ABS offers a consultancy service to organisations which are considering adopting ASCO as the basis of human resource management systems or using ASCO in their own statistical collections. These services are charged at an ABS standard rate.



The relationship between the nine major groups and five skill levels is explained under the heading Conceptual Basis and Structure of ASCO on page 5.
