

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY BUSINESS INDICATORS, OCTOBER 1994

SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Series updated since the September 1994 issue are: business expectations; population; labour force; industrial disputes; housing finance; building approvals; building commencements; established house price indexes; price indexes of house building materials; retail turnover; new motor vehicle registrations; State accounts; and engineering construction work.

Notable movements in this issue include:

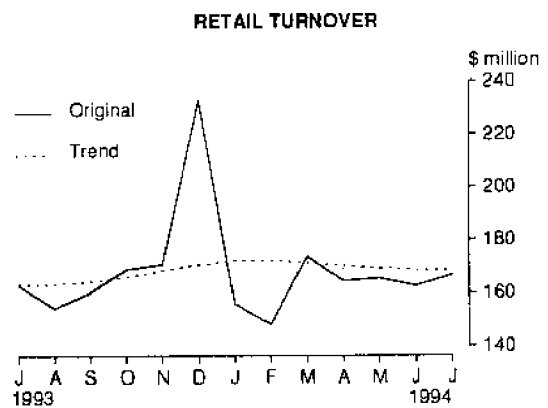
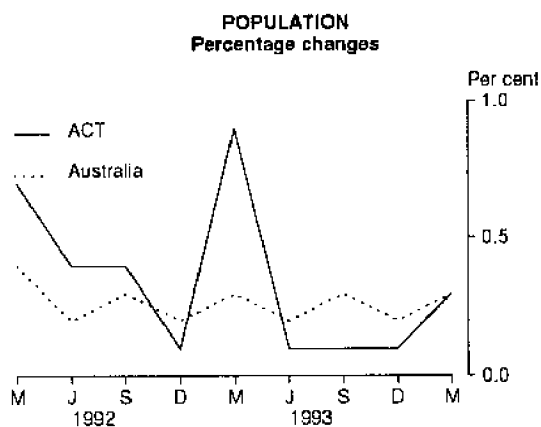
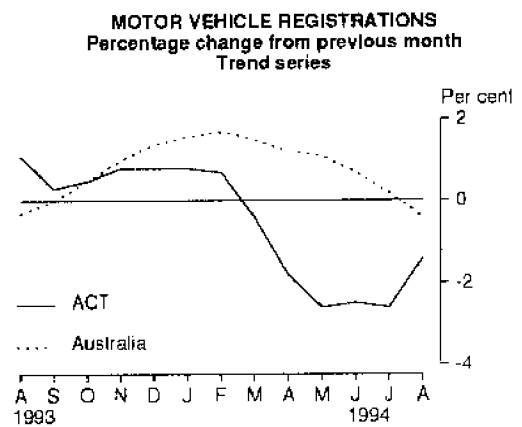
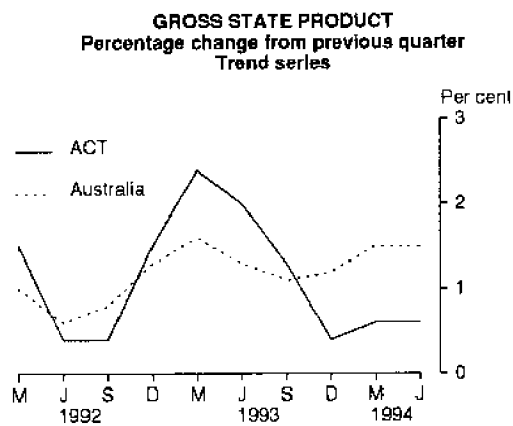
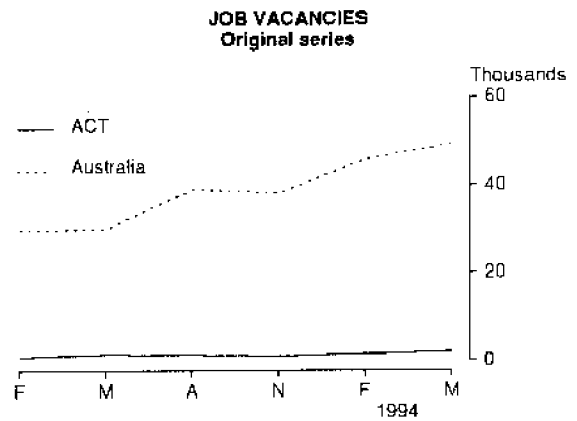
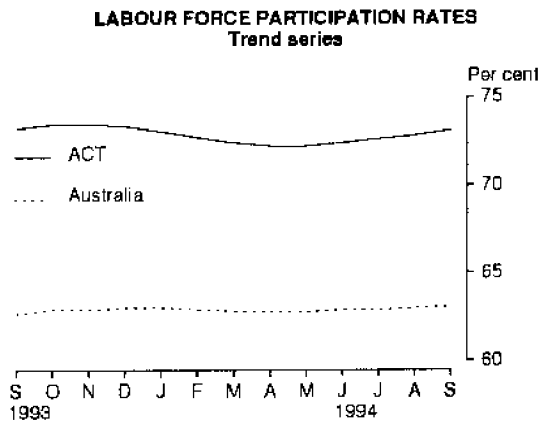
- In the short term, business expectations of sales growth in the ACT (3.8%) are stronger than the Australian figure of 2.3 per cent. In the medium term, sales are expected to increase by 2.3 per cent in the ACT and 4.1 per cent nationally.
- The estimated resident population of the ACT at 31 March 1994 was 300,300, an increase of 900 in the March quarter 1994 and 1,700 since March 1993. The 0.3 per cent growth in the population in the March 1994 quarter was the same as that reported for Australia in the same period.
- Trend labour force participation rates in the ACT increased by 0.4 per cent in September 1994 to reach 73.1 per cent, the highest level since December 1993. Nationally, the participation rate increased by 0.2 per cent to 63.1 per cent, the highest it has been since June 1991 when it was also 63.1 per cent.
- Trend estimates of the value of housing commitments in the ACT fell by 0.4 per cent in July 1994. In the twelve months from July 1993, however, the value of housing commitments in the ACT increased by 21.0 per cent to \$4,234.4 million.
- The ACT price index for established houses fell by 0.8 per cent in the June quarter 1994 and remained unchanged from June 1993. Nationally, the index increased by 1.2 per cent in the quarter and 3.4 per cent over the year.
- Trend estimates of retail turnover were 3.3 per cent higher in July 1994 than recorded in July 1993. A number of components to the total showed growth over the year with Newsagents and Floor coverings stores (both unpublished in *ACT Business Indicators*) showing the greatest increases with July 1994 being 13.3 per cent and 10.5 per cent higher, respectively. Grocers, confectioners and tobacconists and Butchers (also unpublished) were the other components to show strong growth in the period with increases of 6.2 per cent each.
- Trend estimates of new motor vehicle registrations revealed there were 13 fewer new motor vehicles registered in the ACT in August 1994, a fall of 1.4 per cent from the previous month. Nationally there were 20 fewer new motor vehicles registered in the period.
- The ACT recorded increases in trend series Gross State Product of 0.6 per cent in both the March and June quarters. This growth has slowed slightly due to some of the components (Wages, salaries and supplements and Net indirect taxes) showing falls in recent periods. Trend estimates of State final demand in the ACT also showed reasonable growth with increases of 0.4 per cent and 1.0 per cent on the previous quarter and same period last year, respectively.
- The value of engineering construction work done in the ACT in the June quarter 1994 increased by 6.0 per cent to \$42.1 million. All States and Territories showed an increase in the value of work done in the period, producing a national increase of 15.8 per cent in the June quarter 1994.
