



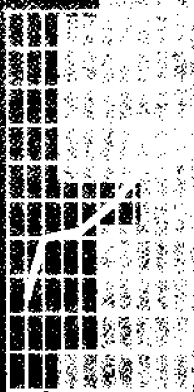

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 1.1

The estimated resident population of Western Australia at 31 March 1997 was 1,791,200, an increase of 8,500 in the March quarter and 32,700 in the twelve months from 31 March 1996. The growth rate during the quarter was equivalent to an annual rate of 1.91%.

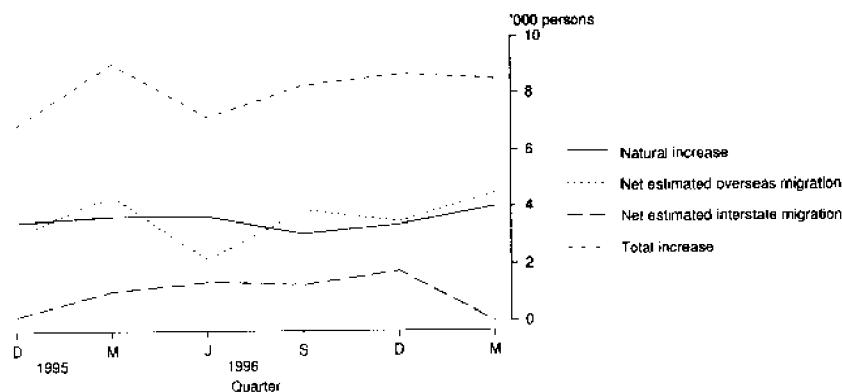

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 1.2

In the March quarter 1997 the population increased by 8,500 compared with an increase of 8,700 in the previous quarter. Both the natural increase and net estimated overseas migration were higher than in the December quarter 1996. However, there was no net estimated interstate migration; a fall of 1,800 from the December quarter.

For the twelve months ended 31 March 1997 the increase of 32,700 was 1.6% higher than the increase in the previous twelve months.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 1.3

The number of marriages fell by 544 or 15.8% in March quarter 1997 from the previous quarter. The total of 2,904 marriages in March quarter 1997 was a fall of 1.2% on March quarter 1996.

The total number of deaths dropped by 356 from December quarter 1996, a fall of 13.2%. The number of live births rose by 3.9% and divorces fell by 3.0% from December quarter 1996. Compared to March quarter 1996, the number of deaths decreased by 245 or 9.5% and births increased by 63 or 1.0%. The number of divorces increased by only 2.

Preliminary data for 1996 shows a drop of 356 livebirths or 1.4% from calendar year 1995. The number of divorces fell slightly by 81 and marriages, with a revised figure, dropped by 110 or 1.1%. Total deaths rose by 650 or 6.3% and infant deaths increased by 28 or 21.9%.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 1.4

Reflecting the fall in the number of infant deaths from a year ago, the rate for infant deaths in March quarter 1997 was 3.9 infant deaths per 1,000 live births lower than March quarter 1996.

Compared to March quarter 1996, rates declined by 0.7 for total deaths and by 0.2 for marriages.

The rates for deaths, infant deaths, marriages and divorces in March quarter 1997 all fell from the previous quarter. Only the rate for live births increased, by 0.5.

Preliminary rates for 1996 calendar year show falls for live births, marriages and divorces compared to calendar year 1995 but rises for infant deaths and total deaths.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 2.1

Total arrivals in June 1997 were 13% higher than in the previous month and were 7% higher than in June 1996.

The number of Western Australian residents returning from short-term visits overseas rose by 12% from the previous month to 27,309 persons. This was 7% higher than in June 1996. The number of overseas visitors arriving in Western Australia for short-term visits increased by 14% from May 1997 and increased by 7% on June 1996.

The number of residents returning to Western Australia in June 1997 after a long-term stay overseas increased by 7% from the previous month but decreased by 9% on June 1996. Arrivals of long-term overseas visitors rose by 35% on May 1997 and by 35% on June 1996.

Total departures in June 1997 rose by 2% from the previous month but were 1% lower than in June 1996.

The number of short-term departures of Western Australian residents rose by 2% on May 1997, but fell by 2% on June 1996. Short-term departures of overseas visitors rose by 5% from May 1997. The number of long-term departures of overseas visitors rose by 58% whilst long-term departures of Western Australian residents fell by 12% on May 1997.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 2.2

Total short-term overseas visitor arrivals rose by 14% on May 1997. The total of 28,535 arrivals in June 1997 was 7% higher than in June 1996.

The number of visitors from the United Kingdom and Ireland in June 1997 rose by 814 or 31% on May 1997 and by 26% on June 1996. There was a fall in short-term arrivals from Japan of 13% compared to May 1997 and by 14% June 1996.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 2.3

The number of short-term overseas visitor arrivals for holidays in Western Australia in June 1997, rose by 18% on May 1997. The total of 16,209 visitors compared to 16,240 in June 1996.

For June 1997, there was an increase from the previous month of 3,410 holidaymakers or 95% from Singapore. Holidaymakers from New Zealand increased by 180% and from Indonesia increased by 48% on May 1997. Arrivals from Malaysia decreased by 61% and from Thailand 58%.

Compared to June 1996, holidaymakers from United Kingdom and Ireland increased by 100%, from New Zealand by 30% and Singapore by 24%. The number of holidaymakers from Malaysia fell by 40%, from Thailand by 39%, and from Indonesia by 26%.

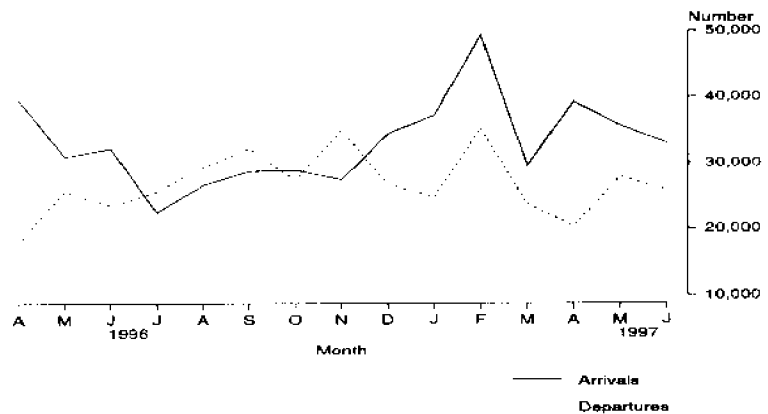

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 2.4

For June 1997, there was a decrease from the previous month of 608 persons or 2% in short-term departures of residents from Western Australia. The total of 29,912 persons was 502 persons or 2% higher than recorded for June 1996.

Compared to May 1997, short-term departures of residents to Indonesia increased by 33%. Departures to New Zealand fell by 21%, to United Kingdom and Ireland by 16%, and to Singapore by 26%.

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 2.5

There were 16,578 short-term departures of residents from Western Australia for holidays abroad in June 1997. This was 859 residents or 5% more than departed in May 1997 and 62 residents less than in June 1996.

For June 1997, five countries recorded increases as holiday destinations for short-term departures of Western Australian residents. They were Malaysia with an increase of 43%, Thailand 41%, Indonesia 23% and New Zealand 13%. Departures to Singapore fell by 33% and to the United Kingdom by 18%.

Indonesia continues to be the favourite short-term holiday destination for Western Australian residents. Of the total of 16,578 departures for June 1997, 6,286 persons or 38% chose Indonesia as their holiday destination.

Compared to June 1996, departures of holidaymakers to New Zealand increased by 39%, and United Kingdom and Ireland by 36%. Holidaymakers to Thailand decreased by 39% and to Singapore by 33%.

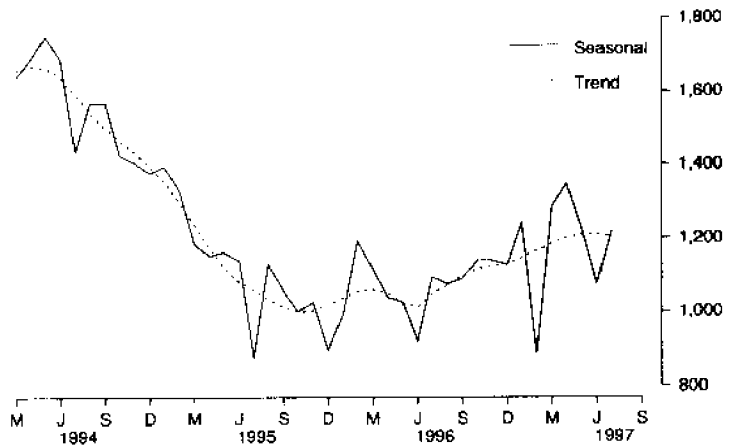

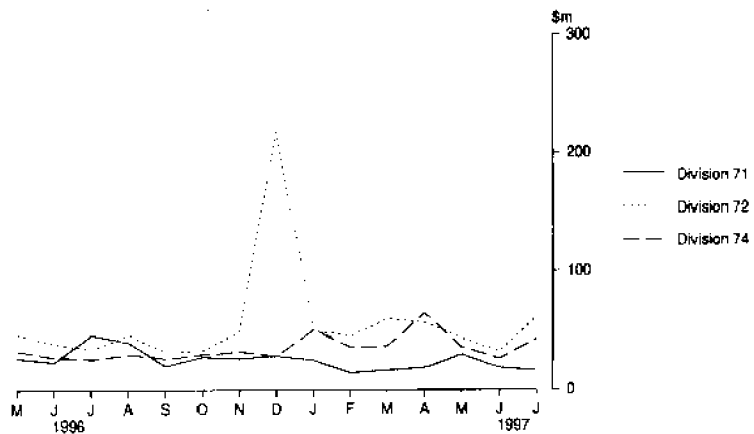

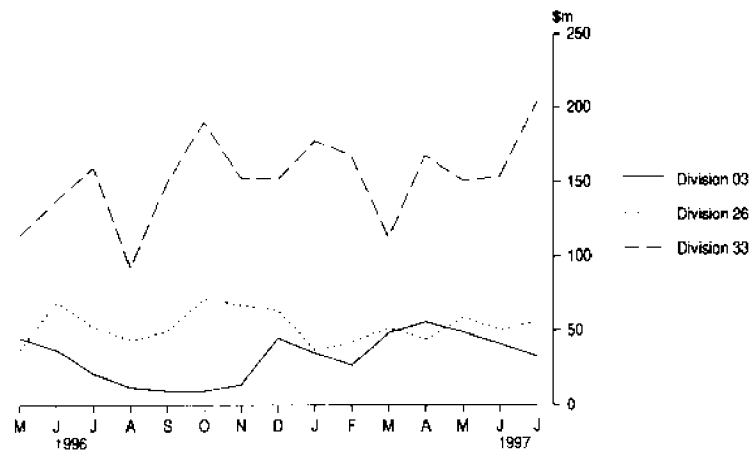

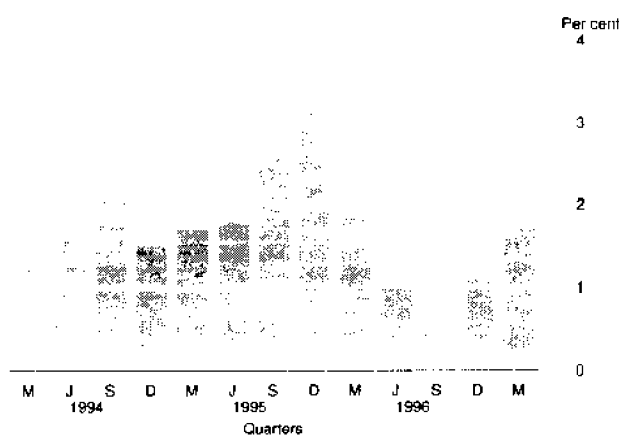

ANALYSIS OF TABLE 9.2

GSP grew by 1.7% in the March quarter, continuing a pattern of increasing growth from the 0.6% increase recorded in September quarter 1996. Growth through the year to March quarter 1997 was 4.4%. Wages, salaries and supplements grew by 1.6% in the March quarter to be 5.6% higher than in the same quarter of the previous year. Growth in gross operating surplus of 2.2% in the March quarter and 4.9% for the year to March quarter 1997 was the strongest for any state on both counts. Indirect taxes less subsidies grew by 0.5% in the March quarter, the first increase since March quarter 1996. Despite this increase, a fall of 2.2% was recorded for the year to March quarter 1997.
