Western Australia had an estimated population of 1,952,280 in June 2003.

Although it has the largest land area of any Australian state or territory, Western Australia accounts for less than 10% of Australia's population.

The state capital is Perth, founded on 12 August 1829. In June 2003 the estimated population of Perth was 1,433,217.
