## ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES FEBRUARY 1996

MAIN FEATURES

**EMPLOYMENT** The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was

2 797 300 in January 1996, a fall of 0.4% on the previous month.

Nationally, there was a fall of 0.3% in employment over the same period. Both State and national employment figures in January 1996 were 2.9%

higher than a year ago.

UNEMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was

> 239 100 in January 1996, an increase of 10.2% on the previous month and a fall of 7.1% over the previous year. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in January 1996 was 7.9% in NSW and 8.6%

nationally.

BUILDING APPROVALS The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in December 1995 was 3 379, an increase of 1.5% on the previous

month.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

REGISTRATIONS

The seasonally adjusted figure for new motor vehicle registrations in NSW increased by 12.6% from 16 395 in November 1995 to 18 469 in

December 1995.

FINANCE The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in

NSW in December 1995 fell by 21.8% from the previous month and was

4.6% lower than in December 1994.

PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL

**EXPENDITURE** 

Private new capital expenditure in September quarter 1995 for NSW on buildings and structures increased 18.3% over the previous quarter, while expenditure on equipment declined by 20.7%. There is almost no

movement in either category when compared with data for the

September quarter of the previous year.

NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.



## BALANCE OF PAYMENTS AUSTRALIA (Monthly)





## GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED (Average 1989–1990 prices, quarterly)





