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## ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES MARCH 1997

MAIN FEATURES

EMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was

2,801,900 in February 1997, a decrease of 1.1% on the previous month.

Nationally, employment fell by 0.1% over the same period.

UNEMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was

258,800 in February 1997, a rise of 8.5% on the previous month and

10.2% higher than in February 1996. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in February 1997 was 8.5% in NSW and 8.8%

nationally.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

REGISTRATIONS

In seasonally adjusted terms, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW

increased by 4.8% from 18,534 in December 1996 to 19,426 in January

1997.

TOURISM The number of guest nights for licensed hotels, motels etc. with facilities

in NSW for the December Quarter 1996 was 5,699,000, an increase of

2.2% on December Quarter 1995.

BUILDING APPROVALS The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in January 1997 was 4,258, an increase of 9.4% on the previous month

and 29.6% higher than in January 1996.

FINANCE The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW

in January 1997 rose by 0.1% from December 1996 and 39.0% from

January 1996.

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and

are subject to revision in subsequent issues.




#### MONTHLY CHANGE IN NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED (Trend)




#### PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




### NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




#### VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)




#### UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




#### RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)
