## ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES APRIL 1994

### **MAIN FEATURES**

### **Employment**

Seasonally adjusted, the number of employed people in NSW in March 1994 increased by 7,600 or 0.3% from February 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed persons increased by 7,100 or 0.1%.

### Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW in March 1994 was 293,900, an increase of 1,300 or 0.4% from the previous month. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons declined by 1.2%. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for NSW rose slightly, from 10.0% in February 1994 to 10.1% in March 1994, while the national rate decreased from 10.5% to 10.3%.

### New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicle registrations in NSW in March 1994 (15,876) decreased by 12.0% compared to February 1994 and by 1.2% for the same period in 1993.

### **Building Approvals**

The value (at average 1989-90 prices) of building work done in NSW for the December quarter 1993 (\$2,260m) decreased by 2.0% compared to the same period for the previous year. This was due to a decrease in the value of new residential building work.

### Actual New Fixed Capital Expenditure

In December quarter 1993, new fixed capital expenditure by private enterprises in NSW rose by 11.0% on September quarter 1993, but was 19.7% lower than in December quarter 1992.

### NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.


# MONTHLY CHANGE IN NUMBER OF PERSONS EMPLOYED




## PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




### NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




### VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989–90 prices, quarterly)




## UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (Trend)




#### RETAIL TURNOVER (Trend, monthly)
