### ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES MAY 1994

#### MAIN FEATURES

#### **Employment**

Seasonally adjusted, the number of employed people in NSW in April 1994 decreased by 4,000 or 0.2% from March 1994. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of employed persons increased by 5,800 or 0.1%.

#### Unemployment

The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW in April 1994 was 291,100, a decrease of 2,800 or 1.0% from the previous month. Nationally, the seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons declined by 3.1%. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for NSW fell from 10.1% in March 1994 to 10.0% in April 1994, while the national rate decreased from 10.3% to 10.1%.

#### Average Weekly Earnings

In February 1994, the trend estimate of average weekly earnings for all employees in NSW was \$537.90. This was a decrease of 0.4% since November 1993 but with no percentage change since February 1993. Nationally, the figure was \$523.30 per week, up 0.1% since November 1993 and up 2.1% since February 1993.

#### New Motor Vehicle Registrations

The seasonally adjusted number of new motor vehicle registrations in NSW in April 1994 (17,610) increased by 10.9% compared to March 1994. There was an increase of 11.7% for Australia over the same period.

#### **Building Approvals**

The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW in March 1994 (3,806) decreased by 8.0% compared to March 1993. There was an increase of 2.4% for Australia over the same period.

#### Housing Finance for Owner Occupation

The value of lending commitments to individuals in NSW rose by 30.4% in March 1994 and was 34.2% higher than in March 1993. Strong rises occurred in lending for dwelling construction (35.9%) and for the purchase of established dwellings (28.3%). Lending for the purchase of newly erected dwellings also rose, though at a lower rate (9.9%).

#### NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.







# PRICES AND EARNINGS, NSW (Annual rate of change)




# NEW MOTOR VEHICLES REGISTERED (Monthly)




# VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS COMMENCED (Average 1989-90 prices, quarterly)



### UNEMPLOYMENT RATE




