ECONOMIC INDICATORS, NEW SOUTH WALES JULY 1996

MAIN FEATURES

EMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of employed persons in NSW was

2,794,600 in June 1996, an increase of 0.7% on the previous month.

Nationally, employment rose by 0.1% over the same period.

UNEMPLOYMENT The seasonally adjusted number of unemployed persons in NSW was

232,400 in June 1996, a fall of 3.9% on the previous month and a rise of 2.8% over the previous year. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate

in June 1996 was 7.7% in NSW and 8.3% nationally.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

REGISTRATIONS

Seasonally adjusted, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW decreased by

19.6% from 20,626 in April 1996 to 16,586 in May 1996.

BUILDING APPROVALS The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in May 1996 was 3,915, an increase of 16.4% on the previous month, but

10.9% lower than in May 1995.

BUILDING COMMENCEMENTS The number of new dwelling units commenced in NSW in March Quarter

1996 was 9,564, an increase of 2.9% on the previous quarter, but a

decrease of 15.7% on March Quarter 1995.

FINANCE The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW

in May 1996 rose by 21.5% from April 1996 and 11.0% from May 1995.

NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues.

For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.





BALANCE OF PAYMENTS AUSTRALIA (Monthly)




GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT, AUSTRALIA SEASONALLY ADJUSTED (Average 1989–1990 prices, quarterly)





