EMPLOYMENT Employment rose by 2.1% in NSW in November 1997 to a seasonally

adjusted figure of 2,839,000. National employment rose by 0.8% over the

same period.

UNEMPLOYMENT Seasonally adjusted unemployment fell by 2.9% in November 1997 to

238,000. The unemployment rate in NSW was 7.7% in November 1997, down from 8.1% the previous month. The national unemployment rate

was 8.4% in November 1997.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE

REGISTRATIONS

Seasonally adjusted, new motor vehicle registrations in NSW decreased by

2.6% from 21,890 in September 1997 to 21,321 in October 1997.

BUILDING APPROVALS The seasonally adjusted number of new dwelling units approved in NSW

in October 1997 was 4,111, an increase of 15.3% on the previous month

and 8.7% higher than in October 1996.

TOURISM The number of guest nights for licensed hotels, motels etc. with facilities

in NSW for the September quarter 1997 was 5,484,100, a decrease of 0.6%

on September quarter 1996.

FINANCE The value of housing finance commitments for owner occupation in NSW

in October 1997 was \$1,980 million. This represented a 0.3% decrease

from September 1997 but a 17.9% increase on October 1996.

PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL

EXPENDITURE

The September quarter 1997 estimates of private new capital expenditure in NSW on equipment, plant and machinery decreased by 7.3% on June quarter 1997, but increased by 6.2% on September quarter 1996. Expenditure on buildings and structures decreased by 15.0% on the June quarter 1997 and

decreased 13.5% on the previous year's September quarter estimate.

## NOTES

This publication provides information on a wide range of economic indicators which are the latest available at the time of publication. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues. For detailed explanatory notes and definitions for the items shown in this publication, readers are referred to the specific ABS publications.
