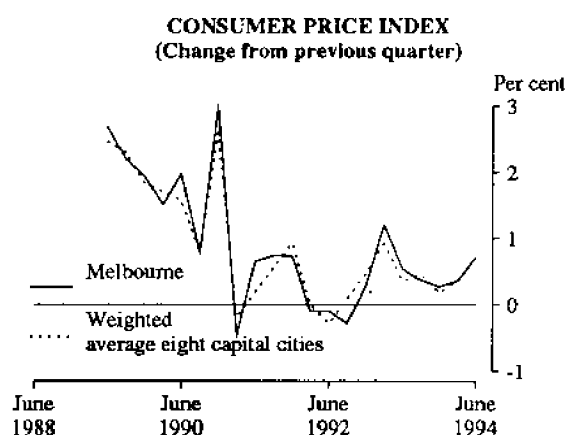

JULY 1994**

MAIN FEATURES



Consumer price index

The consumer price index for Melbourne increased by 0.7 per cent between March and June quarters 1994, resulting in an annual increase of (June quarter 1994 on June quarter 1993) of 1.7 per cent.

The weighted average of the eight capital cities also increased by 0.7 per cent between March and June quarters 1994 and by 1.7 per cent between June quarters 1993 and 1994.

Unemployment rate

The trend estimate of the unemployment rate for Victoria decreased to 10.8 per cent in June 1994 from 11.0 per cent in May 1994. This was the ninth monthly consecutive decrease since September 1993.

At the national level the unemployment rate (trend) decreased by a 0.1 percentage point to 9.9 per cent in June 1994 following monthly consecutive decreases since November 1993.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.

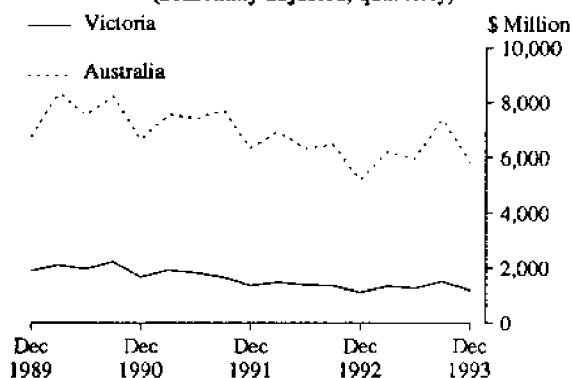

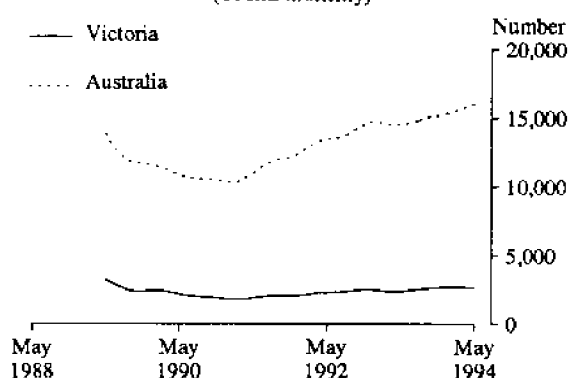

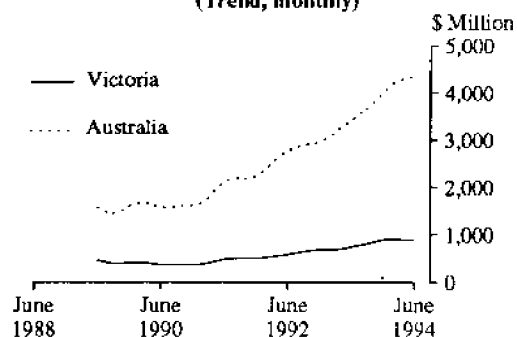
PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL EXPENDITURE
(Seasonally adjusted, quarterly)



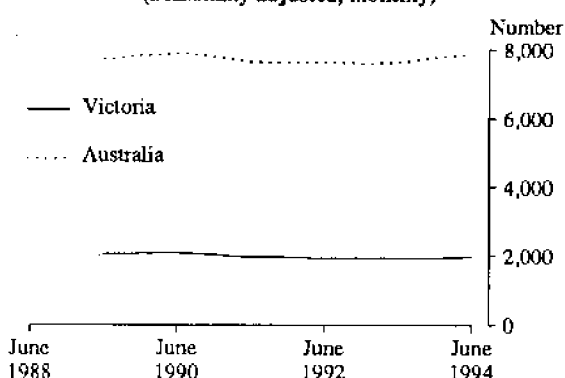
NEW DWELLING UNITS APPROVED
(Trend monthly)



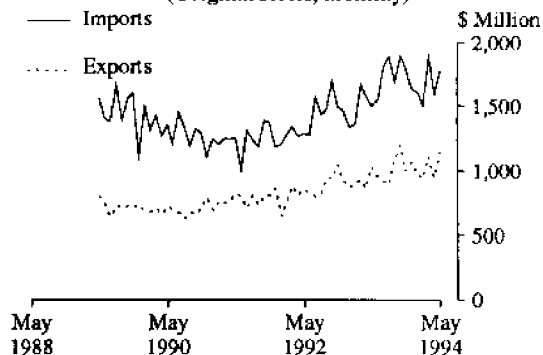
HOUSING FINANCE

(Trend, monthly)



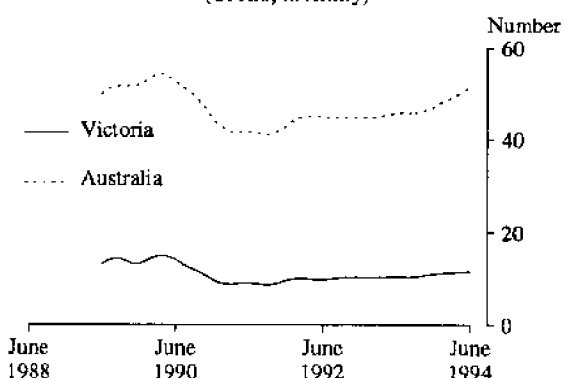
EMPLOYED PERSONS
(Seasonally adjusted, monthly)



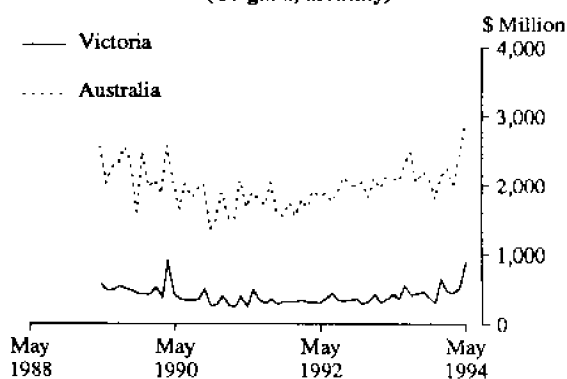
MERCHANDISE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS

(Original series, monthly)



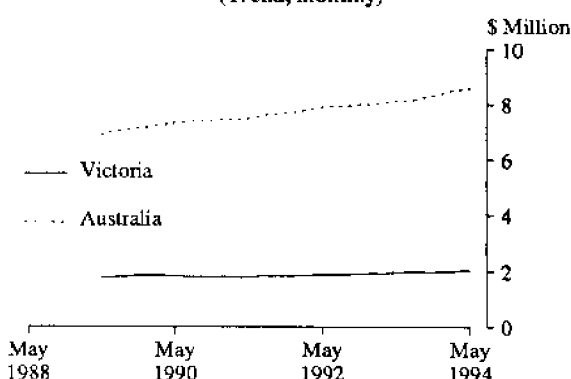
NEW MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION
