### New motor vehicle registrations

The trend estimate of new motor vehicles registered in Victoria increased by 0.7 per cent in June 1994. This followed consecutive monthly increases from July 1993.

The June trend estimate (11,565) was 10.8 per cent above the number of new motor vehicle registations in June 1993 (10,440).

### Unemployment rate

The trend estimate of the unemployment rate for Victoria decreased to 10.4 per cent in July 1994 from 10.6 per cent in June 1994. This was the tenth monthly consecutive decrease since September 1993.

At the national level the unemployment rate (trend) decreased by a 0.1 percentage point to 9.7 per cent in July 1994 following monthly consecutive decreases since November 1993.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.






## PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL EXPENDITURE (Seasonally adjusted, quarterly)




### HOUSING FINANCE TOTAL VALUE OF SECURED HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS TO INDIVIDUALS




#### MERCHANDISE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS VICTORIA




# VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS APPROVED (Original, monthly)




## NEW DWELLING UNITS APPROVED (Trend monthly)




## EMPLOYED PERSONS (Seasonally adjusted, monthly)
