


ECONOMIC INDICATORS, VICTORIA, OCTOBER 1994





Unemployment rate

The trend estimate of the unemployment rate for Victoria decreased to 10.2 per cent (preliminary) in October 1994 from 10.3 per cent in September 1994. This was the thirteenth monthly consecutive decrease since September 1993.

At the national level the trend unemployment rate decreased by a 0.1 percentage point to 9.3 per cent (preliminary) in September 1994 following consecutive monthly decreases since November 1993.

Consumer price index

The consumer price index for Melbourne increased by 0.2 per cent between June and September quarters 1994, resulting in an annual increase of 1.5 per cent (September quarter 1994 on September quarter 1993.

The weighted average of the eight capital cities increased by 0.6 per cent between June and September quarters 1994 and by 1.9 per cent between September quarters 1993 and 1994.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.







HOUSING FINANCE TOTAL VALUE OF SECURED HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS TO INDIVIDUALS




VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS APPROVED (Original, monthly)




NEW MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION (Trend, monthly)




NEW DWELLING UNITS APPROVED (Trend, monthly)




EMPLOYED PERSONS
