

ECONOMIC INDICATORS, VICTORIA, DECEMBER 1994

This is the final issue of Economic Indicators, Victoria.

Economic Indicators (1307.2) will be amalgamating with Monthly Summary of Statistics (1303.2) and the first issue - January is expected for release on the 8th February, 1995





Motor vehicle registrations

The trend estimate for the number of new motor vehicles registered in Victoria increased by 1.5 per cent in October 1994 (12,047) over September 1994. The trend estimate has increased continually since August 1993.

The number of new motor vehicles registerd in Victoria in October 1994 increased by 13.3 per cent over October 1993.

External trade

Imports into Victoria increased from \$1,915 million in September 1994 to \$2,063 in October 1994, an increase of 7.7 per cent. Imports in October 1994 increased by 8.7 per cent over October 1993.

Exports (excluding re-exports) from Victoria increased from \$973 million in September 1994 to \$1,016 million in October 1994, an increase of 4.5 per cent. Victorian exports decreased by 15.3 per cent in October 1994 compared with October 1993.

Readers are reminded that trend estimates are subject to revision as subsequent months data become available.






PRIVATE NEW CAPITAL EXPENDITURE (Seasonally adjusted, quarterly)




HOUSING FINANCE TOTAL VALUE OF SECURED HOUSING FINANCE COMMITMENTS TO INDIVIDUALS




CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (Change from previous quarter)




VALUE OF ALL BUILDINGS APPROVED (Original, monthly)




NEW DWELLING UNITS APPROVED (Trend, monthly)




EMPLOYED PERSONS
