## ECONOMIC INDICATORS, QUEENSLAND, SEPTEMBER 1994

## **MAIN FEATURES**

- The Australian National Accounts show consistent growth in GDP(I) with final consumption expenditure, gross fixed capital expenditure, exports and imports of goods and services all showing increases of between 4.6% and 6.6% over the year ending June 1994. These indicators also showed slight increases from March quarter 1994 to June quarter 1994.
- The Australian indexes of manufacturing production showed growth over the year ending June 1994 with the total manufacturing index increasing 8.4% and increasing 4.7% from March quarter 1994 to June quarter 1994. This was partially offset by a decrease of 1.9% in the food, beverages and tobacco index over the year ending June 1994 and a decrease of 0.7% from March quarter 1994 to June quarter 1994. The price indexes of articles produced by the manufacturing industry in Australia have also shown growth over the year ending June 1994 with the all groups index increasing 0.7%, and from May 1994 to June 1994 increasing 0.3%.
- New motor vehicle registrations in Queensland continue to increase with the trend estimates for passenger vehicles and total new motor vehicle registrations (excluding motor cycles, plant, equipment and trailers) increasing 13.3% and 18.4%, respectively, over the year to July 1994. The trend estimates for passenger vehicles in Queensland increased for the eighth consecutive month.

- Housing finance for owner occupation in Queensland continued to report strong growth with total finance increasing 18.8% from June 1993 to June 1994. Approvals of total dwelling units in trend estimate terms increased 6.4% over the year ending July 1994 and increased 0.6% over the month ending July 1994. In original terms, new houses approved decreased 6.7% over the year ending July 1994 and other residential buildings approved increased 1.8% over the same period but dropped 25.5% over the month ending July 1994.
- Queensland's trend estimate unemployment rate fell 0.1 percentage points to 9.0% from July 1994 to August 1994. This is the fourth lowest rate of all States and Territories. In trend estimate terms, employed persons in Queensland rose by 0.3% to 1,439,000 persons from July 1994 to August 1994 and increased 5.3% over the year ending August 1994.
- Credit demand in Queensland has continued to increase. Over the 12 months ending June 1994, personal finance commitments increased 24.1% and commercial and lease finance commitments increased 16.4% and 48.4%, respectively. From May 1994 to June 1994, personal finance commitments increased 8.7% and commercial and lease finance commitments increased 25.0% and 57.6%, respectively.

Statistics shown in this publication are the latest available at the date of preparation. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues. Reference should therefore always be made to the latest issue, or to the statistical publication on the specific subject when figures are not shown.
