ECONOMIC INDICATORS, QUEENSLAND, NOVEMBER 1994

MAIN FEATURES

- The all groups Brisbane Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 0.9% from June quarter 1994 to September quarter 1994, resulting in an annual increase (September quarter 1993 to September quarter 1994) of 2.4%. Health and personal care (up 6.0%) and tobacco and alcohol (up 4.4%) contributed most to this increase.
- Queensland's trend estimate unemployment rate remains constant at 9.1% for 3 consecutive months ending October 1994. This is lower than the comparable trend estimate figure for Australia of 9.3%. Employment in Queensland in trend estimate terms increased by 4,900 persons to 1,453,300 persons from September 1994 to October 1994. Job vacancies in Queensland increased 109.8% to 12,800 from July 1994 to August 1994.
- The number of persons employed in the communication services industry (which includes postal and courier services and telecommunications services) showed the largest increase of all industries in Queensland of 34.6% for the 12 months ending August 1994. Over the same period, however, persons employed in government administration and defence decreased 33.1%.

- The value of all building approved in Queensland decreased 12.2% from August 1994 to September 1994 and decreased 17.1% for the 12 months ending September 1994. Interest rates on new housing loans increased to 9.50% in September 1994 after 11 consecutive months at 8.75%. Housing finance for owner occupation in Queensland increased 6.9% from July 1994 to August 1994 and 18.2% from August 1993 to August 1994.
- Trend estimates of new motor vehicle registrations in Queensland decreased for the fourth consecutive quarter. Trend estimates for passenger vehicles and total new motor vehicle registrations decreased 2.9% and 3.5%, respectively, for the month ending September 1994.
- Personal finance commitments for the month ending August 1994 increased 16.0% and for the 12 months ending August 1994 increased 27.7%. Commercial finance commitments increased 10.7% for the month ending August 1994 and 24.6% for the 12 months ending August 1994. Lease finance commitments increased 11.1% from August 1993 to August 1994 in spite of a decrease for the month ending August 1994 of 23.9%.

Statistics shown in this publication are the latest available at the date of preparation. In a number of cases, figures appearing in this summary are preliminary and are subject to revision in subsequent issues. Reference should therefore always be made to the latest issue, or to the statistical publication on the specific subject when figures are not shown.
