INTRODUCTION.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population of Western Australia as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulations. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status.

Part I. - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas, etc., of Volume \underline{V}_{\cdot} - Western Australia, of the detailed tables of the Census of 30th June, 1961, containing these data for each city, town and shire and each non-municipal town of 1,000 persons or more is in course of preparation and will be printed as soon as possible.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons according to one particular characteristic (e.g. age, conjugal condition, etc.). A Bulletin similar to this will shortly be issued on Dwellings, and at a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g. the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups, etc. and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

Census Bulletin No. 2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was released on 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in the major towns arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood Aboriginals.

POPULATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. Population - Urban, Rural, Etc. - The following table shows the urban, rural and migratory population of Western Australia at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

For the 1961 Census "Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Perth and adjoining municipalities and shires within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to all other cities and towns with a population of 1,000 persons or more, and "Rural" to the remainder of the State. "Migratory" refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated, who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961, were on ships in Western Australian waters or travelling on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

The figures shown for Other Urban and Rural Divisions of State at the 1954 Census have been adjusted to conform to the boundaries used in 1961.

The total population of Western Australia increased by 15:1 per cent. between Censuses. The increase for males was 13.7 per cent. and for females 16.7 per cent.

The excess of females over males in the "Metropolitan Urban" division of State was 9,919 in 1961 compared with 4,983 in 1954. At 30th June, 1961 the masculinity of the "Metropolitan Urban" population was 95.4 males per 100 females compared with 103.3 males per 100 females in "Other Urban" and 124.0 males per 100 females in "Rural". For the State as a whole the masculinity of the population in 1961 was 104.0 males per 100 females compared with 106.8 males per 100 females in 1954.

The proportion of the total population in the "Metropolitan Urban" division of State rose from 54.5 per cent. in 1954 to 57.0 per cent. in 1961 while the proportion in the "Rural" division fell from 28.2 per cent. to 25.5 per cent.

2. Age. - The following table shows the numbers of each sex in each five-year age group at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The proportion of the total population under 21 years of age was 41.7 per cent. in 1961 compared with 38.8 per cent. in 1954. For ages 21-64 years the proportion was 50.8 per cent. in 1961 compared with 53.8 per cent. in 1954 and for persons aged 65 years and over 7.5 per cent. compared with 7.4 per cent.

At the 1961 Census males exceeded females in number in each age group under 65 years, females exceeding males in all higher age groups. In 1954 the excess of females began at 60-64 years.

3. Conjugal Condition. - The following table shows the population of Western Australia classified according to sex and conjugal condition.

At the 1961 Census 49.4 per cent. of the population were never married (48.4 per cent. in 1954); 43.9 per cent. married (44.6 per cent. in 1954); 1.3 per cent. married but permanently separated (1.4 per cent. in 1954); 4.5 per cent. widowed (4.7 per cent. in 1954); and 0.9 per cent. divorced (0.9 per cent. in 1954).

The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 307: 100 in 1954 to 369: 100 in 1961. The ratio of males to females in the never married group "15 years of age and over" decreased from 167: 100 in 1954 to 153: 100 in 1961.

4. <u>Birthplace</u>. - The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of Western Australia at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The Australian-born portion of the total population rose between Censuses from 76.5 per cent. in 1954 to 77.7 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand, the proportion of European-born persons declined from 21.5 per cent. in 1954 to 20.3 per cent. in 1961. Included in the 20.3 per cent. European-born were: United Kingdom, 11.3 per cent. (13.1 per cent. in 1954); Italy, 3.4 per cent. (2.7 per cent. in 1954); and Netherlands, 1.5 per cent. (1.3 per cent. in 1954).

Of the European countries listed in the table the largest increases since 1954 occurred in respect of the following: Italy, 7,956 persons; Netherlands, 2,677 persons; Greece, 874 persons. The number of persons born in the United Kingdom and Poland decreased by 444 and 419 respectively since 1954.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Table 4.

5. Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia. - The effect of the post-war immigration policy is reflected in the following table which shows the period of residence in Australia of persons in Western Australia born outside Australia. Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence 48.9 per cent in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in 1961 only 24.8 per cent. had been resident less than 7 years.

6. Nationality (i.e. Allegiance). - At the 30th June, 1961, 702,759 persons or 95.4 per cent. of the total population were British subjects compared with 595,851 persons or 93.1 per cent. in 1954. The number of foreign nationals decreased by 10,050 (22.9 per cent.) since 1954.

Of the 164,459 oversea-born population 130,589 (or 79.4 per cent.) were British subjects (compared with 70.7 per cent. in 1954), while the remainder, 33,870 (20.6 per cent.), owed foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in Western Australia at 30th June, 1961 were: Italian, 13,905; Dutch, 7,368; Yugoslavian, 2,173; and German, 1,897.

In the intercensal period 1954-1961 the only foreign nationality listed in the table to show an increase was Italian. The decreases shown for the other foreign nationalities would indicate that any excess of arrivals over departures was counteracted by the decrease due to naturalization (and deaths).

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as shown in Table 6.

7. Religion. - The following table sets out the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 76,796 persons or 10.4 per cent. of the population who gave no reply to this question in 1961 compared with 63,143 or 9.9 per cent. in 1954.

Church of England, with 289,863, had most adherents in 1961 followed by the Roman Catholic Church with 180,184 consisting of 106,053 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 74,131 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. The Methodist Church had 76,465 adherents; Presbyterian, 40,573; Churches of Christ, 10,261; and Greek Orthodox, 9,057.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) with 36,695 persons. This was followed by Church of England, with an increase of 21,728 persons; Methodist, 7,976; Presbyterian, 2,914; Churches of Christ, 2,460; and Greek Orthodox, 1,844.

The greatest proportional increase among Christian religions since 1954 was recorded by Churches of Christ, 31.5 per cent.; Seventh Day Adventist, 29.3 per cent.; Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described), 25.6 per cent.; Greek Orthodox, 25.6 per cent. and Baptist, 23.8 per cent.

The total number of adherents at the 30th June, 1961 in all the Christian religions represented in Western Australia was 651,031 compared with 569,793 in 1954. Adherents to Christian religions represented 98.7 per cent. of all persons who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 98.8 per cent. at the 1954 Census.

8. Industry. - The following table sets out the main groups of industry for the male and female population of Western Australia at 30th June, 1961 compared with 1954. For industry groups Finance and Property, Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Community and Business Services (including Professional) the figures derived from the 1954 classification have been adjusted to accord with the classification used in 1961.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Manufacturing which absorbed 50,975 persons (43,825 males and 7,150 females) and represented 18.2 per cent. of the total work force. This was followed by Commerce, 18.2 per cent. of the total work force; Primary Production, 14.7 per cent.; Community and Business Services (including Professional), 11.1 per cent.; Transport and Storage and Communication, 9.7 per cent.; and Building and Construction, 9.1 per cent. The Community and Business Services group, sixth in numerical importance in 1954, rose to fourth place at 30th June, 1961 displacing Building and Construction which fell to sixth.

There were significant increases since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Community and Business Services (including Professional), Finance and Property, and Commerce. These groups grew by 42.2 per cent., 39.9 per cent., and 16.7 per cent. respectively. These increases were substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 8.3 per cent. There was a decrease between Censuses in the number of persons engaged in Mining and Quarrying (15.7 per cent. decrease), Building and Construction (10.1 per cent. decrease), and Primary Production (0.8 per cent decrease).

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 8.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June, 1961, 77.8 per cent. were employees (79-2 per cent. in 1954); 10.7 per cent. self-employed (11.4 per cent. in 1954); and 7.3 per cent. employers (7.4 per cent. in 1954).

There was a higher percentage of dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (62.0 per cent.) than in 1954 (59.6 per cent.). The increase of 19.8 per cent. since 1954 in the number of persons not in the work force was greater than the increase in the work force of 8.3 per cent. The proportion of fulltime students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954, being 22.0 per cent. and 18.3 per cent. respectively. See also Table 2 showing age distribution of the population.
