SUMMARY OF POPULATION FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIA

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## INTRODUCTION

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This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population of South Australia as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole, being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status.

Part I. - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas, etc., of Volume IV. - South Australia, of the detailed tables of the Census of 30th June, 1961, containing these data for each municipality and district council and each non-municipal town of 1,000 persons or more is in course of preparation and will be printed as soon as possible.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons according to one particular characteristic (e.g. age, conjugal condition, etc.). A Bulletin similar to this will shortly be issued on Dwellings, and at a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g. the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups, etc. and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

Census Bulletin No. 2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was released on 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in the major towns arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood Aboriginals.

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## POPULATION OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA

CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961

1. Population - Urban, Rural, Etc. - The following table shows the urban, rural and migratory population of South Australia at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

"Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Adelaide and adjoining municipal areas within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to (i) all separately incorporated cities and towns outside the Metropolitan Urban Division, except for any portions within the city or town which were specifically regarded as rural for Census purposes, or where the population of the whole town was less than 1,000; and (ii) other towns, not separately incorporated, with a population of 1,000 persons or more. "Rural" relates to the remainder of the State. "Migratory" refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated, who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961, were on ships in South Australian waters or travelling on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

The figures shown for Divisions of State at the 1954 Census have been adjusted to conform to the boundaries used in 1961.

The total population of South Australia increased by 21.6 per cent. between the 1954 and 1961 Censuses. The increase for males was 21.4 per cent. and for females 21.9 per cent.

At 30th June, 1961, the masculinity of "Metropolitan Urban" was 97.0 males per 100 females compared with 105.9 in "Other Urban" and 113.4 in "Rural". For the State as a whole the masculinity of the population in 1961 was 102.3 compared with 102.7 in 1954.

The proportion of the total population in "Metropolitan Urban" was the same for both Censuses i.e. 60.7 per cent. The proportion in "Other Urban" rose from 15.3 per cent. in 1954 to 18.3 per cent. in 1961 while the proportion in "Rural" fell from 23.7 per cent. to 20.6 per cent.

2. Age. - The following table shows the numbers in each five-year age group at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The proportion of the total population under 21 years of age was 40.1 per cent. in 1961 compared with 36.0 per cent. in 1954. For ages 21-64 years the proportion was 51.2 per cent. in 1961 compared with 55.1 per cent. in 1954 and for persons aged 65 years and over 8.7 per cent. compared with 8.9 per cent.

At the 1961 Census males exceeded females in number in each age group under 60 years, females exceeding males in all higher age groups. In 1954 the excess of females commenced with the 55-59 years group.

3. Conjugal Condition. - The following table shows the population of South Australia classified according to conjugal condition at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At the 1961 Census 47.6 per cent. of the population were never married (45.7 per cent. in 1954); 45.8 per cent. married (47.4 per cent. in 1954); 1.1 per cent. married but permanently separated (1.0 per cent. in 1954); 4.8 per cent. widowed (5.1 per cent. in 1954); and 0.7 per cent. divorced (0.8 per cent. in 1954).

The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 303 : 100 in 1954 to 349 : 100 in 1961. The ratio of males to females in the never married group "15 years of age and over" showed little change between Censuses (143 : 100 in 1954; 142 : 100 in 1961).

The Australian-born portion of the total population declined between Censuses from 86.1 per cent. in 1954 to 80.8 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand the proportion of European-born persons to total population rose from 13.0 per cent. in 1954 to 18.1 per cent. in 1961. Included in the 18.1 per cent. European-born were : United Kingdom and Ireland, 8.1 per cent. (6.3 per cent. in 1954); Italy, 2.7 per cent. (1.5 per cent. in 1954); Germany, 1.7 per cent. (1.2 per cent. in 1954); and Netherlands, 1.3 per cent. (0.5 per cent. in 1954).

Of the European countries listed in the table the largest increases since 1954 occurred in respect of the following : United Kingdom, 28,351 persons; Italy, 14,273 persons; Netherlands, 8,736 persons; and Greece, 6,667 persons.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Table 4.

5. Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia. - The post-war migration flow into Australia is reflected in the following table which classifies the oversea-born population of South Australia according to period of residence in Australia. Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence 66.8 per cent. in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in 1961 only 45.8 per cent. had been resident less than 7 years.

6. Nationality (i.e. Allegiance). - At 30th June, 1961, 911,562 persons or 94.0 per cent. of the population of South Australia were British subjects compared with 750,122 persons or 94.1 per cent. in 1954. Since 1954 the number of foreign nationals increased by 10,806 of which 8,051 (or 74.5 per cent.) were females.

Of the 186,139 oversea-born population 128,361 (or 69.0 per cent.) were British subjects (57.5 per cent. in 1954), while the remainder, 57,778 (31.0 per cent.) owed foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in South Australia at 30th June, 1961, were: - Italian, 17,873; Dutch, 9,892; German, 8,288; and Greek, 7,039. They were the only foreign nationalities listed in the table to show an increase between the 1954 and 1961 Censuses. The decreases shown for other foreign nationalities would indicate that any excess of arrivals over departures was counteracted by the decrease due to naturalization (and death).

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as shown in Table 6.

7. Religion. - The following table sets out the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 102,605 persons or 10.6 per cent. of the population who gave no reply to this question in 1961 compared with 89,520 or 11.2 per cent. in 1954.

Church of England, with 255,054, had most adherents in 1961 followed by Methodist with 216,770. The Roman Catholic Church had 183,053 adherents consisting of 59,629 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 123,424 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. The Lutheran Church had 53,947 adherents; Presbyterian, 37,911; Churches of Christ, 23,905; and Baptist, 21,032.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) which increased by 57,283 persons. This was followed by Church of England with an increase of 31,735 persons; Methodist, 23,536; Lutheran, 11,890; and Greek Orthodox, 10,037.

The greatest proportional increases among Christian religions since 1954 was recorded by Greek Orthodox; 116.6 per cent.; Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described), 45.5 per cent.; Seventh Day Adventist, 42.4 per cent.; Lutheran, 28.3 per cent.; and Churches of Christ, 24.8 per cent.

The total number of adherents, at 30th June, 1961 in all the Christian religions represented in South Australia was 858,900 compared with 702,540 in 1954. Adherents to Christian religions represented 99.1 per cent. of all persons who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 99.3 per cent. at the 1954 Census.

8. Industry. - The following table shows the main groups of industry for the male and female population of South Australia at 30th June, 1961, compared with 1954. For industry groups Finance and Property, Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Community and Business Services (including Professional) the figures derived from the 1954 classification have been adjusted to the classification used in 1961.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Manufacturing which absorbed 103,065 persons (85,806 males and 17,259 females) and represented 27.3 per cent. of the total work force. This was followed by Commerce, 17.2 per cent. of the total work force; Primary Production, 11.9 per cent.; Community and Business Services (including Professional), 9.4 per cent.; Building and Construction, 8.6 per cent.; and Transport, Storage and Communication, 8.5 per cent. The Community and Business Services group, sixth in numerical importance in 1954, rose to fourth place at 30th June, 1961, displacing Transport, Storage and Communication which fell to sixth.

There were significant increases since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Electricity, Gas, Water, and Sanitary Services, Finance and Property, and Community and Business Services (including Professional). These groups grew by 65.3 per cent.; 59.9 per cent.; and 51.0 per cent. respectively which was substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 17.3 per cent. There was a decrease of 5.3 per cent. since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Primary Production.

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 8.

9. Occupational Status. - The following table gives details of the Occupational Status of the population of South Australia at 30th June, 1961, compared with the 1954 Census. It shows the capacity in which persons were engaged in the work force, whether as employer, employee, not at work, etc., as well as particulars of those persons not in the work force.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June, 1961, 79.1 per cent. were employees (79.4 per cent. in 1954); 10.9 per cent. self-employed (12.4 per cent. in 1954); and 6.4 per cent. employers (6.6 per cent. in 1954).

There was a higher percentage of dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (61.0 per cent.) than in 1954 (59.6 per cent.). The increase since 1954 in the number of persons not in the work force (24.5 per cent.) was greater than the increase in the work force (17.3 per cent.). The proportion of full-time students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954 (22.0 per cent. and 18.2 per cent. respectively).
