SUMMARY OF DWELLINGS FOR SOUTH AUSTRALIA

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INTRODUCTION

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the dwellings in South Australia as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations.

Census Bulletin No. 11. - Summary of Population for South Australia, was issued on 4th May, 1962. Census Bulletin No. 2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was released on 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in each major town arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated. A list of 1961 Census publications issued to date appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin dwellings are classified according to class (i.e. private house, flat, etc.), material of outer walls, number of rooms, number of inmates, nature of occupancy, date of building, weekly rent and facilities. Each major table shows the numbers of dwellings, according to one particular characteristic (e.g., number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published showing particulars of dwellings in a series of cross-tabulations (e.g., the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

All information in this Bulletin is exclusive of full-blood aboriginals and of dwellings occupied solely by them.

DEFINITIONS AND SCOPE.

Occupied Dwelling: An occupied dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only part of a building. The term has therefore a very wide reference and includes, in addition to houses and flats, a great variety of "dwellings" ranging from a single-roomed shack to a multi-roomed hotel or institution. Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings.

- <u>Private Dwellings</u>: Private dwellings are further classified into the following four categories -
 - <u>Private House</u>: Private Houses include houses, sheds, huts, garages, etc. used for dwelling purposes, and shared private houses for which only one Householder's Schedule was received.
 - <u>Share of Private House</u>: A Share of a Private House is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.
 - Flat: A flat is a part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off and which has its own cooking and bathing facilities.
 - Other Private Dwelling: These include private dwellings such as rooms, apartments, etc., which are parts of buildings but are not selfcontained units.
- Other than Private Dwelling: These include Hotels; Motels; Boarding Houses, Lodging Houses and Hostels; Educational, Religious and Charitable Institutions; Hospitals; Defence and Penal Establishments; Police and Fire Stations; Clubs; Staff Barracks and Quarters, etc.
- <u>Unoccupied Dwelling</u>: These include vacant dwellings available for sale or renting; dwellings such as "week-ender", "holiday home", "second home", "seasonal workers' quarters", which were not occupied on the night of the Census; dwellings normally occupied but whose usual occupants were temporarily absent on the night of the Census; newly completed dwellings whose owners or tenants had not entered into occupation on the night of the Census; dwellings described as "to be demolished", "condemned", "deceased estate", "exhibition home", etc.; and buildings constructed as dwellings but used for non-dwelling purposes on the night of the Census. The total number of unoccupied dwellings shown for any area must not, therefore, be read as representing the number of vacant houses and flats available for sale or renting.

The detailed information in this Bulletin relates to private dwellings occupied at the date of the Census. However, information relating to the number of occupied dwellings other than private is given in Table 2 and a summary by urban and rural divisions of the State of unoccupied dwellings classified according to the reasons why the dwellings were unoccupied is shown in Table 10.

In the tables which follow "Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Adelaide and adjoining municipal areas within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to (i) all separately incorporated cities and towns outside the Metropolitan Urban Division, except for any portions within the city or town which were specifically regarded as rural for Census purposes, or where the population of the whole town was less than 1,000; and (ii) other towns, not separately incorporated, with a population of 1,000 persons or more. "Rural" relates to the remainder of the State.

The composition of the Other Urban and Rural Divisions as used for 1951 Census purposes differ from those used for 1954 Census purposes. Adjustments have been made to the 1954 figures in Table 1 in this Bulletin in order to provide approximate comparison on the 1961 Census basis, but in Tables 2 to 6 and Table 8 no adjustments have been made to 1954 figures. The effect of the changes referred to may be measured by comparing the data in Table 1A with the 1954 data in Table 1, and this effect must be borne in mind when making intercensal comparisons in the other tables.

CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. <u>Summary of Population and Dwellings.</u> - The following table shows the urban and rural distribution of the population and dwellings in South Australia at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. The figures shown for the 1954 Census have been adjusted to conform to the boundaries used in 1961.

Similar adjustment of 1954 data cannot be provided in the tables which follow but comparison of the figures in Table 1A with the 1954 figures in Table 1 will show the effects of changes made between the Censuses. These effects should be borne in mind when making intercensal comparisons in other tables.

Private houses constituted 90.4 per cent. and flats, 5.4 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in 1961 compared with 90.5 per cent. and 2.7 per cent. respectively in 1954. The number of flats increased by 148.4 per cent. since 1954. The total number of occupied private dwellings increased by 22.3 per cent. 3. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Material of Outer Walls. - Brick was the most frequently used material for outer walls in South Australia. At 30th June, 1961 it was used in 50.6 per cent. of those occupied private dwellings where material of outer walls was stated compared with 43.8 per cent. in 1954.

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Private Dwellings with outer walls of stone were second in numerical importance in 1961, as in 1954, despite a decline from 31.2 per cent. of total occupied private dwellings (with stated material of outer walls) in 1954 to 24.7 per cent. in 1961. However, whilst brick predominated in the metropolitan area, stone was most frequently used in other urban and rural areas. In these latter areas, taken together, 42.0 per cent. of private dwellings had outer walls of stone.

The proportion of occupied private dwellings with walls of fibro-cement, third in numerical importance in 1961 (and 1954) increased from 6.8 per cent. in 1954 to 8.3 per cent. in 1961.

In 1961 concrete and wood were used as materials for outer walls in 7.1 per cent. and 5.1 per cent. respectively of occupied private dwellings compared with 5.9 per cent. and 6.5 per cent. in 1954.

The highest percentage increases between Censuses was recorded by occupied private dwellings with walls of fibro-cement, 49.9 per cent. followed by concrete, 48.6 per cent. and brick, 41.2 per cent. (the latter increasing by 124.6 per cent. in the other urban and rural divisions of the State). There were decreases in the number of dwellings with walls of iron, 7.3 per cent.; wood, 4.0 per cent.; and stone, 3.3 per cent.

At 30th June, 1961, four, five and six roomed occupied private dwellings together accounted for 80.0 per cent. of those occupied private dwellings where number of rooms was stated. In 1954 the proportion was 77.1 per cent. In both 1961 and 1954 private dwellings with five rooms were the most numerous and represented 41.7 per cent. and 36.3 per cent. respectively of private dwellings with stated number of rooms. Flats with three rooms predominated in 1961, whereas four-roomed flats were most numerous in 1954.

The greatest proportional increases in the numbers of occupied private dwellings since the 1954 Census occurred in five and seven roomed private dwellings which increased by 40.3 per cent. and 29.4 per cent. respectively. The total number of flats showed a greater proportional increase than the number of any other class of dwelling and this applied generally throughout the size range. In particular there were large increases since 1954 in the numbers of two, three and four roomed flats, the increases being 238.5 per cent., 197.8 per cent. and 137.6 per cent. respectively. The numbers of private dwellings with one, two and three rooms decreased by 25.7 per cent., 26.1 per cent. and 1.2 per cent. respectively.

A trend towards, private houses with more rooms is indicated in the average number of rooms per private house which in 1961 was 5.35 compared with 5.20 in 1954. The average number of rooms per private dwelling was greatest in the Rural Division of the State.

The greatest proportional increase since 1954 in the number of occupied private dwellings occurred in those with seven inmates, the growth of 46.0 per cent. being due mainly to an increase of 45.6 per cent. in the number of private houses with seven inmates. The numbers of flats with one and two inmates underwent substantial increases of 210.3 per cent. and 130.5 per cent. respectively since 1954.

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Dwellings with six or more inmates increased by 41.5 per cent. between Censuses while those with less than six increased by 19.8 per cent.

At 30th June, 1961, dwellings with less than six inmates represented 86.9 per cent. of total occupied private dwellings compared with 88.6 per cent. in 1954.

Two-inmate dwellings were the most numerous at both Censuses accounting for 24.0 per cent. in 1961 and 24.4 per cent. in 1954.

The average number of inmates per private dwelling for South Australia increased from 3.49 in 1954 to 3.54 at 30th June, 1961. In private houses the average rose from 3.60 in 1954 to 3.65 in 1961, in shares of private houses it rose from 2.53 to 2.67 but in flats it was constant at 2.48. The higher average in 1961 was evident in all Divisions of the State.

6. <u>Occupied Private Dwellings according to Nature of Occupancy.</u> - The following table shows the nature of occupancy of private dwellings at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The most significant feature of this table is the increase in the number of , occupied private dwellings being purchased by instalments. Of those occupied private dwellings where nature of occupancy was stated the proportion being purchased by instalments rose from 17.9 per cent. in 1954 to 23.2 per cent. in 1961. This increase occurred

principally in the number of private houses being purchased by instalments, the proport-

The proportion of owner-occupied dwellings declined from 48.1 per cent. in 1954 to 47.0 per cent. in 1961. The proportion of tenanted non-government dwellings also declined from 25.9 per cent. in 1954 to 19.4 per cent. in 1961.

ion of which rose from 19.2 per cent. in 1954 to 25.1 per cent. in 1961.

The proportional increases since 1954 were: - purchaser by instalments, 59.0 per cent. and owner, 19.4 per cent. Tenanted non-government dwellings decreased by 8.3 per cent.

The proportion of owned private dwellings was greatest in rural areas (63.4 per cent. in 1961 compared with 61.4 per cent. in 1954) while the proportion of private dwellings being purchased by instalments was greatest in the metropolitan division (30.1 per cent. in 1961 compared with 24.4 per cent. in 1954).

7. <u>Occupied Private Dwellings according to Date of Building</u>. - Table 7 shows date of building of occupied private dwellings as tabulated from the replies given at the 1961 Census.

Of those occupied private dwellings in South Australia where date of building was stated 24.9 per cent. were built after 30th June, 1954. In the Metropolitan Urban division of State 24.0 per cent. were built after 30th June, 1954 while in "Other Urban" and "Rural" the proportions were 35.1 per cent. and 18.5 per cent. respectively.

8.¹ Weekly Rent (Unfurnished) of Tenanted Private Dwellings. - The following table shows the rents paid for unfurnished private dwellings (excluding dwellings occupied by "Tenants (Governmental Housing)" in 1954 and "Tenants (South Australian Housing Trust)" in 1961) in South Australia, as compiled from information supplied on individual Householders' Schedules at 30th June, 1954 and 1961. Of those tenanted private dwellings for which rent (unfurnished) was stated, 52.9 per cent. had rentals below 50s. in 1961 compared with 90.4 per cent. in 1954. In the range 50s. and under 100s. the proportion rose from 9.0 per cent. in 1954 to 31.3 per cent. in 1961. The proportion in the 100s. and over category rose from 0.6 per cent. in 1954 to 15.8 per cent. in 1961.

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In 1961 the greatest number of tenanted private houses were in the rental range 20s. and under 30s. while the greatest number of tenanted flats were in the range 100s. and over.

Dwellings in the higher rent ranges were predominantly in the Metropolitan Area. Whereas the Metropolitan proportion of dwellings with rents under 60s. was only 42.5 per cent., for rents in the range 60s. - 100s. it was 72.9 per cent. and in the range 100s. and over it was 91.7 per cent.

• Occupied Private Dwellings according to Facilities. - Table 9 shows the facilities - as, electricity, television set - recorded for each class of private dwelling in Urban nd Rural Divisions of the State.

The question on facilities was answered for 258,509 occupied private dwellings n South Australia. Of these 134,991 (52.2 per cent.) had electricity but not gas and 15,447 (44.7 per cent.) had both electricity and gas, making a combined total of 50,438 (96.9 per cent.) with electricity. Occupied private dwellings with gas but not lectricity numbered 687 (0.3 per cent.). The proportion of private dwellings with electricity was 99.8 per cent. in Metropolitan Urban, 99.0 per cent. in Other Urban and 85.6 per cent. in the Rural Division. The proportion with both electricity and gas was 65.1 per cent., 13.5 per cent., and 7.1 per cent. respectively.

The number of occupied private dwellings in South Australia stated to have a television set was 125,084 of which 99,979 (79.9 per cent.) were in the Metropolitan Area. In the Metropolitan Area of Adelaide 61.5 per cent. of occupied private dwellings were stated to have a television set.
