INTRODUCTION.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the non-indigenous population and dwellings in the Territory of Papua and New Guinea as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Papua and New Guinea of persons born outside the Territory, nationality, race, religion, industry and occupational status. Dwellings are classified according to class (i.e. private house, flat, etc.), number of rooms, number of inmates, material of outer walls, nature of occupancy, date of building, rent and facilities.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons or of dwellings according to one particular characteristic (e.g., age or conjugal condition of persons or number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage the data in this Bulletin will be published in amplified form in the Detailed Tables of the Census and detailed analyses showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross-tabulations (e.g., the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.) will be available in the Census Division of the Bureau.

All information in this Bulletin is exclusive of particulars of the indigenous population of the Territory.

PART A. - NON-INDIGENOUS POPULATION OF THE TERRITORY OF PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA, CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. <u>Non-indigenous Population in Districts.</u> - The following table shows the population in each district of Papua and New Guinea at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The total non-indigenous population of the combined Territories of Papua and New Guinea increased by 42.7 per cent. between the two Censuses. For Papua the increase was 55.1 per cent. and for New Guinea 35.8 per cent. The increases between 1954 and 1961 in the male and female populations of Papua were 42.0 per cent. and 76.0 per cent. respectively, and for male and female populations of New Guinea, 27.2 per cent. and 50.4 per cent. respectively.

At 30th June, 1961 the masculinity of the combined populations of Papua and New Guinea was 137.1 males per 100 females compared with 165.5 males per 100 females in 1954. For Papua the ratio was 127.6 in 1961 compared with 158.1 in 1954 and for New Guinea 143.6 in 1961 compared with 169.8 in 1954.

2. <u>Age.</u> - Table 2 shows the numbers in each five-year age group for Papua and New Guinea at the 1954 and 1961 Censuses.

The proportion of the non-indigenous population of Papua and New Guinea under 21 years of age was 34.6 per cent. in 1961 compared with 29.5 per cent. in 1954. For ages 21-64 years the proportion was 63.1 per cent. in 1961 compared with 68.2 per cent. in 1954. The proportion of persons aged 65 years and over was 2.3 per cent. at both Censuses. At 30th June, 1961, 54.1 per cent. of the non-indigenous population of Papua and New Guinea were never married (53.6 in 1954); 41.4 per cent. married (41.2 in 1954); 1.3 per cent. married but permanently separated (1.7 in 1954); 2.0 per cent. widowed (2.1 in 1954); and 1.2 per cent. divorced (1.4 in 1954).

At both Censuses "widowed" was the only group in the Territory as a whole where females outnumbered males. The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 172 : 100 in 1954 to 181 : 100 in 1961. The ratio of males to females in the never married group "15 years of age and over" decreased from 356 : 100 in 1954 to 264 : 100 in 1961.

This represented an increase of 57.7 per cent. since 1954 in the number of nonpopulation compared with 26.3 per cent. in 1954. indigenous persons born in the Territory. Of the persons born outside the Territory, those born in the following countries were most numerous: Australia, 48.1 per cent. of the total population (49.7 in 1954); United Kingdom and Ireland,7.5 per cent. (8.4 in 1954); China, 2.6 per cent. (4.2 in 1954); Germany, 2.4 per cent. (1.9 in 1954); and U.S.A., 2.2 per cent. (1.6 in 1954).

Kingdom and Ireland, 402 persons; U.S.A., 281 persons; and Germany, 257 persons. The number of Chinese-born persons decreased by 106. Persons born in the following countries showed the greatest numerical increase since 1954: Australia, 3,354 persons; United

Of those persons born outside the Territory who stated their period of residence, 24.7 per cent. had, at 30th June, 1961 resided in the Territory less than one year and 65.1 per cent. less than seven years. The corresponding figures in 1954 were 28.9 per cent. and 72.0 per cent. respectively.

At 30th June, 1961, 91.1 per cent. of the total non-indigenous population of the Territory and 87.4 per cent. of the oversea-born population were British subjects. The comparable figures for 1954 were 89.2 per cent. and 85.3 per cent. respectively.

American (U.S.) (2.8 per cent. of the total population) was the most numerous of the foreign nationals followed by German (1.9 per cent.) and Chinese (1.8 per cent.).

7. Race. - The following table shows the non-indigenous populations of Papua and New Guinea classified according to race at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At 30th June, 1961, 19,962 persons or 78.8 per cent. of the non-indigenous population of Papua and New Guinea were European. Of these, 8,260 were in Papua and 11,702 in New Guinea. Of the non-indigenous non-European population the Chinese were most numerous with only 24 in Papua. There were also 255 Chinese of mixed blood with one parent European and a further 279 of mixed blood with one parent who was an aboriginal native of the Territory. with 2,319 or 9.2 per cent. of the total population. These were predominantly in New Guinea where there were 2,295 Chinese compared

Papua - New Guinea natives of mixed blood with one parent European numbered 1,127 or 4.4 per cent. of the total non-indigenous population.

8. <u>Religion.</u> - Table 8 sets out the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory) at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 3,166 persons or 12.5 per cent. of the non-indigenous population of Papua and New Guinea who gave no answer to this question in 1961 compared with 2,312 or 13.0 per cent. in 1954.

The Roman Catholic Church had most adherents in 1961 with 7,961. These consisted of 4,951 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 3,010 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. Church of England was next with 6,798 adherents, followed by Methodist, 2,074; Presbyterian, 1,623; and Lutheran, 1,035.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) with 2,496 persons. This was followed by Church of England with an increase of 1,620 persons; Methodist, 599; Lutheran, 541; Presbyterian, 420; and Baptist, 226.

The greatest proportional increase since 1954 among Christian religions which had 100 or more adherents in 1954 was recorded by Baptist, 118.9 per cent. and Lutheran, 109.5 per cent.

The total number of adherents at 30th June, 1961 in all the Christian religions, represented in Papua and New Guinea was 21,716 compared with 15,005 in 1954, representing 98.0 per cent. and 97.2 per cent. of all persons at the respective Censuses who replied to the religion question.

9. <u>Industry.</u> - Table 9 shows the main groups of industry for the non-indigenous male and female populations of Papua and New Guinea at 30th June, 1961 compared with 1954. For industry groups Fublic Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Community and Business Services (including Professional) the figures derived from the 1954 classification have been adjusted to the classification used in 1961.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Community and Business Services (including Professional) which absorbed 3,133 persons (1,794 males and 1,339 females) and represented 22.6 per cent. of the total work force. This was followed by Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services (which was numerically the largest group in 1954), 20.2 per cent. of the total work force; Commerce, 13.8 per cent.; Transport and Storage and Communication, 12.9 per cent.; Building and Construction, 9.1 per cent.; and Primary Production, 8.3 per cent. Community and Business Services (including Professional), and Commerce, second and fourth in numerical importance in 1954 rose to first and third places respectively at 30th June, 1961 displacing Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Transport and Storage and Communication which fell to second and fourth respectively.

There were significant increases since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Community and Business Services (including Professional), Finance and Property, and Commerce. The proportional increases - 83.5 per cent., 70.7 per cent., and 54.7 per cent. respectively - were substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 34.9 per cent. There was a substantial decrease (68.2 per cent.) between Censuses in the number of persons engaged in Mining and Quarrying.

10. <u>Occupational Status</u>. - Table 10 sets out the occupational status of the nonindigenous populations of Papua and New Guinea at 30th June, 1961 compared with the 1954 Census. It shows the capacity in which persons were engaged in the work force, whether as employer, employee, not at work, etc., as well as particulars of those persons not in the work force.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June,1961, 87.0 per cent. were employees (86.5 per cent. in 1954); 6.0 per cent. employers (5.7 per cent. in 1954); and 4.0 per cent. self-employed (6.1 per cent. in 1954).

There was a higher percentage of dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (45.3 per cent.) than in 1954 (42.1 per cent.). The increase of 53.4 per cent. since 1954 in the number of persons not in the work force was greater than the increase in the work force of 34.9 per cent. The proportion of full-time students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954 (15.6 per cent. and 12.6 per cent. respectively). See also Table 2 showing age distribution of the population.

PART B. - DWELLINGS OF THE NON-INDIGENOUS POPULATION IN THE TERRITORY OF PAPUA AND NEW GUINEA, CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

11. <u>Definitions and Scope.</u> - For the purpose of the Census an occupied dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only a part of a building. Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings.

- Private Dwelling: Private dwellings are further classified into the following four categories -
 - <u>Private House</u>: Private Houses include houses, sheds, huts, garages, etc. used for dwelling purposes, and shared private houses for which only one Householder's Schedule was received.
 - Share of Private House: A Share of a Private House is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.
 - Flat: A Flat is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off and which has its own cooking and bathing facilities.
 - Other Private Dwelling: These include private dwellings such as rooms, apartments, etc., which are parts of buildings but are not selfcontained units.
- Other than Private Dwelling: These include Hotels; Motels; Boarding Houses, Lodging Houses and Hostels; Educational, Religious and Charitable Institutions; Hospitals; Defence and Penal Establishments; Police and Fire Stations; Clubs; Staff Barracks and Quarters, etc.

<u>Unoccupied Dwellings</u> consist mainly of dwellings whose usual occupants were temporarily absent on the night of the Census; they also include newly completed dwellings awaiting occupation.

12. <u>Summary of Population and Dwellings.</u> - The following table is a summary of the population and dwellings (as defined above) in Papua and New Guinea at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

While the non-indigenous population of Papua and New Guinea increased by 42.7 per cent. since 1954 the number of occupied dwellings increased by 56.5 per cent. In Papua population increased by 55.1 per cent. and occupied dwellings by 71.5 per cent. and in New Guinea the corresponding percentages were 35.8 and 48.7. 13. <u>Dwellings in Districts.</u> - The following table shows the number of occupied and uncocupied dwellings in each District of Papua and New Guinea at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

Private houses constituted 90.1 per cent. and flats, 6.8 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in Papua and New Guinea at 30th June, 1961 compared with 96.0 per cent. and 2.2 per cent. respectively in 1954. The number of flats increased by 380.0 per cent. since 1954. The total number of occupied private dwellings increased by 58.1 per cent.

15. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Material of Outer Walls. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to material of outer walls as recorded at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At both Censuses wood was the most frequently used material for outer walls in Papua and New Guinea. At 30th June, 1961 it was used in 47.9 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in the Territory (with stated material of outer walls) compared with 32.2 per cent. in 1954. Private dwellings with outer walls of fibro-cement were second in numerical importance in 1961 and 1954, representing 33.2 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in 1961 and 27.5 per cent. in 1954.

The proportion of private dwellings with outer walls of bush materials dropped from 13.7 per cent. in 1954 to 7.6 per cent. in 1961. The proportion with outer walls of iron also dropped from 19.4 per cent. to 7.1 per cent.

16. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Number of Rooms. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to number of rooms at the Censuse's of 1954 and 1961.

In Papua and New Guinea the numbers of five; six and seven roomed private dwellings showed the most important increases since 1954. They increased by 104.0 per cent., 106.7 per cent. and 134.9 per cent. respectively.

Five roomed private dwellings were most numerous at the 1961 Census, whereas, in 1954, four roomed dwellings predominated. Dwellings with five rooms represented 30.8 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings with stated number of rooms in 1961.

The average number of rooms per private house increased from 4.26 in 1954 to 4.68 in 1961. At 30th June, 1961 the average number of rooms for each of the other classe of private dwelling was less than in 1954.

In Papua and New Guinea the numbers of private dwellings with five and six inmates underwent the greatest proportional increases since 1954. The increases of 84.3 per cent.

and 102.3 per cent. respectively were due almost entirely to increases of 81.4 per cent.

and 107.3 per cent. in the numbers of private houses with five and six inmates.

Dwellings with six or more inmates increased by 75.4 per cent. between Censuses while those with less than six increased by 56.4 per cent.

At 30th June, 1961 dwellings with less than six inmates represented 90.2 per cent. of total occupied private dwellings compared with 91.2 per cent. in 1954.

In the Territory as a whole two-inmate dwellings were the most numerous at both Censuses accounting for 25.3 per cent. in 1961 and 25.8 per cent in 1954. However, in New Guinea, one-inmate dwellings were slightly more numerous than two-inmate dwellings at each Census.

The average number of inmates per private house increased from 2.97 in 1954 to 3.12 in 1961. At 30th June, 1961 the average number of inmates for each of the other classes of private dwelling was less than in 1954.

Weekly Rent (Unfurnished) of Tenanted Private Dwellings. - The following table shows the rents paid for unfurnished private dwellings in Papua and New Guinea as compiled from information supplied on individual Householders' Schedules at 30th June, 1954 and 1961. Of those tenanted private dwellings for which rent (unfurnished) was stated, 54.5 per cent. had rentals below 50s. in 1961 compared with 77.9 per cent. in

1954. In the range 50s. and under 100s. the proportion rose from 17.2 per cent. in 1954 to 24.5 per cent. in 1961. The corresponding proportion in the 100s. and over category rose from 4.9 per cent. in 1954 to 21.0 per cent. in 1961. In 1961 the greatest number of tenanted private houses were in the rental range under 20s. while the greatest number of tenanted flats were in the range 100s. and over.

21. <u>Occupied Private Dwellings according to Facilities.</u> - Table 20 shows the facilities - gas and electricity - recorded for each class of private dwelling in Papua and New Guinea.

The question on facilities was answered for 7,015 occupied private dwellings. Of these 5,559 (79.3 per cent.) had electricity without gas and 73 (1.0 per cent.) had both electricity and gas, making a combined total of 5,632 (80.3 per cent.) with electricity. Occupied private dwellings without electricity or gas numbered 1,379 (19.7 per cent.).
