SUMMARY OF POPULATION FOR VICTORIA

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INTRODUCTION

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population of Victoria as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole, being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status.

These data for each city, town, borough and shire and each non-municipal town of 1,000 persons or more will appear in Part I. - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas, etc., of Volume II. - Victoria, of the Detailed Tables of the Census of 30th June, 1961. This publication is in course of preparation and will be printed as soon as possible.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons according to one particular characteristic (e.g., age, conjugal condition, etc.). A Bulletin on Dwellings (Census Bulletin No. 17 - Summary of Dwellings for Victoria) was issued on 10th August, 1962 and at a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g., the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups, etc. and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

Census Bulletin No. 2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was issued on 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in each major town arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood Aboriginals.

POPULATION OF VICTORIA CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. Population - Urban, Rural, Etc. - The following table shows the urban, rural and migratory population of Victoria at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

"Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Melbourne and adjacent municipalities and shires within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to (i) all separately incorporated cities and towns outside the Metropolitan Urban Division, except for any portions within the city or town which were specifically regarded as rural for Census purposes or where the population of the whole town was less than 1,000; and (ii) other towns, not separately incorporated with a population of 1,000 persons or more. "Rural" relates to the remainder of the State. "Migratory" refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961 were on ships in Victorian waters or on long-distance trains, motor coaches or airoraft.

The figures shown for Divisions of State at the 1954 Census have been adjusted to the boundaries used in 1961.

The total population of Victoria increased by 19.5 per cent. between the 1954 and 1961 Censuses. The increase for males was 19.8 per cent. and for females 19.2 per cent.

The excess of females over males in the Metropolitan Urban division of State fell from 28,767 in 1954 to 12,457 in 1961. In "Other Urban" it fell from 3,066 to 1,531. At 30th June, 1961 the masculinity of the "Metropolitan Urban" population was 98.7 males per 100 females compared with 99.5 in "Other Urban" and 114.5 in "Rural". For the State as a whole the masculinity of the population increased from 100.8 in 1954 to 101.3 in 1961.

The proportion of the total population in the Metropolitan Urban division of State rose from 62.5 per cent. in 1954 to 65.2 in 1961. The proportions in the Other Urban and Rural divisions fell from 19.9 per cent. and 17.3 per cent. respectively in 1954 to 19.6 per cent. and 15.0 per cent. respectively in 1961.

2. Age. - The following table shows the numbers in each five-year age group at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The proportion of the total population under 21 years of age was 38.7 per cent. in 1961 compared with 35.1 per cent. in 1954. For ages 21-64 years the proportion was 52.7 per cent. in 1961 compared with 56.3 per cent. in 1954 and for persons aged 65 years and over 8.6 per cent. compared with 8.6 per cent.

At the 1961 Census males exceeded females in number in each age group under 60 years, females exceeding males in all higher age groups.

3. <u>Conjugal Condition</u>. - The following table shows the population of Victoria classified according to conjugal condition at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At the 1961 Census 47.8 per cent. of the population were never married (46.3 per cent. in 1954); 45.2 per cent. married (46.4 per cent. in 1954); 1.4 per cent. married but permanently separated (1.3 per cent. in 1954); 5.0 per cent. widowed (5.3 per cent. in 1954); and 0.6 per cent. divorced (0.7 per cent. in 1954).

The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 321: 100 in 1954 to 362: 100 in 1961. The ratio of males to females in the never married group "15 years of age and over" increased from 131: 100 in 1954 to 136: 100 in 1961.

The Australian-born portion of the total population declined between Censuses from 85.0 per cent. in 1954 to 80.6 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand the proportion of European-born persons to total population rose from 13.6 per cent. in 1954 to 17.7 per cent. in 1961. Included in the 17.7 per cent. European-born were: United Kingdom, 7.0 per cent. (7.0 per cent. in 1954); Italy, 3.1 per cent. (1.7 per cent. in 1954); Germany, 1.3 per cent. (0.9 per cent. in 1954); and Netherlands, 1.2 per cent. (0.7 per cent. in 1954).

Birthplace. - The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of Victoria at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

Of the European countries listed in the table the largest increases since 1954 occurred in respect of the following: Italy, 48,400 persons; United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland, 34,801 persons; Greece, 24,015 persons; and Netherlands, 20,228 persons.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Table 4.

5. Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia. - The post-war migration flow into Australia is reflected in the following table which classifies the oversea-born population of Victoria according to period of residence in Australia. Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence, 218,326 in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in 1961, 236,930 had been resident less than 7 years.

6. <u>Nationality (i.e. Allegiance)</u>. - At 30th June, 1961, 2,724,266 persons or 93.0 per cent. of the population of Victoria were British subjects compared with 2,315,798 persons or 94.4 per cent. in 1954. Since 1954 the number of foreign nationals increased by 69,304 (50.8 per cent.).

Of the 569,782 oversea-born population 363,935 (or 63.9 per cent.) were British subjects (63.0 per cent. in 1954), while the remainder, 205,847 (36.1 per cent.) owed foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in Victoria at 30th June, 1961 were: Italian, 68,396; Greek, 28,072; Dutch, 27,578; and German, 23,895. The decreases between Censuses, in the numbers of Latvian, Lithuanian, Estonian, Polish and Ukrainian nationals would indicate that any excess of arrivals over departures was counteracted by the decrease due to naturalization (and death).

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as shown in Table 6.

There were 315,050 persons or 10.8 per cent. of the population who gave no reply to the question in 1961 compared with 243,555 or 9.9 per cent. in 1954.

Church of England, with 893,160 had most adherents in 1961 followed by the Catholic Church with 762,734 consisting of 250,822 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 511,912 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. The Presbyterian Church had 367,346 adherents; Methodist, 275,205; Greek Orthodox, 54,823; and Baptist, 38,627.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) with 199,080. This was followed by Church of England with an increase of 60,687 persons; Presbyterian, 39,924; Greek Orthodox; 34,702; Methodist, 22,403; and Lutheran, 12,475.

The greatest proportional increases among Christian religions since 1954 were recorded by Greek Orthodox, 172.5 per cent.; Lutheran, 54.5 per cent.; Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described), 35.3 per cent; Seventh Day Adventist, 28.0 per cent.; and Salvation Army, 19.4 per cent. Among non-Christian religions, the Hebrew religion, with 29,932 adherents in 1961, had increased by 24.6 per cent. since the 1954 Census.

The total number of adherents at 30th June, 1961 in all the Christian religions represented in Victoria was 2,564,811 compared with 2,171,032 in 1954. Adherents to Christian religions represented 98.1 per cent. of all persons who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 98.3 per cent. at the 1954 Census.

^{7.} Religion. - The following table sets out the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

8. <u>Industry.</u> - The following table shows the main groups of industry for the male and female population of Victoria at 30th June, 1961 compared with 1954. For industry groups Finance and Property, Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Community and Business Services (including Professional) the figures derived from the 1954 classification have been adjusted to the classification used in 1961.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Manufacturing which absorbed 379,691 persons (280,465 males and 99,226 females) and represented 31.4 per cent. of the total work force (32.7 per cent. in 1954). This was followed by Commerce, 15.7 per cent. of the total work force (15.5 per cent. in 1954); Community and Business Services (including Professional), 9.6 per cent. (7.7 per cent. in 1954); Primary Production, 9.1 per cent. (11.2 per cent. in 1954); Building and Construction, 8.4 per cent. (8.2 per cent. in 1954); and Transport and Storage and Communication, 7.8 per cent. (8.2 per cent. in 1954). The group Community and Business Services (including Professional), sixth in numerical importance in 1954 rose to third place in 1961. The groups Primary Production, and Transport and Storage and Communication fell from third and fourth places respectively in 1954 to fourth and sixth places respectively in 1961.

The highest proportional increases since 1954 were in the number of persons engaged in Finance and Property, Community and Business Services (including Professional), and Electricity, Gas, Water and Sanitary Services. These groups grew by 53.1 per cent., 43.3 per cent., and 26.9 per cent. respectively which was substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 15.9 per cent. There was a decrease of 5.8 per cent. since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Primary Production.

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 8.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June, 1961, 79.2 per cent. were employees (80.0 per cent. in 1954); 10.0 per cent. self-employed (11.4 per cent. in 1954); and 6.0 per cent. employers (6.6 per cent. in 1954).

There was a higher percentage of dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (58.7 per cent.) than in 1954 (57.4 per cent.). The increase since 1954 in the number of persons not in the work force (22.2 per cent.) was greater than the increase in the work force (15.9 per cent.). The proportion of fulltime students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954 (21.2 per cent. and 17.4 per cent. respectively).
