## INTRODUCIT ON

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population of New South Wales as enumerated at the Census of 30 th June, 1961. It is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole, being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to ageg conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status.

These data for each municipality and shire and each non-municipal town of 1,000 persons or more will appear in Part I. - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas, etc., of Volume I. - New South Wales, of the Detailed Tables of the Census of 30th June, 1961. This publication is in course of preparation and will be printed as soon as possible.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons according to one particular characteristio (e.g.,age, conjugal condition, etc.). A Bulletin on Dwellings (Census Bulletin No. 18 - Sumary of Dwellings for New South Wales) was issued on 3rd September, 1962 and at a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g., the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups, etc, and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, eto.).

Census Bulletin No. 2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was issued on 14 th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in each major town arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood Aboriginals.

1. Population - Urban, Rural, Etc. - The following table shows the urban, rural and migratory population of New South Wales at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.
"Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Sydney and adjacent municipalities and shires within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to (i) all separately incorporated municipalities outside the Metropolitan Urban Division, except for any portions within the municipalities which were specifically regarded as rural for Census purposes or where the population of the whole municipality was less than 1,000; and (ii) other towns, not separately incorporated with a population of 1,000 persons or more. "Rural" relates to the remainder of the State. "Migratory" refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated who at midnight between 29 th and 30 th June, 1961 were on ships in New South Wales waters or on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

The figures shown for Divisions of State at the 1954 Census have been adjusted to the boundaries used in 1961.

The total population of New South Wales increased by 14.4 per cent. between the 1954 and 1961 Censuses. The increase for males was 14.6 per cent. and for females 14.2 per cent.

The excess of females over males in the Metropolitan Urban division of State fell from 43,205 in 1954 to 27,432 in 1961. At 30th June, 1961 the masculinity of the "Metropolitan Urban" population was 97.5 males per 100 females compared with 100.7 in "Other Urban" and 117.5 in "Rural". For the State as a whole the masculinity of the population increased from 101.1 in 1954 to 101.5 in 1961.

The proportions of the total population in the Metropolitan Urban and Other Urban divisions of State rose from 54.4 per cent. and 28.7 per cent. respectively in 1954 to 55.7 per cent. and 29.4 per cent. respectively in 1961. The proportion in the Rural Division fell from 16.7 per cent. to 14.6 per cent. There was a decrease of 512 between Censuses in the number of persons in the Rural Division.

The total population of New South Wales increased by 14.4 per cent. between the 1954 and 1961 Censuses. The increase for males was 14.6 per cent. and for females 14.2 per cent.

The excess of females over males in the Metropolitan Urban division of State fell from 43, 205 in 1954 to 27,432 in 1961. At 30 th June, 1961 the masculinity of the "Netropolitan Urban" population was 97.5 males per 100 females compared with 100.7 in "Other Urban" and 117.5 in "Rural". For the State as a whole the masculinity of the population increased from 101.1 in 1954 to 101.5 in 1961.

The proportions of the total population in the Metropolitan Urban and Other Urban divisions of State rose from 54.4 per cent. and 28.2 per cent. respectively in 1954 to 55.7 per cent. and 29.4 per cent. respectively in 1961. The proportion in the Rural Division fell from 17.2 per cent. to 14.6 per cent. There was a decrease of 16,976 between Censuses in the number of persons in the Rural Division.

The proportion of the total population under 21 years of age was 38.1 per cent. in 1961 compared with 35.8 per cent. in 1954. For ages $21-64$ years the proportion was 53.1 per cent. in 1961 compared with 55.7 per cent. in 1954 and for persons aged 65 years and over 8.8 per cent. compared with 8.5 per cent.

At the 1961 Census males exceeded females in number in each age group wader 60 years, females exceeding males in all higher age groups.
3. Conjugal Condition. - The following table shows the population of New South Weles olassified acoording to conjugal condition at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At the 1961 Census 47.0 per cent. of the population were never married (46.2 per cent. in 1954); 45.2 per cent. married (46.0 per cent. in 1954); t.5 per cent. married but permanently separater ( 1.5 per cent. in 1954); 5.3 per cent. widowed ( 5.4 per cent. in 1954) ; an 1.0 per cent. divorced ( 0.9 per cento in 1954).

The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 321 : 100 in 1954 to 360 : 100 in 1961. The ratio of males to females in the never married group "15, years of age and over" increased from 137: 100 in 1954 to $142: 100$ in 196\%.

The Australian-born portion of the total population deolined between
Censuses from 86.5 per cent. in 1954 to 84.0 per cent. in 1961 . On the other hand the proportion of European-born persons to total population rose from 11.8 per cent. in 1954 to 13.9 per cent. in 1961. Included in the 13.9 per oent. European-born were: United Kingdom, 6.9 per cent. ( 7.2 per cent. in 1954) ; Italy, 1.6 per cent. ( 0.9 per cent. in 1954); Germany, 0.9 per cent. ( 0.6 per cent. in 1954); and Netherlands, 0.7 per cent. ( 0.5 per cent. in 1954).

Of the European countries listed in the table the largest increases since 1954 occurred in respect of the following: Italy, 32,414 persons; United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland, 21,914 persons; Greece, 17,576 persons; and Germany, 16,385 persons.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Tabie 4.
5. Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia. - The post-war migration flow into Australia is reflected in the following table which classifies the oversec - Jorn popuiation of New South Wales scording to period of residence in Australia. Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence, 213, 345 in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in $1961,221,137$ had been resident less than 7 years.

6. Nationality (i.e. Allegiance). - At 30th June, 1961, 3,740,147 persons or 95.5 rex cent. of the population of New South Wales were British subjects compared with 3,294, 137 persons or 96.2 per cent. in 1954. Since 1954 the number of foreign nationals troreassd. ty 47,474 ( 36.7 per cent.).

Of the 626,847 oversea - born population 449,981 (or 71.8 per cent.) were British subjects ( 72.1 per cent. in 1954), while the remainder, 176,866 ( 28.2 per cento) owed. foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in New South Wales at 30th June, 1961 weres Italian, 42,554; Greek, 20,967; Dutch, 20,942; and German 20,777. The decreasea between Censuses, in the numbers of Latvian, Lithuanian and Estonian, Polish and Ukrajnian nationals would indicate that any excess of arrivals over departures was counterated by the decrease due to naturalization (and death).

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as show in Table 6.

7．Religion．－The following table sets out the religions of those persons who answered this question（which is not obligatory），at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 388,024 persons or 9.9 per cent．of the population who gave no reply to the question in 1961 compared with 301,203 or 8.8 per cent，in 1954．

Churoh of England，with 1，556，965 had most adherents in 1961 followed by the Roman Catholic Church with $1,031,782$ consisting of 476,127 who described themselves as ＂Roman Catholic＂and 555，655 as＂Catholic＂．It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church．The Presbyterian Church had 333，635 adherents；Methodist，294，280；Greek Orthodox，57．852；and Baptíst，50，805．

Of those who stated their religious belief，the greatest numerioal increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic（so described）with 187．329。 This was followed by Church of England with an increase of 90,394 persons；Presbyterian， 30，651；Greek Orthodox，28，719；Wethodist，19，092；and Baptisさ，10，522．

The greatest proportional increases among Christian religions since 1954 were recorded by Greek Orthodox， 98.6 per cent．；Lutheran， 61.6 per cento；Baptist， 26.1 per cent．；Roman Catholic and Catholic（so desoribed）， 22.2 per cent．；Churches of Christ， 22.0 per cent．and Salvation Army， 22.0 per cent．Among non－Christian religions，the Hebrew religion，with 24,026 adherents in 1961，increased by 22.7 per cent．since the 1954 Census．

The total number of adherents at 30 th June， 1961 in all the Christian religions represented in New South Weles was 3，479，371 compared with 3，085，808 in 19540 Adherents to Christian religions represented 98.6 per cent．of all persons who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 98.8 per cent。at the 1954 Census．

8. Industry. - The following table shows the main groups of industry for the male and female population of New South Wales at 30th June, 1961 compared with 1954. For industry groups Finance and Property, Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, and Commuity and Business Services (including Professional) the figures derived from the 1954 classification have been adjusted to the classification used in 1961.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Manufacturing which absorbed 462,643 persons ( 357,296 males and 105,347 females) and represented 28.9 per cent. of the total work force ( 29.1 per cent. in 1954). This was followed by Commerce, 16.2 per cent. of the total work force ( 15.8 per cent. in 1954) ; Community and Business Services (inoluding Professional), 9.6 per cent. (8.1 per cent. in 1954); Primary Production, 8.9 per cent. (11.2 per cent. in 1954); Transport and Storage and Communication, 8.7 per cent. ( 9.3 per cent. in 1954) ; and Building and Construction, 8.6 per oent. ( 8.3 per cent. in 1954). The group Community and Business Services (including Professional), sixth in numerical importance in 1954 rose to third place in 1961. The groups Primary Production, and Transport and Storage and Communication fell from third and fourth places respectively in 1954 to fourth and fifth places respectively in 1961.

The highest proportional increases since 1954 were in the number of persons engaged in Finance and Property, Community and Business Services (including Professional), and Electricity, Gas, Water and Sanitary Services. These groups grew by 49.3 per cent., 34.8 per cent., and 26.3 per cent. respectively which was substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 13.9 per cent. There was a decrease since 1954 of 24.8 per cent. and 10.3 per cent. respectively in the numbers of persons engaged in Mining and Quarrying, and Primary Production.

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 8.

9．Occupational Stataso－The following table gives details of the Occupational Status of the population of New South Wales at 30th June， 1961 compared with the 1954 Census．It shows the capacity in which persons were engaged in the work force，whether as employer， ．employee，not at work，etoog as well as particulars of those persons not in the work force．

Of the total persons in the work forge at 30 施 June， 1961.81 .0 per cent．were employees（ 81.1 per cent。in 1954）； 8.7 per cent。 self－employed（ 10.0 per cent．in 1954）；and 6．0 per cent．empioyers（ 6.5 per oent．in 1954）．

There was a higher percentage of dependent popuiation（i．e．persons not in the work force）to total population in 1951 （ 59.1 per eento）than in 1954 （58．9 per cent．）。 The increase since 1954 in the number of persons not in the work force（ 14.8 per cent．） was slightly greater than the increase in the work force（ 13.9 per cento）．The proportion of full－time students or children attending school to total popuiation was greater in 1961 than in 1954 （20．7 per cent。 and 18.5 per cent。respectively）See also Table 2．－ Age Distribution of the Population．
