SUMMARY OF POPULATION AND DWELLINGS FOR THE TERRITORY OF NAURU.

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INTRODUCTION.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population and dwellings of the Territory of Nauru as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961.

In the Census of 30th June, 1954, no account was taken of the characteristics of the indigenous population, which then numbered 1,828 persons. The 1961 Census embraced both the indigenous and non-indigenous population of the Territory but comparison between this and the previous Census of the characteristics of population is made only with the non-indigenous inhabitants.

This Bulletin is one of a series of Census Bulletins for the States and Territories and for Australia as a whole being issued as information becomes available from the first phase of machine tabulation. The information herein may be subject to minor amendment on completion of later tabulations. A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Nauru of persons born outside Nauru, nationality, race, religion, industry and occupational status. Dwellings are classified according to class (i.e. private house, hospital, etc.), and private houses according to number of rooms, number of inmates, material of outer walls, nature of occupancy, date of building, rent and facilities.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons or of dwellings according to one particular characteristic (e.g., age or conjugal condition of persons or number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage the data in this Bulletin will be published in amplified form in the Detailed Tables of the Census and detailed analyses showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g., the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups and the number of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.) will be available in the Census Division of the Bureau.

PART A. - POPULATION OF THE TERRITORY OF NAURU,
CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. Age. - The following table shows the numbers of each sex in each five-year age group of the non-indigenous population at the 1954 Census and of the indigenous and non-indigenous population at the 1961 Census.

The proportion under 21 years of age of the total non-indigenous population was 23.6 per cent. in 1961 compared with 26.4 per cent. in 1954. For ages 21-64 years the proportion was 75.9 per cent. in 1961 compared with 73.0 per cent. in 1954 and for persons aged 65 years and over 0.5 per cent. compared with 0.6 per cent.

Because of the labour requirements of the phosphate industry, non-indigenous males in the working age group formed 71.9 per cent. of the total non-indigenous population in 1961 compared with 66.6 per cent. in 1954.

The sex distribution of the total non-indigenous population showed a male surplus of 1,328 in 1961 and 893 in 1954, the ratio of the sexes being 401.8 males per 100 females in 1961 and 337.5 males per 100 females in 1954. The ratio of the sexes of the indigenous population was 108.4 males per 100 females in 1961.

2. Conjugal Condition. - The following table shows the population of Nauru classified according to sex and conjugal condition.

At the 1961 Census 56.9 per cent. of the non-indigenous population were never married (50.3 per cent. in 1954); 40.9 per cent. married (45.5 per cent. in 1954); 0.4 per cent. married but permanently separated (0.1 per cent. in 1954); 1.6 per cent. widowed (3.4 per cent. in 1954); and 0.2 per cent. divorced (0.7 per cent. in 1954).

At the 1961 Census, of the indigenous population 69.8 per cent. were never married, 25.8 per cent. married, 0.8 per cent. married but permanently separated, 3.4 per cent. widowed and 0.2 per cent. divorced.

3. Birthplace. - The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of Nauru.

Of the total indigenous population 98.5 per cent. were born in Nauru, 8.0 per cent. of the non-indigenous population at the 1961 Census compared to 4.0 per cent. in 1954.

Of the non-indigenous population, those having the following birthplaces were the most numerous: Pacific Islands (other than Australian Territories and New Zealand), 44.7 per cent. in 1954); China, 23.4 per cent. (23.3 per cent. in 1954); Australia, 9.4 per cent. (11.6 per cent. in 1954); Hong Kong, 7.4 per cent. in 1954). Of persons born in China, Hong Kong and the Pacific Islands, males were greatly in excess of females.

4. Period of Residence. - The following table shows the period of residence in Nauru of persons born outside Nauru.

Of the non-indigenous persons born outside Nauru who stated their period of residence at the 1961 Census, 21.8 per cent. had resided on the Island less than one year (26.1 per cent. in 1954); 49.2 per cent. less than three years (44.3 per cent. in 1954); and 81.9 per cent. less than seven years (74.1 per cent. in 1954).

5. Nationality (i.e. Allegiance). - The following table sets out the main nationalities in Nauru at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

Of the total non-indigenous population, 73.0 per cent. were British subjects (66.4 per cent. in 1954) and 23.3 per cent. were of Chinese nationality (33.5 per cent. in 1954).

6. Race. - At Census date in 1961, 409 persons (245 males and 164 females) representing 18.5 per cent. of the non-indigenous population were of European race compared with 262 persons or 15.9 per cent. in 1954. Of the remaining non-indigenous population, 1,063 were of Pacific Islands race or 48.1 per cent. in 1961 (828 persons or 50.3 per cent. in 1954) and 715 were of Chinese race or 32.4 per cent. (550 persons or 33.4 per cent. in 1954).

7. Religion. - The following table shows the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the 1961 Census. Of the indigenous population 7.9 per cent., and of the non-indigenous population 34.4 per cent. compared with 33.5 per cent. in 1954, declined to answer this question.

The Congregational Church in Nauru had most adherents at 30th June, 1961 followed by the Roman Catholic Church presuming that the great majority of those who described themselves as "Catholic" were members of the Roman Catholic Church.

8. Industry. - Table 8 shows the main groups of industry for the male and female population of Nauru.

Mining and Quarrying accounted for 88.5 per cent. of the total work force of the non-indigenous population at 30th June, 1961 compared with 93.2 per cent. in 1954.

Community and Business Services absorbed 25.7 per cent. of the total work force of the indigenous population at 30th June, 1961 followed by Building and Construction with 19.1 per cent., Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services 16.9 per cent., Mining and Quarrying 16.6 percent.

9. Occupational Status. - Table 9 shows the capacity in which persons were engaged in the work force, whether as employer, employee, not at work, etc., as well as particulars of those persons not in the work force.

At 30th June, 1961 all persons except three, two indigenous and one non-indigenous, at work in Nauru gave their occupational status as employee. Of the total indigenous population 77.2 per cent. were dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force), and of the non-indigenous population 26.9 per cent. compared with 31.9 per cent. in 1954 were dependent population.

PART B. - DWELLINGS IN THE TERRITORY OF NAURU,
CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

10. Definitions and Scope. - For the purpose of the Census an occupied dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only a part of a building. Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings.

Private Dwellings in Nauru comprise only private houses (including sheds, huts, etc.)

Other than Private Dwellings in Nauru are Educational and Religious Institutions, Hospitals, a Penal Establishment and Staff Barracks and Quarters.

Unoccupied Dwellings consist mainly of dwellings whose usual occupants were temporarily absent on the night of the Census; they also include newly completed dwellings awaiting occupation.

The detailed information in this Part relates to private houses occupied at the date of the Census. However, the number of dwellings other than private is given in Table 11. The number of unoccupied dwellings is shown in Table 10.

11. Summary of Population and Dwellings. - The following table is a summary of the population and dwellings (as defined above) in the Territory of Nauru at 30th June, 1961.
