## SUMMARY OF POPULATION FOR TASMANIA

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# INTRODUCTION

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population of Tasmania as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. The figures herein have been obtained from machine tabulation and extensive amendment is not anticipated. Similar bulletins will be issued for each State and other Territories, and Australia as a whole, as the information becomes available. A list of those already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status.

**Part I.** - Analysis of Population in Local Government Areas, etc., of Volume  $\underline{VI_{\circ}}$  - Tasmania, of the detailed tables of the Census of 30th June, 1961, containing this data for each municipality and each non-municipal town of 750 persons or more is in course of preparation and will be printed as soon as possible.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons according to one particular characteristic (e.g. age, conjugal condition, etc.). A Bulletin similar to this will shortly be issued on Dwellings, and at a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g. the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups, etc. and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

Census Bulletin No.2. - Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, which was released on 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in the major towns arranged according to the Statistical Division in which they are situated.

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood Aboriginals.

# POPULATION OF TASMANIA CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961

1. Population - Urban, Rural, Etc. - The following table shows the urban, rural and migratory population of Tasmania at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

For the 1961 Census "Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Hobart and adjoining municipal areas within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to all other cities and towns with a population of 750 persons or more, and "Rural" to the remainder of the State. "Migratory" refers to persons not elsewhere enumerated, who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961, were on ships in Tasmanian waters or on long-distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

The figures shown for the 1954 Census have been adjusted to conform to the boundaries used in 1961.

The total population of Tasmania increased by 13.5 per cent. in the period betwee the 1954 and 1961 Censuses, the increase for males being 13.0 per cent. and that for females 13.9 per cent.

The sex distribution of the population of Tasmania showed a male surplus of 4,916 and the ratio of the sexes was 102.8 males per 100 females, compared with 103.6 males per 100 females in 1954. In the "Metropolitan Urban" and "Other Urban" divisions of State in 1961 there was a female surplus, the ratio of the sexes being 97.9 males per 100 females, and 99.0 males per 100 females respectively. On the other hand, the "Rural" division of State showed a marked male surplus, viz., 112.7 males for every 100 females.

2. Age. - The following table shows the numbers of each sex in each five-year age group at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The proportion of persons in the younger age groups increased between the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. Persons in the age group O-14 years represented 33.5 per cent. of the total population of Tasmania at 30th June, 1961, compared with 31.6 per cent. in 1954, while persons under 21 years of age constituted 42.8 per cent. in 1961 compared with 40.0 per cent. in 1954.

All age groups showed an increase in numbers since 1954, with the exception of the groups 25-29 years and 30-34 years which decreased by 10.2 per cent. and 2.1 per cent. respectively during the intercensal period.

At the 1961 Census males exceeded females in number in each age group under 60 years, females exceeding males in all higher age groups. In 1954 the excess of females began at 55-59 years.

3. <u>Conjugal Condition.</u> - The following table shows the population of Tasmania classified according to sex and conjugal condition.

(a) In processing the 1961 Census data a conjugal condition was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

At the 1961 Census 50.0 per cent. of all those who stated their conjugal condition were recorded as being never married (compared with 49.4 per cent. in 1954); 43.7 per cent. as married (44.1 in 1954); 1.2 per cent. as married but permanently separated (1.2 in 1954); 4.4 per cent. as widowed (4.5 in 1954); and 0.7 per cent. as divorced (0.6 in 1954).

The ratio of widowed females to widowed males increased from 266 : 100 in 1954 to 308 : 100 in 1961. The ratio of never married males 15 years of age and over to never married females 15 years of age and over showed no appreciable change between Censuses (about 140 : 100 at both).

4. <u>Birthplace</u>. - The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of Tasmania at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

At the 30th June, 1961, the Australian-born population of Tasmania represented 90.6 per cent. of the total population, compared with 91.5 per cent. in 1954. Europeanborn persons constituted 8.5 per cent. of the Tasmanian population in 1961, compared with 7.7 per cent. in 1954. The main components of the European-born percentage (with 1954 figures in brackets) were : United Kingdon and Ireland, 4.8 per cent. (4.6 per cent.); Netherlands, 1.0 per cent. (0.8 per cent.); Germany. 0.6 per cent. (0.6 per cent.); Poland, 0.5 per cent. (0.5 per cent.); and Italy, 0.4 per cent. (0.3 per cent.).

In the period between the Censuses of 1954 and 1961 the largest increase in numbers of oversea-born persons in Tasmania occurred in respect of the following countries:- United Kingdom and Ireland, 2,592 persons; Netherlands, 1,211 persons; Italy, 561 persons; and Germany, 429 persons. Persons born in Greece, although relatively small in absolute numbers, showed the largest proportional increase having more than tripled their numbers (increased 224.0 per cent.) since 1954.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Table 4.

5. <u>Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia.</u> - The effect of the post-war immigration policy is reflected in the following table which sets out details of the period of residence in Australia of persons in Tasmania born outside Australia. Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence 66.1 per cent. in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in 1961 only 33.8 per cent. had been resident less than 7 years.

6. <u>Nationality (i.e. Allegiance)</u>. - At the 30th June, 1961, 342,399 persons or 97.7 per cent. of the population of Tasmania were British subjects compared with 299,922 persons or 97.1 per cent. in 1954. The number of foreign nationals decreased from 8,830 in 1954 to 7,941 in 1961.

Of the 32,897 persons constituting the oversea-born population 24,956 (or 75.9 per cent.) were British subjects (compared with 66.5 per cent. in 1954), while the remainder, 7,941 (or 24.1 per cent.), owed foreign allegiance.

The most numerous foreign nationals in Tasmania at 30th June, 1961, were: -Dutch, 2,241; German, 1,224; Italian, 1,214; and Polish, 649.

In the intercensal period 1954-1961 the only foreign nationalities listed in the table to show an increase were Greek, Italian and Yugoslavian. The decreases shown for other foreign nationalities would indicate that any excess of arrivals over departures was counteracted by the decrease due to naturalization (and death).

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as shown in Table 6.

7. <u>Religion.</u> - The following table sets out particulars of the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 35,997 persons or 10.3 per cent. of the population of Tasmania who gave no reply to this question in 1961 compared with 27,697 or 9.0 per cent. in 1954.

The denominations with the largest number of adherents in 1961 were Church of England with 159,101, and the Roman Catholic Church with 63,993 consisting of 26,288 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 37,705 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. The Methodist Church had 42,236 adherents; Presbyterian, 16,757; Baptist, 7,227; and Congregational, 4,193.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Church of England. These increased by 11,694 persons followed by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described) with an increase of 10,951 persons Methodist, 4,000; Presbyterian, 1,150; Baptist, 934; and Lutheran, 509. Those with indefinite beliefs increased by 970 persons.

The greatest proportional increase among Christian religions since 1954 was recorded by Greek Orthodox, 70.2 per cent.; Lutheran, 48.7 per cent.; Salvation Army, 27.6 per cent.; Seventh Day Adventist, 22.4 per cent.; and Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described), 20.6 per cent.

The total number of adherents, at the 30th June, 1961, in all the Christian religions represented in Tasmania was 311,534, compared with 279,487 in 1954. Adherents to Christian religions represented 99.1 per cent. of all persons in Tasmania who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 99.4 per cent. at the 1954 Census.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Manufacturing, which absorbed 29,534 persons (representing 22.6 per cent. of the total work force), and comprised 24,274 males and 5,260 females. This was followed by Commerce, 15.7 per cent. of the total work force; Primary Production, 13.1 per cent.; Building and Construction, 10.2 per cent.; Community and Business Services (including Professional), 9.9 per cent.; and Transport, Storage and Communication, 9.7 per cent. The Primary Production group, second in numerical importance in 1954 (with 19,581 persons or 16.6 per cent.) fell to third place (after Manufacturing and Commerce) with 17,166 persons or 13.1 per cent. of the total work force in 1961.

There were significant increases since 1954 in the number of persons engaged in Finance and Property, Community and Business Services (including Professional), and Commerce. These groups exhibited a growth of 43.3 per cent.; 33.1 per cent.; and 25.3 per cent. respectively which was substantially higher than the increase in the total work force of 10.8 per cent. Manufacturing showed the third largest numerical increase, with a proportional increase of 11.7 per cent. There was a decrease over the seven year period in the number of persons engaged in Primary Production (referred to above) and Amusement, Hotels, etc. The former experienced a decrease of 12.3 per cent., and the latter a decrease of 0.7 per cent.

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 8.

9. <u>Occupational Status.</u> - The following table sets out details of the Occupational Status of the population of Tasmania at 30th June, 1961, compared with the 1954 Census. It provides information relating to the capacity in which persons are engaged in the various branches of industry, whether as employer, employee, etc., as well as particulars of that part of the population not in the work force. Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June, 1961, 104,719 were employees (82.6 per cent.) compared with 93,881 (79.4 per cent.) in 1954; employers totalled 8,221 (6.5 per cent. of the work force) compared with 7,670 (6.5 per cent.) in 1954; and 13,191 were self-employed (10.4 per cent.) compared with 13,933 (11.8 per cent.) in 1954.

There was a slightly higher percentage of dependent population (i.e.persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (62.6 per cent.) than in 1954 (61.7 per cent.). The increase since 1954 in persons not in the work force, 15.2 per cent., was greater than the increase in the work force (10.8 per cent.). The proportion of fulltime students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954, being 22.6 per cent. and 19.9 per cent. respectively. See also Table 2 showing Age distribution of the population.
