INTRODUCTION

This bulletin shows the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to Industry in conjunction with Occupational Status.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this bulletin exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

A list of 1961 Census publications already issued appears at the end of this bulletin.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.

INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 2, relates to the State of Victoria.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blocd aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.



INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 3, relates to the State of Queensland.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.

INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 4, relates to the State of South Australia.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.

INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 5, relates to the State of Western Australia.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.

TO INDUSTRY IN CONJUNCTION WITH OCCUPATIONAL STATUS

INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 6, relates to the State of Tasmania.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.



INTRODUCTION

Census Bulletin No. 34, issued on 14th February, 1964, contains particulars of the numbers of males and females in the work force in Australia at the Census of 30th June, 1961, classified according to industry in conjunction with occupational status. Corresponding details for each State and Territory are being published in a series of supplements to this bulletin, of which this issue, Supplement No. 8, relates to the Australian Capital Territory.

The classification used herein for industry is a condensed version of the Australian Classification of Industries (June, 1961) and shows only the totals of each sub-group and each major group. The total males and females in the work force in each industry category within each sub-group may be found in Census Bulletin No. 29 - Industry of the Population: Australia, States and Territories. Since publication of that bulletin some minor amendments have been made to the original tabulations and are incorporated in the present bulletin. Final figures presented on the full classification of industry in conjunction with occupational status will be published in the Detailed Tables of the Census of the Commonwealth of Australia, 30th June, 1961.

The figures in this Supplement exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In processing the 1961 Census data, an occupational status was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

The category "Not at Work" includes those who stated that they were usually engaged in work, but were not actively seeking a job at the time of the Census by reason of sickness, accident, etc., or because they were on strike, changing jobs or temporarily laid off, etc. It includes also persons able and willing to work but unable to secure employment as well as casual and seasonal workers not actually in a job at the time of the Census. The numbers shown as "Not at Work", therefore, do not represent the number of unemployed available for work and unable to obtain it.
