SUMMARY OF DWELLINGS FOR TASMANIA

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INTRODUCTION.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the dwellings in Tasmania as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. A bulletin similar to this relating to the population of Tasmania (Census Bulletin No. 3. Summary of Population for Tasmania) was issued on 21st March, 1962. Census Bulletin No. 2. Population and Dwellings in Local Government Areas, issued 14th March, 1962, shows for each State the numbers of the population and occupied and unoccupied dwellings in each Local Government Area and in the major towns, according to the Statistical Divisions in which they are situated. The data in these Census Bulletins are subject to revision on completion of tabulation, but extensive amendment is not anticipated.

In this Bulletin dwellings are classified according to class (i.e. private house, flat, etc.), material of outer walls, number of rooms, number of inmates, nature of occupancy, date of building, weekly rent and facilities. Each major table shows the numbers of dwellings, according to one particular characteristic (e.g. number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published showing particulars of dwellings in a series of cross-tabulations (e.g. the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

For the purpose of the Census, a dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only part of a building. Non-private dwellings are enumerated as well as private dwellings.

The detailed information appearing in this Bulletin relates to private dwellings which were occupied at the date of the Census. However, information relating to the number of dwellings other than private (hotels, boarding houses, hospitals, etc.), and to the number of unoccupied dwellings is also given.

"Unoccupied dwellings" include vacant dwellings available for sale or renting; dwellings such as "week-ender", "holiday home", "second home", "seasonal quarters", which were not occupied on the night of the Census; dwellings normally occupied but whose usual occupants were temporarily absent on the night of the Census; newly completed dwellings whose owners or tenants had not entered into occupation on the night of the Census; dwellings described as "condemned", "awaiting demolition", "deceased estate", "exhibition home", etc.; and buildings constructed as dwellings but used for non-dwelling purposes on the night of the Census. The total number of unoccupied dwellings shown for any area must not, therefore, be read as representing the number of vacant houses and flats available for sale or renting. Table 10 in this Bulletin shows a summary, by urban and rural divisions of the State, of unoccupied dwellings classified according to the reasons why the dwellings were unoccupied.

In the tables which follow "Metropolitan Urban" relates to the City of Hobart and adjoining municipal areas within boundaries determined for Census purposes. "Other Urban" relates to all other cities and towns with a population of 750 persons or more, and "Rural" to the remainder of the State.

The boundaries of the Metropolitan Urban Division and the composition of the Other Urban and Rural Divisions as used for 1961 Census purposes differ from those used for 1954 Census purposes. Adjustments have been made to the 1954 figures in Table 1 in this Bulletin in order to provide approximate comparison on the 1961 Census basis, but in Tables 2 to 6 and 8 no adjustments have been made to 1954 figures. The effect of the changes referred to may be measured by comparing the data in Table 1A with the 1954 data in Table 1, and this effect must be borne in mind when making intercensal comparisons in the other tables.

All information in this Bulletin is exclusive of full-blood aboriginals and of dwellings occupied solely by them.

A list of 1961 Census publications issued to date appears at the end of this Bulletin.

DWELLINGS IN TASMANIA

CENSUS, 30TH JUNE, 1961.

1. <u>Summary of Population and Dwellings.</u> - The following table shows the urban and rural distribution of the population and dwellings in Tasmania at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. The figures shown for the 1954 Census have been adjusted to conform to the boundaries used in 1961.

Similar adjustment of 1954 data cannot be provided in the tables which follow but comparison of the figures in Table 1A with the 1954 figures in Table 1 will show the effects of changes made between the Censuses. 2. Occupied Dwellings by Class. - Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings. In Tasmania private dwellings consist mainly of private houses, shares of private houses and flats.

"Private House" is a building (or buildings) the whole of which is designed for, or occupied as, the habitation of one household group, living together as a domestic unit. Sheds, huts, tents, caravans, etc. used as dwellings at the time of the Census are included as private houses, except for tents and caravans occupied by overnight travellers.

"Share of a Private House" is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately, and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.

"Flat" is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off, and which includes both cooking and bathing facilities.

"Other" private dwelling is part of a building which is not a self-contained unit. It may be a tenement, an apartment, room(s), etc.

"Dwellings other than Private" include hotels, motels, boarding houses, lodging houses, hostels, hospitals, educational, religious and charitable institutions, defence and penal establishments, etc.

The following table shows the number of occupied dwellings according to class of dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. Private houses constituted 90.1 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings in 1961 compared with 91.1 per cent. in 1954. The proportion of flats to total occupied private dwellings increased substantially from 3.3 per cent. in 1954 to 6.2 per cent. at 30th June, 1961.

The decline in "other" non-private dwellings is due mainly to the changed classification of "caretakers' quarters" which in 1961 were classified as private dwellings.

Dwellings with outer walls of wood were the most common type in Tasmania. At 30th June, 1961, occupied private dwellings with outer walls of wood represented 69.2 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings (70.1 per cent. in 1954) for which material of outer walls was stated. Of those dwellings with stated material of outer walls 20.8 per cent. had walls of brick in 1961 (19.4 per cent. in 1954) while those with walls of concrete accounted for 3.9 per cent. (3.5 per cent. in 1954). The highest percentage increase between Censuses was recorded by occupied private dwellings with walls of concrete, 29.0 per cent., followed by brick, 24.3 per cent.; and wood, 14.9 per cent.

4. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Number of Rooms per Dwelling. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to number of rooms per dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

Five, six and seven roomed dwellings showed the greatest proportional increases in the numbers of occupied private dwellings since the 1954 Census with increases of 29.0, 19.8 and 16.9 per cent. respectively. There were noticeable increases since 1954 in the number of flats with two and three rooms, the increases being 166.8 per cent. and 173.7 per cent. respectively.

A trend towards private dwellings with more rooms is indicated in a comparison of 1954 and 1961 figures for the average number of rooms per dwelling. The average in 1961 was 5.23 compared with 5.15 in 1954. The average number of rooms per dwelling in the Rural division of the State was greater than in "Metropolitan Urban" and "Other Urban".

Dwellings with five rooms were the most numerous and represented 35.1 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings where number of rooms was stated.

5. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Number of Inmates per Dwelling. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to number of inmates per dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The greatest proportional increase since 1954 occurred in occupied private dwellings with 1 inmate, the growth of 28.6 per cent. being due mainly to an increase of 164.2 per cent. in the number of flats with 1 inmate.

Dwellings with 6 or more inmates increased by 18.5 per cent. in the intercensal period while those with less than 6 increased by 15.7 per cent.

At the 30th June, 1961, dwellings with less than 6 inmates represented 83.8 per cent. of total occupied private dwellings compared with 84.1 per cent. in 1954.

Two inmate dwellings were the most numerous during both periods accounting for 21.2 per cent. in 1954 and 22.1 per cent in 1961.

The average number of inmates per dwelling for Tasmania decreased from 3.72 in 1954 to 3.69 at 30th June, 1961. This trend was general for all classes of dwelling and for all divisions of State.

6. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Nature of Occupancy - Table 6 shows the nature of occupancy of private dwellings at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The most significant feature of this table is the increase in the number of occupied private dwellings being purchased by instalments. Of those occupied private dwellings whose nature of occupancy was stated the proportion being purchased by instalments rose from 12.7 per cent. in 1954 to 21.2 per cent. in 1961. This increase occurred principally in respect of private houses being purchased by instalments, the proportion of which rose from 13.6 per cent. in 1954 to 23.0 per cent. in 1961.

The proportion of owner-occupied dwellings declined from 49.8 per cent. in 1954 to 47.7 per cent. in 1961. The proportion of tenanted non-government dwellings also declined from 31.2 per cent. in 1954 to 25.2 per cent. in 1961.

The proportional increases since 1954 were: - purchaser by instalments, 93.7 per cent. and owner, 11.6 per cent. Tenanted non government dwellings decreased by 5.8 per cent. during the intercensal period.

The proportion of owned private dwellings was greatest in rural areas (58.4 pe cent. in 1961 compared with 57.8 per cent. in 1954) whereas the proportion of private dwellings which were either owned or being purchased by instalments was greatest in the metropolitan division (70.4 per cent. in 1961 compared with 62.9 per cent. in 1954).

7. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Date of Building. - Table 7 shows date of building of occupied private dwellings as tabulated from the replies given at the 1954 and 1961 Censuses.

Of those occupied private dwellings in Tasmania whose date of building was stated, 20.4 per cent. were built after 30th June, 1954. In the Metropolitan Urban division of the State 24.6 per cent. were built after 30th June, 1954, while in "Other Urban" and "Rural" the proportions were 20.9 per cent. and 15.0 per cent. respectively.

^{8.} Weekly Rent (Unfurnished) of Tenanted Private Dwellings. - The following table shows particulars of rents paid for unfurnished private dwellings (excluding particulars of dwellings occupied by "Tenants (Governmental Housing)" in 1954 and "Tenants (Housing Department)" in 1961) in Tasmania, as compiled from information supplied on individual Householders' Schedules at 30th June, 1954 and 30th June, 1961. Of those tenanted private dwellings for which rent (unfurnished) was stated, 52.0 per cent. had rentals below 50s. in 1961 compared with 85.7 per cent. in 1954. In the range 50s. and under 100s. the proportion rose from 13.6 per cent. in 1954 to 32.9 per cent. in 1961. The corresponding proportion in the 100s. and over category rose from 0.7 per cent. in 1954 to 15.1 per cent. in 1961. In 1961 the greatest number of tenanted private houses were in the rental range 20s. and under 30s. while the greatest number of tenanted flats were in the range 100s. and over.

9. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Facilities. - The question concerning facilities - gas, electricity, television set - was answered in respect of 89,980 occupied private dwellings in Tasmania. Of these 79,137 (87.95 per cent.) had electricity without gas and 9,011 (10.01 per cent.) had both electricity and gas, making a combined total of 88,148 (97.96 per cent.) with electricity. Occupied private dwellings with gas but not electricity numbered only 113 (0.1 per cent.).

In the Metropolitan Urban Division and in the Other Urban Division also, 99.7 per cent. had electricity while in the Rural Division the proportion with electricity was 93.7 per cent.

The proportion of private dwellings with both electricity and gas was 12.9 per cent. in Metropolitan Urban, 14.8 per cent. in Other Urban and only 0.5 per cent. in the Rural Division.

The number of occupied private dwellings in Tasmania stated to have a television set was 21,202 of which 14,666 (69.2 per cent.) were in the Metropolitan Area. In the Metropolitan Area of Hobart 48.6 per cent. of occupied private dwellings were stated to have a television set.

Table 9 shows the facilities—gas, electricity, television set - recorded for each class of private dwelling in Urban and Rural Divisions of the State.
