\* These characteristics are shown by class of dwelling and also by urban and rural distribution. INTRODUCTION.

This Bulletin contains an analysis, in summary form, of the population and dwellings of the Northern Territory as enumerated at the Census of 30th June, 1961. The figures herein have been obtained from machine tabulation and extensive amendment is not anticipated. Similar bulletins will be issued for each State and other Territories, and Australia as a whole, as the information becomes available. A list of those already issued appears at the end of this Bulletin.

In this Bulletin the population is classified according to age, conjugal condition, birthplace, period of residence in Australia of persons born outside Australia, nationality, religion, industry and occupational status. Dwellings are classified according to class, (i.e., private house, flat, etc.) number of rooms, number of inmates, material of outer walls, nature of occupancy, date of building, rent and facilities.

Each major table herein shows the numbers of males, females and persons or of dwellings according to one particular characteristic (e.g., age or conjugal condition of persons or number of rooms or inmates of dwellings). At a later stage a more detailed analysis will be published, showing particulars of both population and dwellings in a series of cross tabulations (e.g. the numbers of males and females in the various industries according to their age groups and the numbers of dwellings according to both numbers of rooms and inmates, etc.).

All the following tables exclude particulars of full-blood aboriginals and of dwellings occupied solely by them.

(a) Boundaries of districts used in the 1954 Census differ from those used in the 1961 Census, and, consequently, the 1954 populations of districts as recorded are not directly comparable with the 1961 districts. The district figures for 1954 shown in this table are estimates of populations within 1961 boundaries based on 1954 recorded data and derived by allocating the population according to localities. The comparisons must therefore be regarded as approximate only.

(b) Persons not elsewhere enumerated who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961, were on ships in Northern Territory waters, or were travelling on long distance trains, motor coaches or aircraft.

The population of the Northern Territory increased by 64.5 per cent. between the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. The populations of the City of Darwin (see footnote to Table 2.) and Alice Springs Town increased by 81.7 per cent. and 66.9 per cent. respectively in the same period.

The proportion of persons to total population in the Urban Division (Alice Springs Town and City of Darwin) increased from 58.1 per cent. in 1954 to 62.7 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand, the proportion of persons in the Rural Division fell from 40.5 per cent. in 1954 to 36.4 per cent. in 1961.

The increase in the female population of the Northern Territory since 1954 was 76.2 per cent. compared with an increase of 57.5 per cent. in the male population, resulting in an increase in the proportion of females to males from 60.1 in 1954 to 67.2 in 1961.

3. <u>Age.</u> - The following table shows the numbers of each sex in each five-year age group at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The proportion of the total population in the younger age groups increased between the Censuses of 1954 and 1961. At 30th June, 1961, the age group Q-14 represented 30.5 per cent. of the total population compared with 27.4 per cent. in 1954.

The age groups 21-64 and 65 and over constituted a smaller percentage of the total population in 1961 than in 1954, the figures being 59.4 per cent. and 2.5 per cent. respectively in 1961 and 63.5 per cent. and 2.7 per cent. respectively in 1954.

All age groups increased since 1954, the age group 0-4 having the largest numerical increase, while the group 10-14 had the largest percentage increase.

4. <u>Conjugal Condition</u>. - The following table shows the population of the Northern Territory classified according to sex and conjugal condition at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

(a) In processing the 1961 Census data a conjugal condition was allocated prior to tabulation in all instances where this information was not stated.

At the 1961 Census 56.6 per cent. of the total population of the Northern Territory was recorded as never married (compared with 56.4 per cent. in 1954); 37.3 per cent. as married (36.4 per cent. in 1954); 2.6 per cent. as married but permanently separated (2.8 per cent. in 1954); 2.1 per cent. as widowed (2.2 per cent. in 1954) and 1.4 per cent. as divorced (1.6 per cent. in 1954).

Males outnumbered females in all categories except "Widowed" where the ratio of widowed females to widowed males was 1.64 : 1 at 30th June, 1961. This was an increase over the ratio in 1954 (1.26 : 1).

At ages 15 years and over the proportion of never married females per 100 never married males increased from 24.3 in 1954 to 29.7 in 1961.

5. <u>Birthplace</u> - The following table shows the birthplaces of the population of the Northern Territory at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The Australian-born portion of the total population of the Northern Territory declined between Censuses from 82.0 per cent. in 1954 to 79.4 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand, the percentage of European-born persons to total population rose from 14.9 per cent. in 1954 to 17.0 per cent. in 1961. Of the 17.0 per cent. European-born 7.7 per cent. were born in the United Kingdom (8.2 per cent. in 1954), 2.1 per cent. in Italy (1.8 per cent. in 1954), 2.0 per cent. in Greece (0.7 per cent. in 1954) and 1.7 per cent. in Germany (1.0 per cent. in 1954).

Of those European countries listed in the table the largest increase since 1954 occurred in respect of the following: - United Kingdom, etc., 830 persons; Greece, 439 persons; Germany, 289 persons; and Italy, 263 persons.

Figures are not yet available for countries other than those shown in Table 5.

6. <u>Period of Residence in Australia of Persons Born Outside Australia</u>. - The effect of the post-war immigration policy is reflected in the following table which sets out details of the period of residence in Australia of persons in the Northern Territory born outside Australia.

Of those persons born outside Australia who stated their period of residence 1,708 or 58.9 per cent. in 1954 had resided in Australia less than 7 years, while in 1961 2,522 or 46.2 per cent. had been resident less than 7 years.

7. <u>Nationality (i.e. Allegiance)</u> - At 30th June, 1961, 25,191 persons or 93.0 per cent. of the population of the Northern Territory were British subjects compared with 15,475 persons or 94.0 per cent. in 1954. The number of foreign nationals increased from 994 in 1954 to 1,904 in 1961.

Of the 5,575 persons constituting the oversea-born population 3,671 were British subjects, while the remainder, 1,904, owed foreign allegiance.

In the intercensal period 1954-1961 the largest increases in the number of foreign nationals were: - Greek, 342 persons; German, 208 persons; and Italian, 143 persons. The numbers of Latvian, Lithuanian, Estonian, Polish and Ukrainian nationals decreased, largely because of the numbers of persons of these nationalities who had become naturalized as Australian citizens, coupled with the reduced influx in their numbers in recent years as compared with other nationalities.

Figures are not yet available for nationalities or groupings of nationalities other than as shown in Table 7.

8. <u>Religion.</u> - The following table sets out particulars of the religions of those persons who answered this question (which is not obligatory), at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

There were 3,758 persons or 13.9 per cent. of the population of the Territory who gave no reply to this question in 1961 compared with 2,350 persons or 14.3 per cent. in 1954.

The denominations with the largest number of adherents in 1961 were Church of England with 8,165 and the Roman Catholic Church with 7,268 consisting of 4,316 who described themselves as "Roman Catholic" and 2,952 as "Catholic". It is presumed that the great majority of the latter were adherents of the Roman Catholic Church. The Methodist Church had 2,504 adherents; Presbyterian, 1,597; Greek Orthodox, 859; and Lutheran, 589.

Of those who stated their religious belief, the greatest numerical increase since 1954 was recorded by Roman Catholic and Catholic (so described). These increased by 2,989 persons, followed by Church of England, 2,894 persons; Methodist, 783; Greek Orthodox, 609; and Presbyterian, 397.

The greatest proportional increases among the denominations since 1954 were recorded by Greek Orthodox, 243.6 per cent.; Congregational, 161.7 per cent.; Lutheran, 149.6 per cent.; and Baptist, 110.2 per cent.

The total number of adherents at 30th June, 1961, in all the Christian religions represented in the Northern Territory was 22,763 compared with 13,796 in 1954. Adherents to Christian religions (including "indefinite") represented 97.5 per cent. of all persons in the Northern Territory who replied to the religion question at the 1961 Census compared with 97.7 per cent. at the 1954 Census.

The numerically largest industry group in 1961 was Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services, which absorbed 2,802 persons (2,407 males and 395 females) and represented 19.7 per cent. of the total work force. This was followed by the predominantly male industrial group Building and Construction, 12.8 per cent. of the total work force; Transport, Storage and Communication, 12.0 per cent.; Primary Production, 10.9 per cent.; and Community and Business Services (including Professional), 10.9 per cent.

The largest proportional increases since 1954 in the number of persons were engaged in Finance and Property, Manufacturing, and Commerce, these groups exhibiting a growth of 130.1 per cent., 128.1 per cent. and 91.3 per cent. respectively, in comparison with the increase in the total work force of 55.4 per cent. The largest numerical increases were in Public Authority (n.e.i.) and Defence Services (951 persons); Transport and Storage and Communications (700); and Community and Business Services (677).

Figures are not yet available for 1961 to show industry in any greater detail than that given in Table 9.

10. Occupational Status. - The following table sets out details of the Occupational Status of the population of the Territory at 30th June, 1961, compared with the 1954 Census. It provides information relating to the capacity in which persons are engaged in the various branches of industry, whether as employer, employee, etc., as well as particulars of that part of the population not in the work force.

Of the total persons in the work force at 30th June, 1961, 12,144 (85.2 per cent.) were employees compared with 7,687 (83.9 per cent.) in 1954; employers totalled 897 (6.3 per cent. of the work force) compared with 582 (6.4 per cent.) in 1954; and 723 (5.1 per cent.) were self-employed compared with 659 (7.2 per cent.) in 1954.

There was a higher percentage of dependent population (i.e. persons not in the work force) to total population in 1961 (47.4 per cent.) than in 1954 (44.4 per cent.). The increase since 1954 in persons not in the work force, 75.9 per cent., was greater than the increase in the work force (55.5 per cent.). The proportion of fulltime students or children attending school to total population was greater in 1961 than in 1954, being 17.3 per cent. and 14.4 per cent. respectively. See also Table 3. on Age Distribution of the Population.

11. <u>Definitions and Scope.</u> - For the purposes of the Census, a dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only a part of a building. Non-private dwellings are enumerated as well as private dwellings.

The detailed information appearing in this part of the Bulletin relates to private dwellings which were occupied at the date of the Census. However, information relating to the number of dwellings other than private (hotels, boarding houses, hospitals, etc.), and to the number of unoccupied dwellings is also given.

"Urban" refers to the City of Darwin and Alice Springs Town while "Rural" embraces the rest of the Territory. In all the tables which follow (except Tables 11 and 12) the 1954 Census figures for City of Darwin refer to the area at that time designated as "Proposed Greater Darwin", whereas the 1961 Census figures for City of Darwin relate to the Municipality of Darwin (now City of Darwin) as constituted on the 28th June, 1957. As the area of "Proposed Greater Darwin"(90 sq.miles) was considerably larger than the area of the Municipality (19 sq.miles) the 1954 and 1961 Census figures for "City of Darwin", "Total Urban" and "Rural" are not directly comparable. In order to provide a comparison with 1961 Census data, population and dwellings figures shown in Table 11 for City of Darwin at 30th June, 1954 are an estimate (derived from the 1954 Census records) of the population and dwellings within the 1961 boundaries.

12. <u>Summary of Population and Dwellings, Urban, Rural, etc.</u> — The following table shows the urban and rural distribution of the population and dwellings (as defined above) in the Northern Territory at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

14. <u>Occupied Dwellings according to Class.</u> - Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings. In the Northern Territory private dwellings consist mainly of private houses, shares of private houses and flats.

"Private House" is a building (or buildings) the whole of which is designed for, or occupied as, the habitation of one household group, living together as a domestic unit. Sheds, huts, tents, caravans, etc. used as dwellings at the time of the Census are included as private houses, except for tents and caravans occupied by transients on Census night.

"Share of a Private House" is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately, and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was furnished.

"Flat" is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off, and which includes both cooking and bathing facilities.

"Other" private dwelling is part of a building which is not a self-contained unit. It may be a tenement, an apartment, room(s) etc.

"Dwellings other than Private" include hotels, motels, boarding houses, lodging houses, hostels, hospitals, educational, religious and charitable institutions, defence and penal establishments, etc.

The following table shows the number of occupied dwellings according to class of dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The greatest proportional increases since 1954 were shown by "Share of Private House", "Flat" and "Boarding House, Hostel, etc.", with increases of 295.7 per cent., 271.0 per cent. and 172.1 per cent respectively.

Significant features of this table are the decrease in the proportion of occupied dwellings with outer walls of iron and the increase in those with walls of fibro-cement. Of those dwellings where material of outer walls was stated 18.4 per cent. at 30th June, 1961, had walls of iron compared with 43.5 per cent. in 1954, while dwellings with walls of fibro-cement represented 52.5 per cent. in 1961 and 31.8 per cent. in 1954.

In City of Darwin dwellings with walls of fibro-cement were by far the most numerous representing 77.6 per cent. of those occupied private dwellings where material of outer walls was stated. In Alice Springs Town, at 30th June, 1961, 38.8 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings had outer walls of concrete, 25.1 per cent. walls of brick and 14.1 per cent. walls of fibro-cement.

For the whole of the Territory occupied private dwellings of brick increased by 251 per cent. since 1954 followed by fibro-cement, 184.1 per cent.; concrete, 115.1 per cent.; and wood, 15.8 per cent. These compare with the increase, since 1954, of 59.0 per cent. in the total number of occupied private dwellings. 16. <u>Occupied Private Dwellings according to Number of Rooms per Dwelling</u>. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to number of rooms per dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The greatest proportional increases in the numbers of occupied private dwellings since the 1954 Census occurred in five, six and seven roomed private dwellings which increased by 167.1 per cent., 110.6 per cent. and 94.2 per cent. respectively.

At 30th June, 1961, the average number of rooms per private house for the Territory was 4.55 compared with 3.95 in 1954. Alice Springs Town had on the average more rooms per private dwelling than City of Darwin or the rest of the Territory.

As a result of the relatively very large increases in the two and three roomed flats, the average number of rooms per flat decreased from 3.76 in 1954 to 3.48 in 1961.

Private Dwellings with 5 rooms were the most numerous at 30th June, 1961, and re presented 32.7 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings where number of rooms was stated.

17. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Number of Inmates per Dwelling. - The following table shows the number of occupied private dwellings classified according to number of inmates per dwelling at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

The greatest proportional increases in the numbers of occupied private dwellings occurred in seven, six and five-inmate private dwellings which increased by 117.4 per cent., 96.2 per cent. and 92.4 per cent. respectively.

The average number of inmates per private dwelling in the Northern Territory was greater in 1961 than in 1954 mainly as a result of the increase in the average number of inmates per private house. At 30th June, 1961, the average number of inmates per private dwelling was greater in the City of Darwin than in Alice Springs Town and the rest of the Territory.

At the 1961 Census, 81.9 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings had 5 inmates or less compared with 84.8 per cent. in 1954.

In the Territory as a whole, two-inmate dwellings were the most numerous and represented 19.8 per cent. of all occupied private dwellings.

18. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Nature of Occupancy. - Table 17 shows the nature of occupancy of private dwellings at the Censuses of 1954 and 1961.

Of those occupied private dwellings in the Northern Territory where nature of occupancy was stated, the proportion of owned private dwellings declined in the period between Censuses from 33.1 per cent. in 1954 to 22.6 per cent. in 1961. On the other hand, the proportion of tenanted dwellings and dwellings being purchased by instalments rose during the same period from 55.5 per cent. and 2.0 per cent. respectively in 1954 to 61.9 per cent. and 8.8 per cent. respectively in 1961.

At 30th June, 1961, the proportion of tenanted occupied private dwellings to total occupied private dwellings with a stated nature of occupancy was greatest in City of Darwin with 65.7 per cent. followed by Alice Springs Town, 59.1 per cent. and the Rural Division 57.9 per cent. The proportion of owned dwellings, however, was highest in the Rural Division with 28.1 per cent. followed by Alice Springs Town, 26.6 per cent. and City of Darwin, 17.5 per cent.

The proportional increases since 1954 ware:- purchaser by instalments, 609.5 per cent.; tenant, 81.1 per cent.; and owner, 10.7 per cent.

19. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Date of Building. - Of those occupied private dwellings in the Northern Territory where date of building was stated, 54.4 per cent. had been built after 30th June, 1954. In the City of Darwin 61.3 per cent. had been built after 30th June, 1954, while in Alice Springs Town and the Rural Division the proportions were 51.4 per cent. and 45.3 per cent. respectively.

Table 18 shows date of building of occupied private dwellings as tabulated from the replies given at the 1954 and 1961 Censuses.

20. <u>Tenanted Private Dwellings according to Weekly Rent (Unfurnished)</u>. - The following table shows particulars of rent paid for unfurnished private dwellings in the Northern Territory, as compiled from information supplied on individual Householders' Schedules at 30th June, 1954 and 1961.

Of those tenanted private dwellings in the City of Darwin where unfurnished rent was stated 45.4 per cent. had rentals below 50s. in 1961 (84.8 per cent. in 1954), 42.8 per cent. in the range 50s. and under 100s. (14.1 per cent. in 1954) and 11.8 per cent. in the 100s. and over category (1.1 per cent. in 1954.). The corresponding figures for Alice Springs Town (with 1954 figures in brackets) were:- 44.7 per cent. (69.6 per cent.), 38.1 per cent. (26.6 per cent.) and 17.2 per cent. (3.8 per cent.). In the Rural Division of State the proportions were: - 66.0 per cent.(94.5 per cent.), 23.1 per cent. (5.5 per cent.) and 10.9 per cent. (nil).

In 1961 the greatest number of tenanted private houses in the Territory with stated unfurnished rentals occurred in the range 40s. and under 50s. while the greatest number of tenanted flats with stated unfurnished rentals occurred in the range 100s. and over.

21. Occupied Private Dwellings according to Facilities. - The question concerning facilities was answered in respect of 5,088 occupied private dwellings in the Territory and of these 4,634 (91.1 per cent.) had electricity. The proportion with electricity in Darwin was 98.3 per cent., in Alice Springs Town 96.0 per cent. and in the Rural Division 77.1 per cent.

Occupied private dwellings without gas or electricity numbered 443 and of these 366 were in the Rural Division of the Territory.

Table 20 shows facilities in each class of private dwelling and also in private dwellings in Darwin, Alice Springs and the remainder of the Northern Territory.
