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#### PREFACE

This publication contains particulars of the characteristics of population and dwellings in the Territories of Papua, New Guinea, Nauru, Norfolk Island, Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

Details are shown of the characteristics of the population (i.e., Age, Conjugal Condition, Birthplace, Period of Residence in the Territory of Persons born outside the Territory, Nationality, Race, Religion, Occupational Status, Occupation and Industry) and of dwellings (Class of Dwelling, Material of Outer Walls, Number of Rooms, Number of Inmates, Nature of Occupancy, Date of Building and Weekly Rent (Unfurnished)) as recorded for each Territory. The distribution of population and dwellings by districts in the Territory of Papua and New Guinea is also shown.

This is one of five Parts which will constitute the complete Census Volume for the Territories, viz., Part I.—Northern Territory: Population; Part II.—Northern Territory: Dwellings and Householders; Part III.—Australian Capital Territory: Population; Part IV.—Australian Capital Territory: Dwellings and Householders; Part V.—External Territories: Population and Dwellings. A similar volume is being prepared for each State, for the Territories and for Australia as a whole.

A list of printed and mimeographed 1961 Census publications already issued is shown inside the back cover of this Part.

Explanatory notes relative to the contents of this Part follow the Table of Contents.

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

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### EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### **POPULATION**

Indigenous Population. The populations of the Territories of Papua, New Guinea, and Nauru comprise both indigenous and non-indigenous peoples.

For Papua and New Guinea, Censuses are taken only for the non-indigenous population.

For Nauru, both the indigenous and non-indigenous populations were enumerated at the 1961 Census, whereas at the 1954 Census only the non-indigenous people were enumerated. The indigenous population excluded from the 1954 Census numbered 1,828 persons. To provide for intercensal comparisons of the non-indigenous population, data for indigenous and non-indigenous persons is shown separately in this Part for the 1961 Census.

Age.—At Censuses a small proportion of people omit to state their age. At Censuses prior to 1954 these persons were distributed after tabulation over the full range of ages from 15 years upwards, except in 1911 when an effort was made to distinguish children under 15 years of age. These were then distributed over ages 0–14 years.

At the 1954 and 1961 Censuses an age was allocated prior to tabulation to those persons whose age was not stated. The method used in 1961 was as follows—

From an examination of the particulars on the Householder's Schedule for the person concerned, or other persons, a decision was made (in accordance with pre-determined rules) as to the range of ages within which it was considered the missing age must lie. Then from a list of random ages for the appropriate sex a selection of the first age within the determined range was made. Where more than one age had to be determined on a Schedule the method was to determine first the age of the person for whom it was thought the age range could be estimated within the shortest limits. The age determined for this person was then used in determining the ranges of age for other persons on the Schedule.

Conjugal Condition.—At Censuses a small proportion of people omit to state their conjugal condition. At the 1961 Census for the first time, these persons were allocated a conjugal condition prior to tabulation. The method used was as follows—

Males under 20 years of age and females under 18 years were considered to be "never married" unless there was some definite evidence of marriage in other information on the Schedule, in which case the "married" status was given. Males aged 20 years or over and females aged 18 years or over were coded as "married" if there was any evidence of marriage in other information on the Schedule. Otherwise the conjugal condition was determined from a list of random conjugal conditions applicable to the particular age and sex group. The age groups used were 20–21 years, 22–24 years, 25–29 years, 30–39 years, 40–49 years, 50–59 years, 60–69 years, 70–79 years and 80 years and over. Within these groups the random conjugal conditions were proportioned to the expected distribution within the group.

Nationality.—The term "British" used in this publication refers to those persons who were recorded on the Census Schedule as (a) "British" or "British by Naturalization", (b) citizens of the following countries—United Kingdom and Colonies, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, Newfoundland, India, Pakistan, Southern Rhodesia and Ceylon (by virtue of the Nationality and Citizenship Act 1948–1960 citizens of these countries are deemed to be British), and (c) Irish citizens. Particulars of Irish citizens were tabulated separately, but for purposes of publication have been combined with British.

Occupational Status.—At Censuses a small proportion of people omit to state their occupational status. At the 1961 Census, for the first time, these persons were allocated an occupational status prior to tabulation. The method used was as follows—

Where no reply was given to questions 11-14 on the Schedule a decision was first made from any other evidence on the Schedule as to whether the person was not in the work force (child under 5 years; child 5-15 years; married woman; woman other than married, 60 years and over; man 65 years and over) or in the work force. If the latter, then the occupational status was made the same as the first comparable person in following Schedules. Where a reply was given to questions 13 and/or 14 indicating the industry as government, semi-government or a company the occupational status was made "Employee (on wage or salary)".

Race.—This characteristic refers broadly to the ethnic origin of the person irrespective of where born or of what nationality. For this characteristic the basic data do not permit of scientific classification of ethnic origin and the races are named with a geographical rather than a truly ethnological description. Thus "Japanese" to indicate natives of Japan refers to the ethnic types inhabiting that country and normally to be found there. In other words, each racial group described in this fashion is a mixed group when viewed in the light of the hypothetical genetic types from which it is derived.

Religion.—Under the Commonwealth Census and Statistics Act it is not compulsory to answer the question on religion and a note to this effect is incorporated in the Census Schedule. It is mainly for this reason that the number of people who do not state their religion is comparatively large.

Migratory.—Refers to person not elsewhere enumerated who at midnight between 29th and 30th June, 1961, were on ships in Papuan and New Guinean waters. There was no population enumerated as migratory in the other External Territories.

#### **DWELLINGS**

Data on dwellings for Papua and New Guinea exclude particulars of dwellings occupied solely by the indigenous population. For the other Territories the data relate to all occupied dwellings.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

Occupied Dwelling.—An occupied dwelling is any habitation occupied by a household group living together as a domestic unit, whether comprising the whole or only part of a building. The term has therefore a very wide reference and includes, in addition to houses and flats, a great variety of "dwellings" ranging from a single-roomed shack to a multiroomed hotel or institution. Occupied dwellings are classified into "private" and "other than private" dwellings.

Private Dwelling,—Private dwellings are further classified into the following four categories—

- Private House. Private Houses include houses, sheds, huts, garages, etc., used for dwelling purposes, and shared private houses for which only one Householder's Schedule was received.
- Share of Private House. A share of a Private House is a portion of a shared private house which is occupied separately and for which portion a separate Householder's Schedule was received.
- Flat. A Flat is part of a house or other building which can be completely closed off and which has its own cooking and bathing facilities.
- Other Private Dwelling. These include private dwellings such as rooms, apartments, etc., which are parts of buildings but are not self-contained units.
- Other than Private Dwelling.—These include Hotels; Motels; Boarding Houses, Lodging Houses and Hostels; Educational, Religious and Charitable Institutions; Hospitals; Defence and Penal Establishments; Police and Fire Stations; Clubs; Staff Barracks and Quarters, etc.

Rooms.—These include kitchen and permanently enclosed sleep-out, but do not include bathroom, pantry, laundry or storehouse. Rooms in non-attached buildings are included only if used for living or sleeping purposes by the household group. Rooms recorded for a "share of private house" include only those used by the occupier of the share. A shared kitchen or living room is recorded only for the share occupied by the owner or principal tenant.

Rent.—The figures relating to rents are only for dwellings rented unfurnished. The figures representing "rent not stated" include rent-free dwellings, those rented on a furnished basis and those for which rents were not applicable (e.g., for shop and dwelling combined). In Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands all tenanted dwellings were "rent-free", consequently, no table of tenanted dwellings according to weekly rent (unfurnished) can be shown for these Territories.
