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
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## P R E F A C E

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This publication presents a range of social and housing statistics produced from the 1996 Census of Population and Housing for New South Wales and its regions, and for Jervis Bay. Together with census population counts, it includes tables of selected census data which describe the characteristics of people living in each area and their housing arrangements. Similar publications are available for each State/Territory, and nationally.


Detailed characteristics from the 1996 Census are being released in two stages. The first release consists of demographic, social and housing data. The second release, comprising family and labour force related data, will be provided progressively State by State from August 1997.

The data presented in this publication relate to where people were enumerated on census night. They should not be confused with the official estimated resident population (ERP) figures, which are derived by including in the census usual residence counts the following:

- estimates of Australians overseas;
- an adjustment for estimated underenumeration; and
- adjustments for births, deaths and migration, between 30 June and 6 August 1996.

Census data presented in this publication represent only a selection of the full range of statistics that could be derived from the census. For further information about other census or ABS data refer to the Appendix — Census Products and Services, or the *Directory of Census Statistics* (Cat. no. 2910.0). Concepts and definitions used in this publication are explained in the Glossary and more detailed information is available in the *Census Dictionary* (Cat. no. 2901.0).

## **SUMMARY OF FINDINGS New South Wales**

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### **STATE OVERVIEW**

The 1996 Census of Population and Housing counted 6,038,696 people in New South Wales (NSW) on census night, 95.2% of whom were counted at home. This represents a growth of 5.4% (306,664 people) in the NSW population count since 1991 (5,732,032).

The number of people counted in occupied private dwellings increased by 5.5% since the 1991 Census, from 5,539,278 to 5,841,476. Over the same period, the average number of people per occupied private dwelling declined from an occupancy rate of 2.8 to 2.7 people per dwelling.

#### **AGE**

The population of NSW is ageing, with a median age of 32 years in 1991 compared to 34 years in 1996. Just over one-fifth (21.4%) of the State's population (excluding overseas visitors) in 1996 were aged 0–14 years, 14.2% were aged 15–24, 30.6% were aged 25–44, 21.1% were aged 45–64, and 12.7% were aged 65 years and over.

#### **BIRTHPLACE**

Almost three-quarters (72.8%) of the people counted in NSW were Australian-born (74.8% in 1991). People born in the United Kingdom (4.8% of the NSW population), New Zealand (1.5%), Italy (1.1%), China (excluding Taiwan Province) (1.1%), Viet Nam (1.0%) and Lebanon (0.9%) comprised the most numerous overseas-born categories.

#### **INDIGENOUS ORIGIN**

The number of people who reported being of Indigenous origin increased by 44.9% between 1991 and 1996, from 70,019 to 101,485. This represents an increase from 1.2% to 1.7% of the total population of NSW. This increase may be partly explained by people's increased willingness to declare their Indigenous origin.

#### **EDUCATION**

In 1996, 371,615 people were reported to be attending a Technical or Further Educational Institution, university or other tertiary institution, representing 6.2% of the population.

#### **INCOME**

The median weekly personal income for people aged 15 years and over in 1996 was \$298 (approximately \$15,496 p.a.). In comparison, the NSW median weekly income in 1991 was \$276.

#### **DWELLINGS**

Over two-fifths (42.5%) of the occupied private dwellings counted in NSW were owned by their occupants, 22.5% were being purchased and 29.9% were rented. These levels were similar to those of 1991.

### REGIONAL OVERVIEW

#### SEX

There were slightly more females than males counted in NSW (50.6% and 49.4% respectively of the total NSW population). Since the 1991 Census the proportion of females increased by 0.2 percentage points.

Females outnumbered males in all Statistical Divisions (SDs), on the coast from Illawarra to Richmond-Tweed and in Northern SD, centred on Armidale and Tamworth, ranging from 50.3% in Northern to 50.8% in Richmond-Tweed. To the west and south of that triangle, males outnumbered females in all SDs, with findings for males ranging from 50.1% in Central West to 50.8% in South Eastern.

At the Statistical Subdivision (SSD) level, the highest percentages of females were recorded in the urban or coastal areas of Lower Northern Sydney (52.4%), Hornsby-Ku-ring-gai (52.2%), Eastern Suburbs, Tweed Heads (both 51.6%), Gosford-Wyong and Inner Western Sydney (both 51.5%). In contrast, the SSDs with the highest percentages of males were the rural areas of Snowy (54.6%), Macquarie-Barwon (53.7%), Upper Darling (53.2%) and Murray-Darling (52.6%).

At the Statistical Local Area (SLA) level, the highest percentages of females were in the northern suburbs of Sydney (Mosman (54.2%), North Sydney (53.4%)) and Woollahra (53.3%) on Sydney Harbour. On the other hand, males were most concentrated in the rural and inner city areas: Unincorporated Far West (59.5%), Central Darling (57.7%), Snowy River (57.2%), Walgett (56.6%) and Sydney - Inner (56.4%).

Note that the statistics in this publication for Snowy River SLA and Snowy SSD would have been affected to some extent by the ski season.

#### AGE

In 1996 the median age ranged from 32 years in Murrumbidgee SD to 38 years in Mid-North Coast SD, compared with 30 to 36 years in the same areas in 1991. In 1996 the highest percentages of people aged 65 years and over were recorded in the coastal areas of Mid-North Coast (17.5%) and Richmond-Tweed (17.0%). These SDs also recorded the highest percentages of people in this age group in 1991, albeit with lower figures (15.9% and 16.0% respectively). The increases in the percentages of people aged 65 years and over ranged from 0.5 percentage points in Sydney to 2.4 percentage points in Far West SD.

At the SSD level, the highest median ages as well as the highest percentages of people aged 65 years and over, were recorded in the coastal areas of Tweed Heads (44 years and 26.4% respectively) and Lower South Coast (40 years and 19.8%). However, the greatest change in the age structure was indicated in Far West SSD, where the median age increased from 33 to 37 years between 1991 and 1996.

The highest median ages were recorded in SLAs on the coastal strip (Great Lakes, Tweed - Part A , Maclean (all 44 years)). Moreover, over one-fifth of the population of Tweed - Part A (26.4%), Great Lakes (24.8%), Maclean (22.8%), Hastings (21.7%) and Eurobodalla (21.7%) were aged 65 years and over. SLAs with the lowest median ages tended to be more dispersed: Campbelltown, Armidale (both 27 years), Snowy River and Brewarrina (both 28 years).

## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS New South Wales *continued*

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### BIRTHPLACE

#### Australian-born

The highest and lowest percentages of people who were born in Australia were recorded in Northern SD and Sydney SD (respectively 90.6% and 64.7%). Between 1991 and 1996, the percentage of people who were born in Australia increased slightly in Snowy SSD (80.0 to 80.2%), but decreased in all other SSDs, Central Western Sydney (63.9 to 58.9%) registering the largest decrease.

#### Overseas-born

Eight Sydney SLAs recorded populations, in which at least two-fifths of the people enumerated had been born overseas. These SLAs formed an arc from Botany Bay, through Marrickville and Canterbury to Fairfield. Within this area, Fairfield (53.5%) and Auburn (51.5%) had the highest concentrations of overseas-born people.

The highest proportions of people born in the United Kingdom, Ireland or New Zealand were enumerated in the waterside SLAs of Manly (13.9%), Mosman (12.9%), North Sydney (12.8%) and Pittwater (12.1%). People born in other countries were concentrated in the arc mentioned above, in which Fairfield (50.6%), Auburn (48.4%) and Canterbury (45.5%) had the highest levels.

### SPEAKS ANOTHER LANGUAGE AT HOME

The majority (55.1%) of people aged five years and over, who reported speaking languages other than English at home, spoke Chinese languages, Arabic (incl. Lebanese) languages, Italian, Greek, Vietnamese or Spanish. The highest percentages who spoke other languages were counted in Fairfield (64.1%), Auburn (62.6%), Canterbury (62.2%) and nearby SLAs. Areas with the lowest levels were mainly in the non-metropolitan areas, where 20 SLAs recorded levels of 1.0% or less.

### INDIGENOUS ORIGIN

In 1996 the SSDs with the greatest numbers of Indigenous people were Newcastle (7,346), Central Macquarie (5,840) and Blacktown-Baulkham Hills (5,542).

The increase since 1991 in the numbers of people reporting to be of Indigenous origin was unevenly distributed. In almost two-fifths (38.0%) of the SSDs the increases were greater than 50%. The increase since 1991 ranged from 12.3% in Upper-Darling to 92.2% in Gosford-Wyong SSD.

SLAs with the highest proportions of people of Indigenous origin were in the north west or far west of the State, notably Brewarrina (53.5%), Central Darling (25.3%), Bourke (24.7%) and Walgett (20.6%). However, in the majority (56.4%) of SLAs, less than 2% of the population reported being of Indigenous origin.

### INCOME

Median weekly personal income levels for people aged 15 years and over ranged from \$205 in Far West SD to \$343 in Sydney SD.

Between 1991 and 1996, incomes increased most in Lower Murrumbidgee SSD (28.5%) and decreased in two SSDs: Fairfield-Liverpool (-1.5%) and Far West (-3.8%). Four SSDs in Sydney recorded median incomes of more than \$400. These were Lower Northern Sydney (\$470), Eastern Suburbs (\$424), Hornsby-Ku-ring-gai and Northern Beaches

(both \$417). The lowest median incomes were calculated for the coastal areas of Hastings (\$215), Clarence (\$213) and Far West (\$205).

At the SLA level, median incomes over \$400 were predominantly in the metropolitan areas, ranging from \$402 in Warringah to \$597 in North Sydney. Yarrowlumla - Parts A (\$434) and B (\$469), and Snowy River (\$474) also recorded high median incomes. All 19 SLAs with median incomes below \$200 were in regional areas, Manilla (\$183) and Barabba (\$184) recording the lowest medians.

### TENURE TYPE

Levels of home ownership varied widely across NSW, ownership rates ranging from 25.7% in Inner Sydney SSD to 59.7% in Far West SSD.

At the SLA level, seven areas west of the Great Dividing Range along with Ku-ring-gai in Sydney's north recorded home ownership levels above 60%. Broken Hill registered the highest rate of 61.8%. In contrast, the seven SLAs with home ownership rates below 30% were all in the urban areas of Sydney or Newcastle, Sydney - Remainder (12.2%) and Sydney - Inner (8.6%) recording the lowest levels.

The highest proportions of dwellings being purchased were located in the outer Sydney SLAs (Camden (41.1%), Penrith (38.4%) and Wollondilly (37.6)) and Yarrowlumla - Part A (38.9%), located near the Australian Capital Territory.

The major SLAs where dwellings were rented were close to city centres: Sydney - Inner (68.7%), Sydney - Remainder (64.9%), Newcastle - Inner (60.1%), South Sydney (57.2%) and North Sydney (51.1%).

### RENT PAYMENTS

The median rent payment for NSW increased by 10.2% since the 1991 Census, rising from \$127 in 1991 to \$140 per week in 1996.

Fifteen Sydney SLAs recorded median rent payments of \$200 or more per week and in 16 regional SLAs median rents were \$50 or less. Ku-ring-gai (\$300) and Sydney - Remainder (\$270), and Conargo (\$20) and Windouran (\$10) represent the highest and lowest median rents respectively.

### HOUSING LOAN REPAYMENTS

Between 1991 and 1996, the median housing loan repayment for the State increased by 40.3%, from \$618 to \$867 per month.

The highest median housing loan repayments were recorded in Yarrowlumla - Part B (\$1,767), Mosman (\$1,650) and Woollahra (\$1,500). In 30 other SLAs, all of which were in Sydney, median repayments were \$1,000 or more per month. In contrast, the eight SLAs with median repayments of \$500 or less per month were all in regional areas west of the dividing range, Urana (\$349) and Central Darling (\$365) recording the lowest.

## **SUMMARY OF FINDINGS Jervis Bay**

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### **JERVIS BAY**

The 1996 Census of Population and Housing counted 762 people in Jervis Bay Territory on census night, representing a decrease of 1.4% (11 people) in the population count since 1991 (773).

Two measures indicated a young age profile. First, the Territory's median age was 25 years (compared to 23 years in 1991). Second a small minority (1.3%) of people were aged 65 years and over (compared to 1.7% in 1991).

The sex ratio in Jervis Bay in 1996 (65.2% males and 34.8% females) had increased considerably since 1991, when the corresponding figures were 56.0% and 44.0%.

The majority (86.2%) of people were Australian-born. Furthermore, of those born overseas, just over three-quarters (76.7%) were from the United Kingdom, Ireland or New Zealand.

In 1996 people of Indigenous origin comprised almost one-quarter (24.3%) of the Territory's population. The number of people who reported being of Indigenous origin (185) was similar to that recorded in 1991 (182).

The median weekly personal income for people aged 15 years and over in 1996 was \$636 (approximately \$33,072 p.a.). The corresponding income level for 1991 was \$406 (\$21,112).

About three-fifths (60.5%) of the population were counted in occupied private dwellings. Further, of the occupied private dwellings over four-fifths (84.3%) were rented by their occupants, a similar level of rental accommodation to 1991 (87.1%).

## **EXPLANATORY NOTES**

## **SCOPE AND COVERAGE**

- 1 The 1996 Census of Population and Housing was held on 6 August 1996. The first census was held in 1911 and since 1961 a census has been taken every five years, a frequency which is specified in the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*. The objective of the census is to measure accurately the number and key characteristics of people in Australia on census night, and the dwellings in which they live.
  - 2 The census aims to count every person who spent census night in Australia. This includes Australian residents in Antarctica and people in the territories of Jervis Bay, Cocos (Keeling) Islands and Christmas Island. The other Australian External Territories, Norfolk Island and minor islands such as Heard and McDonald Islands, are outside the scope of the Australian Census. The only group of people who spend census night in Australia but are excluded from the census are foreign diplomats and their families.
  - 3 The census includes people on vessels in or between Australian ports, on board long distance trains, buses or aircraft and on oil or gas rigs off the Australian coast. People entering Australia before midnight on census night are counted while people leaving an Australian port for an overseas destination before midnight on census night are not. Visitors to Australia are included regardless of how long they have been in the country or how long they plan to stay. However, for people who intend to be in Australia less than six months only basic demographic data are available. The census includes people camping out and the homeless.
  - 4 All private dwellings, except diplomatic dwellings, are included in the census, whether occupied or unoccupied. Caravans in caravan parks, manufactured homes in manufactured home estates and self-care units in accommodation for the retired or aged are counted only if occupied. Occupied non-private dwellings, such as hospitals, prisons, hotels, etc. are also included.
  - 5 Details about the 1996 Census content, collection operations, confidentiality and privacy protection, processing and evaluation activities are contained in *1996 Census of Population and Housing: Nature and Content of the Census* (Cat. no. 2008.0).

- 7** This publication contains population counts based on where people were counted on census night, which may not have been where they usually lived. The census can provide person counts based on place of usual residence at the geographic level of Statistical Local Area (SLA).

**8** Official ABS population estimates (estimated resident population) are also separately available from the ABS. The estimates are based on census counts that have been adjusted to:

  - include people who were in Australia on census night but were missed in the census;
  - include Australian residents who were temporarily overseas on census night (these people were not within scope of the census); and
  - exclude overseas visitors counted in the census who were not usual residents of Australia.

**9** The adjusted census count is then updated quarterly using demographic statistics. These are statistics on births, deaths, and overseas and internal migration.

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### **ABS POPULATION ESTIMATES** *continued*

**10** ABS population estimates are published in *Australian Demographic Statistics* (Cat. no. 3101.0), produced quarterly, and in *Estimated Resident Population by Sex and Age: States and Territories of Australia* (Cat. no. 3201.0) produced annually.

**11** The ABS also provides projections (based on different assumptions as to future fertility, mortality and migration) of the resident population of Australia, States and Territories. These projections are published biennially in *Projections of the Populations of Australia, States and Territories* (Cat. no. 3222.0).

### **DATA LIMITATIONS**

**12** Census data are subject to a number of inaccuracies resulting from errors by respondents or mistakes in collection or processing. Whilst many of these are corrected by careful processing procedures, some still remain. The effect of the remaining errors is generally slight, although it may be more important for small groups in the population. The main kinds of error to keep in mind are:

- *Partial non-response*: In some cases where an answer is not provided to a question an answer is imputed (often from other information on the form). In other cases a 'not stated' code is allocated.
- *Processing error*: While such errors can occur in any processing system, quality management is used continuously to improve the quality of processed data, and to identify and correct data of unacceptable quality.
- *Random adjustment*: Table cells containing small values are randomly adjusted or suppressed to avoid releasing information about particular individuals, families, or households. The effects of these adjustments are statistically insignificant.
- *Respondent error*: Because processing procedures cannot detect or repair all errors made by people in completing the forms, some remain in final data.
- *Undercount*: Although the census aims to count each person, there are some people who are missed and others are counted more than once. The data in this publication are not adjusted for the net undercount.

**13** Further information on data quality is provided progressively in *Census Update* and in *1996 Census Data Quality Working Papers*.

### **OVERSEAS VISITORS**

**14** Data for overseas visitors (who intend to be in Australia for less than six months) are restricted to age, sex and marital status. In this publication overseas visitors contribute only to the male, female and total person counts.

### **CALCULATIONS OF PROPORTIONS**

**15** When calculating the proportion of the population with a particular characteristic, overseas visitors and 'Not stated' responses are included in the denominator. For example, in the Summary of Findings, the *Proportion of Australian-born* was calculated by dividing the number of persons who stated that they were Australian-born by the total population (including overseas visitors and those who did not report their birthplace) and expressing the result as a percentage.

### **CALCULATION OF MEDIANS**

**16** A median is a measure of central tendency. It is a mid value which divides a population distribution into two, with half the observations falling below it and half above it. Unlike averages (means) medians are not usually skewed by extreme observations.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES *continued*

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### CALCULATION OF MEDIAN *continued*

**17** There are a number of issues to be aware of:

- The categories 'Not stated', 'Overseas visitor', and 'Not applicable' are not included in the calculation of medians.
- If a median falls into a category that has a text only label then the median is set to 0. For this publication this is only relevant to the calculation of median personal income, as the income classification includes categories 'Nil income' and 'Negative income'.
- If the median is calculated on a classification containing ranges and a range is open-ended and the median falls within that category, the median is set to the number in the label. For example, in the calculation of median personal income, if the median falls in the last range \$1,500 or more, \$1,500 is allocated as the median.

### UNADJUSTED DOLLARS

**18** The 1991 Census dollar values for Median Personal Income, Median Housing Loan Repayments and Median Rent Paid have not been adjusted into 1996 dollars.

### Community Profile Series

The series comprises six community profiles:

- *Basic Community Profile (BCP)* contains 32 tables of detailed data covering dwelling, household and family topics. This profile is available for all standard census geographic areas, Commonwealth (CED) and State Electoral Divisions (SED), Postal Areas, and Suburbs, for the States/Territories and Australia.
- *Time Series Community Profile* contains 21 tables of variables from the Basic Community Profile comparing data from the 1986, 1991 and 1996 Censuses where the classifications are comparable.
- *Usual Residents Profile* contains 25 tables based on the usual residents of SLAs. This is the only community profile based on place of usual residence.
- *Expanded Community Profile* contains 41 tables available for SLAs and larger areas, comprising more detailed versions of some of the basic profile tables, plus new tables.
- *Working Population Profile* contains 17 tables of labour force and related characteristics of people who work and are counted in SLAs within the journey to work (JTW) study areas — usually capital cities.
- *Summary Indigenous Profile* contains selected characteristics of Indigenous people in two tables which are available at the Indigenous Location level.
- *Detailed Indigenous Profile* contains selected characteristics of Indigenous people in 26 tables which are available for Indigenous Areas, ATSIC Regions, States and Territories.

### CDATA96

*CDATA96* (Cat. nos. 2019.0–8) is a CD-ROM product which provides a large volume of tabulated census data, digital boundaries and base map data. It includes software capable of producing tables, maps and graphs of the data.

### KEYDATA

*CENSUS KEYDATA* (Cat. nos. 2023.0–8) is a CD-ROM product which provides access to 1996 Census Community Profiles and Classification Counts data and Digital Boundaries, using a specially encrypted CD-ROM.

## GLOSSARY

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General descriptions of terms and concepts used in this publication are provided below. Tables are also footnoted where applicable for additional clarity. Detailed definitions of classifications and concepts are available in the *1996 Census Dictionary* (Cat. no. 2901.0).

**Dwelling** A dwelling is a building or structure in which people live. This can be a building, such as a house; part of a building, such as a flat; or it can be a caravan or tent, humpy or park bench. Houses under construction, derelict houses, vacant tents, or converted garages, are not counted in the census.

There are private and non-private dwellings.

A private dwelling is normally a house, flat, part of a house, or even a room; but can also be a house attached to, or rooms above, shops or offices; an occupied caravan or unit in a caravan park or craft in a marina; occupied dwelling in a Manufactured Home Estate; occupied self-care unit in Accommodation for the Retired or Aged; a houseboat; or tent if it is standing on its own block of land. An occupied caravan situated on a residential allotment is also classed as a private dwelling. Private dwellings can be either occupied or unoccupied.

Non-private dwellings are those dwellings not included above, which provide a communal or transitory type of accommodation. These dwellings include hotels, motels, guest houses, prisons, religious and charitable institutions, defence establishments, hospitals and other communal dwellings. Only occupied non-private dwellings are included in the census.

**Geographic areas** The tables in this publication are at the levels of Statistical Local Area, Statistical Subdivision and Statistical Division, as defined by the 1996 Census edition of the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC).

*Statistical Local Area (SLA)*: These areas consist of one or more whole Census Collection Districts (CDs) and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps.

SLAs correspond in many cases to Local Government Areas (LGAs). The main exceptions are:

- where the boundaries of one or more Statistical Subdivisions (SSDs) cut across an LGA, the LGA is split into two or more parts, each of which forms a separate SLA;
- where a particular LGA is substantially different from other LGAs in terms of size and economic significance, or in terms of user needs for statistics, the LGA may be split into two or more SLAs. For example, the City of Brisbane covers a large area and is split into 163 SLAs while most LGAs in Victoria are split into two or more SLAs following the recent restructuring of local government in that State;
- where an area is unincorporated (i.e. not part of an LGA) an SLA is created.

*Local Government Area (LGA)*: LGAs are spatial units which represent the whole undivided geographic area of responsibility of either:

- an incorporated local government council; or
- an incorporated community government council (CGC) where the CGC is of sufficient size and statistical significance.

LGAs cover only part of Australia. The major areas not covered by LGAs are the large northern parts of South Australia, most of the Northern Territory, and all of the Australian Capital Territory and Other Territories. For the 1996 Census, LGA boundaries are as defined on 5 August 1995 and included in the 1996 Edition of the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC) (effective 1 July 1996).

## GLOSSARY *continued*

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### Geographic areas *continued*

*Statistical Subdivision (SSD)*: These areas consist of one or more SLAs and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps.

*Statistical Division (SD)*: These areas consist of one or more SSDs and cover, in aggregate, the whole of Australia without gaps or overlaps. They do not cross State or Territory boundaries. However, the Other Territories, Jervis Bay Territory and the Territories of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands together form one SD. Capital city SDs are predominantly urban in character and the boundaries are delineated to contain the anticipated urban development of the capital cities (and associated urban centres) for a period of at least 20 years.

SDs outside the capital city are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and the economic units in the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities.

*State/Territory (STE)*: States and Territories consist of one or more SDs and are the largest type of spatial unit in the ASGC. The six Australian States and five Territories which are part of geographic Australia and included in the 1996 ASGC are New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, Northern Territory, Australian Capital Territory, Jervis Bay Territory and the external Territories of Christmas Island and Cocos (Keeling) Islands. In the ASGC, Jervis Bay Territory, the Territory of Christmas Island and the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands are combined to form Other Territories (OT).

- 3 – Queensland
- 4 – South Australia
- 5 – Western Australia
- 6 – Tasmania

- 8 – Australian Capital Territory


<b>Income</b>	People aged 15 years or more are asked to state their usual gross weekly income, which is the income before tax, superannuation, health insurance, or other deductions are made. Gross income includes family allowance, family allowance supplement, pensions, unemployment benefits, student allowances, maintenance (child support), superannuation, wages, salary, overtime, dividends, rents received, interest received, business or farm income (less operation expenses) and worker's compensation received.
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## **GLOSSARY** *continued*

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**Indigenous** A person is defined to be of Indigenous origin if he or she identifies himself or herself as of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander origin.

**Overseas-born** Overseas-born people are those who state that they were born in a country other than Australia, those born at sea, and those whose responses are classed as 'Inadequately described' or 'Not elsewhere classified'.






NSW SOUTH WALES — STATISTICAL SUBDIVISIONS AND STATISTICAL LOCAL AREAS, 1996 EDITION






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





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


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
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
