PERSONS AND DWELLINGS IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS AND URBAN CENTRES

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication is one of a series presenting final person and dwelling counts from the 1981 Census of Population and Housing for various geographic levels. Persons were counted where they spent the night of 30 June 1981.

Content

- 2. The tables in this publication contain counts of persons by sex and of occupied private and non-private dwellings and unoccupied private dwellings in Local Government Areas, Urban Centres and Bounded Rural Localities.
- 3. All tables contain counts from the 1976 and 1981 Censuses, where geographic comparability allows.
- 4. For the purposes of the 1981 Census, Local Government boundaries in New South Wales were those which existed at 1 January 1981, and for other States and Territories the boundaries existing at 30 June 1980.
- 5. For Local Government Areas (LGA's), 1976 Census data has been presented according to boundaries adopted for the 1981 Census. Because some intercensal boundary changes involve areas smaller than Collection Districts, precise figures cannot always be calculated. Consequently, where areas are nearly but not directly comparable, estimates of 1976 population on 1981 boundaries are given. In cases where estimates are not possible, the 1976 population on 1981 boundaries is recorded as not available (n.a.). See Appendix A. for major intercensal area changes.
- 6. Note that for Urban Centres and Bounded Rural Localities the 1976 Census data are shown on boundaries delineating the areas defined in 1976.

Maps

- 7. The maps contained in this publication show the boundaries, names and codes of Statistical Divisions, Subdivisions and Districts, and LGA's and identify major urban areas.
- 8. Additional copies of these maps can be obtained from the ABS for 50 cents a sheet.

Scope and coverage

9. The 1981 Census of Population and Housing aimed at counting every person who spent Census night, 30 June 1981, in Australia including persons on vessels in or between Australian ports, on board long-distance trains, buses or aircraft. All dwellings were counted, whether occupied or unoccupied. People were counted where they were on Census night, which may not be where they usually live. Visitors to Australia were enumerated regardless of how long ago they had arrived or how long they planned to stay. Australian residents out of the country on Census night were excluded from the count.

- 10. Diplomatic personnel and their families are, by definition, out of the scope of the Census, as are diplomatic residences.
- 11. While every effort is made to minimise undercounting in the Census, some inevitably remains for various reasons (e.g. inadvertant omission of very young children, treatment of some dwellings as unoccupied when, in fact, they were occupied, and failure to find all dwellings). Refusal by householders to complete the Census Schedule is not a significant cause of undercounting.

Definitions

- 12. Dwellings—For Census purposes, dwellings are classified into two groups: occupied and unoccupied. Occupied dwellings can be either private or non-private while unoccupied are private only.
 - (a) An occupied private dwelling is defined as the premises occupied by a household on Census night (for definition of Household see below). A private dwelling is normally a house, flat, part of a house or even a room but can also be a tent. houseboat, or caravan if standing on its own block of land and not occupied by members of the same household resident in an adjacent dwelling. It is important to remember that the Census definition of a private dwelling means that the total number of dwellings may be more than the total number of known structures in any given area (see Household below). Non-private dwellings are hotels, motels, boarding houses, gaols, religious and charitable institutions, defence establishments, other communal dwellings and caravan parks. Usually occupants of such dwellings use communal facilities (such as hotel dining rooms or mess halls) attached to the particular establishment. A caravan in a caravan park (whether permanently or temporarily located) is treated as part of a non-private dwelling as are self-contained units provided by commercial enterprises such as hotels, motels and guest-houses.
 - (b) An unoccupied dwelling is a structure built specifically for living purposes and capable of being lived in but unoccupied at the time of the Census: Vacant houses, holiday houses, huts, cabins (other than seasonal workers' quarters) and houseboats are counted as unoccupied dwellings but vacant tents, garages and caravans (if not normally occupied) are not. Also included are newly completed dwellings not yet occupied; dwellings which are vacant because they are due for demolition or repair; dwellings to let; and dwellings where all members of the household were absent on Census night.

- 13. Household—For Census purposes, a household is either a person living alone or a group of people living together as a single domestic unit with common eating arrangements. It is possible for more than one household to live in one house or structure. For example, a lodger who lives with a family and provides all his own food is not a member of the family's household but constitutes a separate household and therefore completes a separate householder's schedule. Because an occupied private dwelling is defined as the premises occupied by a household on Census night (see above), the number of households and the number of occupied private dwellings is identical and the number of occupied dwellings, as defined for Census purposes, may be greater than the known number of structures.
- 14. Migratory—Persons enumerated on board vessels in and between Australian ports, or on board long-distance trains, buses or aircraft are classified as Migratory. Such persons are not included in the population of specific LGA's, but are shown as a balancing item in the population of a State or Territory.
- 15. Campers out—Persons who spent Census night in the open in cars, caravans or trucks pulled up at the side of the road for that night only, or persons in other temporary camps or accommodation erected for that night only are classified as campers out. Such persons are included in the population of the LGA in which they were enumerated.

Geographic definitions

- 16. Information from the Census is available at various levels of geographic detail, only some of which are shown in this publication. Information at other levels may be made available on request. Some of the principal levels are described below.
- 17. Collection District (CD)—The Collection District (CD) is the smallest geographical area used in the collection and dissemination of Census data. A CD is an area containing approximately 300 dwellings in urban areas and fewer in rural areas. CD's can be aggregated to form other geographic levels, such as LGA's and Statistical Divisions.
- 18. Local Government Area (LGA)—This is a basic unit used in the presentation of Census data. LGA's correspond in all but a few instances to legal Local Government Authority Areas, e.g. City, Municipality, Shire, District Council. Because the City of Brisbane, the Northern Territory and the Australian Capital Territory do not have legal LGA's equivalent in size to other States and capital cities, they have been divided, for statistical purposes, into Census LGA's.
- 19. Urban Centres—At each Census of Population and Housing a boundary is defined for each population cluster of 1,000 or more people and for known holiday resorts of less population if they contain 250 or more dwellings of which at least 100 are occupied on Census night. These clusters are known as Urban Centres and the population and dwellings enumerated in them are classified as urban for statistical purposes. The rules used to determine Urban Centres and define their boundaries are complex. They can be made available on request.

- 20. Localities—See 'Bounded Rural Locality' under the heading 'Section of State'.
- 21. Section of State—This identifies aggregations of CD's on a basis which ignores legal boundaries. Sections of State are defined for statistical purposes only.

Five Sections of State are used:

- (a) Major Urban—Urban Centres with a population of 100,000 and over;
- (b) Other Urban—Urban Centres with a population of 1,000 to 99,999;
- (c) Bounded Rural Locality—population clusters of 200 to 999 persons;
- (d) Rural Balance—the remainder of the State;
- (e) Migratory—see explanation under 'Definitions'.
- 22. Statistical Division—Statistical Divisions are designed to be relatively homogeneous regions characterised by identifiable social and economic links between the inhabitants and between the economic units within the region, under the unifying influence of one or more major towns or cities. Capital City Statistical Divisions are predominantly urban in character and the boundaries are delineated to contain the anticipated urban development of the capital cities (and associated Urban Centres) for a period of at least twenty years.
- 23. Statistical Subdivision—A Statistical Subdivision is defined in most States on the same basis as a Statistical Division but as a portion of the latter.
- 24. Statistical District—Generally, a Statistical District is a Statistical Subdivision that meets additional criteria. Most Statistical Districts contain an Urban Centre with a population of 25,000 or more and their boundaries, like those of Capital City Statistical Divisions, are delineated to contain the anticipated urban development of the centre for a period of at least twenty years. These fixed boundaries delineate areas which for general statistical purposes are free from the problems imposed by the moving boundaries of the majority of Urban Centres.
- 25. In selected cases, especially in Queensland, Statistical District boundaries have been delineated around Urban Centres with a population of fewer than 25,000, where there was a demand for intercensal population estimates for the area and where existing LGA boundaries were obviously inadequate for this purpose.
- 26. There are three cases where Statistical Districts are not equivalent to Statistical Subdivisions. They are the Statistical Districts of Gold Coast and Albury-Wodonga which cross State boundaries and each of which consist of two Statistical Subdivisions, and the Canberra Statistical District which consists of the Canberra Statistical Division and the LGA of Queanbeyan in New South Wales.

Terms and abbreviations

Geographic code

- 27. The six digit geographic code used in Tables 1, 4, 5 and 6 in this publication indicates Statistical Division (first two digits), Statistical Subdivision or Statistical District (third digit) and Census LGA code (last three digits).
- 28. The Census LGA codes have been allocated in alphabetical order within each State or Territory.
- 29. The combination of codes shown in this series of publications thus provides a cross-reference between the various tables and maps, as well as identifying those parts of legal LGA's divided by Statistical Division, Statistical Subdivision or Statistical District boundaries (see Appendix A).

APPENDIX A

MAJOR CHANGES TO STATISTICAL DIVISIONS, STATISTICAL SUBDIVISIONS AND DISTRICTS, LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS AND URBAN CENTRES, AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY, 1976 TO 1981

1. STATISTICAL DIVISIONS, SUBDIVISIONS AND DISTRICTS

The Canberra City District was abolished by the District Ordinance, February 1976, and the Australian Capital Territory was divided into eighteen Districts. As there is no system of local government equivalent to that in the States, these districts and their divisions have been treated as LGA's for Census purposes.

The A.C.T. has been divided into the Canberra Statistical District (A.C.T. Part) and the Balance of Territory.

The Canberra Statistical District (A.C.T. Part) has been further sub-divided into six Statistical Subdivisions corresponding with the following Districts: Canberra Central, Woden Valley, Weston Creek, Belconnen, Tuggeranong and the Balance of the Statistical District.

The Balance of the Statistical District includes the Districts of Gungahlin, Hall, Jerrabomberra, Kowen, Majura, Mitchell, Pialligo, Stromlo and Symonston.

The Balance of Territory includes Jervis Bay and the Remainder of the A.C.T. (see below).

The total population of the Canberra Statistical District, including the Municipality of Queanbeyan, was 239,798* persons in 1981, compared with 215,461 in 1976.

The total population of urban Canberra, including the urban population of the Municipality of Queanbeyan, was 238,379* in 1981, compared with 213,055 in 1976.

• Note that the Queanbeyan component of this figure is only preliminary.




