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INTRODUCTION

This publication contains estimates of the resident populations of Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) of Tasmania, as at 30 June, from 1991 to 1993.

Included are estimates of the age-sex composition of Tasmanian Statistical Local Areas (SLAs) at 30 June 1993. The publication also presents an analysis over the last six years of the components of population change in Tasmania.

Information on the methodology used to estimate resident population in Tasmania (and in LGAs and SLAs) is contained in the Explanatory Notes at the back of this publication. The notes also contain an assessment of the quality of the estimates produced.

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MAIN FEATURES

Tasmanian population growth at its lowest level in 50 years

In the year to 30 June 1993, Tasmania's population increased by an estimated 1760 persons, or 0.37 per cent. This was the lowest increase recorded since the year to 30 June 1943, when the population actually decreased. In the period 30 June 1986 to 30 June 1991 Tasmania's population increased, on average, by 0.89 per cent whereas the national rate of growth averaged 1.53 per cent. Between 30 June 1991 and 30 June 1993 Tasmania's population increased, on average, by 0.50 per cent (nationally 1.07 per cent).

Tasmanian natural increase still below the national average

In the period from 1987-88 to 1992-93 births were in the range from 6705 to 6972. Deaths were in the range from 3590 to 3712. In the last ten years the average number of births has been 6955 and the average number of deaths has been 3621.

Tasmania's natural increase (births less deaths) of 3214 persons, in 1992-93, was an increase of 24 on the previous year's figure of 3190. Tasmania's rate of natural increase since 1987-88 (from 0.68 per cent to 0.74 per cent) has been consistently lower than the national average (from 0.77 per cent to 0.83 per cent). However, any movement in the Tasmanian rate has closely followed that of Australia as a whole.

Migration

Overseas migration falters

In the period from 1987-88 to 1992-93 overseas arrivals ranged from 1851 to 2187. Overseas departures were in the range from 1358 to 1649. In the last ten years the average number of arrivals has been 2002 and the average number of departures has been 1406. Departures have risen fairly consistently over the ten years. Net migration has shown a downward trend over the period 1987-88 to 1992-93 with the current levels the lowest since 1975-76.

Interstate migration returns to the negative

In the period from 1987-88 to 1992-93 interstate arrivals were in the range from 9715 to 13 259. Interstate departures were between 10 469 and 12 642 (recorded in 1992-93). In the last ten years the average number of arrivals has been 10 415. The average number of departures has been 10 434. Net migration has fluctuated over the last ten years from a high of 2790 to a low of -1924. The last two years have shown a return to the negative interstate migration levels that Tasmania experienced throughout most of the 1980s.

Net migration

In the period from 1987-88 to 1992-93 total migration arrivals ranged from 11 902 to 15 314. Migration departures were in the range from 11 952 to 14 224 (recorded in 1992-93). Net migration has fluctuated over the period from a high of 3550 to a low of -1453 (recorded in 1992-93).

Age

Ageing of the population

The median age of males in Tasmania at the 1981 Census was 28.3 years compared with 32.5 years in 1993, representing an increase of 14.8 per cent. Similarly, the female median age rose by 15.3 per cent within the same period from 29.4 years to 33.9 years. The overall increase in the median age of the population of Tasmania from 28.9 years in 1981 to 33.2 years in 1993 was a rise of 14.9 per cent.

Underlying the increase in median ages has been a decline in fertility, reflected as a declining proportion of persons in the 0-14 age group. Increased life expectation has been reflected, in part, by increases in the proportion of persons aged 65 years and over. In 1981, 0-14 year olds accounted for 25.9 per cent of Tasmania's population, but by 1993 this had declined to 22.8 per cent. Conversely, persons aged 65 years and over accounted for 10.0 per cent of the population in 1981 compared to 12.2 per cent in 1993.

Brighton was the most youthful Local Government Area in 1993 with a median age of only 23.9 years. The establishment of young families in this area is in contrast with those Local Government Areas popular for retirement; Glamorgan/Spring Bay, Tasman and Break O'Day all had median ages above 36 years at 30 June 1993.

Growth between 30 June 1991 and 30 June 1993

Regions show little change

The Greater Hobart-Southern Region accounted for 48.0 per cent of Tasmania's estimated resident population at 30 June 1993; the Northern Region, 28.1 per cent; and the Mersey-Lyell Region, 23.8 per cent. These proportions are similar to those recorded in previous years. They have changed only slightly since 1981 when they were 47.1 per cent, 27.5 per cent and 25.4 per cent respectively.

During 1991-93 the Greater Hobart-Southern Region showed a growth rate of 0.60 per cent and the Northern Region 0.59 per cent. The overall State growth was only 0.50 per cent due to only a small population increase of 0.19 per cent in the Mersey-Lyell Region.

Statistical Local Areas

Meander Part A, the area that represents the urban component of the Meander Local Government Area (and includes the fringe of urban Launceston, west of Prospect), experienced an average annual rate of increase of 4.77 per cent. Other Statistical Local Areas showing average annual increases over 2 per cent included Sorell Part A (2.95 per cent), Kingborough Part A (2.22 per cent) and West Tamar Part A (2.12 per cent).

The most significant decrease in the rate of change occurred in the West Coast Statistical Local Area. Between 30 June 1991 and 30 June 1993 it registered an average annual fall of 1.18 per cent. The Western Statistical Subdivision is subject to the economic vagaries of the mining industry. With the recession and its adverse effect on mining, emigration from this area was not unexpected.

Local Government Areas

Sorell experienced an average annual rate of increase 2.77 per cent. Other Local Government Areas showing reasonable growth included Kingborough (2.11 per cent), West Tamar (2.08 per cent) and Meander Valley (1.58 per cent).

Growth between 30 June 1991 and 30 June 1993 in each of the cities in Tasmania has been marginal. Glenorchy registered the greatest rate of growth at 0.35 per cent per annum followed by Clarence (0.26 per cent), Devonport (0.22 per cent) and Launceston (0.12 per cent). The populations of Hobart and Burnie decreased marginally.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Methodology

1. Australia's population statistics (since 1971) are compiled according to the place of usual residence of the population. An explanation of the conceptual basis is given in the ABS Information Paper *Population Estimates: An Outline of the New Conceptual Basis of ABS Population Estimates* (Catalogue No. 3216.0) issued on 29 March 1982.
2. The estimated resident population of any area at 30 June 1991 is derived by adjusting the Census Count Place of Enumeration data to exclude visitors who normally reside outside the area, to include residents who were temporarily absent in other areas or overseas, and to apply a factor for census under-enumeration.
3. Post-censal estimates at the National and State and Territory levels are made quarterly and are obtained by adding components of natural increase (on a usual residence basis) and net migration gain to the population at the beginning of each period.
4. At the National level, estimates of overseas migration are based on net permanent and long-term overseas movements as recorded on passenger cards completed by incoming and outgoing travellers for the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.
5. At the State and Territory level, information about internal migration is available from population censuses and from a sample survey of internal movements conducted triennially. These sources, however, do not provide the up-to-date quarterly estimates of interstate migration required for regular population estimates. The only suitable sources for this purpose are administrative records. Prior to June 1986, quarterly estimates of internal migration were derived from records of interstate changes of addresses advised to the Department of Social Security in connection with family allowance payments. After June 1986 the estimates are derived from changes of addresses advised to the Health Insurance Commission in the process of administering Medicare.
6. Post-censal Statistical Local Area (SLA) estimates are made annually and are produced with the assistance of local government authorities and other bodies who provide information on significant local factors which may have caused population changes in the relevant period.
7. After each census, final estimates for the preceding intercensal period are provided by incorporating an additional adjustment (intercensal discrepancy) to ensure that the total intercensal increase agrees with the difference between the estimated resident populations at the two respective census dates. This publication contains these estimates based on the result of the 1991 Census.
8. Estimates of the age and sex of SLA populations in this bulletin are based on the 1991 Census results.

Data Quality

9. The quality of estimates contained within this publication is dependant on the quality of population census results (including under-enumeration adjustments) and on the various components and indicators of population change.
10. Intercensal discrepancy measures the difference between population estimates updated from a past population census and the estimates based on the subsequent population census. For Tasmania, between the 1986 and 1991 Censuses, the intercensal discrepancy was measured at 6300 persons, or 1.4 per cent of the estimated population.

11. Analysis of intercensal discrepancy between 1986 and 1991 reveals that for eleven local government areas greater than 10 000 persons, discrepancy was less than two per cent of the final estimated population. For smaller local government areas, estimates for nine out of every ten were within five per cent of the final estimated population.

Statistical Geography

12. The statistical geography used in this publication is based on the Australian Standard Geographical Classification (ASGC), Edition 4. Users should refer to the *ASGC Manual* (Catalogue No. 1216.0) or *Index of Tasmanian Towns, Localities and Standard Area Codes, Tasmania* (Catalogue No. 1101.6) for further information.

13. Population estimates for Statistical Local Areas and Local Government Areas in this publication are based on the boundaries in existence at 30 June 1993.

Reliability

14. Estimates of the age and sex of the population in each SLA and of overseas and interstate migration are shown in units without being rounded. However, accuracy down to the unit is not claimed and should not be assumed.

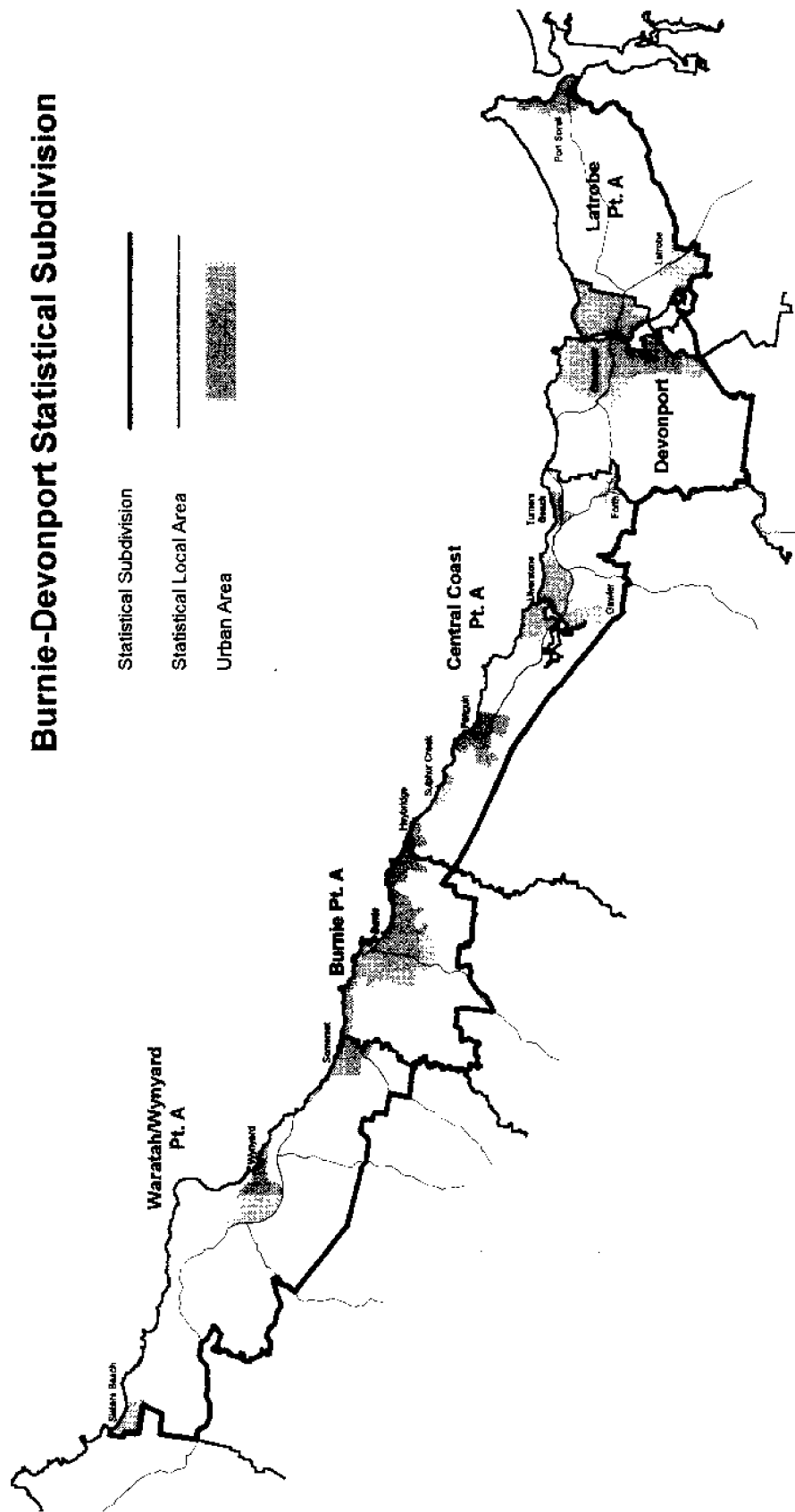


Greater Launceston Statistical Subdivision

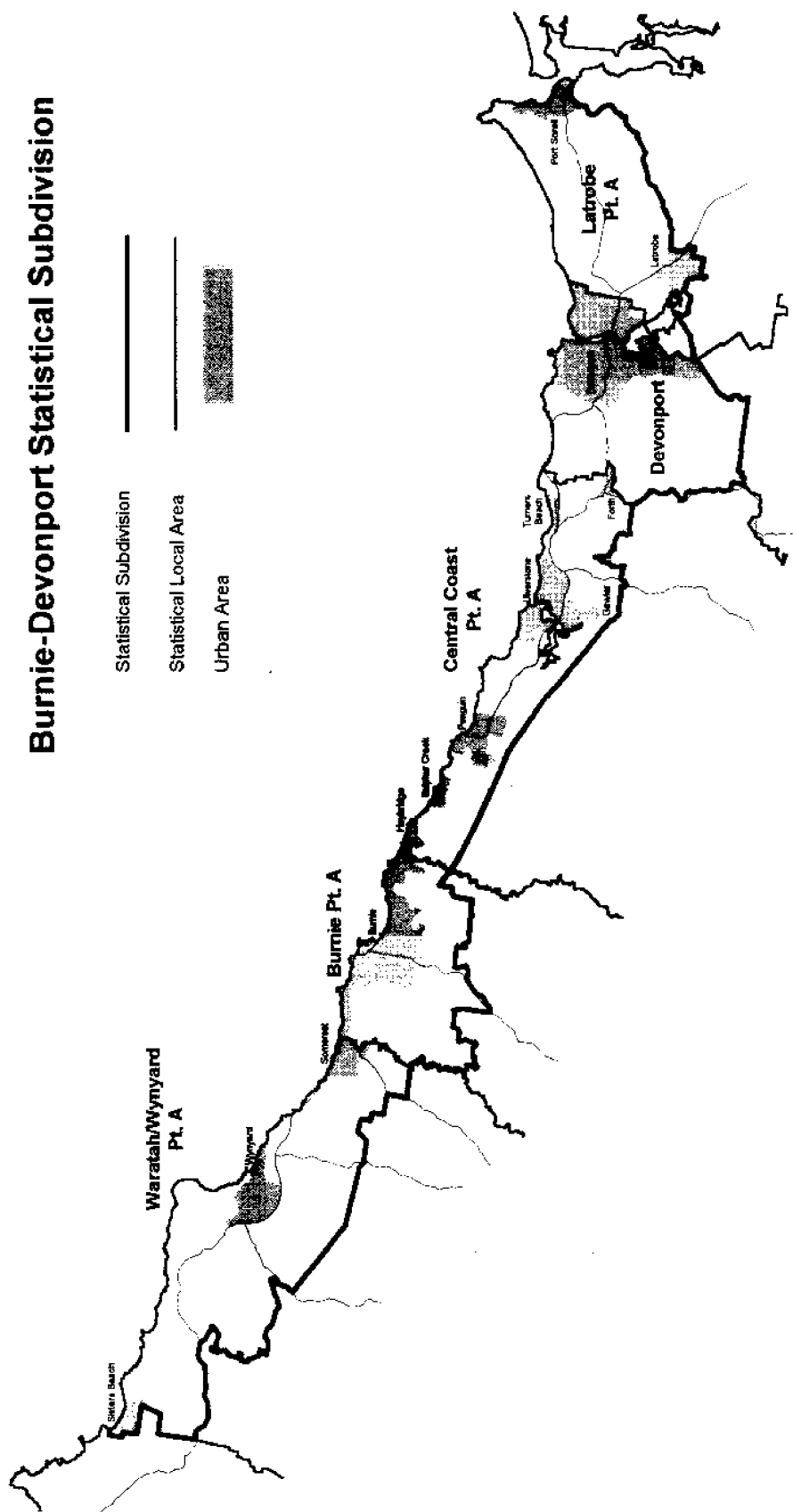
