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## SUMMARY OF VITAL AND POPULATION STATISTICS : MARCH OUARTER 1970

This publication contains a summary of vital and population statistics for the quarter ended 31 March 1970 and recent quarters and years.

## INTRODUCTION

The results of the 1966 Census have been taken into account in the preparation of the population estimates shown herein. Population estimates published in earlier issues in this series prior to that for September Quarter 1967 exclude full-blood Aborigines as required by Section 127 of the Constitution prior to its repeal in 1967.

Vital statistics for periods prior to 1967 exclude full-blood Aborigines. Differences between the statistics now published and those formerly published which implied the exclusion of Aboriginal vital events, cannot be taken as reliable statistics of births, deaths or marriages among full-blood Aborigines, because in many areas no satisfactory administrative or other pasis existed for distinguishing vital events among full-blood Aborigines from those among part-Aborigines or the rest of the population.

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9. The estimate for Australia as a whole takes account of natural increase and net overseas migration since the Census.
10. The estimated population for each State or Territory represents the population ascertained at the Census plus recorded natural increase and recorded net gain from overseas migration for that State or Territory; gains and corresponding losses that result from movenents between States and Territories are also taken into account in so far as they are recorded as transfers of state of residence under child endowment procedures or Commonwealth electoral procedures supplerented by results of any special count or sample survey. Holiday, business and other similar short-term movements between States and Territories are not taken into account. As records of migration by State or Territory are not complete the estimated State and Territory populations so derived are approximate and are subject to revision when the actual population of each State is ascertained at the next Census.
11. As a consequence of the omission of holiday, business or other similar short-term movements between States and Territories the marked seasonal movements in the population of some States due to interstate holiday movements are not reflected in the estimates since June 1961. However, two aspects of seasonal movements are reflected in the estimated populations of the States. These are:
(i) People who were on holiday or other short-term travel interstate at the time of the Census are counted in the State where they spent Census night.
(ii) There is some seasonal movement in the population of Australia as a whole which is due to movements of tourists and other visitors from overseas and of Australians travelling overseas for short periods.

NOTE. (i) A line drawn across a column between two consecutive figures indicates a break in continuity in the series.
(ii) Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in Tables 1-3 are due to rounding.

NOTE. Mean populations are calculated for twelve-month periods to provide a satisfactory average basis for calculations requiring allowance for the continuous change in population figures during such periods. The mean population for any year has been calculated by the formula:

Mean population $=\frac{a+4 b+2 c+4 d+e}{12}$
where $a, b, c, d$ and $e$, respectively, are the populations at the end of the quarter immediately preceding the year and at the end of each of the four succeeding quarters; e.g., in the case of a calendar year, 31 December of the preceding year, and 31 March, 30 June, 30 September and 31 December of the year under consideration.

NOTE. Rates for quarters are equivalent annual rates per 1,000 of mean population. Quarterly rates, especially in deaths and marriages, reflect seasonal influences and all rates may he influenced by varyine delay in registration. Also, a variation in rates based on small numbers of events is of less significance than the same variation in rates based on larger numbers. In some instances rates are based on too few marriages to warrant calculation to the second decimal place.
