OVERSEAS ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER 1976

And Provisional Estimates to November 1976

MAIN FEATURES

- Overseas arrivals and departures for the eleven months ended November 1976 are estimated at 1,502,359 and 1,413,198 respectively, compared with 1,390,006 and 1,351,094 in the corresponding period in 1975.
- . Settlers arriving in the eleven months ended November 1976 numbered 50,539 compared with 49,007 in the same period in 1975.
- Australian residents departing for short-term trips abroad increased from 227,870 in the September quarter 1975 to 243,532 in the September quarter 1976, an increase of 7 per cent.
- Short-term overseas visitors arriving increased slightly from 115,361 in the September quarter 1975 to 115,393 in the September quarter 1976, an increase of less than one per cent.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

This publication contains preliminary summary statistics of overseas arrivals in and departures from Australia during the months of August and September 1976, together with statistics for earlier periods. More detailed statistics are published quarterly and annually in Overseas Arrivals and Departures (Reference Numbers 4.1 and 4.23).

Preliminary and provisional estimates

2. The preliminary statistics shown in this bulletin are derived from part-edited data and are subject to subsequent correction. However, later edit and amendment action is not expected to greatly change the statistics shown in this bulletin. Provisional estimates of total arrivals and departures and of settlers arriving in the months of October and November 1976, included in Tables 2 and 3, are based on hand counts of records of

embarking and disembarking passengers and on estimates of settler arrivals made by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.

Source of the statistics

3. Persons arriving in or departing from Australia are required to complete prescribed questionnaires in the form of Incoming and Outgoing Passenger Cards. These cards provide information to the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs for administrative purposes and serve as the main source of statistics of overseas arrivals and departures.

Scope

4. The statistics published in this bulletin exclude air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Seasonally adjusted series

5. Seasonally adjusted figures of total and short-term arrivals and departures are shown in Tables 2 and 5. Details of the methods employed in seasonally adjusting these series are given in Seasonally Adjusted Indicators 1975 (Reference No. 1.10).

Category of traveller

6. Permanent movement consists of settlers arriving and Australian residents departing permanently. Residents departing permanently are sub-divided into former settlers (persons who state on departure that they had come to Australia intending to settle), and other residents departing permanently. Long-term movement is defined as comprising overseas visitors arriving and Australian residents departing temporarily with the intention of staying (in Australia or abroad, respectively) for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve

months or more. Travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term.

Country of stay, embarkation or disembarkation

7. Country of stay refers to the country in which Australian residents departing temporarily intend to spend most time, or the country in which Australian residents returning have spent most time. Country of embarkation or disembarkation refers to the country in which the traveller boards the actual ship or flight which brings him to Australia, or alights from the actual ship or flight which takes him from Australia. Travellers may answer this incorrectly, perhaps naming the country in which their journey commenced or will end, not withstanding any changes of flight or ship en route.

Occupation

8. Statistics classified by occupations of travellers are not available from tabulations of part-edited data and are therefore no longer published in this bulletin. However, they are available on request for months for which final figures are available, and will continue to be published in the quarterly bulletin Overseas Arrivals and Departures (Reference No. 4.1).

Related statistics

9. Related statistics are available from certain surveys, such as those published by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs and the Australian Department of Transport. Statistics of overseas arrivals and departures are also available in quarterly and annual publications issued by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs. The tables in this and other publications necessarily contain only a small part of the cross-classifications of items which are or can be produced. Also, items such as country, occupation and length of stay are necessarily summarised from more detailed classifications. Further details can be obtained by writing to the Bureau or ringing the number shown on page 1.

Sampling

10. While all permanent and long-term movement, and short-term movement by sea, is fully enumerated,

statistics of short-term movement by air are estimates derived from a sample. The sampling fractions used for the various sampling strata are as follows:

. Overseas visitors, according to country of citizenship

Australian residents returning	1 in 20

11. Estimates based on a sample are likely to differ from those obtained from a full enumeration. A measure of the difference which may be expected due to sampling is the "standard error" of the estimate. There are approximately two chances in three that the difference will be less than one standard error, and 19 chances in 20 that it will be less than two standard errors. The standard error varies with the sampling fraction used and the size of the estimate. The table below gives approximate standard errors for estimates of various sizes for three categories of travellers.

Rounding

12. After sampling, weights are assigned to sampled records to three decimal places, to increase the accuracy of estimation. During estimation all figures are rounded to the nearest integer. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components of tables are due to rounding.
