MAIN FEATURES

- The provisional figure for total arrivals in the year ended December 1978 is 1,814,119, an increase of 7 per cent over the previous year's figure of 1,697,770. Total departures are estimated at 1,758,422, a 9 per cent increase over the 1977 figure of 1,618,230.
- Settler arrivals for the year ended December 1978 numbered 68,337, a decrease of 11 per cent on the 1977 figure of 75,640. Whilst the U.K. and Ireland continued to be the largest single source of migrants in 1978, the importance of these countries as a source of settlers continued to decline - 24 per cent of settlers came from the U.K. and Ireland in 1978 compared with 28 per cent in 1977. A significant increase, however, occurred in both the number and proportion of settlers arriving from South East Asia. In 1978, 21 per cent of settlers came from this region compared with 11 per cent in 1977. The most sizeable increases were in the numbers arriving from Vietnam (122 per cent increase) and Malaysia (186 per cent). However it is likely that a significant proportion of the latter originated in Indo-china.
- Australian residents departing for short-term trips abroad increased by 10 per cent from 250,701 in the September quarter 1977 to 276,623 in the September quarter 1978 and during this period the U.K. and Ireland was the most popular destination. In contrast to the general trend, there was a 20 per cent decrease in the number of Australian residents departing for short term visits to Japan.
- Overseas visitors arriving for short-term visits to Australia in the September quarter 1978 numbered 139,992, an increase of 16 per cent over the corresponding period of 1977. New Zealand provided 54,706 visitors in this period (24 per cent more than in the September quarter 1977) representing 30 per cent of total short-term visitor arrivals. The U.S.A. provided a further 13 per cent of total visitors and the U.K. and Ireland 10 per cent.

Introduction

This publication contains summary statistics of overseas arrivals in and departures from Australia during the months of August and September 1978, together with statistics for earlier periods. More detailed statistics are published quarterly and annually in Overseas Arrivals and Departures (3402.0 and 3404.0).

Provisional estimates

2. Provisional estimates of total arrivals and departures and of settlers arriving from different countries in the months of October, November and December 1978, included in Tables 1, 3 and 5, were provided by the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs.

Source of the statistics

3. Persons arriving in or departing from Australia are required to complete prescribed questionnaires in the form of Incoming and Outgoing Passenger Cards. These cards provide information to the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs for administrative purposes and serve as the main source of statistics of overseas arrivals and departures.

Scope

4. The statistics published in this bulletin exclude air crew and ships' crew, transit passengers who pass through Australia but are not cleared for entry, and passengers on pleasure cruises commencing and finishing in Australia aboard ships not then engaged on regular voyages.

Seasonally adjusted series

5. Seasonally adjusted figures of total and short-term arrivals and departures are shown in Tables 1 and 7. Details of the methods employed in seasonally adjusting these series are given in Seasonally Adjusted Indicators (1308.0).

Category of traveller

6. Permanent movement consists of persons who, on arrival, state that they intend to settle in Australia (settlers) and of Australian residents, including former settlers, departing permanently, i.e. those who, on departure, state that they do not intend to return to Australia. Long-term movement is defined as comprising overseas visitors arriving and Australian residents departing temporarily with the intention of staying (in Australia or abroad, respectively) for twelve months or more, together with the departure of visitors and the return of Australian residents who stayed, in Australia or abroad, for twelve months or more. Travellers whose intended or actual period of stay is less than twelve months are classified as short-term.

Country of stay, embarkation or disembarkation

7. Country of stay refers to the country in which Australian residents departing temporarily intend to

spend most time, or the country in which Australian residents returning have spent most time. Country of embarkation or disembarkation refers to the country in which the traveller boards the actual ship or flight which brings him to Australia, or alights from the actual ship or flight which takes him from Australia. Travellers may answer this incorrectly, perhaps naming the country in which their journey commenced or will end, not withstanding any changes of flight or ship en route.

Related statistics

8. Related statistics are available from the Department of Immigration and Ethnic Affairs and the Department of Transport. The tables in this and other publications necessarily contain only a small part of the cross-classifications of items which are or can be produced. Also, items such as country, occupation and length of stay are necessarily summarised from more detailed classifications. Further details can be obtained by writing to the Bureau or ringing the number shown on page 1.

Sampling

9. While all permanent and long-term movement, and short-term movement by sea, is fully enumerated, statistics of short-term movement by air are estimates derived from a sample. The sampling fractions used for the various sampling strata are as follows:

Estimates based on a sample are likely to differ 10. from those obtained from a full enumeration. A measure of the difference which may be expected due to sampling is the "standard error" of the estimate. There are approximately two chances in three that the difference will be less than one standard error, and nineteen chances in twenty that it will be less than two standard errors. Thus, for example, if the estimate for Australian residents departing short-term is 500 then the approximate standard error is 70. There are two chances in three that the actual number of Australian residents departing short-term would lie between 430 and 570, and nineteen chances in twenty that it would lie between 360 and 640. The standard error varies with the sampling fraction used and the size of the estimate. The table below gives approximate standard errors for estimates of various sizes for three categories of traveller.

Rounding

11. After sampling, weights are assigned to sampled records to three decimal places, to increase the accuracy of estimation. During estimation all figures are rounded to the nearest integer. Where figures have been rounded, discrepancies may occur between sums of the component items and totals.
