SCHOOLS, 1971

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains detailed statistics of schools, teachers and students in Australia for 1971. Additional information can be found in publications of the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician in each State, various publications of the Commonwealth Department of Education and Science, and in the annual reports of the State Education Departments.

2. The statistics reported are not comparable between States nor entirely comparable between government and non-government schools in any one State because of differences in:

- (a) school systems, especially type of school;
- (b) the grading of students and their advancement;
- (c) the examination systems;
- (d) the transfer from secondary to vocational education; and
- (e) the recruitment and employment of teachers.

3. Schools are broadly classified as government or non-government and may provide primary, secondary, or both primary and secondary education. They include junior technical schools; correspondence schools (included in government ordinary schools); schools in institutional homes and hospitals; mission schools and similar establishments. They exclude pre-schools and kindergartens not incorporated in ordinary schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, institutions such as business colleges, and coaching colleges. The category other denominational in Tables 1,4,8 and 11 includes:

Victoria - Three Baptist schools and one Christian Scientist school.

Queensland - Five schools conducted by the Presbyterian and Methodist Schools Association and one Brethren mission school.

South Australia - Two Baptist and Congregational schools.

Western Australia - Two Free Reformed schools.

Tasmania - One Particular Baptist school, one Society of Friends school, and one Free Reformed school.

Special schools are those specifically intended for the instruction of students who are physically or mentally handicapped, or socially maladjusted. Special schools also include schools specifically set up for the education of Aboriginal children requiring other than ordinary schooling.

4. Teachers. The statistics include teaching staff, principals and head teachers, whether permanent or temporary, but exclude teachers-in-training, teachers on leave without pay, and other teachers engaged wholly in advisory, administrative or other non-teaching duties. Variations occur from State to State in:

- (a) the treatment of special purpose and casual teachers;
- (b) the classification of teachers who, in addition to primary or secondary teaching, are also engaged on other duties.

5. All teaching staff are classified as either full-time or part-time; part-time staff have also been expressed in units of full-time equivalents. The methods used for calculating equivalent full-time units of part-time teaching vary from State to State and even between schools within States. Most schools base their calculations on hours worked, number of class periods, or proportion of full-time salary.

6. Students. Statistics of students refer to the number enrolled at the schools included in this collection at the school census date. Students in pre-schools incorporated in ordinary schools are included, but adult and part-time correspondence students are excluded as far as possible.

7. Methods of allocating classes to grades, particularly classes for students in special categories vary from State to State: students at special schools may follow the normal curriculum and students at ordinary schools may be in special classes and follow special curricula. In addition there are differences in the organisation of special Aboriginal education in the various States and the Northern Territory.

8. In New South Wales there were seventeen non-government special schools, each of which was partly staffed by State education department teachers, thereby forming distinct units (government and non-government) within each school. For statistical purposes each unit (including teachers and students) has been treated as a separate school.

9. The tables showing schools by size of total enrolment and by size of primary and secondary enrolment and those showing the age/grade enrolments of students which were included in previous bulletins are now only available upon request. The historical table showing age of students by sex for a ten year period will next appear in the 1975 bulletin.

NOTE. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.

The following symbols, when used in tables mean:

n.a. - not available.

.. - nil, or less than half the final digit shown.

p - preliminary.

COMMENT

In 1971 there were 9,588 schools operating in Australia (7,404 government schools and 2,184 non-government schools) a decrease of one per cent over 1970. This decrease is largely due to the closing down of smaller schools in some States. Included in the 9,588 schools in 1971 were 407 special schools (301 government and 106 non-government) an increase of 5 per cent over 1970.

*2. The full-time teaching staff in all schools in 1971 numbered 118,030. In addition there were 5,975 equivalent full-time units of part-time teaching (95,042 full-time and 4,073 full-time equivalents of part-time teaching in government schools and 22,988 full-time and 1,901 full-time equivalents of part-time teaching in non-government schools). Compared with 1970 the number of full-time equivalents of part-time teaching has risen by 16 per cent and the number of full-time teachers by 3 per cent in all schools (21 per cent and 2 per cent in government schools and 7 per cent and 4 per cent in non-government schools respectively).

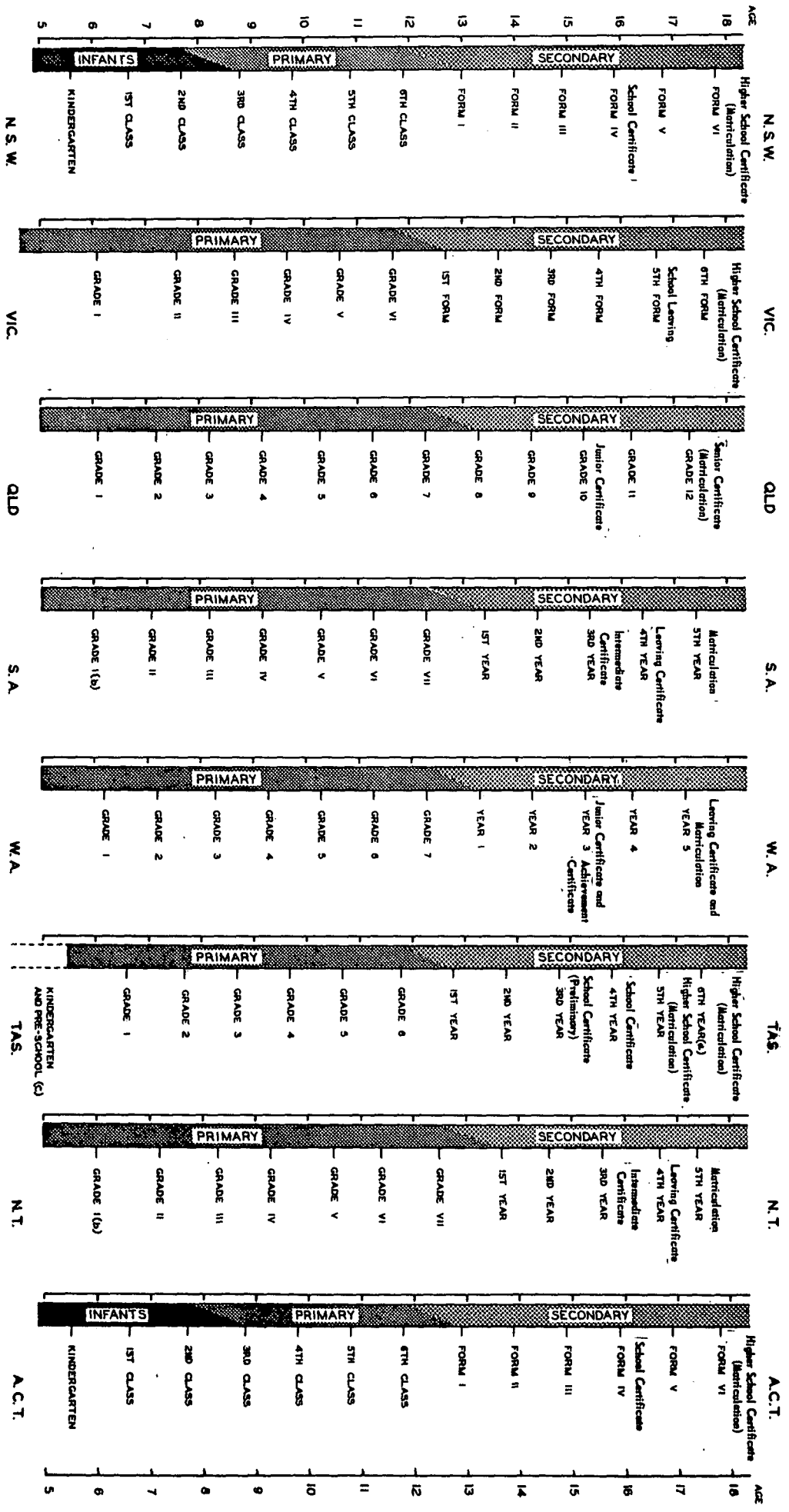
3. Students attending these schools in 1971 numbered 2,807,386 (2,196,312 attending government schools and 611,074 attending non-government schools). The increases over 1970 enrolments are 1.4 per cent (1.7 per cent increase for government students and 0.5 per cent increase for non-government students).

4. Over the five year period 1967 to 1971 there has been a decrease of 3 per cent in the number of schools. The full-time equivalent of part-time teaching has increased by 70 per cent, the number of full-time teachers by 18 per cent, and the number of students by 9 per cent.

GRADES AND EXAMINATIONS IN THE PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL SYSTEMS IN EACH STATE AND TERRITORY, 1971

The grade numbering follows, as nearly as possible, the usual in grade/level primary and high schools in each State in 1971. It is not necessarily used in all types of schools. The grades have been written in to agree with the specific names on the diagram, in order to indicate differences in nomenclature between States. However, appropriate information is not given enough to allow determination of accurate average age of students in each grade, and the age indicators are therefore only approximate. The diagram should not be taken as a comparison of academic standards of grades between States. For a more detailed presentation of the systems operating in each State, reference should be made to diagrams etc. appearing in the annual reports of State Education Departments.

The total statistics of all special teachers, excluding New South Wales, are: full-time - 1,894; part-time number - 135; equivalent full-time units - 54; total full-time teachers plus equivalent full-time units - 1,948.
