EXPLANATORY NOTES

This bulletin contains detailed statistics of schools, teachers and students in Australia for 1972. Additional information can be found in publications of the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician in each State, various publications of the Commonwealth Department of Education, and in the annual reports of the State education departments.

2. The statistics reported are not comparable between States nor entirely comparable between government and non-government schools in any one State because of differences in:

- (a) school systems, especially type of school;
- (b) the grading of students and their advancement;
- (c) the examination systems;
- (d) the transfer from secondary to vocational education; and
- (e) the recruitment and employment of teachers.

3. Schools are broadly classified as government or non-government and may provide primary, secondary, or both primary and secondary education. They include junior technical schools; correspondence schools (included in government ordinary schools); schools in institutional homes and hospitals; mission schools and similar establishments. They exclude pre-schools and kindergartens not incorporated in ordinary schools, senior technical and agricultural colleges, evening schools, continuation classes, institutions such as business colleges, and coaching colleges. Special schools are those specifically intended for the instruction of students who are physically or mentally handicapped, or socially maladjusted. Special schools also include schools specifically set up for the education of Aboriginal children requiring other than ordinary schooling.

4. Teachers. The statistics include teaching staff, principals and head teachers, whether permanent or temporary, but exclude teachers-in-training, teachers on leave without pay, and other teachers engaged wholly in advisory, administrative or other non-teaching duties. Variations occur from State to State in:

(a) the treatment of special purpose and casual teachers;(b) the classification of teachers who, in addition to primary or secondary teaching, are also engaged on other duties.

5. All teaching staff are classified as either full-time or part-time; part-time staff have also been expressed in units of full-time equivalents. The methods used for calculating equivalent full-time units of part-time teaching vary from State to State and even between schools within States. Most schools base their calculations on hours worked, number of class periods, or proportion of full-time salary.

6. If a full-time teacher teaches both senior and junior technical school students in Victoria, he is counted as part-time in these statistics (which include junior technical but not senior technical schools) if his teaching load in the junior school is less than 75 per cent. Part-time teachers (including visiting teachers) teaching at two or more schools are shown as part-time at each school.

7. Students. Statistics of students refer to the number enrolled at the schools included in this collection at the school census date. Students in pre-schools incorporated in ordinary schools are included, but adult and part-time correspondence students are excluded as far as possible.

8. Methods of allocating classes to grades, particularly classes for students in special categories vary from State to State: students at special schools may follow the normal curriculum and students at ordinary schools may be in special classes and follow special curricula. In addition there are differences in the organisation of special Aboriginal education in the various States and the Northern Territory.

9. In New South Wales in 1972 there were eighteen non-government special schools, each of which was partly staffed by State education department teachers, thereby forming distinct units (government and non-government) within each school. For statistical purposes each unit (including teachers and students) has been treated as a separate school.

10. An increasing number of schools (other than special schools), both government and non-government, are no longer maintaining a formal grade structure. These schools allocate students to 'groups' for each subject according to their ability in that subject. States either allocate these 'groups' to grades or show them as 'Ungraded non-special'.

NOTE. Any discrepancies between totals and sums of components in tables are due to rounding.

COMMENT

In 1972 there were 9,552 schools operating in Australia (7,362 government schools and 2,190 non-government schools), a decrease of 0.4 per cent over 1971. This decrease is largely due to the closing down of smaller schools in some States. Included in the 9,552 schools in 1972 were 419 special schools (311 government and 108 non-government), an increase of 3 per cent over 1971.

*2. The full-time teaching staff in all schools in 1972 numbered 123,645 (99,774 government and 23,871 non-government). In addition there were 6,771 equivalent full-time units of part-time teaching (4,773 government and 1,998 non-government). Compared with 1971, the number of full-time equivalents of part-time teaching has risen by 10 per cent and the number of full-time teachers by 5 per cent in all schools (12 per cent and 5 per cent in government schools and 5 per cent and 4 per cent in non-government schools respectively).

3. Students attending these schools in 1972 numbered 2,840,951 (2,228,941 attending government schools and 612,010 attending non-government schools). The increases over 1971 enrolments are 1.2 per cent (1.5 per cent increase for government students and 0.2 per cent increase for non-government students).

4. Over the five year period 1968 to 1972 there has been a decrease of 3 per cent in the number of schools. The full-time equivalent of part-time teaching has increased by 69 per cent, the number of full-time teachers by 17 per cent, and the number of students by 7 per cent.

GRADES AND EXAMINATIONS IN THE PRIMARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL SYSTEMS IN EACH STATE AND TERRITORY, 1972

The grade terminology follows, as nearly as possible, that used in government primary and high schools in each State in 1972. It is not necessarily used in all types of schools. The grades have been written in to agree with the age-scale shown on the diagram, in order to indicate differences in age-grade patterns between States. However, age-grade information is not procise enough to allow determination of accurate average age of students in each grade; and the age indications are therefore only approximate. The diagram should not be taken as a comparison of academic standards of grades between States. For a more detailed presentation of the systems operating in each State, reference should be made to diagrams etc. appearing in the annual reports of State Education Departments.
