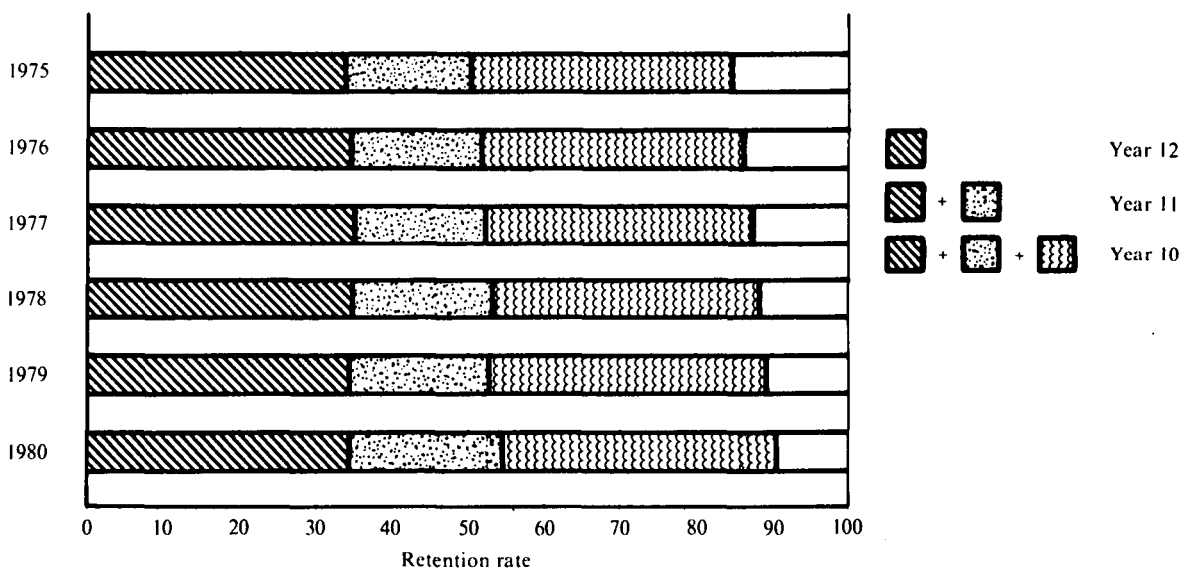

In 1980, 90.5 per cent of students who had commenced secondary school stayed until at least Year 10. This figure represents an increase from 1979 figures, and a continuation of the steady rise in Year 10 retention rates witnessed in the period 1975 to 1979.

Differences in retention rates can also be seen between categories of schools. Government schools in 1980 had the lowest retention rates where only 28.4 per cent of students were retained until Year 12. Non-government schools (other than Roman Catholic schools) by comparison had the highest retention rates with 87.9 per cent staying until Year 12.

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MAIN FEATURES

Total School enrolments were 2,984,562 in 1980, representing a decline of 0.08 per cent (2,369 persons) over the previous year's enrolments. This contrasted with a total increase of 2.6 per cent from 1975 to 1980.

Between 1979 and 1980, male enrolments fell by 2,787 (0.18 per cent), while female enrolments rose by 418 (0.03 per cent).

The number of students at non-government schools increased between 1979 and 1980 by 16,272 persons (2.4 per cent) while numbers at government schools declined by 18,641 persons (0.8 per cent).

The number of teachers at government schools increased by 0.23 per cent (326 persons) and at non-government schools by 4.2 per cent (1,428 persons).

EXPLANATORY NOTES

This publication contains detailed statistics of teachers and students in primary and secondary schools in Australia at July/August 1980. Preliminary statistics for 1980 were published in *School Enrolments, Australia, 1980 (Preliminary)* (4201.0) on 27 January 1981. Additional information can be found in publications of the Deputy Commonwealth Statistician in each State, various publications of the Department of Education and the Schools Commission, and in the annual reports of the State Education Departments.

2. The statistics in this publication relate to primary and secondary education provided by schools and also to special schools specifically set up for the education of children requiring other than ordinary schooling. Children attending pre-school classes at schools have been excluded from the statistics and are shown separately in Appendix B, page 42. Teacher figures are generally expressed in full-time equivalent units (FTE) in this publication.

3. Because of the diversity of the Australian education system and its administration, the statistics reported in this publication are not entirely comparable. Comparability between States and between government and non-government schools in any one State is affected by differences in the organisation of grades, policy on student advancement, flows from secondary to vocational education and the recruitment and employment of teachers.

4. This publication has been divided into five sections.

5. The first section contains an overview of schools statistics and in particular the changes occurring in this sector of the education system.

6. The second, third and fourth sections of the publication contain more detailed statistics on schools, students and teachers respectively.

7. The fifth section, the Appendixes, contains a table on the average age of students at government schools and another on pre-primary enrolments at primary schools.

Scope and coverage

8. The statistics in this publication relate to schools established to provide full-time instruction according to a primary and/or secondary curriculum and to schools catering for students with special needs who would be attending an ordinary school under other circumstances.

9. In previous years, pre-school activity conducted under the administration of a primary and/or secondary school has been included in statistics for Western Australia, Tasmania, Northern Territory and non-government schools in New South Wales. From 1979, all pre-primary education undertaken on a sessional basis or in a recognised pre-school class of a primary/secondary school has been excluded from the statistics in this publication. (Exceptions are footnoted in the relevant tables). This pre-primary activity is considered to be different from the primary education activities of most kindergarten, preparatory, reception and transition classes included in primary education.

10. Student enrolment data for 1975 to 1980 is shown on the new basis, i.e. excluding pre-primary enrolments. Teacher figures, however, have only been presented on the new basis from 1979 as earlier data with this dissection is not readily available. For similar reasons, student:teacher ratios have not been revised before 1979.

11. Details of student enrolments in pre-primary education at primary schools have been presented in Appendix B of this publication.

Definitions

12. *Schools* are broadly classified as government or non-government and may provide primary, secondary and/or special education (special education being special instruction for physically and/or mentally handicapped or socially maladjusted students). The term 'school' in this publication includes junior technical schools, correspondence schools (included in government schools), schools in institutions and hospitals, mission schools and similar establishments. The term excludes recognised pre-school and kindergarten centres; pre-primary schools or classes in, or attached to, ordinary schools; senior technical and agricultural colleges; evening schools; continuation classes; and institutions such as business or coaching colleges.

13. *Teacher* statistics include teaching staff, principals and head teachers (whether permanent or temporary), but exclude teachers-in-training, teachers on leave without pay, and other teachers engaged wholly in advisory, administrative or other non-teaching duties. Comparability between States is affected by different treatments of casual and special purpose teachers and different classifications of teachers who perform other duties as well as primary or secondary teaching.

14. All teachers are classified as either *full-time* or *part-time*. Part-time teaching effort is also expressed in 'full-time equivalent units' (FTE). Methods used for calculating FTE vary slightly between and within States, however most schools base their calculations on hours worked, number of class periods, or proportion of full-time salary. Generally, total teaching effort is presented in FTE in this publication.

15. Teachers of sessional and/or pre-school classes have been excluded for 1979 and 1980.

16. *Student* statistics refer to the number of full-time students enrolled at schools included in the Schools Census collection at the reference period. The reference period is July/August 1980.

17. There is no Australia-wide standard method of allocating students and classes to a certain year of education (grade). In particular there are differences in the organisation of both special schools and special classes at ordinary schools. Where possible, special students have been allocated to a year of education, otherwise they have been recorded as *ungraded special*.

18. A number of schools (other than special schools) do not maintain a formal grade structure. Students at these schools have been allocated to equivalent grades where possible but otherwise appear against the category *ungraded*.

19. The *Apparent retention* rate is the percentage of students commencing secondary school who remain at school until the third last, second last or last year of schooling (i.e. Years 10, 11 or 12). The rates are called *Apparent* as they do not take into account the effects of migration, the repeating of classes, or inter-system transfer on the school population.

Age grade tables

20. Supplementary age grade tables are available on request. These tables are classified by category of school (government, non-government and total) and show the age distribution of boys and girls within grades in each State and Territory and for Australia.

SECTION I—ANALYSIS OF RESULTS

This section provides an analysis of the trends occurring in Australian schools in recent years. Trends highlighted relate to the change in number of students, schools and teachers, the masculinity ratio, retention rates and participation rates, and the growth in student numbers in the non-government sector. Table 1 summarises the changes in the size of the school sector in Australia over the past six years.

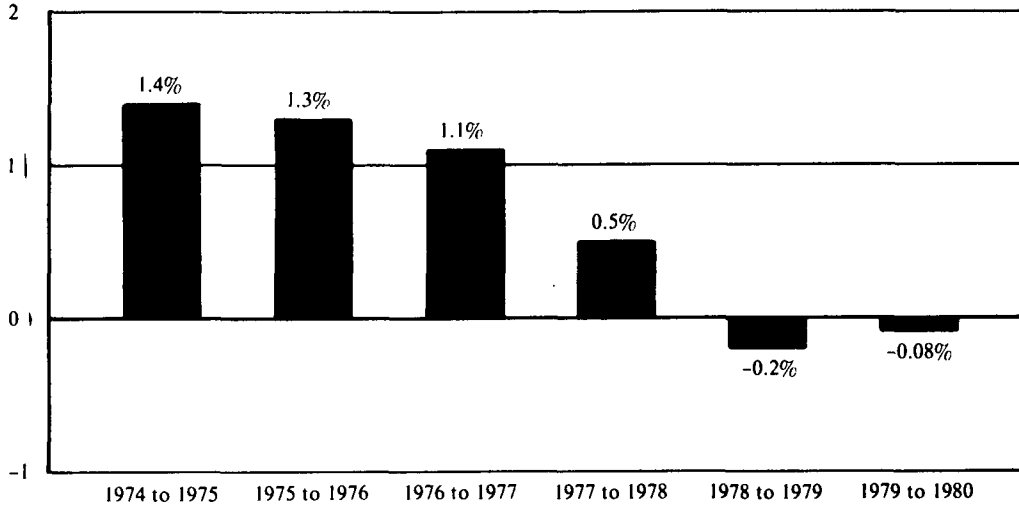

The number of students continues to decrease in 1980

Percentage change



The percentage change in the number of students enrolled in schools decreased during the period 1975 to 1980. Although decreases have occurred, net increases in the total school population were sustained up until 1978. Since then the size of the total school population has declined.

The number of male students continued to decrease in 1980, while the number of female students increased in 1980. In 1979, both sexes showed declining numbers over the previous year.

Increase in the non-government school sector

In 1980 the number of students attending non-government schools increased from 650,213 in 1979 to 666,485 in 1980, despite a decrease from 2,986,931 in 1979 to 2,984,456 in 1980 in the total number of students enrolled in all schools.

The number of schools and teachers in both the government and non-government sectors have increased (see Table 1).

Number of students commencing school in year 1 continues to fall in 1980

Enrolments in Year 1 have declined each year since 1977, contributing decreases of 5,206; 5,901; and 8,155 in 1978, 1979 and 1980 respectively, to the previous year's total student enrolments.

Diagram 2 shows the pattern of declining school enrolments in Year 1 from 1975 to 1980.

Enrolments ' 000

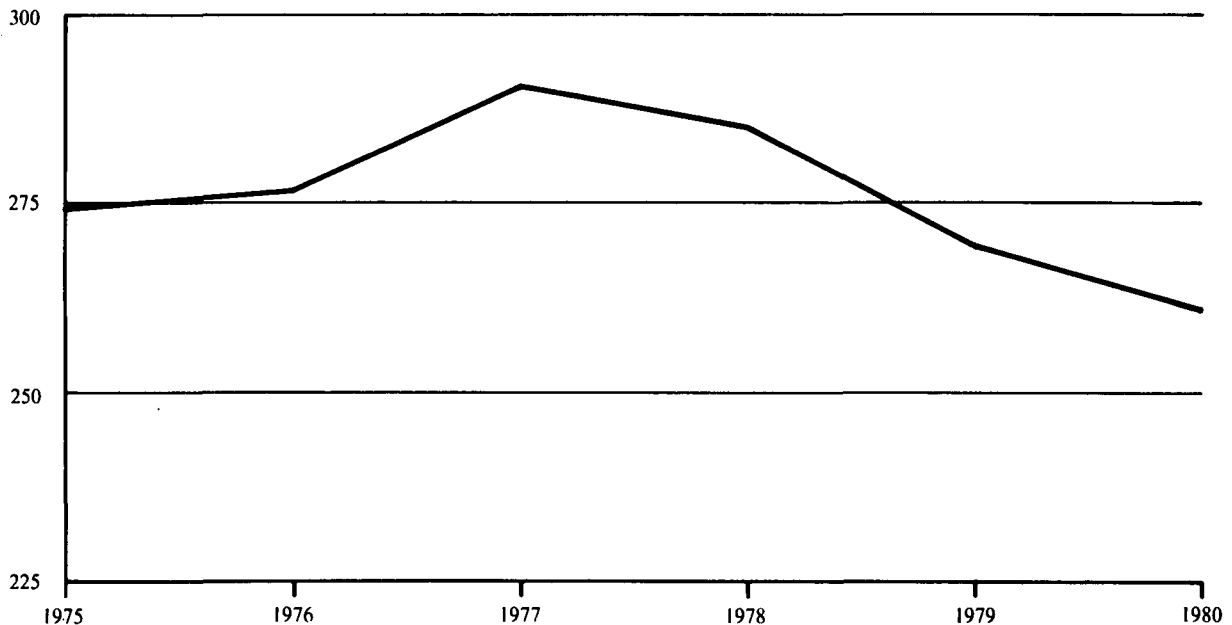

Student participation declines in high school education

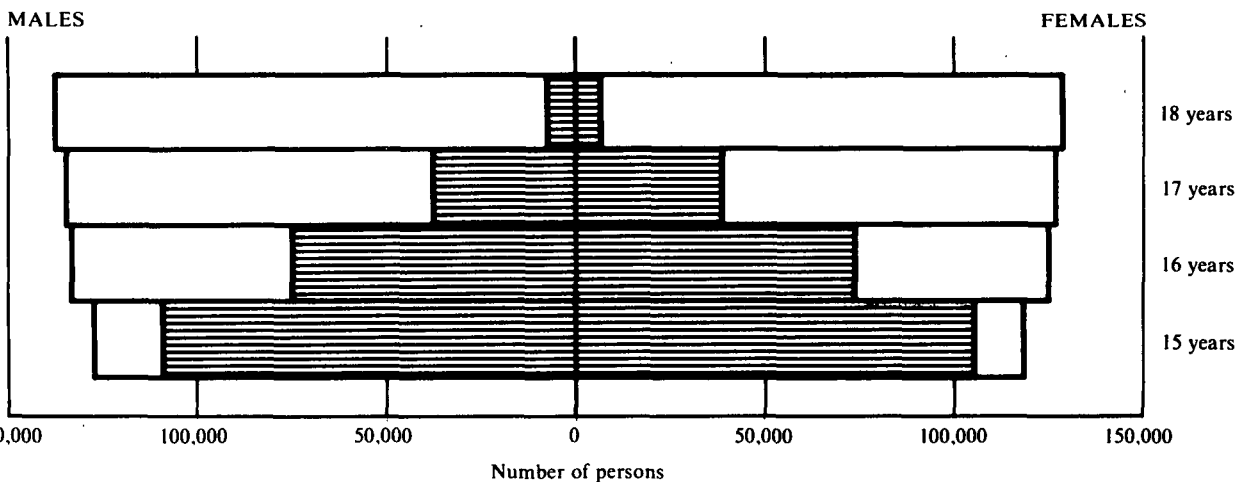
Total student participation in the 15 to 18 year age group has declined from 46.5 per cent in 1978 to 44.4 per cent in 1980. Male participation rates have declined in the 15 to 18 year age group since 1976. Female participation rates during the 1975 to 1980 period peaked at 47.0 per cent in 1978 and since then have declined to 45.3 per cent in 1980. Since 1977 female participation rates (in the 15 to 18 year age group) have been greater than those for male students in the same age group.

(The area shaded represents the population at school.)

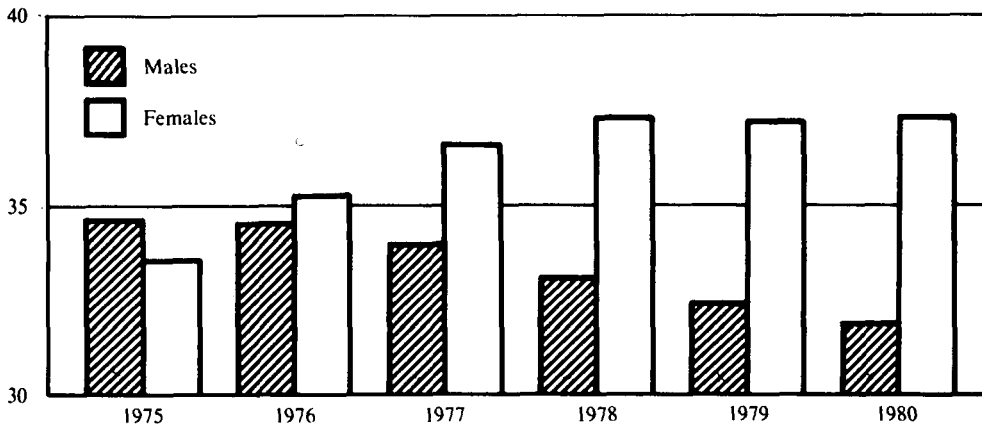


Boys less likely to stay to Year 12

The growing tendency in the early seventies of both boys and girls to continue their schooling through to Year 12 changed in 1976, and this change is still evident in 1980. Apparent retention rates for males to Year 12 have declined from 34.6 per cent in 1976 to 31.9 per cent in 1980. Boys are now less likely to continue to Year 12, while girls are more likely to stay to Year 12.

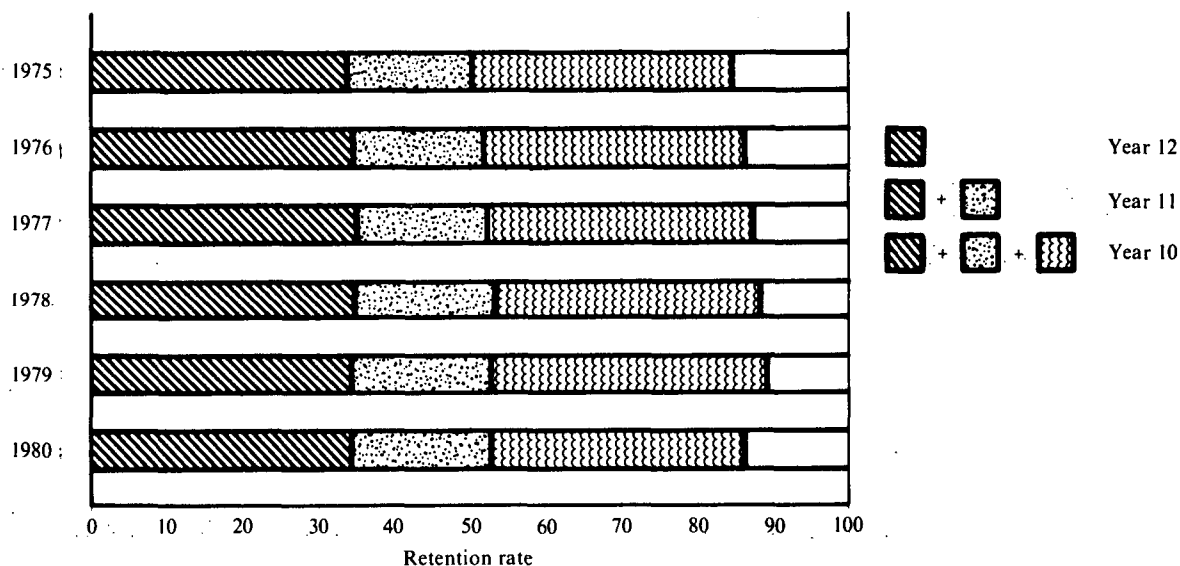

In 1980, 87 per cent of students who had commenced secondary school stayed until at least Year 10. This figure represents a decrease from 1979 figures, and a discontinuation of the steady rise in Year 10 retention rates witnessed in the period 1975 to 1979.

Differences in retention rates can also be seen between categories of schools. Government schools in 1980 had the lowest retention rates where only 28 per cent of students were retained until Year 12. Non-government schools (other than Roman Catholic schools) by comparison had the highest retention rates with 88 per cent staying until Year 12.

Ratio of 18 year old boys to girls decreases

Since 1975 the ratio of male to female students has declined particularly in the 18 years and over age group. In 1975 there were 153.7 males per 100 females in this group compared with 107.1 males per 100 females in 1980. The 17 years age group has also shown a decline during the period with a decrease from 112.2 males per 100 females in 1975 to 95.8 males per 100 females in 1980.

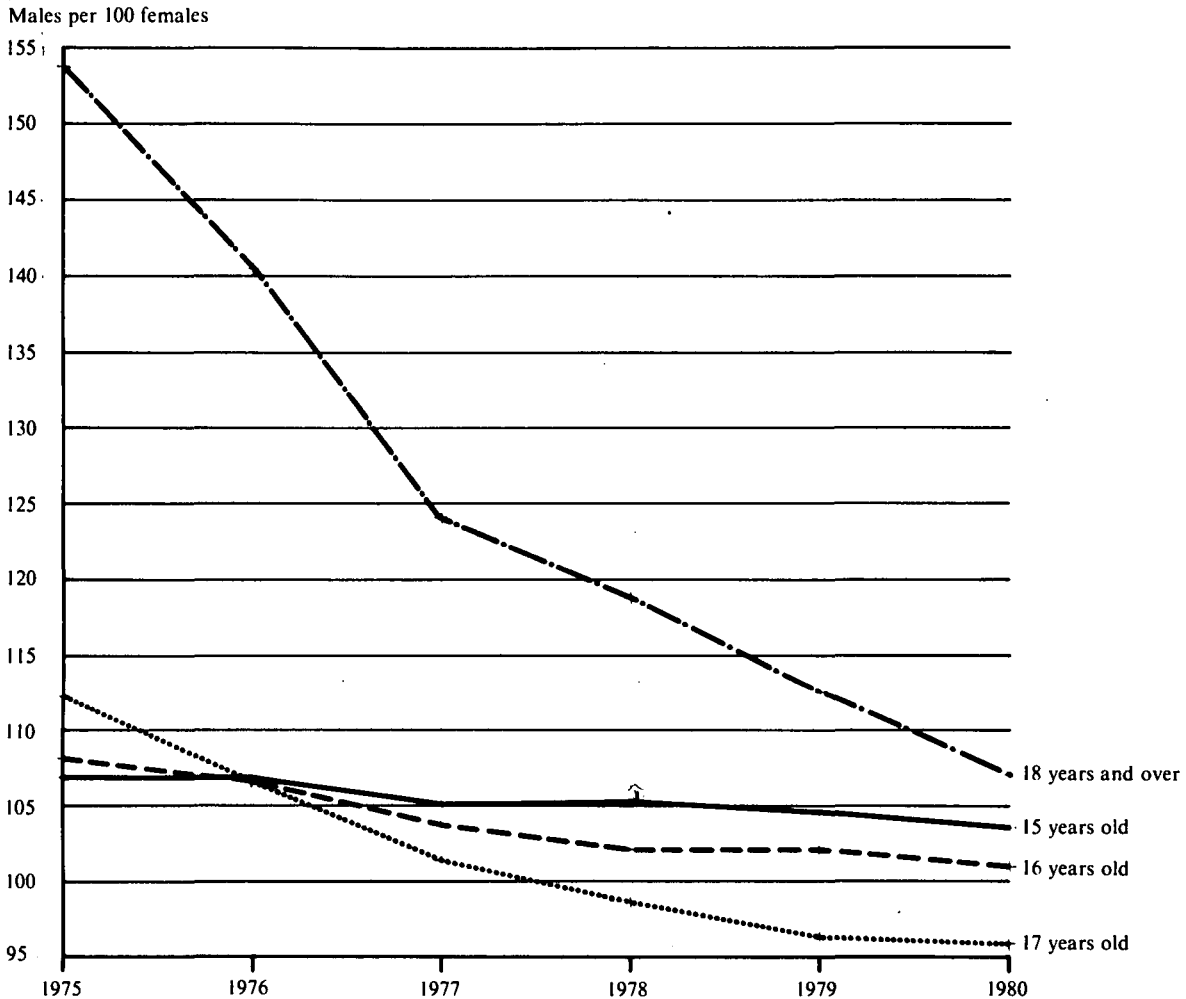

SECTION II—SCHOOLS, 1980

The structure of primary and secondary schooling in Australia varies between the different States and Territories. There are two basic patterns evident, as illustrated in Diagram 7.

The first pattern is found in New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and the Australian Capital Territory where the primary system comprises a Kindergarten or Preparatory grade followed by Years 1 to 6. The secondary system comprises Years 7 to 12.

The second pattern exists in Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia and the Northern Territory where the primary system comprises Years 1 to 7 and the secondary system Years 8 to 12.

Each State and Territory also has an expanding pre-school sector which is prior to, and separate from, primary and secondary schooling. Data on pre-primary education within primary schools have been excluded from primary enrolments in this publication. (See paragraphs 3 to 5 of the Explanatory notes, and the table on pre-primary enrolments in primary schools in Appendix B).
