EXPLANATORY NOTES

This Bulletin contains statistics of hospitals throughout Australia for the year ended 30th June, 1962 with comparative figures for earlier years. Corresponding particulars appeared in Social Statistics No. 2 - 1960 and No. 7 - 1961 of this Series.

- 2. The particulars shown herein refer to public hospitals, mental hospitals, and also to those private hospitals approved for the payment of hospital benefits under the Commonwealth National Health Act 1953-1962.
- 3. The statistics shown under the heading of "Public Hospitals" refer to all institutions providing hospital treatment, whether general or special, with the exception of mental hospitals, repatriation hospitals, leper hospitals, and private hospitals conducted commercially. They include hospitals wholly provided for by the State, hospitals partially subsidized by the State or by State endowments but receiving also private aid, and hospitals established and endowed by individuals for the benefit of the needy generally.
- 4. Statistics shown for mental hospitals include particulars of the two authorized private mental hospitals in New South Wales. The mental hospital figures exclude particulars of reception houses, and observation wards in gaols.
- Particulars of the six repatriation general hospitals (at Concord, N.S.W.; Heidelberg, Victoria; Greenslopes, Queensland; Springbank, S.A.; Hollywood, W.A.; and Hobart, Tasmania) are not included. The average daily number of patients resident in these hospitals during the year ended 30th June, 1961 was 3,163.
- 6. The four isolation hospitals for the care and treatment of persons suffering from Hansen's disease (leprosy), located at Little Bay, N.S.W.; Fantome Island, Queensland; Derby, W.A.; and East Arm Settlement, N.T. are also excluded. At the end of 1962 there were 395 patients at these hospitals.
- 7. Statistics of staff of private hospitals are not available.
