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ISTICAL BULLETIN : CONSUMPTION OF TEA AND COFFEE, AUSTRALIA

NO. 3: 1963-64

This bulletin contains particulars of the estimated quantities of tea and coffee available for consumption (i.e. the apparent consumption) during the years 1959-60 to 1963-64, together with details of imports of tea and coffee for the years 1963-62 to 1963-64.

Consumption data have, in general, been obtained by deducting quantities of these commodities exported from imports cleared for home consumption. An adjustment has been made for changes in stocks held by firms which imported tea and coffee products in each of the years ended 30th June. Stocks held by retailers have, for the most part, been excluded.

#### TEA

Total apparent consumption of tea in 1963-64 at 62,857,000 lb. showed a slight increase over the previous year, but consumption per head declined from 5.8 lb. to 5.7 lb.

Particulars of the net change in stocks, imports cleared, exports and apparent consumption are shown in the following table for the five years 1959-60 to 1963-64.

### COFFEE

The basic information on stocks, imports cleared and exports of coffee covers a variety of coffee products such as raw beans, pure processed whole or ground coffee, instant coffee, etc. For the purpose of obtaining apparent consumption of coffee, these commodities have been converted to the pure processed whole or ground coffee equivalent, and it is on this basis that details are shown in Table 3 and the third part of Table 4.

Owing primarily to the inclusion of information relating to changes in stocks in calculating apparent consumption since 1960-61, data relating to the consumption of coffee for the years since then are not strictly comparable with particulars for 1959-60 and earlier years.

Total apparent consumption of coffee in 1963-64, at 23,871,000 lb., was approximately the same as in 1962-63 and consumption per head remained at 2.2 lb.

Details relating to the supply and utilization of coffee for the years 1959-60 to 1963-64 are shown in Table 3.
