JUN QTR 1996 KEY POINTS

TREND ESTIMATES

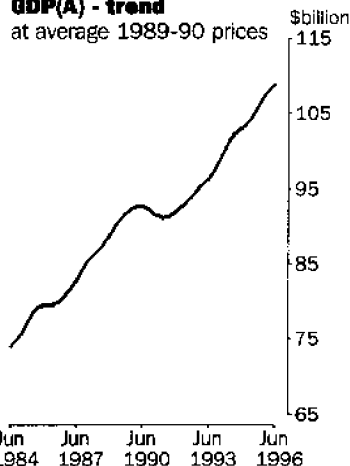
- GDP(A) increased by 0.7% in the June quarter to a level 4.2% higher than in June quarter 1995.
- All three independent measures grew at a similar rate in the June quarter with GDP(E) and GDP(P) rising 0.7% and GDP(I) up 0.6%.
- The terms of trade increased 1.5% in the June quarter, the tenth consecutive quarterly increase. Real gross domestic income grew 1.2%, compared with the 0.7% rise in GDP(I).
- Gross farm product increased by 0.9% in the June quarter, while the average measure of gross non-farm product increased by 0.7%.

SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

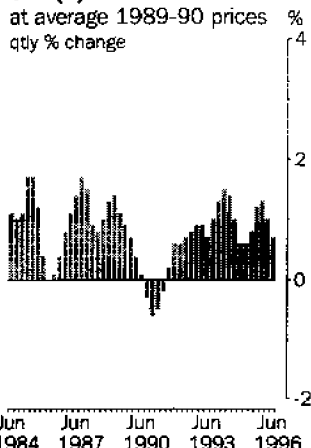
- GDP(A) showed little change (up 0.1%) in June quarter, but is 4.5% higher than in June quarter 1995.
- All measures of GDP recorded little change in the June quarter.
- Modest growth in expenditures by the private sector was largely offset by falls in the public sector, leading to a small increase in domestic final demand of 0.3%.
- The negative contribution (0.9 percentage points) to growth in GDP(E) from an increase in imports and a decrease in exports was largely offset by the positive contribution (0.7 percentage points) from a stronger increase in stocks.
- The implicit price deflator for GDP rose 0.8% in the June quarter to a level 2.3% higher than in the June quarter 1995.

DETAILED INTERNATIONAL TRADE DATA

The June quarter 1996 issue of *Balance of Payments, Australia* (5302.0) is scheduled for release on Tuesday, 27 August 1996. The tables which will be included in 5302.0 containing details of current and constant price exports and imports of goods and services and which underly the aggregated data in the domestic production account in this publication (5206.0), will be available on PC Ausstats at 7.30 pm on Tuesday, 20 August, when 5206.0 is released. Hard copies of these tables can be obtained from Wednesday, 21 August, from Michael Morgan on (06) 252 6716.

REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE

Quarterly estimates for some components of GDP(I) and GDP(E) have been revised as a result of incorporating annual benchmark data and more complete survey data. There have been significant downward revisions to constant price estimates of GDP(P) from 1992-93, mainly due to revisions to the manufacturing industry estimates. Further information is provided in a note on page 11.

Revisions to percentage changes for major summary aggregates in trend terms are shown in Tables 41 to 43, while revisions to the major summary aggregates in original terms are shown in Tables 44 to 46. Revisions to trend GDP(A) over recent quarters have been relatively small, with no change to the March quarter 1996 increase of 1.0%. The series for public gross fixed capital expenditure has been seasonally reanalysed. Details are provided in a separate note on page 11.

CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

As has been the practice in the June quarter issues of 5206.0 in recent years, a number of supplementary annual tables have been included to provide annual sector income and outlay accounts and public sector capital accounts (see Tables 71 to 81).

JUNE QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew by 0.8% (0.5% seasonally adjusted). There were decreases in most categories of household goods, but these were more than offset by increases in expenditures on services. Government consumption grew by 0.4% (-1.1% seasonally adjusted).

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Dwelling construction fell by 3.9% (+0.6% seasonally adjusted) in the June quarter, the seventh consecutive quarterly decline. Investment in equipment rose by 6.0% (2.3% seasonally adjusted) while non-dwelling construction fell by 1.8% (+2.4% seasonally adjusted). Overall, private GFCE rose by 1.8% compared with an increase of 2.3% in seasonally adjusted terms.

INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- The build-up in private non-farm stocks over the past three years continued, but at a slower rate. There was an increase of \$466 million in the June quarter following an increase of \$557 million in the March quarter. The seasonally adjusted increases were \$436 million in the March quarter and \$788 million in the June quarter. (See also the note on the SVA on page 11.)

EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Exports of goods and services increased by 2.1% in the June quarter, with goods growing by 1.9% and services up 2.6%.

IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Imports of goods and services increased by 3.3% in the June quarter, with goods growing by 3.3% and services up 3.2%.

JUNE QUARTER

SUMMARY COMMENT

AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

- Increased by 0.8% in trend terms but by fell 3.8% in seasonally adjusted terms. The latter fall was due to a 5% fall in livestock slaughtering and an increase in seed and fodder inputs.

MANUFACTURING

- The trend estimate fell 0.1% while the seasonally adjusted estimate fell by 1.6%. The major contributors to falls in seasonally adjusted terms were food, beverages and tobacco, metal products, and machinery and equipment.

CONSTRUCTION

- Fell 2.3% in trend terms and 1.0% in seasonally adjusted terms. The latter was associated with a 9% fall in work done by the public sector.

WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- Wholesale trade increased by 2.1% in trend terms while retail trade rose by 0.7%. In seasonally adjusted terms both fell, by 1.5% and 0.4% respectively.

TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- Increased by 1.1% and 0.2% in trend and seasonally adjusted terms, respectively. In trend terms, all forms of transport showed steady growth.

WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

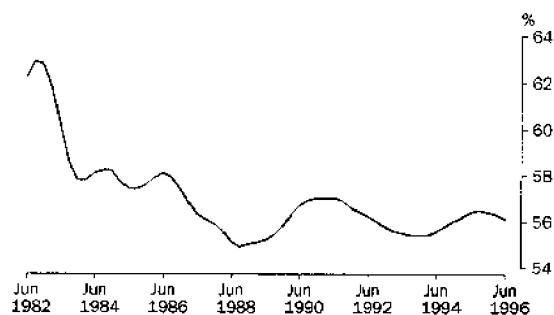
- Rose 1.2% (1.3% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The rise reflects an increase of 1.2% in average earnings, with no change in the number of wage and salary earners in the June quarter. In seasonally adjusted terms average earnings were up 1.1%, but with an increase of 0.2% in the number of wage and salary earners.

GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

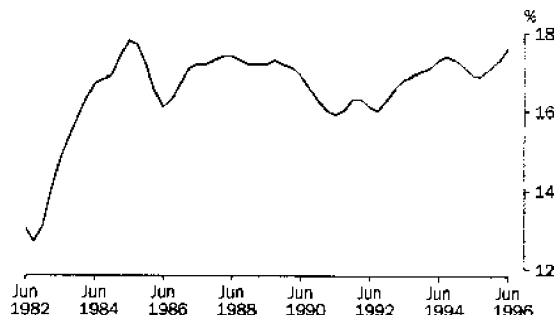
- In the June quarter GOS of private corporate trading enterprises increased by 3.0%, following an identical increase in the March quarter. In seasonally adjusted terms the increase was 2.0%, following an increase of 7.0% in March quarter 1996.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring "Trends"; An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in September quarter 1996.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 1.0% is required in September quarter 1996 to maintain the trend growth, in the September quarter, of 0.7% currently estimated for June quarter 1996.

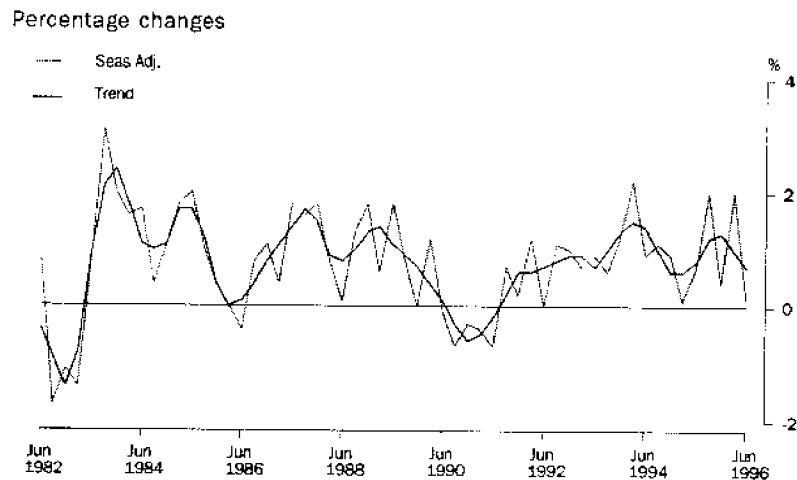

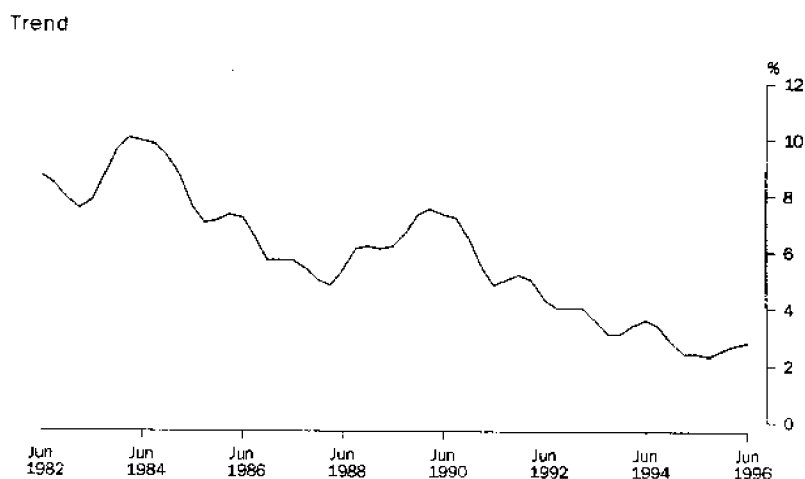
GROWTH RATES IN GDP(A)

The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.



HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the June quarter was 97.2%. The balance, household saving, was 2.8%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. See also the note on revisions to the household saving ratio on page 12. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).

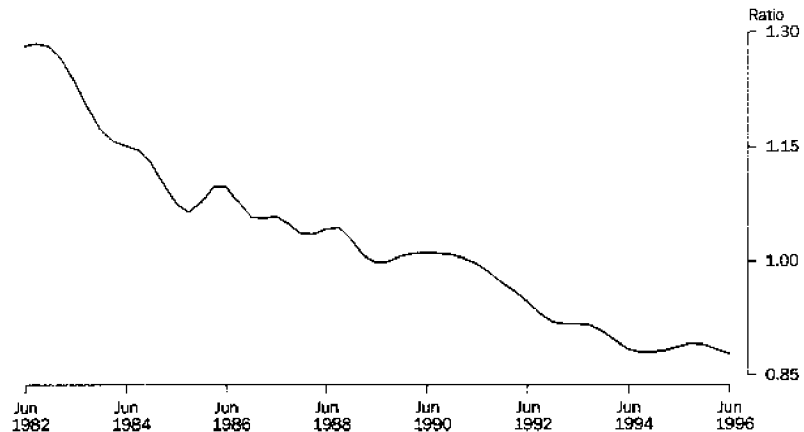

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$237 million (0.3%) in the June quarter, while sales increased by \$808 million (1.1%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio declined from 0.884 in March quarter 1996 to 0.878. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).

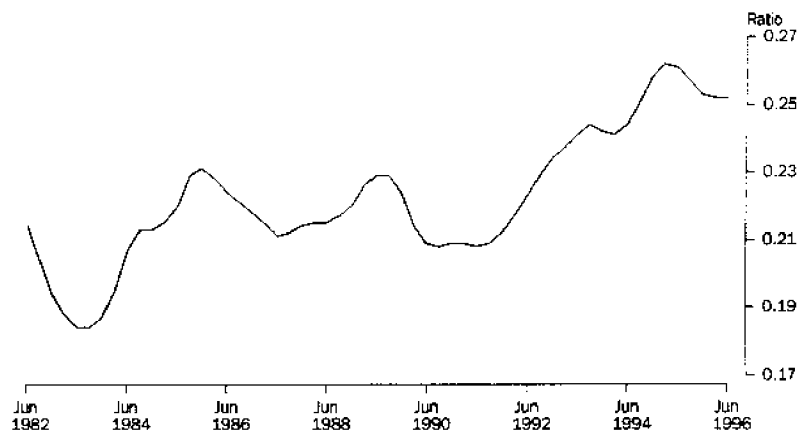
Trend at Current Prices



IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, remained unchanged at 0.252 in the June quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices

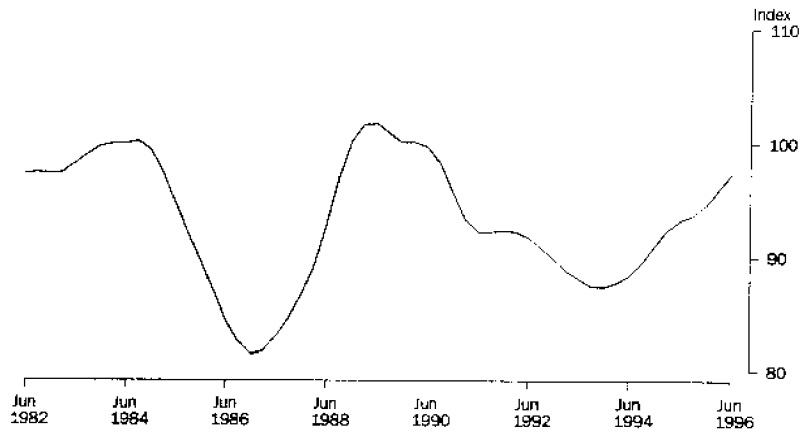

TERMS OF TRADE

In June quarter 1996 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose 1.5%. A fall in export prices of 0.6% was more than offset by a fall in import prices of 2.0%.

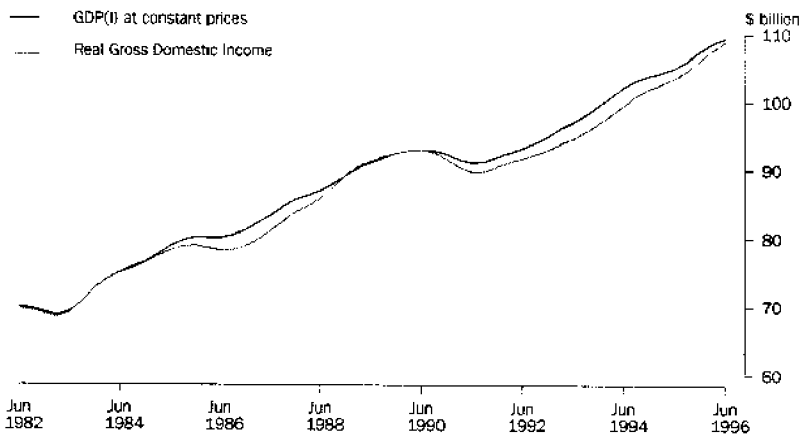
Trend (1989-90 = 100)



REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE—NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

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STOCK VALUATION ADJUSTMENT (SVA)

According to standards of historic cost accounting, businesses measure the value of stocks as the lower of cost or net realisable value. In times of rising prices, the change in the book value of stocks from one period to the next will reflect an element of holding gain in addition to any physical change. This holding gain will also be reflected in business income and saving. In the ANA, the element of holding gain is excluded from increase in stocks, income and saving by way of the stock valuation adjustment. (The SVA is discussed in detail in Chapter 8 of Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods (5216.0).)

The SVA in June quarter 1996 had the largest negative value (-\$717 million) since June quarter 1991. The major contributors were wholesaling (-\$331 million), manufacturing (-\$266 million) (of which wood, paper, metal, chemical, petroleum and coal production were the major contributors), agriculture (-\$116 million) and mining (-\$66 million).

Changes in the size of the SVA are largely a function of changes in the rate of price change of the goods held in stock. Therefore, it is generally the case that a lower SVA will be associated with a fall in the rate of price increase, and a negative SVA will be caused by an actual fall in prices.

In June quarter 1996, there was a widespread fall in import prices (the implicit price deflator for imports of goods fell by 3.4%), largely associated with the appreciation of the Australian dollar and boosted by a strong fall in the price index for computer equipment. In addition, the prices of many Australian agricultural and manufactured products fell.

REVISIONS TO GDP(P)

There have been significant downward revisions to constant price estimates of GDP(P) from 1992-93. They are mainly due to revisions to the manufacturing industry estimates. The manufacturing industry estimates are based on annual benchmarks derived using turnover from the annual manufacturing survey and quarterly indicator series based on the quarterly survey of manufacturers' stocks and sales. The latter series are used to interpolate between and extrapolate forward from the annual benchmarks. In this release, new benchmarks for 1992-93 and 1993-94 have been incorporated. It appears that the quarterly indicator series overstated growth for most, but not all, manufacturing industries in these years and the effect of introducing new annual benchmarks has led to the estimates of total manufacturing for 1992-93 and 1993-94 being revised down by \$1,940 million and \$3,468 million, respectively. The 1994-95 and 1995-96 estimates are still based on movements in the quarterly indicator series, but because they are derived by extrapolating forward from the latest annual benchmarks, estimates for these years have been revised down substantially also. In addition, revisions have been made to the annual benchmarks for earlier years, but these have had a relatively minor effect on growth rates.

SEASONAL REANALYSIS - PUBLIC ENTERPRISES GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

Qantas has been a private enterprise since September quarter 1995. Prior to privatisation it made a significant contribution to the Commonwealth component of public enterprises' gross fixed capital expenditure and affected that component's seasonal pattern. With the exclusion of Qantas, the seasonal pattern of the component is different. Therefore, new seasonal factors have been derived for both the current and constant price estimates of gross fixed capital expenditure by Commonwealth public enterprises. They have been derived for quarters up to, and including, June quarter 1995 using data including Qantas and for later quarters using data excluding Qantas.

ANALYSES AND COMMENTS *(continued)*

ADJUSTMENTS TO TAX COLLECTION SERIES Since the release of the March quarter 1996 issue of this publication, investigations have revealed that some revenue collections in December quarter 1995 were not recorded until March quarter 1996. The series affected were PAYE income tax collections (\$550 million) and sales tax collections (\$380 million). Consequently, estimates for household saving and indirect taxes have been revised in December quarter 1995 and March quarter 1996. In addition, computer processing difficulties in the Australian Taxation Office on 30 June 1996 delayed the recording of some revenue collections on that day. Adjustments have therefore been made to PAYE income tax collections (\$175 million) and sales tax collections (\$15 million) for June quarter 1996.

REVISIONS TO THE HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO The household saving ratio has been revised up for recent quarters as a result of incorporating revised annual estimates for various aggregates and initial annual estimates for 1995-96. Most income components were revised up, while some expenditure aggregates were revised down. Consequently, household saving which is derived as a balancing item, has been revised up significantly for recent quarters. The saving ratios for December quarter 1995 and March quarter 1996 were also affected by the adjustment to PAYE income tax collections noted in the previous paragraph.

WAGES SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS Quarterly movements in wages, salaries and supplements can at times be significantly affected by changes in two of the component series: severance, termination and redundancy payments, and supplements to wages and salaries (i.e. employers' contributions to superannuation and workers' compensation claims). EXPLANATORY NOTES

INTRODUCTION

1 This publication contains estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages 13–14, show the full range of data provided.

CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

2 These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). An updated version of the 5216.0 publication, along with other similar ABS publications, is now available on CD-ROM, entitled *Statistical Concepts Reference Library on CD-ROM* (1361.0). It was released in July 1996.

ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

3 Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

REVISIONS

4 Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Major revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

TREND ESTIMATES

5 Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

6 A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

7 If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

8 For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and an analysis of the advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, see *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring 'Trends': an Overview* (1348.0) or contact the Assistant Director, Time Series Analysis on (06) 252 6345.

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFLATOR (IPD)

9 The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:
GENERAL METHOD

10 Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I)
INCOME APPROACH

11 GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)
EXPENDITURE APPROACH

12 GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989–90 prices.

GDP(P)
PRODUCTION APPROACH

13 GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989–90 prices) for each industry.

MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

GDP(A) THE AVERAGE **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH

15 Tables 6 and 7 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

A(t) = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

A(t-1) = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

GDP(t-1) = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

16 There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 11, 12, 18, 19, 68 and 69.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

17 GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 68 and 69.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT
OF LABOUR INPUT

18 Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

19 When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer-term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

20 A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market sectors* are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM
MARKET SECTORS

21 The estimates of gross product at constant prices for six industries: Finance and insurance; Property and business services; Government administration and defence; Education; Health and community services; and Personal and other services are derived either wholly or primarily by using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purpose of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) less the above six industries, less Ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to the 'non-market' industries.

22 A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector less Agriculture, forestry and fishing. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of agricultural production due to changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND
HOURS WORKED

23 The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

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PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS
TO SALES RATIO

24 The ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- *plus* private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- *plus* public gross fixed capital expenditure
- *plus* exports of non-rural goods.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

25 The ratio is merchandise imports (ie total imports of goods) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69.

HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

26 This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 27 and 28 and is also shown in Table 67.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

27 This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

28 All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974. The cost is currently \$130.00 per release or \$390.00 for an annual subscription. Place your order by ringing (06) 252 6627.
