


### SEP QTR 1994 KEY POINTS

#### TREND ESTIMATES

- The trend estimate of gross domestic product - average (GDP(A)), increased 1.2% in September quarter 1994.
- The trend growth rate has exceeded 1% in each of the last four quarters.
- The trend estimate of GDP(A) has increased 5.8% since September quarter 1993.
- The trends of all three independent measures of GDP(I, E and P) have grown in each of the last twelve quarters.
- The trend in GDP(A) per capita has increased in each of the last twelve quarters, after declining for the previous two years.
- Real gross domestic income (GDP(I) at constant prices adjusted for changes in the terms of trade—see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 17) increased 2.0% in the September quarter.

#### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- Seasonally adjusted GDP(A) increased 1.3% in September quarter, following growth of 1.4% in June quarter.
- GDP(I) increased 2.3% in the September quarter, while GDP(E) grew 0.6% and GDP(P) was up 1.0%.
- Seasonally adjusted GDP(A) has increased 6.4% since September quarter 1993.

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## REVISIONS THIS QUARTER

Significant revisions have been made to private gross fixed capital expenditure on equipment in 1993-94 in the light of evidence that the new business provisions previously applied in the survey have not adequately represented the increasing business population over that period. Similarly, significant revisions have also been made to the increase in private non-farm stocks for most quarters over the last two years.

Private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings was revised up by \$269 million in June quarter 1994. Consequently, in seasonally adjusted constant price terms, the increase in private capital expenditure on dwellings was revised up from 2.3% to 6.8% for that quarter.

Wages, salaries and supplements was revised up by \$433 million in June quarter as a consequence of incorporating results from a more complete response to the Survey of Employment and Earnings.

Estimates of GDP(P) have been revised back to 1989-90. New and revised benchmarks have been introduced for forestry, fishing, mining and the imputed bank service charge. In addition, estimates for recent years have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data. For details on the revisions to manufacturing industry refer to the note on page 11. Also a new methodology has been adopted for calculating estimates of gross product for road freight (see page 11 for details).

As a result of the various revisions to components of all three independent measures of GDP in June quarter 1994, the rise in seasonally adjusted constant price GDP(A) has been increased from 0.9% to 1.4% for that quarter. Revisions to seasonally adjusted estimates of GDP(A) for earlier quarters have been minimal. The upward revision to June quarter combined with a strong increase of 1.3% in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) in September quarter 1994 has resulted in upward revisions to trend growth in GDP(A) for all quarters from September quarter 1993.

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## CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE

There are no changes in this issue. However, the December quarter 1994 issue will contain industry estimates according to a new industrial classification (for details see page 12).

## SEPTEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

### FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew 1.1% with increases in all categories, except cigarettes and tobacco, energy and net expenditure overseas.
- Government expenditure fell 0.2% with a rise of 0.4% in State and local authorities being offset by a fall of 1.4% in Commonwealth expenditure.

### GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Private dwelling construction grew 3.5%, while non-dwelling construction increased 3.1%. Private investment in equipment rose 7.7%.
- Public expenditure rose 3.3%, with both Commonwealth and State and local government contributing to the increase. Two aircraft were acquired by Qantas during the September quarter.

### INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- An increase of \$927 million this quarter continued the steady acceleration in stocks growth over the last seven quarters. The strongest build-up this quarter was in the wholesaling and retailing sectors.

### EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Grew 1.1% of which services contributed 0.7%. Other major contributors were cereals and mineral fuels.

### IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Increased 5.3%. Computer equipment, services and machinery were the major contributors.

## SEPTEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

### AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, FISHING AND HUNTING

- Fell 6.8% in trend and 16.8% in seasonally adjusted terms due to the effect of the drought on agricultural production. For further details refer to Page 11.

### MINING

- Rose 2.4% in trend and 0.7% in seasonally adjusted terms. Increased production of oil and gas is the major contributor to growth.

### MANUFACTURING

- Trend estimate increased 2.0% to be 11.2% higher than in September quarter 1993. In seasonally adjusted terms growth was 1.5%. Particularly strong growth was recorded for food, beverages and tobacco and paper products, printing and publishing.

### CONSTRUCTION

- Trend estimate rose 2.1%, but the growth rate in seasonally adjusted terms over the last three quarters has been declining, rising 3.5%, 3.2% and 0.7% respectively.

### WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- Wholesale grew 1.6% (2.0% in seasonally adjusted terms). Retail grew 0.9% (1.5% in seasonally adjusted terms).

### TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- Increased 1.2% due to sustained growth in all sectors except rail transport.

### COMMUNICATION

- Increased 2.7% to be 8.7% higher than in September quarter 1993.


### WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

- Rose 2.2% (1.6% in seasonally adjusted terms).
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.8% in the number of wage and salary earners and a rise of 1.4% in the underlying average earnings. The corresponding changes in seasonally adjusted terms were an increase of 0.7% in the number of wage and salary earners and a rise of 1.0% in average earnings.


### GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

- GOS of private trading enterprises grew 3.5% (7.1% in seasonally adjusted terms) to a level 10.5% higher than in September quarter 1993.

## ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

### RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring "Trends": An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in December quarter 1994.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 1.6% is required in December quarter 1994 to maintain the trend growth, in December quarter, of 1.2% currently estimated for September quarter 1994.



The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.


Percentage changes



### HOUSEHOLD SAVINGS RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the September quarter was 95.4%. The balance, household saving, was 4.6%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, para 26).

Trend



### PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$1,007 million (1.7%) this quarter, while sales increased by \$1,492 million (2.2%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio fell from 0.877 to 0.873. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).


Trend at Current Prices



### IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, rose to 0.251 this quarter from 0.244 last quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices



### TERMS OF TRADE

In September quarter 1994, the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose 0.2%. A fall of 0.7% in the implicit price deflator (IPD) for exports was more than offset by a fall of 0.9% in the IPD for imports.


Trend (1989-90 = 100)



### REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 75 and 76 respectively.

## ANALYSES AND COMMENTS (continued)

### PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE— NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. Non-dwelling construction in the September quarter showed a large decline of 5.7% in seasonally adjusted constant price terms, mainly due to the sale of a building to the State Electricity Commission of Victoria for \$250 million. Purchases of equipment rose 7.0% in seasonally adjusted constant price terms, with an increase of 6.3% in new equipment and an increase of 39.9% in second-hand equipment. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

## **ANALYSES AND COMMENTS** (continued)

### **GROSS FARM PRODUCT**

Gross farm product fell 18.3% in seasonally adjusted constant price terms in the September quarter 1994. There were substantial falls in seasonally adjusted production of wool, wheat, other grain crops and other crops, while production of livestock slaughterings and other livestock products declined marginally. Sugar cane was the only major commodity for which production increased.

It should be noted that the convention used to seasonally adjust wheat, sugar cane, other cereals and other crops has particular implications for the interpretation of quarter-to-quarter changes in seasonally adjusted gross farm product. The method used is to divide the annual production of these crops by four and allocate this amount to each of the four quarters in a financial year. Although this avoids problems that would be associated with the application of standard methods of seasonal adjustment to the production of these crops, it does have the effect of concentrating the whole of the annual change into the September quarter, followed by zero growth in December, March and June quarters. (A more detailed description of the seasonal adjustment of gross farm product is provided on page 8 of the December quarter 1991 issue of 5206.0, and in Appendix 1 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).)

### **EXPORTS AND IMPORTS**

Notable changes in the seasonally adjusted September quarter constant price estimates of exports were gold exports which declined by over 20% and cereals (mostly wheat) which grew by over 20% as Public Marketing Authorities ran down stocks. The growth in trend was 1.1% - with services, cereals and mineral fuels being the major contributors.

Import growth was strong in the September quarter, up 5.3% in trend terms - with computer equipment and machinery imports being major contributors.

### **ROAD FREIGHT GROSS PRODUCT**

A new method has been adopted for calculating estimates of gross product at constant prices for the road freight component of the transport industry. In previous issues the quarterly indicator for this item was tonnes carried provided by the Survey of Interstate Road Freight. This survey had very low coverage of total road freight and has now been discontinued. A new indicator of road freight production has been developed, which is derived by extrapolating 1989-90 detailed road freight margins with estimates of wholesalers' sales at average 1989-90 prices. Estimates derived using the new indicator are considered to be superior to those derived previously, and have been incorporated from September quarter 1989.

### **MANUFACTURING GROSS PRODUCT**

Substantial revisions have been made to the constant price estimates of manufacturing gross product, boosting its growth rate in June quarter 1994 from 0.4% to 4.2% in seasonally adjusted terms. This revision is primarily due to the annual update of the sampling frame, the annual sample reselection, compensation for previous framework deficiencies and a major sample redesign of the Survey of Manufacturers' Sales. It should be noted, however, that the revisions to the manufacturing subdivisions have been more extensive: some have had their growth rates increased over recent quarters (e.g. food, beverages and tobacco), while others have had their growth rates reduced (e.g. clothing and footwear).

## **ANALYSES AND COMMENTS** (continued)

### **MOVEMENTS IN IMPLICIT PRICE DEFLATORS**

The IPD for private gross fixed capital expenditure on equipment declined 0.4% in seasonally adjusted terms in the September quarter. Factors contributing to the decline include compositional changes and decreases in the price indexes for computer equipment and industrial machinery and equipment.

The decline in the computer equipment index was also primarily responsible for the decline in seasonally adjusted terms of the IPD for general government gross fixed capital expenditure.

### **CHANGE IN INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION**

Over recent years, the ABS has been progressively adopting a new industrial classification - the *Australian and New Zealand Standard Industrial Classification* (ANZSIC).

From the beginning of 1995, all national accounts industry statistics will be published in terms of the new standard. The first national accounts publication to be released in 1995 will be the December quarter 1994 issue of this publication, in which only the components of GDP(P) and private non-farm stocks are affected by the change. GDP(P) estimates on an ANZSIC basis will be presented back to September quarter 1984 in the publication, but will be available on request for earlier periods at the Division level.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

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### INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains estimates of the components of Gross Domestic Product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages 13–14, show the full range of data provided.

### CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

**2** These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). In association with the introduction of constant price estimates at average 1989–90 prices, some of the methods used to derive constant price estimates were changed. The major changes are described in Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989–90 Prices* (5243.0).

### ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

**3** Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

### REVISIONS

**4** Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

### TREND ESTIMATES

**5** Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

**6** A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters have changed.

**7** If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.

TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

**8** For more information about ABS procedures for deriving trend estimates and analysis of advantages of using them over alternative techniques for monitoring trends, refer to the three ABS Information Papers:

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFULATOR (IPD)

**9** The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:  
GENERAL METHOD

**10** Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here:

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I) **11** GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

EXPENDITURE APPROACH **12** GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989–90 prices.

PRODUCTION APPROACH **13** GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989–90 prices) for each industry.

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MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

GDP(A) **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS  
TO GROWTH

**15** Tables 6 to 9 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I) and GDP(P). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

$A(t)$  = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

$A(t-1)$  = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

$GDP(t-1)$  = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

TERMS OF TRADE

**16** There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 13, 14, 22, 23, 75 and 76.

REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME

**17** GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion). A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 75 and 76.

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT  
OF LABOUR INPUT

**18** Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

**19** When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

**20** A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market sectors* are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM  
MARKET SECTORS

**21** The estimates of gross product at constant prices for two industries: Finance, property and business services; and Community services are derived using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purposes of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price gross product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) *less* the above two industries, *less* Public administration and defence (which is defined to be in the non-market sector, even though an estimate of productivity change is now produced for that industry), *less* ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), *plus* the imputed bank service charge related to these industries.

**22** A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector *less* Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of Agricultural production caused by changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND  
HOURS WORKED

**23** The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS  
TO SALES RATIO

**24** The ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76. The denominator of this ratio, in current price terms, is defined as :

- private final consumption expenditure on goods
- plus private gross fixed capital expenditure on dwellings, non-dwelling construction and equipment
- plus public gross fixed capital expenditure
- plus exports of non-rural goods.

IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO

**25** The ratio is merchandise imports (ie total imports of goods) to sales (as defined in paragraph 24 above). This ratio is presented in Tables 75 and 76.

HOUSEHOLD SAVINGS RATIO

**26** This is the ratio of household saving to household disposable income, where household saving is the difference between household disposable income and private final consumption expenditure. The ratio is a memorandum item in Tables 31 and 32 and is also shown in Table 74.

GDP(A) PER CAPITA

**27** This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from *Australian Demographic Statistics* (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.

DATA ON FLOPPY DISK

**28** All quarterly series in this publication are available in spreadsheet format on floppy disk, *Australian National Accounts: Quarterly Data on Floppy Disk* (5228.0). These data generally run from September quarter 1959. An important exception is GDP(P) and its components which run from September quarter 1974. The cost is currently \$130.00 per release or \$390.00 for an annual subscription. Place your order by ringing (06) 252 6627.
