

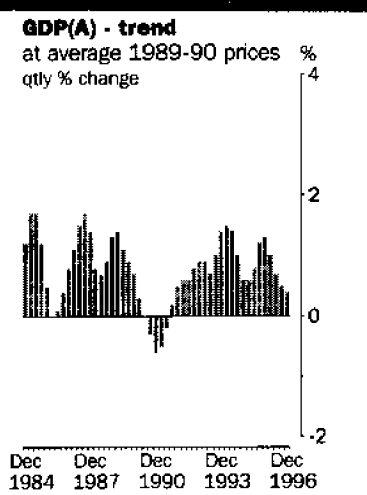
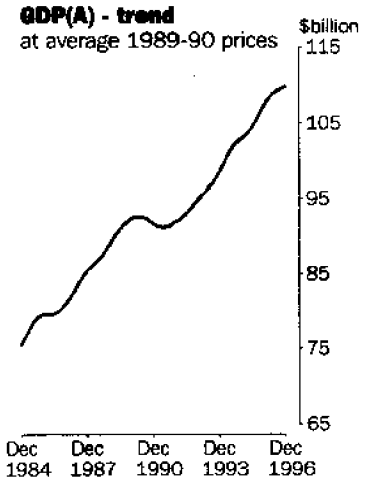

## DEC QTR 1996 KEY POINTS

### TREND ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased by 0.4% in the December quarter to a level 2.7% higher than in December quarter 1995.
- All three independent measures increased in the December quarter, although at somewhat different rates.
- The terms of trade increased by 0.5% in the December quarter, the twelfth consecutive quarterly increase. Real gross domestic income grew by 0.8%, compared with the 0.6% rise in GDP(I).
- Gross farm product increased by 1.8% in the December quarter, while the average measure of gross non-farm product increased by 0.3%.

### SEASONALLY ADJUSTED ESTIMATES

- GDP(A) increased by 0.5% in the December quarter to be 3.1% higher than in December quarter 1995.
- GDP(I) and GDP(P) increased by 0.8% and 0.6% respectively, while GDP(E) remained unchanged in the December quarter.
- The major contributors to growth in GDP(E) were private and government final consumption expenditure (0.3 and 0.4 percentage points, respectively) and private gross fixed capital expenditure on equipment (0.4 percentage points), while imports made a negative contribution (-1.2 percentage points).
- The implicit price deflator for GDP increased by 0.4% in the December quarter to a level 1.7% higher than in December quarter 1995.

**REVISIONS IN THIS ISSUE**

Quarterly estimates for all aggregates have been revised in accordance with revised annual benchmark estimates. In addition, seasonally adjusted estimates have been revised following the annual reanalysis of seasonally adjusted series.

The most significant annual revisions arose from the incorporation of income tax benchmarks for gross operating surplus for companies and unincorporated enterprises (for 1994-95) and private gross fixed capital expenditure on equipment (for 1993-94 and 1994-95). A number of components of private final consumption expenditure were revised following the incorporation of data from more up-to-date sources.

Constant price estimates of GDP(P) have been revised for all years. The base year (1989-90) income-based estimates of current price gross product have been revised and because of the extrapolative techniques used, constant price estimates for all years have been affected for most industries. New benchmarks for 1994-95 have been introduced for mining and manufacturing. New benchmarks for 1995-96 and revised benchmarks for earlier years have been incorporated for government administration and defence, education, and health and community services. In addition, for many industries, recent quarters have been revised due to the availability of more complete survey data.

**CHANGES IN THIS ISSUE**

There have been no changes to the format or content of this publication. However, two methodological improvements affecting the derivation of constant price estimates for government final consumption expenditure and private non-farm stocks are outlined on page 11.

## DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

### FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE

- Private expenditure grew by 0.3% (0.5% seasonally adjusted). There were increases in most categories, but the major contributors to growth were dwelling rent, health, entertainment and recreation, other services and net expenditure overseas. There were falls in some categories, including other household durables, cigarettes and tobacco, and other goods.

### PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE

- Dwelling construction grew by 0.9% (3.0% seasonally adjusted) in the December quarter. Investment in equipment rose by 2.2% (4.3% seasonally adjusted), while non-dwelling construction rose by 4.1% (-7.5% seasonally adjusted).

### INCREASE IN PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

- The increase in private non-farm stocks over the last three years continued with a large increase of \$798 million (\$766 million seasonally adjusted) in the December quarter following a slightly larger increase of \$856 million (\$822 million seasonally adjusted) in the September quarter.

### EXPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Exports of goods and services increased by 0.5% in the December quarter, with goods growing by 0.4% and services by 0.8%.

### IMPORTS OF GOODS AND SERVICES

- Imports of goods and services increased by 0.5% in the December quarter, with goods and services both increasing at the same rate. Capital goods rose by 0.4%, with computer equipment being the major contributor. Intermediate goods rose by 2.1%, while consumption goods increased by 2.9%.

## DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

### AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY AND FISHING

- Increased by 1.6% in trend terms and 1.8% in seasonally adjusted terms. The latter increase was the result of increased production of livestock products, particularly wool.

### MANUFACTURING

- Fell 0.3% in trend terms and 2.6% in seasonally adjusted terms. Six of the nine subdivisions recorded seasonally adjusted decreases. The most significant falls were in machinery and equipment, and metal products.

### CONSTRUCTION

- The trend estimate rose by 1.4% and the seasonally adjusted estimate by 0.4%. The major contribution to seasonally adjusted growth was increased activity in house building by the private sector.

### WHOLESALE AND RETAIL TRADE

- Both wholesale and retail trade recorded small falls, by 0.5% and 0.3%, respectively. In seasonally adjusted terms, wholesale trade increased by 1.2%, while retail trade fell by 0.6%.

### TRANSPORT AND STORAGE

- The trend and seasonally adjusted estimates rose by 0.6% and 2.0% respectively.

## DECEMBER QUARTER SUMMARY COMMENT

### WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

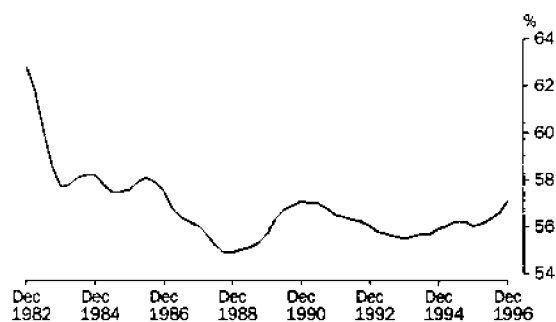
- Rose 1.8% (1.1% seasonally adjusted).
- The rise reflects an increase of 0.6% in the number of wage and salary earners and a 1.2% increase in average earnings. In seasonally adjusted terms, the number of wage and salary earners rose by 0.3% and average earnings increased by 0.8%.

### GROSS OPERATING SURPLUS

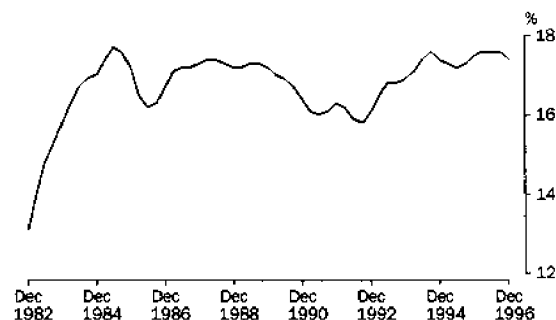
- In the December quarter, the GOS of private corporate trading enterprises increased by 0.1%, following a 0.7% rise in the September quarter. In seasonally adjusted terms, GOS increased by 1.6% in the December quarter, after falling by 0.8% in the September quarter 1996.

## ANALYSES AND COMMENTS

### RELIABILITY OF CONTEMPORARY TREND ESTIMATES

Seasonally adjusted series include both the trend effects and the irregular effects which influence movements in a series. As a result, seasonally adjusted estimates do not necessarily provide a good indication of the underlying behaviour of a series. On the other hand, trend estimates represent the underlying direction of the series, excluding seasonal effects and residual/irregular factors. Trend estimates are calculated by smoothing the seasonally adjusted series using a statistical procedure based on centred Henderson moving averages. The procedure used is designed to minimise distortions in the trend level, turning point shape and timing of turning points.

For the most recent quarters, insufficient data exist to use centred Henderson moving averages to calculate the trend values and so approximations to the Henderson moving averages are used for the latest three quarters. This means that revisions to the trend estimates for the last few quarters are unavoidable, even if none of the original data have been revised. More details about trend estimation are contained in the ABS Information Paper *A Guide to Interpreting Time Series — Monitoring "Trends": An Overview* (1348.0) which was released on 19 April 1993.

Potential revisions to trend estimates can be indicated by showing the effects of particular changes in seasonally adjusted estimates that might occur in the next quarter. The table below shows the trend estimates for the last few quarters and the values to which they would be revised if the notional movements in seasonally adjusted GDP(A) actually occurred in March quarter 1997.

Seasonally adjusted growth of 0.3% is required in March quarter 1997 to maintain the trend growth, in March quarter, of 0.4% currently estimated for December quarter 1996.

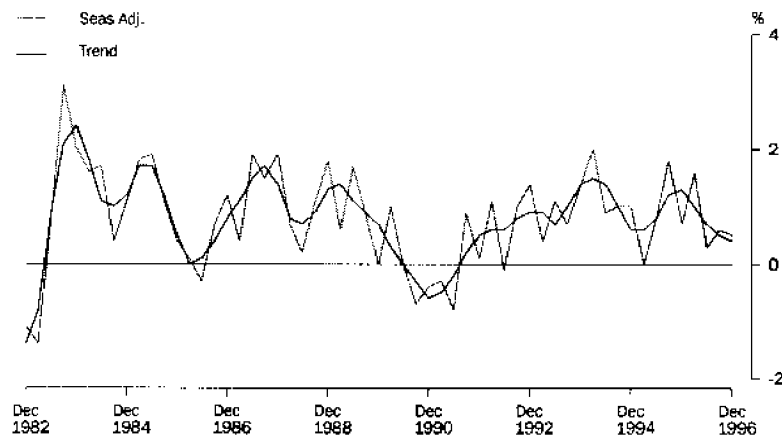

The graph below provides a comparison of the quarterly growth rates (percentage changes) in constant price GDP(A) in both seasonally adjusted and trend terms in recent years.

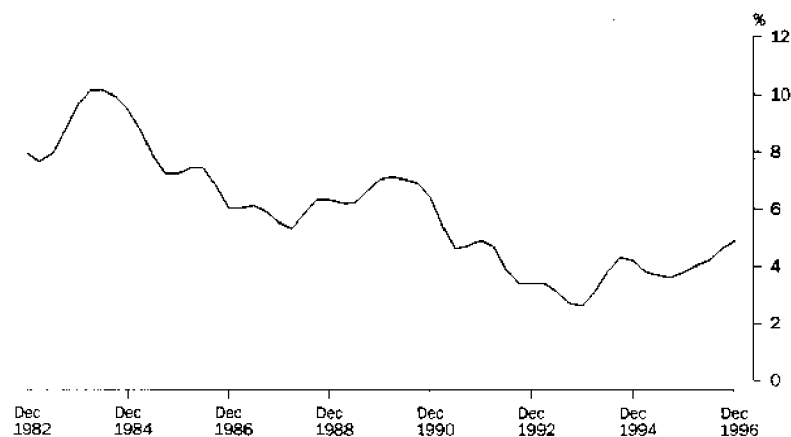
Percentage changes



### HOUSEHOLD SAVING RATIO

The proportion of household disposable income devoted to consumption in the December quarter was 95.1%. The balance, household saving, was 4.9%. Caution should be exercised in interpreting this ratio in recent years, because major components of household income and expenditure may still be subject to significant revisions. The impact of these revisions on the saving ratio can cause changes in the apparent direction of the trend. For example, in this issue of 5206.0 the household saving ratio has been revised up by about 1.5 percentage points per quarter over the last couple of years as a result of revisions to annual estimates for various aggregates in the household income and outlay account. Saving was revised up by about \$4 billion in 1994-95 and 1995-96, mainly due to increases in dividend receipts and unincorporated enterprises income, and to reductions in private final consumption expenditure. The following graph presents the household saving ratio derived from trend data (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 26).

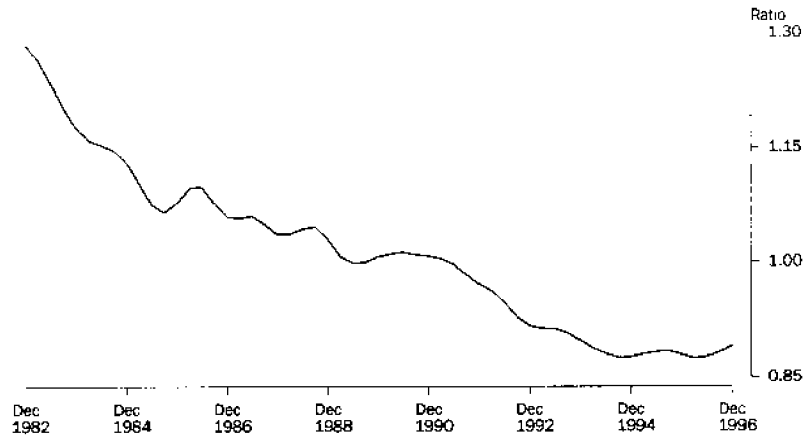

**PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS  
TO SALES RATIO**

In trend current price terms, the book value of private non-farm stocks increased by \$788 million (1.1%) in the December quarter, while sales increased by \$156 million (0.2%). Consequently, the stocks to sales ratio rose from 0.882 in September quarter to 0.891. The following graph presents the ratio of private non-farm stocks to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 24).

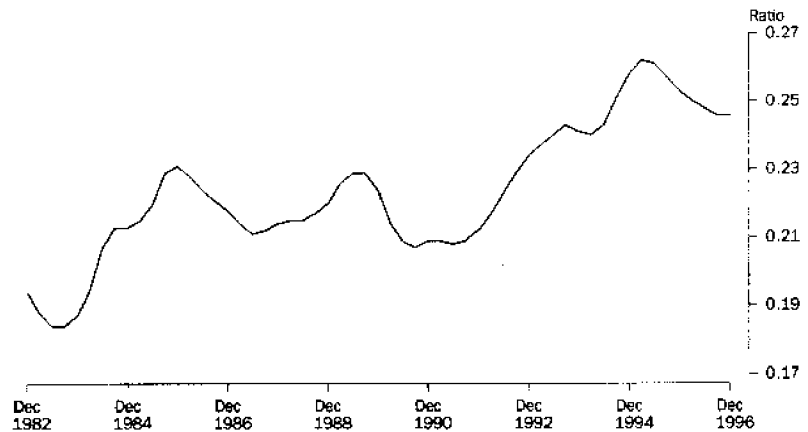
Trend at Current Prices



**IMPORTS TO SALES RATIO**

The imports to sales ratio, trended and at current prices, remained steady at 0.246 in the December quarter. The following graph presents the ratio of imports to sales over the last fourteen years (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 25).

Trend at Current Prices

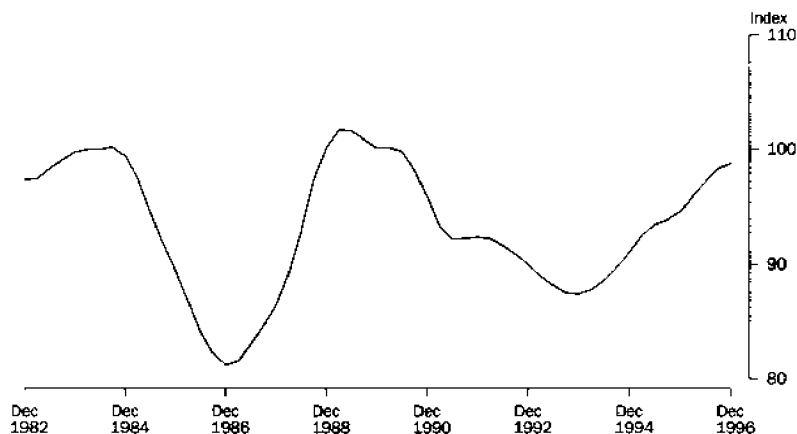




**TERMS OF TRADE**

In December quarter 1996 the terms of trade index derived from trend estimates (see Explanatory Notes, paragraph 16) rose by 0.5%. A fall in export prices of 0.8% was more than offset by a fall in import prices of 1.3%.

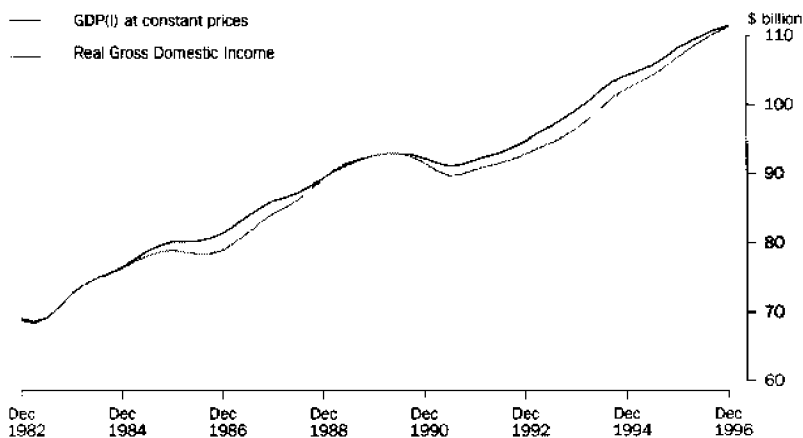
Trend (1989-90 = 100)



**REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME**

GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the Technical Note included in the September quarter 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income*. The graph below provides a comparison of trend GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices and real gross domestic income. Trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of real gross domestic income are shown in Tables 68 and 69 respectively.

### PRIVATE GROSS FIXED CAPITAL EXPENDITURE— NON-DWELLING CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT

Movements in private gross fixed capital expenditure can often be affected by large second-hand transactions and large one-off purchases. For example, net second-hand purchases of non-dwelling construction from the public sector in September quarter 1996 were boosted by three large transactions relating to a gas pipeline in Queensland, the World Trade Centre in Melbourne and the Port of Geelong. Details of recent transactions in second-hand assets between the private and public sectors, expenditure on new equipment and new work on non-dwelling construction are provided in the table below.

## ANALYSES AND COMMENTS *(continued)*

### GOVERNMENT FINAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURE - COMMONWEALTH REDUNDANCY PAYMENTS

Redundancy and termination payments are a component of government final consumption expenditure (GFCE). Until 1994, these payments were not separately identified in either the Commonwealth or state estimates of GFCE as they were lumped together with government expenditure on wages, salaries, supplements and intermediate inputs. The constant price estimates of these aggregates were derived using deflators comprising price and wage rate indexes reflecting the composition of the aggregates in the base year, 1989-90.

Changes in the constant price estimates of GFCE are meant to indicate changes in the volume of services produced by general government. With the onset of large scale redundancies by state governments in the early 1990s, changes in the level of redundancy and termination payments from quarter to quarter began to have a marked effect on the movements of the constant price estimates of GFCE. As there is no reason to believe that changes in redundancy and termination payments lead directly to corresponding changes in the volume of services produced by general government, the method of constant price estimation of state and local GFCE was changed in 1994.

With the recent onset of increased redundancies in the Commonwealth public service, it has been decided to change the method for deriving constant price estimates of Commonwealth GFCE, too. The new method for both the Commonwealth and state and local components of GFCE is effective from September quarter 1989.

In the new method, specially constructed current price estimates of redundancy and termination payments are subtracted from the current price aggregates and the remainders are deflated to produce constant price estimates. Constant price estimates of redundancy and termination payments are derived by extrapolating the current price estimates in 1989-90 using estimates of the number of employees in the Commonwealth and state and local government sectors. These constant price estimates are then added to the deflated estimates.

### PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS

A new system for estimating private non-farm stocks at constant prices has been introduced, which simplifies the level at which the current price data are deflated. This has resulted in minor revisions to the constant price estimates over and above those arising from revisions to the current price numbers. Research has shown that the simplified system does not lead to inferior estimates, and in some cases leads to superior estimates.

There was a significant build-up in private non-farm stocks in the December quarter 1996 which was mainly attributable to the retail industry. The following table shows the industry composition for the increase in private non-farm stocks in seasonally adjusted constant price terms for the last five quarters.

### WAGES, SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS

As explained in the September quarter 1996 issue of this publication, the wage and salary earner component of the Labour Force Survey (LFS) is used in compiling estimates of wages and salaries. In addition to the adjustment to the September quarter 1996 estimate of the number of wage and salary earners (down by 50,000 persons) outlined in the September quarter 1996 issue of 5206.0, further adjustments have been made to the wage and salary earner series used in compiling the wages estimates for September and December quarters 1996 contained in this publication.

The new adjustments make allowance for the estimated effect of the move to telephone interviewing for the LFS. For details about this effect see page two of the January 1997 issue of *Labour Force, Australia, Preliminary* (6202.0). The national accounts adjustments are based on the mid-point of the estimated range of the gap between the old and new methods of measuring employment (ie an increase of 7,500 persons per month) shown in 6202.0, and assume that the wage and salary earner and the self employed components of the employed labour force are similarly affected. The national accounts estimates for wage and salary earners (which are based on the number of such persons reported in the middle month of each quarter) were therefore adjusted upwards by 6,400 persons in August 1996 and 25,600 persons in November 1996, since wage and salary earners comprise about 85% of the employed labour force, and August and November were affected by the telephone interviewing effect for one and four months, respectively.

Quarterly movements in wages, salaries and supplements can at times be significantly affected by changes in two of the component series: severance, termination and redundancy payments, and supplements to wages and salaries (i.e. employers' contributions to superannuation and workers' compensation claims). Severance, termination and redundancy payments for recent quarters are shown below (although an estimate for December quarter 1996 is not yet available separately from the total wages and salaries figure) together with estimates for supplements for the last nine quarters. (The estimates can be shown only in original terms because wages, salaries and supplements are seasonally adjusted in total.)

## INTRODUCTION

**1** This publication contains estimates of the components of gross domestic product and national expenditure and supporting tables for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the eight previous quarters and the last four financial years. Seasonally adjusted and trend estimates of the major aggregates and some selected series are also provided for the latest quarter, together with comparative estimates for the twelve previous quarters. The List of Tables, pages XX-14, show the full range of data provided.

## CONCEPTS, SOURCES AND METHODS

**2** These are documented in *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). An updated version of the 5216.0 publication, along with other similar ABS publications, is now available on a CD-ROM product, which is entitled *Statistical Concepts Reference Library on CD-ROM* (1361.0). It was released in July 1996.

## ACCURACY OF QUARTERLY ESTIMATES

**3** Estimating for a period of less than one year presents special problems. It is often difficult to adhere strictly to definitions used in annual estimates when deriving quarterly ones. This is particularly the case for the quarterly measure of income, because it is not always possible to match the value of production for a quarter with the cost incurred in that production. Difficulties are also encountered in obtaining detailed data for short periods and in preparing consistent estimates from different sources with different accounting procedures and periods. Furthermore, the quarter-to-quarter growth in seasonally adjusted terms is very sensitive to the timing of recording a transaction. If the recording of a transaction is delayed by one quarter, seasonally adjusted movements will be distorted for three consecutive quarters. All these problems affect the accuracy of the current and constant price estimates and should be taken into account in interpreting the estimates.

## REVISIONS

**4** Most figures are subject to revision as more complete and accurate information becomes available. The revisions are of two types: those made to recent quarters and those made as a consequence of a redistribution across all quarters within a year following revisions to annual totals. Major revisions made this quarter are discussed on page 2.

## TREND ESTIMATES

**5** Given the qualifications regarding the accuracy and reliability of the quarterly national accounts, the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) considers that trend estimates provide the best guide to the underlying movements, and are more suitable than either the seasonally adjusted or original data for most business decisions and policy advice.

**6** A trend estimate is obtained by removing the irregular component from the seasonally adjusted series. For estimates in this publication, it is calculated using a centred 7-term Henderson moving average of the seasonally adjusted series. Estimates for the three most recent quarters cannot be calculated using this centred average method; instead an asymmetric average is used. This can lead to revisions in the trend estimates for the last three quarters when data become available for later quarters, even if none of the original data for earlier quarters has changed.

**7** If a series has a high 'irregular' component, then the trend estimates will be subject to greater revision for the latest few quarters as data become available for subsequent quarters than would otherwise be the case. However, it is important to note that this does not make the trend series inferior to the seasonally adjusted or original series. In fact, in such cases the effect of the irregular component on overall movements is likely to be even more marked in the seasonally adjusted and the original estimates than in the trend series.



TREND ESTIMATES (continued)

IMPLICIT PRICE DEFLATOR (IPD)

**9** The quarterly implicit price deflators (IPDs) are derived by dividing seasonally adjusted and trend current price estimates by the corresponding constant price estimates. Movements in IPDs can be greatly affected by changes in the physical composition of the aggregates and their components. For this reason, quarterly IPDs derived from seasonally adjusted or trend data are preferred to those using original data. The seasonal adjustment process itself is also a possible source of distortion. For further information see Appendix VI of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0).

SEASONAL ADJUSTMENT:  
GENERAL METHOD

**10** Data that are affected by seasonal factors are adjusted to remove the effects of these factors. The general methods for doing so are described in Appendix I of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts, Sources and Methods* (5216.0). Three important points should be noted here :

- The methods used in seasonal adjustment do not force the sum of the adjusted estimates for each quarter of a year to equal the original annual total.
- Where constant price estimates have no apparent seasonality in their implicit price deflators, the estimates are adjusted using the corresponding factors for current price estimates.
- Special methods have been used to adjust some components of gross farm product. These concern the adjustment of crop production where production/harvest only occurs in a couple of quarters each year. In these instances, the output for each financial year is distributed equally over the four quarters.

MEASURES OF GDP

GDP(I)  
INCOME APPROACH

**11** GDP(I) is the sum of factor incomes, consumption of fixed capital (depreciation) and net indirect taxes. The preferred current price measure of GDP is GDP(I). It is the overall measure which is consistent with subsidiary measures such as national income and the other consolidated tables (such as the national income and outlay account). GDP(I) also provides the base year benchmarks for the constant price estimates of GDP(P). Constant price estimates of GDP(I) are derived by deflating current price estimates of GDP(I) by the implicit price deflator of GDP(E).

GDP(E)  
EXPENDITURE APPROACH

**12** GDP(E) is the sum of all final expenditures, changes in stocks, and exports less imports. Constant price estimates of GDP(E) are the sum of all these components at average 1989–90 prices.

GDP(P)  
PRODUCTION APPROACH

**13** GDP(P) is calculated as the market value of goods and services produced by an industry (i.e. gross output) less the cost of goods and services used in the productive process (i.e. intermediate consumption). Constant price estimates of GDP(P) are the sum of constant price estimates (at average 1989–90 prices) for each industry.

MEASURES OF GDP (continued)

**GDP(A) THE AVERAGE** **14** While the three measures above are identical in concept, they can differ significantly in practice, especially in the short term, because of the different data sources used for each measure. Using the average of the three, GDP(A), smooths out these differences. GDP(A) is considered by the ABS to be the most satisfactory indicator of short-term seasonally adjusted or trend growth (see the Feature Article in the June quarter 1990 issue of *Australian National Accounts: National Income and Expenditure* (5206.0)).

**ANALYSIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS TO GROWTH**

**15** Tables 6 and 7 present analyses of the contribution provided by each major component to the percentage change in trend and seasonally adjusted estimates of constant price GDP(I). The figures in each table are additive within each quarter, unlike the percentage changes shown in other tables in this publication. The formula used to calculate the contribution of each aggregate to the growth in GDP is:

$$\frac{A(t) - A(t-1)}{GDP(t-1)} \times 100$$

where

A(t) = value of aggregate A in quarter under consideration

A(t-1) = value of aggregate A in preceding quarter

GDP(t-1) = value of GDP in preceding quarter.

**TERMS OF TRADE**

**16** There are several ways of measuring the terms of trade. In this publication, the following index is used :

$$\frac{\text{Implicit price deflator for exports of goods and services}}{\text{Implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services}} \times 100$$

Estimates of the terms of trade are shown in Tables 11, 12, 18, 19, 68 and 69.

**REAL GROSS DOMESTIC INCOME**

**17** GDP at constant prices is a measure of the volume of goods and services produced in Australia. If the terms of trade change significantly over the period of comparison, then this measure of real GDP will not accurately reflect the change in real purchasing power of the income generated by domestic production. (See the *Technical Note* included in the September 1993 issue of this publication for a more detailed discussion.) A better measure of the real purchasing power of income generated by domestic production is GDP(I) at average 1989-90 prices adjusted for the terms of trade effect, which is referred to as *real gross domestic income* (or real GDI). The following adjustment is made to GDP(I) at constant prices to obtain an estimate of real GDI:

- exports of goods and services at current prices are deflated by the implicit price deflator for imports of goods and services
- the actual constant price value of exports is then deducted from this value, and
- the resultant terms of trade adjustment is then added to GDP(I) at constant prices to give real GDI presented in Tables 68 and 69.

.....

GROSS PRODUCT PER UNIT  
OF LABOUR INPUT

**18** Indexes of constant price gross product per person employed and per hour worked are commonly referred to as measures of labour productivity. However, it should be noted that these indexes reflect not only the contribution of labour to changes in product per unit of labour, but also the contribution of capital and other factors (such as managerial efficiency, economies of scale, etc.).

**19** When analysing labour productivity indexes it is critical to note that they are subject to the vagaries of the growth (or business) cycle as well as the effects of any measurement error in either output or labour input. Differences in the amplitude and phase of the output and input cycles can result in labour productivity indexes deviating substantially from their longer-term trend. Analytical work undertaken within the ABS suggests that movements in employment and hours worked tend to lag movements in GDP. Over a 20 year period, the lag at turning points in the growth cycle varied between zero and four quarters, with the average being between two and three quarters. The implication is that, in the period of the growth cycle when the growth in output is declining, indexes of labour productivity are likely to decline, particularly if rapid growth in GDP is abruptly ended. Conversely, labour productivity indexes are likely to grow strongly when the economy comes out of a cyclical trough.

**20** A simple way to estimate the underlying trend in labour productivity is to compare the values of a labour productivity index spanning a growth cycle e.g. from the peak of one growth cycle to the peak of another. Note that such estimates rest on the assumption that labour is being utilised to the same degree at each growth cycle peak. Average annual growth rates, over growth cycles, of estimates of gross product per hour worked in the *market* and *non-farm market* sectors are shown in *Australian National Accounts: Multifactor Productivity* (5234.0).

MARKET AND NON-FARM  
MARKET SECTORS

**21** The estimates of gross product at constant prices for six industries: Finance and insurance; Property and business services; Government administration and defence; Education; Health and community services; and Personal and other services are derived either wholly or primarily by using either deflated input cost data or hours worked as indicators of output. As such, the estimates cannot adequately reflect changes in productivity. For the purpose of measuring changes in productivity, it is therefore preferable that these industries be excluded. The constant price product of a group of industries referred to as the *market sector* is defined to be GDP(P) less the above six industries, less Ownership of dwellings (for which capital stock is used as the indicator of output), plus the imputed bank service charge related to the 'non-market' industries.

**22** A second industry group, referred to as the *non-farm market sector*, comprises the market sector less Agriculture, forestry and fishing. Productivity estimates derived for this group are free of the effects caused by the volatility of agricultural production due to changing seasonal conditions.

INDEXES OF EMPLOYMENT AND  
HOURS WORKED

**23** The quarterly employment indexes used to derive the gross product per person employed indexes comprise all labour engaged in the production of goods and services and include not only civilian wage and salary earners but also employers; self-employed persons; persons working one hour or more without pay in a family business or on a farm; and members of the Australian defence forces. For details of how the employment and hours worked estimates are formed, refer to Section 23 of *Australian National Accounts: Concepts Sources and Methods* (5216.0), and also Section 4 of the Information Paper *Australian National Accounts: Introduction of Constant Price Estimates at Average 1989-90 Prices* (5243.0) which describes changes in methods introduced in conjunction with the rebase of constant price estimates to average 1989-90 prices.

PRIVATE NON-FARM STOCKS TO SALES RATIO	<p><b>24</b> The ratio is presented in Tables 68 and 69. GDP(A) PER CAPITA	<p><b>27</b> This is the ratio of GDP(A) to an estimate of the resident Australian population. For all but the most recent quarters, the resident population data are drawn from <i>Australian Demographic Statistics</i> (3101.0). For the most recent quarters, estimates are made by extrapolating from the latest available data.</p>
