# LABOUR FORCE EXPERIENCE AUSTRALIA <br> DURING THE YEAR ENDING FEBRUARY 1984 

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## EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Introduction

In association with the February 1984 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia, persons aged fifteen years and over were asked about their labour force experience during the year up to the end of the week prior to interview in February 1984. Information sought included the length of time they worked, looked for work or were out of the labour force, the number of spells during which they looked for work and other aspects of labour force experience.
2. During the two weeks beginning Monday 6 February, 1984, specially trained interviewers asked the questions of a sub-sample of 52,000 of the 72,000 respondents in the February labour force survey.
3. A preliminary publication containing a summary of the survey results was issued on 28 June 1984 (6205.0).
4. Similar surveys were conducted in a number of earlier years, the first relating to 1968. Results were published in Labour Force Experience, Australia (6206.0). However, see paragraph 19 regarding the change in February 1981 to the reference period for the survey.

## Scope

5. This supplementary survey to the labour force survey included all civilians aged fifteen years and over except:
(a) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
(b) overseas residents in Australia;
(c) dependants of non-Australian defence forces personnel stationed in Australia;
(d) students boarding at school, some patients in hospitals and sanatoria, inmates of jails, reformatories, etc.
6. The estimates relate to persons covered by the survey in February 1984. Because of emigration, deaths and other exits not all persons with labour force experience during the period were covered. Labour force experience may relate to experience outside Australia.

## Definitions

7. It is impracticable to obtain information relating to a whole year which is strictly comparable with that obtained in the monthly labour force survey for which the reference period is one week. The definitions used in determining the labour force status of persons in the monthly survey depend on a detailed set of questions asked about a person's labour force activity during the reference period. For the survey of labour force experience, a person is assigned to a labour force category for each of the weeks in the year on the basis of a more limited set of questions. It is for this reason that the terms worked and looked for work are used in this survey rather than the rigidly defined terms employed and unemployed used in the monthly labour force survey.
8. Persons in the labour force are those persons who, for those weeks, reported having either worked or looked for work as defined in paragraphs 9 and 10.
9. Persons who worked are those persons who, for those weeks, reported having either worked or been on paid leave. Periods of one week or more on strike or time off without pay are not classified as worked.
10. Persons who looked for work are those persons who, for those weeks, reported having been out of work and looking for a job. Weeks spent looking for work during the year is the total number of weeks persons reported having been out of work and looking for a job, including the weeks in the current period.
11. The number of spells of looking for work during the year is the number of different periods, including the current period, during which persons reported having been out of work and looking for a job.
12. Persons out of the labour force are those who, during any week, neither worked nor looked for work as defined in paragraphs 9 and 10.
13. For the purposes of the survey, a $j o b$ is defined as:
(a) employment as a wage or salary earner (or unpaid family helper) by a particular employer, in a particular locality; or
(b) self-employment (with or without employees) in a particular locality.
14. Locality. In capital cities and major towns each suburb is considered to be a different locality.
15. Persons are classified as married if they are reported as being married (including de facto) and their spouse was a usual resident of the household at the time of the survey. The not-married category includes persons who have never married, or are separated, widowed or divorced, as well as those who, although reported as being married, did not have a spouse who usually lived in the household. For effects on estimates of marital status, see paragraph 21 .
16. Family status characteristics are explained in detail in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0). It should be noted that they were not obtained for all persons included in the survey. Family information was not collected for the following persons:
(a) all persons enumerated in non-private dwellings (including hotels, motels, hospitals and other institutions);
(b) persons enumerated as visitors to, rather than usual residents of, private dwellings; and
(c) where it was not possible to obtain family information relating to all the usual residents of a household, e.g. where one member of the family was a member of the permanent defence forces and therefore outside the scope of the survey.

## Population benchmarks

17. Following the change in official population estimates to a place of usual residence basis after the 1981 Census, the population benchmarks used in this survey are compiled according to place of usual residence. For an explanation of the new conceptual basis of population estimates see The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
18. The change from 1976 Population Census based benchmarks to 1981 Population Census based benchmarks has had little effect on the movement in the estimates between the February 1983 and February 1984 surveys.

## Discontinuities in the series

19. The estimates for February 1983 and February 1984 are not strictly comparable with those obtained from previous surveys. The reference period for the February 1980 and prior surveys was the previous calendar year (e.g. 1 January to 31 December 1979). The reference period for the February 1981 and 1982 surveys was from the beginning of the previous February to the end of the week prior to interview. As interviews were conducted over the second and third week of February, the reference period could have extended to 54 weeks. For the February 1983 and February 1984 surveys the reference period was the 52 weeks up to the end of the week prior to interview. Due to the change in the reference period timing, some estimates, particularly those for groups who entered the labour force during the earlier months of the year (e.g. 15 to 19 year olds), were affected from February 1981 survey onwards.
20. In the February 1981 survey, persons who answered they had been in their current job for a year or longer but who also reported having actually worked for less than the whole period were not counted as out of the labour force for the remainder of the period. In all other years these persons were counted as out of the labour force for that time. In consequence, the February 1981 estimate of persons out of the labour force during all or part of the period was 512,300 persons ( 249,100 males and 263,200 females) less than the figures which would have been obtained with the procedures used in other years.
21. Paragraph 15 outlines the definition of marital status now used in this survey. Consequently, estimates of marital status contained in this publication are not comparable with estimates published for this survey in previous years, which classified as married all respondents who reported that they were married or separated.

## Reliability of the estimates

22. Estimates in this publication are subject to two sources of error:
(a) sampling error: since the estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings they are subject to sampling variability; that is they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error. More information about this topic will be found in the Technical note.
(b) non-sampling error: inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents and errors made in the coding and processing of data. These inaccuracies may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.

## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

## Summary of Labour Force Experience of the Population

Of the $11,488,400$ civilians aged fifteen years and over at February 1984, 7,773,800 had been in the labour force at some time during the year ending February $1984 ; 4,882,700$ of these ( 62.8 per cent) had worked for the whole period and 589,900 ( 7.6 per cent) had not worked at all (i.e. they had looked for work at some time during the period but had not found it). $2,301,200$ ( 29.6 per cent) had only worked for part of the year. 63.9 per cent of those who had worked for part of the year had worked for more than six months; 43.7 per cent had worked for more than nine months.

## Participation in the labour force at some time during the year

For males, labour force participation has changed little since the February 1975 survey although males aged 15 to 19 years and males aged 60 to 64 years have shown different trends. Since the February 1975 survey the participation of 15-19 year old males in the labour force at some time during the year increased from 67.1 per cent to 78.4 per cent in 1981 but has declined since, to 73.8 per cent in 1984. Participation of 60 to 64 year old males has shown a decrease in this period from 77.3 per cent in the February 1975 survey to 54.6 per cent in the February 1984 survey. Other age groups have shown little change in this period.

While participation for all females has risen from 49.7 per cent to 53.9 per cent since the February 1975 survey, differences between age groups are not as pronounced as they are for males. Participation has risen for most age groups, the major exception being females aged 60 to 64 years for whom participation has fallen from 19.9 per cent to 15.9 per cent.

However, the nature of participation has changed significantly. In the 1975 survey 67.1 per cent of the civilian population had worked at some time during the year and 7.1 per cent had looked for work at some time during the year but in the 1984 survey these proportions had changed to 62.5 per cent and 13.6 per cent respectively.

## Full-time and part-time employment

Of the civilian population aged fifteen years and over, less than half ( 48.5 per cent) had worked only on a full-time basis during the year ending February 1984. One in ten persons ( 10.6 per cent) had worked only on a part-time basis while about one in twenty nine persons ( 3.5 per cent) had a combination of full-time and part-time work during the year. Over the period 1975 to 1984 there has been a decline in the proportion of persons working only full-time and an increase in persons working part-time: 80.5 per cent of all persons working only part-time during the year ending February 1984 were females, three in four being married

## The changing nature of unemployment experience

The increase in the number of persons who looked for work at sometime during the reference period (from 682,100 in the February 1975 survey to $1,563,900$ in the February 1984 survey) has been accompanied by a change in the time spent looking for work. For the February 1975 survey 41.1 per cent who looked for work did so for less than four weeks compared with 15.8 per cent in the February 1984 survey. Conversely fewer people looked for work for the whole of the reference period in the February 1976 survey ( 3.8 per cent) than in the February 1984 survey ( 17.7 per cent).

The average time spent looking for work during the year ending February 1984 was 22.5 weeks, ranging from 16.7 weeks for persons with degrees or other tertiary qualifications to 26.6 weeks for persons who had left school aged 15 years or under and had not gained any qualifications since. Members of families spent an average 22.2 weeks looking for work compared with 24.0 weeks for persons who were not members of families. The average for family heads who were not married but who had children aged 0-14 years present was 22.0 weeks while husbands and wives with children aged 0-14 present looked for work an average for 22.2 weeks.

## TECHNICAL NOTE

## Estimation procedure

The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a ratio estimation procedure which ensures that the survey estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population for each capital city and remainder of State by age and sex, rather than to the corresponding distribution within the sample itself.

## Reliability of the estimates

2. Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error, which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate.
3. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given on the following page. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these figures will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.
4. An example of the calculation and the use of standard errors in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 2 shows the estimated number of married females who worked at some time during the year ending February 1984 was $1,689,200$. Since this estimate is between $1,000,000$ and $2,000,000$ the standard error for Australia will be between 10,000 and 13,000 , and can be approximated as 12,100 (rounded to the nearest 100). Therefore there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall in the range $1,677,100$ to $1,701,300$ and about nineteen chances in twenty that the value will fall within the range $1,665,000$ and $1,713,400$. This example is illustrated in the following diagram.

5. As can be seen from the standard error table, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In this publication, estimates less than the lowest levels shown in the standard error table have not been published. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.
6. Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. The formula for the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion is given below:

$$
\operatorname{RSE}(x / y)=\sqrt{[\operatorname{RSE}(x)]^{2}-[\operatorname{RSE}(y)]^{2}}
$$

7. Considering the example from paragraph 4 above, these females as a proportion of all married females $(3,552,000)$ is shown in Table 2 as 47.6 per cent. The standard error for $3,552,000$ is approximately 15,100 so the relative standard error is 0.4 per cent. The relative standard error for $1,689,200$ is 0.7 per cent. Applying the above formula, the relative standard error of the proportion is $\sqrt{(0.7)^{2}-(0.4)^{2}}$ or 0.6 per cent, giving a standard error for the proportion ( 47.6 per cent) of 0.3 percentage points. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the proportion of married females who worked at some time during the year is between 47.3 per cent and 47.9 per cent and nineteen chances in twenty that the proportion is within the range 47.0 per cent to 48.2 per cent.
8. Published figures may also be used to estimate the difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such a figure is itself an estimate and is therefore subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their standard errors and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate standard error (SE) of the difference between two estimates ( $x-y$ ) may be calculated by the following formula:

$$
\operatorname{SE}(x-y)=\sqrt{[\operatorname{SE}(x)]^{2}+[\operatorname{SE}(y)]^{2}}
$$

While this formula is strictly applicable only to differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics or subpopulations, it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likely to be of interest in this publication.
9. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample.
