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## SURV EY OF LEAVERS FROM SCHOOLS, UNIVERSIT IES OR OTEER EDUCATIONAL INST ITUTIONS -

FBBROARY, 1964, 1965 AND 1966

This bulletin contains statistics which were obtained by means of aurveys carried out in February, 1964, 1965 and 1966. The questions were designed to distinguiah persons who had attended full-time at a sohool, univeraity or other educational institution at some time in the previous year and, further, to distinguish among these persons, those who were intending to return to full-time education and those who were not returning to full-time education, the latter being described in this publicetion as "leavers".
2. On each occasion the survey was conducted by means of a multi-stage area sample. Estimates based on the survey relate to the total population of Australia within the age range 14 to 24 years, with the exception of members of the permanent armed forses, national servicemen enilsted in the Regular Army Supplement and certain diplomatic personnel, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations.
3. Persons who were patients in hospitals and sanatoria, or inmates of geols, reformatories, etc., and for whom, for the purpose of the survey, the institution was regarded as their dwelling, although included in the survey, were not asked the particular questions on attendance at schools, etc. Persons who were reported as permanently unable to work were also not asked these questions. An estimate of the total number of such persons for whom no information on attendance, etc., can be given is shown in Table 1.
4. The "leaverf", i.e. the persons who had attended full-time at a school, university, etc., at some time in the previous year and who were not returning to full-time education, were asked to indicate when they had ceased full-time education and these times of leaving are shown in Table 3(i).
5. All perscns were asked questions about their occupational status and those in the work force were further questioned about occupation and industry. Occupational staius is shown in Table 4 for "leavers", but not for persons returning to full-time education. Aithough many of these latter persons were in the work force at the time of the surveys, their numbers would not give a useful indication of the extent of vacation working, because of the timing of the surveys. The reference period to which the work force information refers, which is the week preceding the interview, extends from the last week in January to the third week in Pebruary. Hence, between the first and last weeks the level of school vacation jobholding would have decreased very substantially and that of university vacation jobholding might also have declined.
6. Por the purposes of these surveys the occupational status of a person depends upon his aotivity during a specified week. The principal categories are the employed and unemployed, which together constitute the work force, and the remainder, who are not in the work force. Details of the classification are es follows:-
(1) Employed Persong: all those who, during the specified week
(a) did any worl: for pay, profit, commission or payment in kind, in a job or business, or on a farm (the category includes employees, employers and workers on own account), or
(b) worked 15 hours or: more without pay in a family business (or farm), ownec and operated by a member of the same houserolc, or
(c) had a job, bieiress or farif, but were not at work because of ininess, accicient, leave or holiday, industrial dispute or because of production hold-up due to bad weather, piant breakiowns etc.

Persons who had a job but were temporarily laid oif by their employers for the whole week without pay are excluded, and are classified in the tables as unemployed. Persons who dis some work during the week, however, before they either lost their jobs or were laid off, are classified as employed.
(ii) Unemplojed Pursons: Gll those who, during the specified week, did no work at all, and
(a) did not have a job or business and were looking for mork (including those who gtated that they would have looked for work had they not been temporarily ill, and those who would have looked for work had they not already made definite arrengements to start woris in a new job after the specified weok), or
(b) were laid off from their jobs without pay for the whole week.

Persons who either lost their jobs or were laid off during the speciffed week, but did some work duchig that week, are classified as employed.
(1i1) The Work Foroe: comprises all persons, who, during the speoified week, were employed cr unemployed as defined in (i) and (ii) above.
(iv) Persons Not in the Work Forca: those who, during the specified week, were not clessified as employed or unemployed. This category therefore includes persons without a job, business or farm and not looking for work.
7. Sinoe the survey estimates are based on a sample they are subject to sampling variability, that is, variations that might osour by chance because only a sample of the poplation is enwerated. Estimates of less than 5,000 are not published in the tables because they would be subject to sampling variability too high for most practical purposes. Although figures for these small components can, in some cases, be derived from the tables by deduction, undue significance should not be attached to them. Further information on variability of survey estimates is available on request.
