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TRANSITION FROM EDUCATION TO WORK, AUSTRALIA MAY 1983

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EXPLANATORY NOTES

Introduction

In association with the May 1983 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia, persons aged fifteen to sixty-four years who had attended an educational institution in 1982 or were attending one at the time of the survey were asked about their labour force participation. Separate information was obtained in respect of persons who were full-time students in 1982 and had continued their full-time education in 1983 and those who had not returned to full-time education in 1983 (described in this publication as leavers).

- 2. During the two weeks beginning Monday 9 May 1983, specially trained interviewers asked questions of those of the 70,000 respondents in the May labour force survey who fell within the scope of this survey.
- 3. Results of similar surveys, the first conducted in February 1964, have been published in *Transition From Education to Work, Australia* (6227.0).

Scope

- 4. The survey includes all civilians aged fifteen to sixty-four years except:
 - (a) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
 - (b) overseas residents in Australia;
 - (c) dependants of non-Australian defence forces personnel stationed in Australia;
 - (d) persons permanently unable to work, some patients in hospitals and sanatoria and inmates of jails, reformatories etc.

Definitions

- 5. Definitions of the principal labour force categories appearing in this publication are given in *The Labour Force, Australia* (6203.0).
- 6. An educational institution is defined as any institution whose primary role is education. Included are schools, universities, colleges of advanced education, public and private colleges, etc. Excluded are institutions whose primary role is not education, for example hospitals.
- 7. Persons are regarded as attending an educational institution full-time if the institution which they are attending so classifies them or they consider themselves to be attending full-time.
- 8. A *tertiary institution* is defined as any educational institution other than a school.
- 9. Leavers from educational institutions are persons who were full-time students at some time in the previous year but are not currently full-time students.

Comparability of series

10. The scope of surveys prior to 1977 was restricted to persons aged fifteen to twenty-four years and from 1977 to 1980 inclusive, fifteen to twenty-five years. In 1981 the survey was expanded to include all persons aged fifteen to sixty-four years. Care should therefore be exercised in comparing estimates from this survey for persons aged fifteen to twenty-four years with those from previous surveys which relate to persons aged fifteen to twenty-five years.

Reliability of the estimates

- 11. Estimates in this publication are subject to two sources of error:
 - (a) sampling error: since the estimates are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. More information on this topic is given in the Technical note.
 - (b) non-sampling error: inaccuracies may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents and errors made in the coding and processing of data. These inaccuracies may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.




SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

Movements into and out of educational institutions demonstrate different patterns for different age groups. Of persons aged 15 to 19 years, 897,900 persons (71.1 per cent) attended an educational institution in 1982. 205,400 persons or more than one fifth of these were not attending an educational institution in May 1983. 25,900 persons aged 15 to 19 who had not attended in 1982 had taken up study in May 1983 (this being 3.6 per cent of the number attending in 1983). By comparison more than half of those persons aged 25 to 64 who had attended an educational institution in 1982 were not attending in 1983 and a considerable number, 167,500 persons (or 40.9 per cent of the number attending in 1983) who had not attended in 1982 had taken up study in May 1983.

ATTENDANCE AT AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION IN 1982 AND MAY 1983 (Source of data: Table 1)




In May 1983, the number of leavers from educational institutions was significantly lower than the number of leavers in previous years. The main reason for the lower figure was that there were fewer male leavers who had attended school in the previous year. Of those 367,100 males aged 15 to 24 at full-time school in 1982, 68.0 per cent remained at school full time in 1983. In addition, 8.0 per cent of males continued their full-time education at a tertiary institution. These two factors combined to reduce the number of male leavers.




Leavers aged 15 to 24, had an unemployment rate of 26.6 per cent in May 1983, compared with 18.5 per cent for the age group as a whole. The rate of increase of unemployment rates for leavers and the age group as a whole was similar.

Most persons attending an educational institution full time in May 1983 were not in the labour force. However, about one quarter of these who attended full time were employed, mostly part time. The majority (79.4 per cent) of those who attended an educational institution part time were also employed. The unemployment rate for persons who were attending an educational institution full time in May 1983 was 23.2 per cent. This was significantly higher than the unemployment rates for persons who were attending an educational institution part time in May 1983 and for persons who were not attending an educational institution in May 1983. The unemployment rates for persons in these groups were 8.5 per cent and 10.1 per cent respectively.

In May 1983, there were 151,100 apprentices in training, that is approximately 13 apprentices for each 1,000 persons in Australia. Most States have a similar number of apprentices per head of population. The number of apprentices is not uniformly distributed across the four years of apprenticeship training. In May 1983, less than half (46.6 per cent) of all apprentices were in their first or second year of training. Only 17.1 per cent of apprentices in New South Wales were in their first year of training.




TECHNICAL NOTE

Estimation procedure

The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a ratio estimation procedure, which ensures that the estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population for each capital city and remainder of State by age and sex, rather than to the corresponding distribution within the sample itself.

Reliability of the estimates

- Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability; that is, they may differ from the figures that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the figure that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error, which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate.
- 3. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given on the following page. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these figures will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.
- An example of the calculation and the use of standard errors in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 2 (page 8) shows the estimated number of persons aged 15 to 24 years who attended university full time during 1982 and were continuing their full-time studies in May 1983 is 69,400. Since this estimate is between 50,000 and 100,000 in the standard error table, the standard error for Australia will be between 2,900 and 3,900 and can be approximated as 3,300 (rounded to the nearest 100). Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall in the range 66,100 to 72,700 and about nineteen chances in twenty that the value will fall within the range 62,800 to 76,000. This example is illustrated in the following diagram.



- 5. As can be seen from the standard error table, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this publication, estimates less than the lowest levels shown in the standard error table have not been published. Although figures for these small components can in some cases be derived by subtraction, they should not be regarded as reliable.
- 6. Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. The formula for the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion is given below:

RSE
$$(x/y) = \sqrt{[RSE(x)]^2 - [RSE(y)]^2}$$

- 7. Considering the example from paragraph 4 above, the 69,400 persons represent 76.9 per cent of the 90,300 persons who attended university full time during 1982. The standard error of 90,300 is approximately 3,700 so the relative standard error is 4.1 per cent. The relative standard error for 69,400 is 4.8 per cent. Applying the above formula, the relative standard error of the proportion is $\sqrt{(4.8)^2 (4.1)^2}$ or 2.5 per cent giving a standard error for the proportion (76.9 per cent) of 1.9 percentage points. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the proportion of 15 to 24 year old full-time university students continuing full-time studies in May 1983 is between 75.0 per cent and 78.8 per cent and nineteen chances in twenty the proportion is within the range 73.1 per cent to 80.7 per cent.
- 8. Published figures may also be used to estimate the difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such a figure is itself an estimate and is therefore subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their standard errors and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate standard error (SE) of the difference between two estimates (x-y) may be calculated by the following formula:

$$SE(x-y) = \sqrt{[SE(x)]^2 + [SE(y)]^2}$$

While this formula will only be exact for differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics of subpopulations it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likely to be of interest in this publication.

9. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or only a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive training and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.
