## SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

## Overview

The focus of this survey is on the educational and work profiles of persons aged 15 to 64 , who were either attending an educational institution in May 1990, or who had attended such an institution in 1989.

The May 1990 survey identified $11,265,000$ persons aged 15 to 64 as within the scope of the survey of which:

- 1,773,900 persons ( $16 \%$ ) were attending an educational institution in May 1990 and $9,491,100$ persons ( $84 \%$ ) were not attending
- 2,277,200 persons ( $20 \%$ ) had attended an educational institution at some time in the previous year and $8,987,700$ persons ( $80 \%$ ) had not attended
- 7,817,300 persons ( $69 \%$ ) were employed in May $1990,548,900$ persons (5\%) who were unemployed and $2,898,700$ persons ( $26 \%$ ) were not in the labour force
- 4,471,000 persons (40\%) had a post-school qualification, $6,172,100$ (55\%) had no post-school qualifications and $621,900(5 \%)$ were still at school
- $5,674,600$ were males and $5,590,300$ were females.
- 359,600 persons ( $3 \%$ ) had left full-time education in the period from the beginning of 1989 up to the time of the survey, comprising 335,000 persons who had left between January and December 1989 and 24,600 who had left in the period January to May 1990
- 162,600 persons ( $1 \%$ ) were classified as apprentices.


## Changes over time

## Students

The proportions of persons of different age groups who reported attending an educational institution in the previous year increased from 76 to 79 per cent between May 1985 and May 1990 for those aged 15 to 19 years, from 25 to 31 per cent for those aged 20 to 24 years and from 8 to 9 per cent for those aged 25 to 64 years. For all age groups the increase was 380,100 over the May 1985 estimate of $1,897,100$ - the proportion increasing from 19 to 20 per cent.

For students aged 15 to 19, the estimate of those attending school full-time in the survey week dropped for the second successive year to 603,900 ( $43 \%$ of all 15 to 19 year olds).

The estimate of persons aged 15 to 19 years attending a tertiary institution full-time in 1990 continued its upward movement to 199,300 or 14 per cent of the population aged 15 to 19 years.

## Persons who had left full-time education in the previous year (Leavers)

The number of persons who left full-time education in the year prior to the survey dropped significantly to 172,900 in May 1990 having remained relatively stable at about 195,000 to 200,000 over the previous three years.

The estimate of leavers from tertiary institutions has increased by 49,200 from May 1989 (137,500) to May 1990 $(186,700)$.

Where they were in 1989 - What they're doing now
There were $1,333,400$ persons ( $12 \%$ of the survey population) studying full-time at an educational institution at some time during 1989. Of these 973,800 ( $73 \%$ ) were continuing full-time study in May 1990, 77,000 persons ( $6 \%$ ) had changed to part-time study and 282,600 persons ( $21 \%$ ) were not attending any educational institution.

A further 943,800 persons ( $8 \%$ of the survey population) were studying at some time during 1989 on a part-time basis. Of these $385,100(41 \%)$ were continuing part-time study in May 1990, 27,600 (3\%) had converted to full-time study and the remaining $531,100(56 \%)$ were not attending any educational institution.

In addition 310,300 persons aged 15 to 64 years who had not attended an educational institution at all during 1989 had commenced either full-time (20\%) or part-time ( $80 \%$ ) study by May 1990.

Of the $1,333,400$ students studying full-time at an educational institution in 1989, 282,600(21\%) had ceased attending any educational institution at May 1990. Of these 214,200 ( $76 \%$ ) were employed in May $1990,46,100$ ( $16 \%$ ) were unemployed and $22,200(8 \%)$ were not in the labour force.

Also, of the 943,800 persons who had attended an educational institution part-time in 1989, 531,100 ( $56 \%$ ) were no longer attending in May 1990. Of these 442,000 ( $83 \%$ ) were employed in May 1990, 26,500 (5\%) were unemployed and the remaining $62,600(12 \%)$ were not in the labour force.

## Type of institution

There were 526,900 persons who were attending a higher education institution in May 1990.
In 1989, 350,900 ( $67 \%$ ) of these persons had attended a higher education institution, 84,300 ( $16 \%$ ) had not attended any educational institution, 70,600 (13\%) had attended school, 14,400 (3\%) had attended a TAFE/technical college and $6,600(1 \%)$ had attended other educational institutions.

There were also 473,700 persons who were attending a TAFE/technical college in May 1990.
In 1989, 246,600 (52\%) of these had attended a TAFE/technical college, 152,500 ( $32 \%$ ) had not attended any educational institution, $64,500(14 \%)$ had attended school; $5,000(1 \%)$ had attended a higher education institution and $5,200(1 \%)$ had attended other educational institutions.

The number and percentage of persons in May 1990 continuing at the same type of institution as they had attended in 1989 were:

- School 609,800 (67\%)
- Higher Education 350,900 ( $67 \%$ )
- TAFE / technical college 246,600 ( $40 \%$ )
- Other tertiary institutions $57,900(26 \%)$.



Age
The survey population of persons aged 15 to 64 years in May 1990 comprised $1,392,50015$ to 19 year olds ( $12 \%$ ), $1,331,90020$ to 24 year olds ( $12 \%$ ) and $8,540,60025$ to 64 year olds $(76 \%)$. The respective estimates of persons in these age groups who were attending an educational institution in May 1990 were $928,500(67 \%), 311,800(23 \%)$ and 533,500 (6\%).

Other features of particular age groups include:

- 44.8 per cent $(416,000)$ of 15 to 19 year olds at an educational institution were participating in the labour force compared to 72.6 per cent $(226,500)$ of 20 to 24 year olds and 79.7 per cent $(425,300)$ of 25 to 64 year olds
- 79 per cent $(788,000)$ of 15 to 19 year olds who were studying full-time in 1989 continued to do so in May 1990, compared to 63 per cent $(140,300)$ of 20 to 24 year olds and 40 per cent $(45,600)$ of 25 to 64 year olds
- 28 per cent $(322,300)$ of tertiary students were aged 15 to 19 years, 27 per cent $(307,500)$ were aged 20 to 24 years and the remaining 45 per cent $(522,200)$ were aged 25 to 64 years.


## Participation in the labour force

Persons attending an educational institution full-time in May $1990(1,063,900)$ had a labour force participation rate of 40.2 per cent and an unemployment rate of 15.5 per cent.

Those attending part-time $(710,000)$ had a labour force participation rate of 90.1 per cent and an unemployment rate of 4.5 per cent - well below the general population's unemployment rate of 6.6 per cent at May 1990.

Of the 621,900 persons attending school in May 1990, 169,800 (27\%) were also employed - 7,800 of these on a full-time basis.

The labour force participation rate of persons with post-school qualifications was 85.9 per cent; for persons without post-school qualifications it was 70.0 per cent. The respective unemployment rates for the same groups were 4.2 per cent and 8.2 per cent.

## Educational attainment

In May 1990, 4,471,000 persons ( $40 \%$ of the survey population) had attained at least one post-school qualification, comprising $2,062,500(46 \%)$ with a certificate or diploma, $1,414,900(32 \%)$ with a trade qualification, $941,800(21 \%)$ with a degree and $51,800(1 \%)$ with other post-school qualifications.

Amongst the 6,172,100 persons who were without a post-school qualification in May 1990 1,906,600 (31\%) had attended the highest level of secondary school available, and 464,900 ( $24 \%$ ) of these were attending a tertiary institution in May 1990.

Of the $4,216,700$ persons who had not attended the highest level of secondary school available 228,400 ( $5 \%$ ) of these were attending a tertiary institution in May 1990.

Some $458,700(40 \%)$ of the $1,152,000$ persons attending a tertiary institution in May 1990 had already attained a post-school qualification.

Just on 50 per cent of males $(1,278,300)$ with post-school qualifications had a trade qualification, 27 per cent $(700,200)$ a certificate or diploma, 22 per cent $(564,400)$ a degree or higher qualification and 1 per cent $(31,400)$ some other post-school qualification. Amongst females with post-school qualifications 72 per cent $(1,362,300)$ had a certificate or diploma, 20 per cent $(377,400)$ a degree or higher qualification, 7 per cent $(136,700)$ a trade qualification and 1 per cent $(20,400)$ some other post-school qualification.

## Leavers

There were 359,600 persons reported as having left full-time education between the beginning of 1989 and May 1990.

Those leaving full-time school education numbered $172,900(48 \%)$ and those leaving full-time tertiary education numbered 186,700 (52\%).

## Other characteristics of leavers include:

- 78 per cent $(281,400)$ were employed in May 1990,15 per cent $(52,300)$ were unemployed and 7 per cent $(26,000)$ were not in the labour force
- 35 per cent $(126,200)$ had attained a post-school qualification and a further 33 per cent $(19,400)$ had attended the highest level of secondary school available
- 21 per cent $(77,000)$ continued to attend educational institutions on a part-time basis in May 1990
- 51 per cent $(184,500)$ were males and 49 per cent $(175,100)$ were females
- 46 per cent $(85,100)$ of leavers from tertiary institutions had studied for a certificate or diploma in 1989, 36 per cent $(68,600)$ for a degree, 8 per cent $(14,600)$ for a trade qualification and 10 per cent $(18,900)$ for other qualifications.


## Apprentices

The number of persons who classified themselves as apprentices in May 1990 was 162,600-a drop of 12,900 from the series peak of 175,500 in May 1989.

Other characteristics of apprentices in May 1990 include:

- 92 per cent $(149,800)$ of apprentices were born in Australia
- 71 per cent $(116,000)$ were aged 15 to 19 years, 16 per cent $(43,000)$ aged 20 to 24 years and 2 per cent $(3,700)$ were aged 25 to 34 years
- 89 per cent $(145,300)$ were employed in the private sector
- 78 per cent $(127,300)$ had previously attended government schools
- 22 per cent $(30,600)$ of male apprentices $(138,800)$ were in building trades, 20 per cent $(28,400)$ in vehicle trades, 18 per cent $(24,500)$ in metal trades, 16 per cent $(21,700)$ in electrical trades and 24 per cent $(33,600)$ in other trades
- 61 per cent $(14,400)$ of female apprentices $(23,800)$ were in the hairdressing trade, 12 per cent $(2,800)$ in food or related trades and 28 per cent $(6,600)$ in other trades.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

## Introduction

The monthly population survey (which is described in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0)) comprises the monthly labour force survey and supplementary topics. This publication contains some results of a supplementary survey run in association with the May 1990 labour force survey conducted throughout Australia.
2. Of the respondents to the labour force survey, those who fell within the scope of the supplementary survey were asked additional questions. They were asked whether they were attending, or had attended in the previous year, an educational institution and, if so, the type of educational institution and the type of attendance. If respondents were not attending an educational institution full time in May 1990 they were asked the year they finished full-time study. Persons who had left full-time study during the previous year were asked the time of the year they had left. All persons were asked about their highest educational qualifications. For persons who did not complete their schooling, the information sought included the age at which they left school. In respect of apprentices, information was obtained on their year of apprenticeship and field of trade.

## Scope

3. The scope of this supplementary survey was restricted to persons aged 15 to 64 (with the population for apprentices further restricted to employed persons aged 15 to 34) and excluded the following persons:
(a) members of the permanent defence forces;
(b) certain diplomatic personnel of overseas governments, customarily excluded from census and estimated populations;
(c) overseas residents in Australia;
(d) members of non-Australian defence forces (and their dependents);
(c) persons permanently unable to work;
(f) some patients in hospitals and sanitariums; and
(g) inmates of reformatories, gaols etc.

## Coverage

4. In the population survey, coverage rules are applied which aim to ensure that each person is associated with only one dwelling, and hence has only one chance of selection. See The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0) for more details.

## Definitions

5. Definitions of labour force and demographic classifications appearing in this publication are given in The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
6. Unless otherwise stated, all characteristics referenced in this publication relate to the week before the interview (i.e. the reference week).

## Results of the survey

7. Due to differences in the method of estimation used in this supplementary survey and that used in the labour force survey, there are some small variations between cstimates in this publication and those in the corresponding issue of The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0).
8. The estimates in this publication refer to information collected in the survey month and, due to seasonal factors, may not be representative of other months of the year.
9. Results of similar surveys, conducted annually from February 1964 to February 1974, in May 1975 and 1976, in August 1977 and 1978 and annually since May 1979 have been given in previous issues of this publication. Information on apprentices was collected for the first time in May 1983.
10. It is proposed that this survey will be conducted next in May 1991.

## Unpublished tables

## Discontinuities in the series

12. Comparison of estimates of occupation for the May 1986 and earlier surveys with later surveys is affected by the introduction of the Australan Standard Classification of Occupations (ASCO) in August 1986. This replaced the Classification and Classified List of Occupations (CCLO) previously used. 'Field of Trade' for apprentices, which is based on occupation, will also be affected. More detailed information on this changeover is available in the appendix to The Labour Force, Australia, August 1986 (6203.0).
13. Where possible single year benchmarks for the ages 15 to 24 have been used. For more information on the application of single year benchmarks inquiries should be directed to Mr Leo Stinson on Canberra (06) 2526578.

## Survey sample redesign

14. The Labour Force Survey (LFS) sample has been redesigned and reselected using information collected in the 1986 Population Census. As a result, the standard errors used in this supplementary survey differ from those used in surveys of the same topic run prior to September 1987. For details, see Information Paper - Labour Force Survey - Sample Design (6269.0).

## Estimation procedure

15. The estimates are derived from the population survey by use of a ratio estimation procedure which ensures that the estimates conform to an independently estimated distribution of the population for each capital city and remainder of state by age, gender and labour force status, rather than to the corresponding distribution within the sample itself.

## Reliability of the estimates

16. Estimates in this publication are subject to sampling and non-sampling error. For more information refer to the Technical Note, page 25.

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## TECHNICAL NOTE

## Estimation procedure

Since the estimates in this publication are based on information obtained from occupants of a sample of dwellings, they are subject to sampling variability, that is, they may differ from those that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey. One measure of the likely difference is given by the standard error, which indicates the extent to which an estimate might have varied by chance because only a sample of dwellings was included. There are about two chances in three that a sample estimate will differ by less than one standard error from the number that would have been obtained if all dwellings had been included, and about nineteen chances in twenty that the difference will be less than two standard errors. Another measure of the likely difference is the relative standard error, which is obtained by expressing the standard error as a percentage of the estimate.
2. Space does not allow for the separate indication of the standard errors of all estimates in this publication. A table of standard errors for general application is given on the following page. Since they are averages based on calculations for a limited number of past surveys over a wide range of labour force characteristics these numbers will not give a precise measure of the standard error of a particular estimate but they will provide an indication of its magnitude.
3. An example of the calculation and the use of standard errors in relation to estimates of persons is as follows. Table 16 shows the estimated number of persons aged 15 to 24 who attended an educational institution full-time in 1989 is $1,219,600$. Since this estimate is between $1,000,000$ and $2,000,000$ in the standard error table, the standard error for Australia will be between 11,100 and 14,300 and can be approximated by interpolation as 11,800 (rounded to the nearest 100). Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the value that would have been produced if all dwellings had been included in the survey will fall in the range $1,207,800$ to $1,231,400$ and about nineteen chances in twenty that the value will fall within the range $1,196,000$ to $1,243,200$. This example is illustrated in the following diagram.

4. As can be seen from the standard error table, the smaller the estimate the higher is the relative standard error. Very small estimates are thus subject to such high standard errors (relative to the size of the estimate) as to detract seriously from their value for most reasonable uses. In the tables in this publication only estimates with relative standard errors of 25 per cent or less and percentages based on such estimates are considered sufficiently reliable for most purposes. However, estimates and percentages with larger relative standard errors have been included and are preceded by an asterisk (e.g. *3.4) to indicate they are subject to high standard errors and should be used with caution.
5. Proportions and percentages formed from the ratio of two estimates are also subject to sampling errors. The size of the error depends on the accuracy of both the numerator and the denominator. A formula to approximate the relative standard error (RSE) of a proportion is given below:

$$
\operatorname{RSE}(x / y)=\sqrt{[\operatorname{RSE}(x)]^{2}-[\operatorname{RSE}(y)]^{2}}

6. Considering the example from paragraph 3 above, of the $1,219,600$ persons aged 15 to 24 who attended an educational institution full time in 1989885,400 or 72.6 per cent attended school. The standard error of 885,400 is approximately 10,500 so the relative standard error is 1.2 per cent. The relative standard error for $1,219,600$ is 1.0 per cent. Applying the above formula, the relative standard error of the proportion is $\sqrt{(1.2)^{2}-(1.0)^{2}}$ or 0.7 per cent, giving a standard error for the proportion (72.6 per cent) of 0.5 percentage points. Therefore, there are about two chances in three that the proportion of persons aged 15 to 24 who attended school full time in 1989 is between 72.1 per cent and 73.1 per cent and nineteen chances in twenty the proportion is within the range 71.6 per cent to 73.6 per cent.
7. Published estimates may also be used to calculate the difference between two survey estimates (of numbers or percentages). Such an estimate is subject to sampling error. The sampling error of the difference between two estimates depends on their standard errors and the relationship (correlation) between them. An approximate standard error (SE) of the difference between two estimates ( $x-y$ ) may be calculated by the following formula:

\operatorname{SE}(x-y)=\sqrt{[\operatorname{SE}(x)]^{2}+[\operatorname{SE}(y)]^{2}}
$$

While this formula will only be exact for differences between separate and uncorrelated characteristics of subpopulations it is expected to provide a good approximation for all differences likely to be of interest in this publication.
8. The imprecision due to sampling variability, which is measured by the standard error, should not be confused with inaccuracies that may occur because of imperfections in reporting by interviewers and respondents, and errors made in coding and processing data. Inaccuracies of this kind are referred to as the non-sampling error, and they
may occur in any enumeration, whether it be a full count or a sample. Every effort is made to reduce the non-sampling error to a minimum by careful design of questionnaires, intensive trainng and supervision of interviewers and efficient operating procedures.

## GLOSSARY

Apprentices: employed persons aged 15 to 34 who indicated in the survey that they were apprentices.

Attended an educational institution in the previous year: any period of study during that calendar year.

Certificate or diploma: completion of an approved certificate or diploma in secretarial or business studies, administration, teaching, nursing, etc.

Degree: a bachelor degree (including honours), a graduate or post-graduate diploma, masters degree or a doctorate.

Educational attainment: measures the highest qualification obtained by the respondent. Qualifications may include those obtained at other than educational institutions (e.g. nursing qualifications obtained at a hospital).

Educational institution: any institution whose primary role is education. Included are schools, higher education establishments, colleges of technical and further education, public and private colleges, etc. Excluded are institutions whose primary role is not education, for example hospitals.

Field of trade: derived from information provided by apprentices on their occupation. (See paragraph 12 of the Explanatory Notes.)

Full-time attendance: persons who consider themselves to be attending full-time, or the institution which they are attending so classifies them.

Higher Education institutions: includes all Australian institutions providing higher education courses eg., Universities; Colleges of Advanced Education; Institutes of Technology; Institutes of Advanced Education; Institutes of Higher Education; Institutes of Tertiary Education; Agricultural Colleges.

Highest level of secondary school available: the highest level of secondary schooling (or equivalent) offered by the education system at the time the respondent left school.

Labour force participation rate: an estimate of the labour force in any group expressed as a percentage of the civilian population aged 15 to 64 in the same group (for a more detailed explanation see The Labour Force, Australia (6203.0)).

Leavers: persons who were full-time students at any time in the previous calendar year, but were not full-time students at the time of the survey. It should be noted that
6.8 per cent of leavers left full-time education during the period January 1990 through to the survey date. Also, 107,900 persons who attended school full-time at some time in the previous year and left, but were attending full-time education at any tertiary institution at the time of the survey are not included in the definition of leavers. Information about this group can be obtained from Table 10.

Main field of study: respondents with a degree; trade qualification; or a certificate or diploma (as defined) indicated the main field of study for their highest qualification.

Other educational institution: attendance at other educational institutions include business, commercial and secretarial colleges; religious and theological colleges; and overseas institutions.

Other post-school qualifications: completion of other types of education, e.g. adult education, preparatory/bridging course or hobby course.

Part-time altendance: persons who consider themselves to be attending part-time, or the institution which they are attending so classifies them.

Post-school qualifications: qualifications held by those persons who had left school and answered 'Yes' to the question: 'Since leaving school have you obtained a trade qualification, certificate, diploma, degree or any other qualification?'. Respondents indicated which of the following groups best described their highest qualification: Degree; Trade qualification; Certificate or diploma; Other post-school qualification.

Still at school: current school attendance was recorded only for persons aged fifteen to twenty years.

TAFE: college of technical and further education.
Tertiary institution: any educational institution offering post-school courses.

Trade qualification: completion of an approved trade/technical apprenticeship in fitting and turning, hairdressing, plumbing, carpentry, etc.

Unemployment rate: an estimate of unemployed persons in any group expressed as a percentage of the labour force in the same group.
